OAKLAND ATHLETICS (71-83) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (76-78)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to a season-high six games last night, which matches the A's longest winning streak over the last four years...the last time Oakland won more than six straight was a nine-game winning streak from April 3-12, 2013...are 13-3 over the last 16 games, which is their best 16-game stretch since Sept. 7-23, 2013 when they also won 13 of 16...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 36-35 since then...are 71-83 (.458) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors... have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)... have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 121 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a seven-game home winning streak, which is their longest such streak since July 3-18, 2014 when they also won seven straight...the last longer home winning streak is an 11-game streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are 2-0 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (2-0) and Seattle (three games)...are 44-33 (.571) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...the home winning percentage is .220 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...the A's road record is second worst in the AL...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 13-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE AT HOME: The A's have hit 124 home runs at home, which is third most in the majors (BAL 133, NYY 126) and two short of the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum (126 in 2000)...are slugging .472, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have already set Oakland records for extra base hits (296) and strikeouts (697) at home...have 160 doubles, which are second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 399 runs scored, which ranks eighth (7th is 402 in 2009, 6th is 405 in 2004, 5th is 423 in 2001)...the pitching staff has set an Oakland record for strikeouts at home (627)...has a 4.42 ERA...if the A's finish with an ERA above 4.34, it will be the third highest home ERA in Oakland history (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 90 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history (102 in 1996, 96 in 1997).

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 13-8 in September and have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...that is also the last time they won more than 12 games in a month...the streak of 10 consecutive losing months is an Oakland record...the A's offense has 36 home runs, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the majors...rank second in the American League in extra base hits (82) and slugging percentage (.486), tied for second in walks (81), third in on-base percentage (.345) and strikeouts (206) and fourth in runs (118)...the Athletics record for strikeouts in September is 276 in 2012...have already set franchise records for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors with 118 errors, which is seven more than any other team (CWS, 111)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in stolen bases allowed (108), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (156) and fewest outfield assists (21).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1440 times, which is sixth most in American League history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1482 by TB in 2016, 1481 by TB in 2017, 1452 by HOU in 2016, 1442 by HOU in 2014)...rank third in the AL in doubles (288) and extra base hits (527) and fifth in home runs (224) and walks (546)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are tied for sixth most (6th is 527 in 1932, 5th is 540 in 2004)... have 55 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is second most in the majors (CLE, 56)...home runs have accounted for 347 of the A's 705 runs (49.2%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on

