**WINS AND LOSSES:** Texas has lost 3 straight games to drop to 1-4 this season, currently in 5th place in the A.L. West and 3.0 games behind division-leading Houston...Rangers and Reds are the only clubs with a current 3.0-game deficit in their respective divisions...Rangers' A.L.-high 4 losses are tied with the Padres (0-4) for most in MLB...club has opened with a 1-4 record for a 2nd straight year, this after having 2+ wins after 5 games in every season from 2007-16...Rangers did not win its season-opening series for a 4th straight season after going 1-3 vs. HOU (2-2 at OAK in 2015, 1-2 vs. SEA in 2016, 0-3 vs. CLE in 2017)...club had won its 1st series in 4 consecutive campaigns from 2011-14...thru 6 G, Rangers had a 2-4 record in 2017, and have not opened with a 1-5 mark-or-worse since 2006 (1-5)...in fact, a 1-5 start would match the worst 6-G record in franchise history (also 1966, 1985, 1987, 2002, 2006)...going back to '17, TEX has is 3-12 in last 15 G.

**NO LUCK IN ROAD OPENER:** The Rangers dropped a 6th consecutive road opener last night, and have now lost 7 of 8, 13 of 15, and 16 of the last 19 in the first away contest of a campaign...only wins in last 15 tries came in 2012 at MIN and 2010 at CLE.

**VS. OAKLAND:** This 4-game set marks 1st of 6 series between the Rangers and A's in 2018...overall, Rangers have lost 2 straight, 9 of 11, 11 of 16, and 15 of last 25 vs. A's, but have an 18-17 advantage beginning 6/14/16...Texas was 8-11 against Oakland in 2017, Rangers have lost season series vs. A's in 4 of last 6 seasons...Texas leads all-time series 361-353, while A's have 187-170 edge at the Coliseum.

• Last night was the Rangers' 9th consecutive loss at the Coliseum dating back to last season, the club's longest ever at this venue (previous 8 from 6/17/03-4/6/04)...in fact, the 9-game losing skid is T3rd-longest in any single road venue in Rangers history...the only longer streaks were a pair of 0-11 droughts, one across the Bay at AT&T Park from 6/27/98-6/21/09 and the other at Comerica Park vs. Detroit from 9/11/07-5/21/09...the losing skid against the Giants does not include the postseason, as Rangers lost 2010 World Series Games 1 and 2 at that venue for an 0-13 drought before finally landing a win there with Matt Harrison's CG SHO on 6/8/12.

**STILL GOT IT, STILL GOT IT:** Bartolo Colon took a no-decision in his Rangers debut last night, but posted the 1st quality start by a Texas pitcher in 2018...the Rangers are the 11th team with which he has pitched, including the A.L.-record 8th junior circuit club...with his start last night, Colon now has 20 major league seasons, joining teammate Adrián Beltré (21 seasons) as the only active MLB players to have appeared in 20+ seasons...at 44 years, 313 days old for his start last night, he is the oldest to have appeared in MLB this season and the 2nd-oldest player in Rangers history (Nolan Ryan was 46.234 for his final start on 9/22/93 at SEA).

• The last pitcher to open their Rangers career with a start of 6.0+ innings while allowing one-or-zero runs? Jerome Williams on 7/25/14 vs. OAK...Williams earned the win in that outing, but allowed 10 R-ER in 4.0 IP in his next start on 8/1/14 at CLE and was designated for assignment on 8/8/14 after just 2 games/starts w/ Texas.

**SQUARE PAIR:** The Rangers are slated to open 2018 with a pair of 4-game series vs. Houston and at Oakland...it would be the 1st time in Texas history for the club to play back-to-back series of 4+ G to open a season, as there have been just 5 previous occasions of a 4-game set to open a campaign: 1980 at NYY, 1992 at SEA, 2000 vs. CWS, 2002 at OAK, 2015 at OAK.

**SINGLED OUT:** Last night marked just the 3rd time since the start of 2016 for Texas to have 7+ hits all go for singles...the other 2 instances were 9/12/17 vs. SEA and 7/29/17 vs. BAL...previous road instance had been 8/6/13 at LAA.

**ELVIS ON TOUR:** Elvis Andrus went 1-for-5 last night to extend his season-opening hit streak to 5 games, tied with LAA's Andrelton Simmons and a pair of Marlins (Brian Anderson/Starlin Castro) for longest in MLB in 2018...the run matches Rougned Odor (5 G in 2017) for longest season-opening hit streak by a Ranger (beg. Opening Day) since 2014, when Andrus (11 G) and Alex Rios (8 G) both had extended streaks.

Andrus ranks among early A.L. leaders in multi-hit games (T2nd, 3), OBP (4th, .524), hits (T4th, 8), TB (T5th, 13), BA (7th, .444), R (T8th, 4), 2B (T9th, 2), and BB (T9th, 3).

