OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-76) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (67-68)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 2, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 6:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) to start the week after sweeping a three-game series from Texas last week-end...have now lost four straight games and are a season-low 18 games under .500...are 58-76 (.433), which is tied for the second worst record in the American League with Detroit...were 57-77 last year and 58-76 in 2015 after 134 games...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 99 days in fifth overall...today will be the A's 100th day in sole possession of fifth place, which will mark the seventh time in Oakland history the A's spent at least 100 days alone in last place (last: 142 days in 2015).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley and Jake Smolinski from the disabled list and recalled Franklin Barreto and Sam Moll from Triple-A Nashville yesterday to bring their active roster to 29...Moll made his Major League debut last night, becoming the 28th player to pitch for the A's this year...that is the second highest in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...he is the 51st player the A's have employed, which matches the season total from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 21-45 (.318) on the road compared to 37-31 (.544) at home...have the worst road record in the majors (SF, .319)...the home winning percentage is .226 better than the road, which is currently the biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this three-game series with Seattle marks the fifth series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas and are 0-4 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-1)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-16-2 in road series.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-4 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10...are 21-36 (.368) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-36/.357)...are batting .228 (428-for-1879) and are averaging 3.93 runs per game against the AL West (224 runs in 57 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (105) and unearned runs (77)...are tied for the American League lead in passed balls (16), are tied for second in fewest outfield assists (19), third in most stolen bases allowed (95) and third in most double plays (138).

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs in the fourth inning on Wednesday at Los Angeles (AL) but lost...it marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's scored eight runs in an inning and lost (Aug. 2, 1983 at SEA; April 10, 1998 at NYY)...rank third in the American League in doubles (250) and extra base hits (448)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.243) and most strikeouts (1242) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.316)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012...home runs accounted for 8 of the A's 11 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) and 284 of 589 runs for the season (48.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have 187 home runs for the season, which is the 10th highest single season total in Athletics history (9th is 189 in 2004, 8th is 195 in 2012).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with an Athletics franchise record 73 wild pitches (previous: 72 in 1979)...have the fourth highest ERA in the American League (4.72)...A's starting pitchers are 8-13 with a 6.06 ERA (110 er in 163.1 ip) and .316 (212-for-671) opponents batting average over the last 32 games dating back to July 28...starters rank second in the AL in most losses (54), second in fewest strikeouts (567) and fourth in fewest home runs (104)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 174 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 18 rookies (8 batters, 10 pitchers) after Sam Moll's debut last night...employed 19 rookies last year...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup four times this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

LOSING MONTHS: The A's went 11-16 (.407) in August...it was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record, which is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude March and October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one of four teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

IN AUGUST: The A's struck out 244 times in August to set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of August (previous: 235 in 2012)...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August...the record for September is 276...tied for the American League lead in doubles in August (56), ranked third in extra base hits (99), fourth in slugging (.456) and tied for fourth in batting (.260)...the slugging percentage was second best in a full month by an A's team over the last 12 years (.487 in Sept. 2013)...the pitching staff ranked second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (173) and highest opponents batting average (.285), third in highest slugging percentage (.487) and fourth in highest ERA (5.26)...the ERA was the third highest August ERA in Oakland history and the highest since 2000 (5.54)...allowed 43 home runs, which fell one short of the franchise record for August (44 in 1969).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-52 (.381) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games)...224 (617-for-2755) and 3.90 runs per games at night (328 runs in 84 games)...the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .240).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Phegley and Smolinski from the disabled list yesterday, the A's have four players remaining on the DL (Blackburn, Fowler, Triggs, Wahl)...the last time the A's had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 947 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have two players on the 60-day DL (Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 6-8 against the Mariners...are 3-5 in Seattle and 3-3 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 36-54 (.400) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-278 against the Mariners...that includes 183-124 in Oakland, 156-153 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-89 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs since the break (10)...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the AL in home runs (36), ranks fourth in RBI (91) and tied for sixth in extra base hits (60)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the majors in doubles (41).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons has two home runs and seven RBI in the second game of a doubleheader against Boston, a 15-0 A's win...in **1989** Jose Canseco's two-run homer in the first inning of the A's 7-2 win at Milwaukee is the 8000th in the history of the Athletics franchise...in **2003** the A's score two times in the 12th inning to defeat Baltimore 2-0 and extend their winning streak to 10 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (7-10, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 2-2 with a 5.94 ERA (22 er in 33.1 ip) and .273 (36-for-132) opponents batting average in six starts since his return...has allowed eight home runs in 33.1 innings (2.16 per nine innings)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

