### BEFORE WE GO

- The Colorado Rockies conclude their five-game Interleague homestand tonight with the final game of a three-game series against the Oakland Athletics, the final home Interleague series of the 2018 season.
- Won 4-1 last night to claim the series victory ... Antonio Senzatela allowed one run over 5.2 innings and Nolan Arenado hit his Major League-leading 27th home run of the season ... Seunghwan Oh made his Rockies debut and pitched a scoreless inning of relief.

### YOU CAN'T SEE ME

- Held the Athletics to one run for the second straight game, and have now held opponents to one run or fewer in six games at home this month, two runs or fewer in nine ... the six games in which they held opponents to one or fewer runs this month is a franchise record for a calendar month (previous: five in July of 2006) ... have a 2.44 ERA (118.0 IP, 32 ER) at home this month, including a 1.65 ERA (82.0 IP, 15 ER) for the starting rotation.

### KNOCK YOU DOWN A PEG

- Split a two-game series against the Houston Astros to begin the homestand ... with last night's win, have now gone eight consecutive series without a series loss (last series loss: June 26-28 at San Francisco, 1-2) ... that is their second-longest streak in franchise history without losing a series (longest: nine, April 30-May 28, 2017) ... prior to the split with Houston, had won six consecutive series against teams at .500 or above, their longest series winning streak since 2014 and the first time in franchise history that they won six consecutive series against teams at or above .500.

### TIGHT SEAMS

- The Rockies are 22-9 since June 19, a .710 winning percentage that is the best in the NL and the third-best in MLB (Oakland's .735 winning percentage is best) ... have won 18 of their last 23 games since June 28.
- Of the 20 series remaining in the Rockies season, 16 are against teams currently at or above .500, including each of the next eight series.

### A LITTLE MORE THAN A FLASH

- Since June 19, the Rockies have posted a 3.53 team ERA (275.1 IP, 108 ER), the second-lowest ERA in the NL and MLB over that span.

- Rockies starters have a 3.43 ERA (183.2 IP, 70 ER) over that span, second-lowest in the NL ... have surrendered only 14 home runs since June 19, the fewest in the NL.

### IT'S WHAT WE DO

- Since June 19, the Rockies rank first in the NL and second in MLB with a .280 team batting average and tied for second in the NL (fourth in MLB) with 49 home runs ... rank second in the NL and fifth in MLB with 5.48 runs per game over that span.

### HOME IMPROVEMENT

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended on June 18 the Rockies have gone 15-4 at Coors Field.
- Over that 18-game span, have outscored opponents 115-71 ... have posted a 3.35 team ERA over that span, a 3.05 ERA by the starters and a 3.95 ERA by the bullpen.
- Have averaged 6.1 runs per game while batting .305.

### SENIORITY

- Colorado is 10-5 in Interleague play this season, including 7-2 at Coors Field ... the seven home wins against the AL ties the franchise record for home Interleague wins in a single season (also: 2004, 2006).
- Colorado is 159-194 all-time in Interleague play ... the Rockies are 100-81 at home, 59-113 on the road ... Colorado is 13-11 the past 24 road games vs. the AL, including 3-3 this year.

### BOMEL'S BANDITS

- The Rockies are playing the Athletics for the first time since 2015 (2-1 series loss in Oakland), their first time at Coors Field since June 12-14, 2012 (3-0 Oakland sweep).
- Carlos González made his Major League debut with Oakland on May 30, 2008 and played 85 games with them prior to his November 10 trade to Colorado (along with Greg Smith and Huston Street) in exchange for Matt Holliday.
- Brett Anderson was acquired by Colorado from Oakland on Dec. 10, 2013 in exchange for Chris Jensen and Drew Pomeranz ... made eight starts for the Rockies in 2013, going 1-3 with a 2.91 ERA (43.1 IP, 14 ER) prior to becoming a free agent on Nov. 1.
- Jonathan Lucroy was acquired by the Rockies from the Texas Rangers on July 30 of last season for a player to be named later (Pedro Gonzalez) ... he batted .310 (44-for-142) in 46 games for Colorado prior to signing with Oakland as a free agent on March 12 of this year.
- Matt Chapman (class of 2011) was teammates with Nolan Arenado (class of 2009) at El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

### EARLY ACTION

- Colorado leads the Majors in runs scored in the first inning (82) and also leads MLB in runs allowed in the first (89).
- Have hit a Major League-leading 30 home runs in the first inning, while their 25 home runs allowed are the second-most in MLB ... Nolan Arenado's 11 first-inning home runs and 28 RBI lead MLB.

### GO JOE

- Trevor Story is batting .352 (56-for-159) in 40 games since June 8, the highest batting average in the Major Leagues over that span ... has hit .403 (27-for-67) on the road over that span, which also leads MLB.
- Had his career-best 13-game hitting streak snapped last Tuesday, the longest streak by a Rockies player this season.

### PLATINUM POWER

- Nolan Arenado leads the NL with 27 home runs and a .599 slugging percentage and ranks third with 75 RBI ... also ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.393) and seventh in batting average (.309).