**BELTRÉ NEARS CAREW - AND RICKEY:** Adrián Beltré enters tonight with 3052 career hits, 26th all-time and one shy of tying Rod Carew's 3053 total...Carew, who was born in Panama, is the all-time hits leader for a native of Latin America...Beltré is already the all-time hits leader among players born in the Dominican Republic...with 4 hits in this series, Beltré could also pass Oakland great Rickey Henderson (3055).

• Beltré has 2819 career games, 22nd all-time and one shy of tying Reggie Jackson (2820) for 21st place.

**BELTRÉ AND THE A'S:** Beltré has 38 HR and 133 RBI in his career against the A's, his 2nd-highest totals versus any opponent (45/161 vs. LAA)...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, the 133 RBI rank 4th among opponents (154-G. Brett, 144-R. Palmeiro, 136-A. Rodriguez) and the 38 HR rank T5th (43-R. Palmeiro/A. Rodriguez, 39-D. Evans/M. Ramirez).

**QUICK 50?:** Joey Gallo hit career HR no. 49 on Sun. vs. HOU...next game will be the 204th of his career...while Gallo cannot crack the top 10 all-time in fastest to 50 HR, he has some room to place 11th on that list (see page 8)...it should also be noted that the Cubs' Kyle Schwarber entered the day with 48 career HR in 205 games...the current fastest players in Washington/Texas franchise history to reach 50 career HR are Mark Teixeira (229 games) and Pete Incaviglia (247 games).

• Gallo's 5 hits rank 3rd among Rangers thru 5 G, and he has a team-high 3 RBI after driving in last night's lone Texas run.

**THE BATS:** Texas has scored 6 runs during the current 3-G losing streak and club's 2.40 R/G in 2018 is 4th-lowest in MLB (0.50-SF, 1.50-BAL, 2.25-TB)...before last night (1 R/11 LOB), it had been nearly 3 years since team had scored one-or-zero runs while stranding so many runners (1 R/14 LOB on 5/3/15 vs. OAK) and almost 4 years since previous road instance (1 R/11 LOB on 5/6/14 at COL)...before last night's 1-for-15 w/ RISP, team had not seen one-or-zero hits on 15+ AB with RISP since 7/8/15 vs. ARI (also 1-for-15).

**RUPP TO ROUND ROCK:** The Rangers today announced that the club has signed free agent C Cameron Rupp to a minors deal and assigned him to Round Rock...Rupp was DFA'd by PHI on 3/25 and released on 3/26...had spent past 3 seasons w/ Phillies, batting .217 w/ 14 HR and 34 RBI in 88 G...is a 2007 graduate of Prestonwood Christian Academy in Plano, TX and played three seasons at the University of Texas before being selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2010 MLB draft.

**INJURY UPDATES: OF Delino DeShields** had successful surgery to repair the fractured hamate bone in his left hand on Monday morning...the surgery was performed by Dr. Tom Diliberti in Dallas...the timeline for DeShields' recovery is still estimated at 4-6 weeks...he suffered the injury during his plate appearance in the 7th inning on Fri. vs. HOU...**RHP Tony Barnett** threw 24 pitches/16 strikes in a 1.0-inning appearance in yesterday's Round Rock/Frisco intrasquad contest in Frisco...he is tentatively slated to begin an injury rehab assignment in Thursday's Frisco season opener vs. Tulsa (7:05 pm CT)...**RHP Tim Lincecum** is on the trip and threw a pregame bullpen yesterday...his next step is TBD.

**TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER**

**#35 Cole Hamels, LHP  
(0-1, 4.76)**

**TONIGHT:** The 34-year-old left-hander will be making his 2nd start of the season tonight in the 2nd of 4 games vs. the Athletics in the Bay Area this week...will be working on regular 4-days' rest after suffering his 1st defeat of the season in a 4-1 Opening Day loss to the Astros...whiffed 7 batters after recording 7+ strikeouts in 3 of 24 starts last season...went 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) over 4 starts in 'A' games this spring...has opened with a 9-1 record through 10 decisions in consecutive seasons (2016-17), joining just 3 others pitchers to accomplish that feat in the expansion era (since 1961): Greg Swindell (CLE in 1988-89), Curt Schilling (ARI in 2001-02), and Kevin Brown (LAD in 2003, NYY in 2004) – credit Elias Sports Bureau...despite being slowed by a lengthy disabled list stint in 2017, still posted his 9th career double-digit win total...earned the wins in each of the Rangers' division-clinching games in 2015 and 2016...joined the Rangers in a 7/31/15 trade after 9 1/2 seasons with the Phillies, ranking in the team's top 6 all-time in wins, starts, innings, and strikeouts...signed a six-year contract extension on 7/25/12, taking him through 2018, with a club/vesting option for 2019.