home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (40), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.69 ERA, which is fourth highest in the American League...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...are tied for the Major League lead with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 517 extra base hits, which is fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1146 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but sixth most in Athletics history (5th is 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 198 home runs, which is eighth most in the AL but second most in Oakland history to the record of 205 in 1996.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in five of the last eight games and are 5-0 with a 1.66 ERA (8 er in 43.1 ip) over that span...however, are 17-16 with a 5.42 ERA (160 er in 265.2 ip) and .300 (322-for-1072) opponents batting average over the last 52 contests...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (642), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in fewest home runs (121)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 52 home runs in just 221 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-25 (.490) against teams that would be in the playoffs if the season was over, 47-58 (.448) against everyone else...are 32-27 (.542) during day games compared to 39-56 (.410) at night...are 28-40 (.412) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 52 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have 33 players on the active roster.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 8-6...are 7-1 in Oakland but are 1-5 in Texas...have won eight games at home against the Rangers twice in Oakland history (8-2 in 2002, 8-1 in 2003)...have a seven-game home winning streak, which is tied for the second longest A's Coliseum winning streak against the Rangers...the longest is an eight-game streak from June 17, 2013-April 6, 2004...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against Texas...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 46-44 against the Rangers over the last five seasons...are 349-359 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 185-170 in Oakland and 164-189 in Texas...are 97-101 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 446-441 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001)...**Matt Olson** has homered six times in his last eight games, nine times in his last 13 and 16 times in his last 24...has 13 home runs in September, which match the most by a rookie in any month over the last 30 seasons (Bellinger, LAD 13 in June 2017)...they match the most by any player in Athletics history in September (Giambi, 2000)...has 24 home runs in 69 career games, which are third most in ML history by a player over his first 69 games (since 1913)...is averaging 7.75 at bats per home run, which is fourth lowest in ML history among batters with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in **1988** Dave Stewart strikes out 11 in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee to win his 20th game of the season...in **2000** Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (8-10, 5.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has spent most of the season with Oakland where he is 8-10 with a 5.81 ERA in 23 starts over two stints with the A's...was on the Opening Day roster and went 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the 10-day disabled list July 4 with a right thumb blister...was reinstated July 30 and is 3-2 with a 6.85 ERA (36 er in 47.1 ip) and .293 (56-for-191) opponents batting average in nine starts since his return...missed his last scheduled start on Monday at Detroit after straining his right groin during warm-ups.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 over his last five starts for the first three-game winning streak of his career...however, allowed 11 runs in 9.0 innings in his two no decisions over that stretch and has a 5.74 ERA (17 er in 26.2 ip) and .267 (28-for-105) opponents batting average during the winning streak...has surrendered nine home runs.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed an Athletics rookie record 28 home runs...broke the previous mark of 27 set by Dan Pfister in 1962 and matched by Trevor Cahill in 2009...has the most home runs by a Major League rookie since Wei-Yin Chen yielded 29 with Baltimore in 2012...the 28 home runs are second most by any A's pitcher over the last 11 years (Griffin, 36 in 2013)...has allowed an average of 2.03 home runs per nine innings, which is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 120 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, it is the highest mark in Athletics history (Jerry Walker, 1.70 in 1962)...has allowed at least one home run in each of his last seven starts and has surrendered 13 home runs in 38.2 innings total over that stretch (3.03 per nine innings)...allowed three home runs in back-to-back starts on Sept. 2 and 8 and is the first A's pitcher to do that since Cory Lidle in 2001 (June 21 and 29)...14 of his home runs have come with two outs, which is second most in the American League (Zimmerman, DET 16)...13 have come over the first two innings, including seven in the second inning, which is tied for third most in the AL.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (8) and ranks second in strikeouts (99), innings pitched (124.0) and games started (23)...this marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in balks (2), tied for sixth in unearned runs (11) and tied for ninth in wild pitches (9)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...based on a minimum of 120 innings pitched, he ranks fourth in the AL in highest ERA (5.81), highest opponents slugging percentage (.508) and highest opponents OPS (.855)...using the same minimum, his ERA is sixth highest in Oakland history and the highest since Jimmy Haynes had a 6.34 ERA in 152.0 innings in 1999...the slugging percentage is third highest and the OPS is eighth highest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-6 with a 7.52 ERA (54 er in 64.2 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in 12 starts in Oakland compared to 5-4 with a 3.94 ERA (26 er in 59.1 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 11 starts on the road...is tied for second in the majors in home runs allowed at home and is two short of the Oakland record of 20 set by Trevor Cahill in 2009...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he has the second highest home ERA in the majors (Jimenez, BAL 7.86) and in Oakland history (Mark Redman, 7.46 in 2004).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-7 with a 7.78 ERA (51 er in 59.0 ip) and .339 (84-for-248) opponents batting average in 12 starts at night compared to 6-3 with a 4.02 ERA (29 er in 65.0 ip) and .205 (48-for-234) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...has the fourth highest night ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at night...using the same minimum, it is third highest in Oakland history (Blake Stein, 9.00 in 1998; Dave Stewart, 8.15 in 1995)...is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed during the day (15) and is tied for third in the American League in day wins...is now 2-7 with a 6.72 ERA (56 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 career starts at night, 8-3 with a 3.56 ERA (31 er in 78.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .274 opponents batting average, which includes .267 (56-for-210) against left-handed pitchers compared to .279 (76-for-272) against right-handers...has a .855 OPS against lefties, .854 against righties...opponents are hitting .291 with a .547 slugging percentage when leading off an inning.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-5 with a 7.02 ERA (45 er in 57.2 ip) in 11 starts against American League West competition compared to 5-5 with a 4.74 ERA in 12 starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 10 days rest today...is 5-4 with a 4.74 ERA (30 er in 57.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest, 3-6 with a 6.72 ERA (50 er in 67.0 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 7-3 win at Boston on Sept. 13...the A's scored four times in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a Betts RBI ground out...had a 6-1 lead when he allowed a Benintendi RBI double in the third...also allowed a leadoff home run to Bradley in the bottom of the fifth.

COTTON vs. TEXAS: Is 2-1 with a 3.44 ERA (18.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in three career starts, all in Oakland...including 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA (11.1 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 7-0 decision on April

17...allowed a RBI double to Mazaara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0...the win came in an 8-3 victory on Aug. 27...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings...allowed an unearned run in the second inning when Beltre scored on a Lowrie error, but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the second...surrendered a solo home run to Choo in the fifth and left after six innings with a 4-2 lead.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (4-9, 5.38 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-3 with a 5.74 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in six starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with the Sounds...has combined for a 2.81 ERA in innings one through three and has an 8.68 ERA from the fourth inning on...is one of four pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least nine games over his first 16 career appearances (Morgan 13, Mengden 10, Mazzaro 9)...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-8 A's win at Detroit last Tuesday (4.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA in two career starts against the Mariners, both this year at Seattle.

- Has batted clean-up 135 times, which will be fourth most in Oakland history and the most since 1985 when Dave Kingman had 157.
- Has the third lowest batting average in the AL against left-handed pitchers (.183) and the fifth lowest in night games (.213).
