### THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

**June 17**

**(1993) Chili Davis** pitched two innings (1 HB) vs. Texas, the last position player to pitch for the Halos.

**June 18**

**(1986)** Hall of Famer **Don Sutton** recorded his 300th career win, defeating Texas (5-1; 9 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 3 SO), becoming the 19th pitcher in major league history to reach the plateau; **(2007) Chone Figgins** became the first player in MLB to go 6-for-6 with a walk-off hit since **Jim Northrup** with the Tigers on August 18, 1969 (2-run HR in 13th)...His six hits tied an AL record for a 9-inning game and club record set by **Garret Anderson** who went six for seven in a 15-inning game at Texas on Sept. 27, 1996.

**LEADING OFF: HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!...** Today the Angels play the final contest of a nine-game (3-5) road trip to **Minnesota** (June 8-10; 2-1), **Seattle** (June 11-13; 0-3) and **Oakland** (June 15-17; 1-1)... **Angels have dropped five of last six games to fall a season-high 8.5 games back of pace in A.L. West...** Angels are 25-30 since a club-record 13-3 start...**LAA is 12-8-2 in 22 series (7-3-1 in 11 road series)...** Since a 14-4 mark thru first 18 road games, **Halos are 7-11 in last 17 away affairs...** Halos are **8-6 overall this month...** Following this series, LAA hosts **Arizona** (June 18-19) & **Toronto** (June 21-24).

**FISH ON FIRE: Mike Trout** is 11-for-17 (.647) with seven runs, a double, four home runs & seven RBI over his last five games... Has raised season clip from .299 to .323 in span.

**SHELVED:** Angels currently have 14 players on the disabled list – most in MLB...**Before A. Simmons was activated yesterday, Halos had 15 players simultaneously on D.L. for first time in club history...** Last MLB team with 15 on D.L. at same time was **Oakland** in 2016 (*STATS D.L. data spans to 1987*)...**46 players** have appeared for the Angels this season, most in MLB.

**MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout (6.3 WAR in '18) is on pace for a 14.4 WAR season – would be the best single season in MLB history passing Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...** Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **Jose Ramirez (CLE)** at 4.7... **Trout leads MLB w/ 23 HRs (on pace for 52 HRs)...** Also leads **MLB with 172 total bases, 42 extra-base hits, 59 runs, 58 walks and a .450 OBP.**

**FLETCH LIVES! David Fletcher** collected his first MLB hit Wednesday - a two-run triple...**Just second Angel to record a triple for his first big league hit in MLB debut (also Thad Bosley in 1977 vs. KC)...** Fletcher is the fifth LAA player with three hits in his MLB debut, joining **C.J. Cron (2014), Kendrys Morales (2006), Lee Stevens (1990) and Gil Flores (1977)...** In 58 Triple-A games this season, **Fletcher** was batting .350 (89/254) with 55 runs, 25 doubles, five triples, six HRs and 35 RBI...**Was leading Pacific Coast League in hits, runs, doubles, extra-base hits and ranked third in average.**

**SOMETHING FISHY: Mike Trout** is the first player in Angels' history with 20+ HRs in seven straight seasons...**Joins Alex Rodriguez and Mickey Mantle as only A.L. players to amass seven seasons of 20+ HRs prior to their age-27 season.**

**OHTANI TO D.L.** On June 8th, **Shohei Ohtani** was placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a Grade 2 sprain of the UCL...Underwent a PRP and stem cell injection last Thursday with **Dr. Steve Yoon** in LA & will be re-evaluated in three weeks...**His 61 Ks are a club record through first nine career starts & lead A.L. rookies.**

**FROM THE START:** Halo starters have allowed three runs-or-less in 36 of last 43 games...**LAA starters have fashioned a 2.90 ERA (242.1 IP – 78 ER) since May 1, tops in MLB in span.**

**GLOVE STORY:** LAA has gone errorless in 48 of 71 contests on season...**Club has 29 errors thru 71 games (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct...** Halo outfielders are tied for MLB lead with 15 OF assists.

**WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 36 of 71 games and 20 of last 35 contests...** LAA has just seven 10+ hit efforts in last 33 games...**Angels hitting .234 (81/346) with RISP since May 1 (43 G).**

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 33 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through first 71 games (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 642 Ks)...**Halos have issued 251 free passes, second-most in A.L...** Angels' bullpen has tossed 262.1 IP to rank second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...**14 blown saves are second-most in MLB.**

**HOT HALOS: Tyler Skaggs** is 3-0 with a 0.45 ERA (20 IP – 1 ER) in his three starts this month...Has fashioned a 2.41 ERA (59.2 IP – 16 ER) over his last 10 starts...**Mike Trout** has four HRs in last six games (back to back multi-HR games June 11-12)...He is batting .375 (36/96) with 25 runs scored, eight doubles, one triple, 11 home runs and 21 RBI over his last 27 games...**Justin Upton** has opened June 15-for-45 (.333) with four home runs and six RBI (4 HR his last 11 G)...**Martin Maldonado** has hits in 16 of last 20 games...12 RBI his last 20 games...Has .298 (34/114) average with eight doubles and three HRs since May 1...Over his last 17 contests, **Ian Kinsler** is batting .300 (21/70) with 15 runs, five doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI.

**ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols** has 3,032 career hits – good for 27th all-time...**Rod Carew** is next on the hit list at 3,053...**Pujols** collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just fourth player to log 600 HRs and 3,000 hits (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**)...Ranks seventh all-time in RBI with 1,955; *source Baseball-Reference.com*...**Lou Gehrig** is sixth all-time with 1,995...**Pujols** sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632).

**@ OAKLAND:** Angels are 11-4 in last 15 games vs. Oakland (6-3 in last 9 G in Oakland)...**Halos lead 2018 series 6-3 and are 18-10 since 2017 vs. A's...** March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between these clubs...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...**Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .327 (119/364) with 25 HR & 62 RBI in 95 games vs. Oakland.**

**D-BACKS ON DECK:** 2018 marks ninth all-time meeting... Clubs split last season series (2-2 in 2015)...Halos are 9-5 all-time in Phoenix, 5-6 at Angel Stadium (14-11 all-time)...**LAA has scored 68 runs (6.8 per) on 97 hits (9.7 per) in last 10 games at Chase Field (LAA is 7-3 in span)...** D-Backs skipper **Torey Lovullo** had his best professional season with the Angels in 1993.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY**

**3-5, 3.68 ERA**

*First start at the Oakland Coliseum since Sept. 2, 2015*

- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 12<sup>th</sup> start of the season and sixth on the road...First start of 2018 vs. Oakland...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Monday at Seattle after tossing 3+ innings and allowing five earned runs on seven hits with one walk and two strikeouts; marked shortest start of season and matched season-high with three home runs allowed.
- **BIRTHDAY SHUTOUT:** Tossed a one-hit shutout on June 5 (his 27<sup>th</sup> birthday) vs. Kansas City...Marked first complete game and shutout of career...First shutout by an Angel since Ricky Nolasco on July 1, 2017 vs. Seattle...It was the first CG one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...Became first Major Leaguer to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.
- **MONTH OF JUNE:** In his last four starts in month of June, is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (25 IP – 7 ER).
- **RECENT QUALITY:** Has been charged with two-or-fewer earned runs in seven of last nine starts, while pitching to a 2.65 ERA (54.1 IP – 16 ER) in that span...His 2.65 ERA since April 27, ranks as seventh best in the A.L....Had streak of five consecutive quality starts snapped on May 31 at Detroit.
- **FIRST PITCH SWINGING:** Opponents have swung at the first pitch 35.4% of the time vs. Heaney, which is the highest rate in the American League (min. 50 IP) and tied for second highest in the Majors (**Max Scherzer** – 36.6%)
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has allowed seven home runs this season (three came on April 20 vs. SF & three came on June 11 @ SEA)...Rate of 0.99 HR/9 innings ranks seventh in the A.L. (min. 50 IP) among left-handers...Eight starts of 5+ innings and zero HR allowed this season are tied for the American League lead among lefties.
- **HOT AT HOME:** In last five starts at Angel Stadium, is 3-1 with a 0.79 ERA (34 IP – 3 ER) and 32 strikeouts...His home ERA leads the American League in that span (since April 27).
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In three career starts against the Athletics, is 2-1 with a 3.79 ERA (19 IP – 8 ER) and 20 strikeouts...Earned win in last start vs. A's Aug. 28, 2017 at Angel Stadium after tossing six innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with three walks and a career-high 10 strikeouts; Only run allowed was solo HR by **Dustin Garneau**...In two starts vs. Oakland since joining Angels, is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13 IP – 4 ER).
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Today marks second career appearance at the Coliseum; is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (7 IP - 3 ER)...Earned the win in only previous appearance of career at the Oakland Coliseum on Sept. 2, 2015 after tossing seven innings and allowing three earned runs on seven hits with no walks and six strikeouts.
- **9 K's IN 5 IP:** On April 27 vs. New York (A.L), became first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **STARTING NINE:** With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP:** Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.