**LAST START:** Suffered his 1st defeat of the season in a 4-1 Opening Day loss to the Astros (5.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER, 4 BB, 7 SO, 2 HR, 94 pitches/54 strikes)...2 of 3 runs allowed came via a pair of solo home runs by George Springer (leadoff) and Jake Marisnick (4th inning)...whiffed 7 batters after recording 7+ strikeouts in 3 of 24 starts last season...was 1st time to record 7+ strikeouts in a start and lose since his 2nd start as a Ranger on 8/7/15 at Seattle (6.0 IP, 7 K in a 4-3 loss).

**VS. OAKLAND:** Has gone 2-3 with a 4.39 ERA (20 ER/41.0 IP) over 7 career starts vs. the Athletics, including 0-2, 11.05 (9 ER/7.1 IP) in a pair of starts last season...had 2 of his 4 shortest outings of '17 vs. the Athletics and his 7 runs allowed in start on 8/26 at the Coliseum matched his season high...also started against Oakland in the season finale, throwing 59 pitches in 3.0 innings...is 2-1, 3.38 (9 ER/24.0 IP) over 4 career starts at the Oakland Coliseum...has delivered a quality start in 3 of the 4 outings.

**ON THE ROAD:** Was 4-4 with a 4.06 ERA (35 ER/77.2 IP) over 12 road starts in 2017...held opponents to a .218/.299/.366/.665 slash line on the road compared to .239/.318/.405/.723 in Arlington...surrendered 11 of 18 home runs on the road...snapped a 3-game road losing streak with a victory in his final road start of 2017, a 4-2 Texas win on 9/21 at SEA (8.0 IP, 1 R)...has gone 8-4 with a 3.42 ERA (38 ER/100.0 IP) over 16 starts on the road vs. A.L. West opponents since joining the Rangers.

**OPENING ACT:** Was tabbed as the starting pitcher for Opening Day on March 16 in Surprise...was Hamels' 4th career Opening Day start, his 2nd with Texas...became the 10th different pitcher to start multiple openers for Texas.

**SPRING TRAINING:** Went 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) over 4 starts in 'A' games this spring...totaled 10 K's in 13.0 IP in 'A' games this spring...last 3 'A' starts: 10.2 IP, 2 R-ER.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Has gone 33-13 (.717) over 69 starts since the 7/31/15 trade to the Rangers, tied for best win pct. in A.L. with BOS/TB's David Price in that span and T4th-best in MLB (min. 25 decisions)...according to STATS LLC, he was one of just 5 pitchers since 1913 to win at least 19 of his 1st 22 decisions with a single club, joining Vida Blue as only pitchers to do it for an A.L. club...won a career-high 12 consecutive decisions from 8/23/15-5/22/16 before loss on 5/27/16 vs. PIT...it matched the longest win streak by a starter in Rangers history (Bobby Witt - 12 G in 1990) and was the longest by a left-hander...enters 2018 with 147 career wins. • After his win on 8/21 at LAA, had a 31-7 (.816) record in his 1st 60 career starts w/ TEX, 2nd pitcher in MLB history with .800+ win pct. in 1st 60 starts with a team (credit Elias)...the other: Jim McCormick, 47-10 (.825) with the Cubs in 1885-1886 (credit Elias).

**STRIKEOUTS:** Is one of 8 major league pitchers to record at least 5 seasons of 200+ strikeouts over the last 7 years (2010-2017)...in 2017, posted worst SO/9 (6.39), SO/BB (1.98), and swing-and-miss pct. (21.6) of his career...finished season on uptick, however, averaging 8.92 SO/9 in final 7 starts beg. 9/1 after a 5.50 SO/9 average through his 1st 17 starts...his 200 K's in 2016 ranked 7th in the A.L...whiffed Leonys Martin in the 3rd inning 6/12/16 at SEA for his 2000th career strikeout...reached 2000 K's in his 320th career game, joining a short list of pitchers in the last 100 years to reach the milestone in so few games...the other 9 to do it so quickly in that span (chronological order): Sam McDowell (game no. 309 in 1971), Tom Seaver (305 in '75), Nolan Ryan (287 in '76), Roger Clemens (294 in '93), Randy Johnson (262 in '97), Pedro Martinez (300 in '02), Felix Hernandez

(310 in '15), Clayton Kershaw (277 in '17), and Max Scherzer (287 in '17)...has fanned at least 10 batters in a game 34 times, with last instance on 8/19/16 at TB (10)...fanned a career high 15 on 4/21/07 at CIN...his career strikeouts/walks ratio is 3.45, 6th best among active pitchers (1500.0+ IP)...recorded his 1,000th career SO, 6/19/11 at SEA.

**ALL I NEED IS THREE:** Since Hamels took a 4-3 loss on 8/7/15 at SEA in his 2nd start as a Ranger, he has gone 31-2 over his last 51 starts when receiving 3+ runs of support...of his 362 career starts has received 3 runs of support or more in 209 of them, going 132-18 (.880) in those games.
