### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-80) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (72-67)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost a season-high eight consecutive games to fall to a season-low 22 games under .500 at 58-80 (.420)...that is the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 138 games and is the worst since 1997 (53-85)...win or lose today, the A's will have their worst 139-game record since 1997 (54-85)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 103 days in fifth overall...trail the Astros by a season-high 27 games...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 27 or more games at any point in the season (1977, 1979, 2016).

**EIGHT-GAME LOSING STREAK:** The A's have an eight-game losing streak, which is their longest losing streak since May 22-June 1, 2012 when they lost nine straight...have been out-scored 60-37 during the streak...the pitching staff has a 7.23 ERA (56 er in 69.2 ip) and has surrendered 19 home runs...starters are 0-4 with an 8.05 ERA (34 er in 38.0 ip) and have tossed four innings or fewer in four of the eight games...the offense is hitting .263 (75-for-285) with 14 doubles, a triple and 14 home runs.

**TIME OF GAME:** The A's have played back-to-back four hour games for the eighth time in Oakland history but just the second time over the last 22 years (April 15-16, 2014 vs. LAA)...are averaging 3:57 over the last four games (948 minutes) and 3 hours, 9 minutes and 46 seconds for the season...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and Houston (four games)...went 0-6 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...now have a season-high seven-game road losing streak...are 37-33 (.529) at home compared to 21-47 (.309) on the road...the home winning percentage is .220 better than the road, which is currently the second biggest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003)...the road record is the worst in the majors...have hit 110 home runs at home, which is fourth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history (126 in 2000, 116 in 2002, 113 in 1996, 112 in 1999).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-8 in this stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sunday...are 21-40 (.344) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-38/345).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors in errors (109) and unearned runs (79)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (100) and most double plays (141) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank third in the American League in doubles (258) and extra base hits (466)...however, are second in lowest batting average (.244) and most strikeouts (1281) and fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.317)...the strikeouts are the second highest single season total in Athletics history to the record of 1387 in 2012.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's hit three home runs last night and now have 196 for the season, which is the eighth highest single season total in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999, 205 in 2002, 199 in 2001, 199 in 1987, 197 in 1997)...need four more home runs to reach 200 for the fifth time in Athletics history...home runs have accounted for 297 of the A's 613 runs (48.5%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 19 home runs in the last seven games and have a 7.88 ERA (54 er in 61.2 ip) and .307 (77-for-251) opponents batting average over that span...have surrendered 183 home runs for the season, which is fourth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 185 in 2016)...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (76), third in highest ERA (4.82) and fourth in most extra base hits (463)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 8-14 with a 6.40 ERA (128 er in 180.0 ip) and .321 (238-for-741) opponents batting average over the last 36 games dating back to July 28...rank second in the American

League in fewest strikeouts (579), tied for second in most losses (55) and fourth in fewest home runs (111) and highest ERA (4.89)...are one of three AL teams without a complete game (CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 178 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have currently used 51 players this year, but Nuñez and Wendle will bring the total to 53, which would be second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have already used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have used 18 rookies (8 batters, 10 pitchers), including eight players who have made their Major League debut...Nuñez and Wendle would bring the rookie total to 20, which would be the second most rookies in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

**ELIMINATED:** The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Monday...that is the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977)...have a tragic number of 11 to be eliminated from the playoffs.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have a 26-26 (.500) record during day games compared to 32-54 (.372) at night...went 11-16 (.407) in August, which was their 10th consecutive month with a losing record...that is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966...have used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 963 games (41.9 games per stint)...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games (67.0 games per stint)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs...have a run differential of -120, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182).