TWO STRAIGHT: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts, which marks the third time in his career he has won back-to-back decisions...has never won three straight...has a 2.13 ERA (3 er in 12.2 ip) and .174 (8-for-46) opponents batting average over his last two starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (7) and ranks second in strikeouts (91), innings pitched (110.0) and games started (20)...this marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in balks (2), tied for fourth in unearned runs (11), tied for seventh in wild pitches (9) and tied for sixth in losses (10)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 3.40 ERA (19 er in 50.1 ip) and six home runs allowed in nine starts on the road compared to 3-6 with a 7.09 ERA (47 er in 59.2 ip) and 15 home runs allowed in 11 starts in Oakland...has the second highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at home (Jimenez, BAL, 7.46)...the highest home ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more innings at home is 7.46 by Mark Redman in 2004.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-7 with a 7.40 ERA (37 er in 45.0 ip) and .339 (64-for-189) opponents batting average in nine starts at night compared to 6-3 with a 4.02 ERA (29 er in 65.0 ip) and .205 (48-for-234) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...has the fourth highest night ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at night but is tied for second in day wins...leads the majors in home runs allowed during the day (15)...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 12 career starts at night, 8-3 with a 3.56 ERA (31 er in 78.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-5 with a 6.29 ERA (34 er in 48.2 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-5 with a 4.70 ERA (32 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 3-6 with a 6.05 ERA (39 er in 58.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 21 home runs, 13 of which have been solo shots...12 have come with two outs, which is second most in the American League...12 have come over the first two innings, including seven in the second inning...has a .300 (48-for-160) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .219 (34-for-155) the second time and .278 (30-for-108) after that.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...had a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from May 9 to June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville before he was reinstated July 30.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Beltre scored on a Lowrie error, but the A's came

back with three in the bottom of the second...surrendered a solo home run to Choo in the fifth and left after six innings with a 4-2 lead.

COTTON vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-1 with a 6.06 ERA (16.1 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in three career starts...including 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 4 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 4-3 A's victory in Oakland on April 22...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2...then took the loss in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 9...surrendered a career-high tying three home runs and all six Mariners runs came on home runs...yielded a three-run home run to Segura in the first inning, a two-run home run to Cruz in the third and a solo home run to Cruz in the fifth...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 9-8 A's win in 10 innings at Seattle on Oct. 1...allowed two runs in the second inning and two more in the fifth and was relieved by Hendriks with one out in the fifth inning and the A's leading 5-4.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (3-7, 5.21 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday (6.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...it was the seventh loss of his career and it came in his 12th start...is one of five pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least seven games over his first 12 career appearances (Morgan 9, Mazzaro 8, Mengden 7, Anderson 7)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Seattle, a 4-0 A's loss earlier this year at Safeco Field on July 9 (4.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville.

Saves/Opportunities: 27-for-48 (56.3%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-16 (43.8%) save opportunities over the last 41 games...is 27-for-48 (56.3%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 55.0%)...Tied for third fewest saves and is tied for the fourth most blown saves (21) in the AL.
- Has a 3.95 ERA (67 er in 152.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.22).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (166) and third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.431).
- Ranks second in the AL in fewest inherited runners (170).
- Has allowed 45 stolen bases, tied for second most in the majors.