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive year as they trail 6-12 entering the final game today...the 12 losses match the most in Oakland history against the Angels in a season (2009 and 2016)...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...are 30-45 against the Angels over the last four years...are 4-5 in Oakland this year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses match Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-366 against the Angels...that includes 222-172 in Oakland and 205-194 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-443 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in doubles (15) and extra base hits (26) since the All-Star Break...ranks second among American League rookies in home runs (10) and RBI (24) since the break...**Khris Davis** is tied for the AL lead in home runs (38), ranks third in RBI (97) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (64)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for second in the majors and tied for fourth in Oakland history with 42 doubles...**Matt Olson** has homered in three straight games for the third time in his career...all have come over his last 21 games (Aug. 11-13, Aug. 27-30).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1913** Eddie Collins steals home twice in the same game against Boston to tie a major league record...in **1943** Carl Scheib becomes the youngest player to appear in an American League game at the age of 16 years, 248 days...in **1969** the A's play their second 18-inning game in a 14-day span but lose to Minnesota 8-6 after each team scores once in the 16<sup>th</sup>...in **1976** the A's steal seven bases in a 2-1, 11 inning win at California to run the season total to an American League record 297...Oakland would go on to steal 341 bases to best the AL record of 291 established by Washington in 1913.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (9-9, 4.52 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 1-4 with a 6.81 ERA (28 er in 37.0 ip) and .354 (58-for-164) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts this year and 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 before his current stretch.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 3-7 with a 4.96 ERA (38 er in 69.0 ip) in 13 starts against American League West teams compared to 6-2 with a 4.08 ERA (31 er in 68.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

**2017 vs. 2016:** Is 9-9 with a 4.52 ERA in 25 starts this year after going 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts, last year...has a .770 OPS this year compared to .713 last year...has 17 home runs, 47 walks and 120 strikeouts in 137.1 innings this year vs. 20 home runs, 37 walks and 124 strikeouts in 144.2 innings last year.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 2-4 with a 6.14 ERA (30 er in 44.0 ip) and .333 (63-for-189) opponents batting average in nine starts since the All-Star Break after going 7-5 with a 3.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 starts before the break...has allowed nine home runs in 44.0 innings since the break after yielding just eight in 93.1 innings before the break.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Left-handed hitters are 23-for-72 (.319) against him over his last 15 starts after going 2-for-38 (.053) over his first 10 starts...has yielded 15 of his 17 home runs and issued 42 of his 47 walks to right-handed hitters...12 of his home runs have come on the road and 12 have been solo shots...opponents are 27-for-80 (.338) with runners in scoring position over his last 14 starts after hitting .146 (7-for-48) over his first 11...has a .153 (43-for-281) opponents batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .410 (25-for-61) batting average to the opponents two hitter.

**THE FIRST AND SECOND INNING:** Has allowed 36 of his 77 runs this year over the first two innings of his starts...has a 5.96 ERA (32 er in 48.1 ip) over the first two innings of a game, 3.17 (23 er in 65.1 ip) over innings three through five and an 8.04 ERA (14 er in 15.2 ip) in the sixth inning...has not allowed a run after the sixth inning (8.0 ip)...last year, he allowed just nine runs in the first inning and second inning (1.29 ERA).

**IN AUGUST:** Went 1-3 with a 9.17 ERA and .391 opponents batting average in five starts in August...tied for fifth in the American League in losses in August...the opponents batting average was the highest in the AL among pitchers with 15 or more innings in August and the ERA was third highest...struck out just seven batters in 17.2 innings, an average of 3.57 per nine innings...averaged 8.76 strikeouts per nine innings over the first four months of the season...is now 3-7 with a 5.75 ERA in 11 career starts in August compared to 13-11 with a 3.83 ERA (98 er in 230.1) in all other months.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is tied for third in the American League with four pick-offs and opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for eighth most in the AL...has a 4-1 record in day games, 5-8 at night...tossed fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts from Aug. 1 to 12...is the first A's starting pitcher to toss fewer than four innings in three consecutive starts over the course of one season since Miguel Jimenez did it from April 30-May 12, 1994.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one rehab start before he was reinstated from the DL May 15...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least

1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings in a 12-5 loss to Baltimore on Aug. 12 in Oakland...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit or walk.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle last Friday...Oakland scored twice in the first inning but he allowed three runs in the third on a home run by Zunino, a RBI single by Haniger and a sacrifice fly by Seager...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work and the A's were shutout on five hits over the final eight innings.

**MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 0-2 with a 6.38 ERA (24.0 ip, 25 h, 19 r, 17 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 5 hr) in five career starts...is 0-2 with a 6.50 ERA (13 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts in Anaheim and 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (4 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 7.88 ERA (11.1 ip, 15 h, 13 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year...the first no decision came in a 7-6 loss in Oakland on April 4...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh...then took the loss in an 8-5 decision at Los Angeles April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...had another no decision in the A's 11-10 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 6...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the first and a solo home run to Trout in the third...Oakland scored four times in the fourth inning to take a 4-2 lead, but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a two-run double by Graterol, a RBI single by Pennington and an error.