### ENERGIZER

- Ian Desmond has recorded a hit in 13-straight games, the longest active streak in MLB and tied for the second-longest streak of his career (longest: 15 games in 2013) ... is tied with Trevor Story for the longest hitting streak by a Rockies player this season.
- In 47 games since June 1, is batting .295 (49-for-166) with a .378 on-base percentage and a .548 slugging percentage.

### ABSOLUTELY SOMETHING

- Kyle Freeland (5.0) and Tyler Anderson (4.1) rank fourth and fifth, respectively, among NL pitchers in Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball Reference*).

**MAKE YOUR MARQUE**

- 23-year-old right-hander was a member of his second career Opening Day roster in 2018 ... broke camp with the 2017 club as a reliever.
- Made his Major League debut on Sept. 8, 2016 at San Diego, pitching an inning of relief.
- Acquired from Tampa Bay on Jan. 28, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Jake McGee in exchange for outfielder Corey Dickerson and infielder Kevin Padlo.
- Pronounced *HAIR-mahn MAR-keh-z*

**FOR THE FIRST TIME**

- Will make his first career start against Oakland, his second Interleague start of the season.
- Is 3-0 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP, 10 ER) in six career Interleague starts ... in two career Interleague starts at Coors Field, has gone 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA (13.1 IP, 6 ER).

**HOME AND AWAY**

- Has a 7.31 home ERA (48.0 IP, 39 ER) compared to a 3.15 road mark (60.0 IP, 21 ER) ... 10 home runs allowed in Denver, seven on the road.

**ROAD WARRIOR**

- His 3.15 road ERA (60.0 IP, 25 ER) ranks ninth in the NL ... is tied for seventh in the NL with five road wins.
- Rockies have won seven of his 10 road starts this year ... has made six of his seven quality starts on the road with a .214 opponents' batting average against (48-for-224) ... worked five or more innings in every road game, including six or more frames seven times.
- In 27 career starts on the road, is 10-8 with a 4.01 ERA (146.0 IP, 65 ER) ... made two road relief appearances in 2016 and allowed three runs in 4.1 innings pitched (6.23 ERA).

**COORS HEAVY**

- Is 3-5 with a 7.31 ERA (48.0 IP, 39 ER), 23 walks and 50 strikeouts in 10 starts at home this season.
- In 26 career appearances, 25 starts, at Coors Field, is 10-8 with a 5.32 ERA (140.1 IP, 83 ER) ... Rockies are 14-11 when he starts at home.
- Is 3-6 with a 6.90 ERA (60.0 IP, 46 ER) in his past 12 starts at home since Sept. 3, 2017 with the Rockies 4-8.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST**

- Allowed 24 of his 60 runs in the first inning (second-most are 10 in the third and fifth) ... given up a run in the first inning in 13 of his 20 starts, including eight of his 10 home starts ... opponents are batting .363 (33-for-91) with six of his 17 home runs allowed in the first.

**SILVER SLUGGER**

- His .361 (13-for-36) batting average leads all Major League pitchers ... leads the Majors with 13 hits and a .444 slugging percentage.
- Is 7-for-13 (.538) over his past five games with three multi-hit games ... has a season-high tying three-game hit streak (also: April 11-22).

**LIKE CHRISTMAS IN JULY**

- In eight career starts in July, is 6-0 with a 3.75 ERA (50.1 IP, 21 ER) ... made five starts in July 2017 and went 4-0 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP, 13 ER).

**DEEP SIX**

- Allowed six or fewer hits 13 times this year, including eight times on the road.

**A DENVER OPENER**

- Started the Rockies home opener on April 6 and walked a career-high six batters en route to an 8-3 loss vs. the Braves at Coors Field ... allowed four runs in the first inning and charged with three in the fifth, working 4.2 frames ... game was delayed one hour due to inclement weather and eventually began at 27 degrees, the second-coldest start temperature in club history.

**A YEAR TO REMEMBER**

- Named to the *Topps* All-Star Rookie Team, the second pitcher in franchise history to earn that honor (Jason Jennings, 2002).
- Made 29 starts in his rookie season in 2017 and went 11-7 with a 4.39 ERA (162.0 IP, 79 ER), 49 walks and 147 strikeouts.
- Led all Major League rookies in strikeouts and quality starts (14) and finished tied with Kyle Freeland in wins ... finished second in innings pitched (162.0) and tied for first in games started (29).
- Recorded six consecutive quality starts from July 7-Aug. 8, the longest streak by a Rockies rookie in franchise history.
- Per Elias, became the first rookie in Rockies history to record at least nine strikeouts in each of three consecutive games in a single season, July 17-29 (9 SO, 9 SO, 10 SO).

**TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP TYLER ANDERSON (6-3, 3.57)**

The 28-year-old right-hander will make his 22nd start of the season, 11th on the road ... his first road start since June 29, his last four starts have come at Coors Field ... did not factor in the Rockies 8-2 loss to the Houston Astros his last time on out July 24 ... pitched 7.1 innings, allowing two runs (one earned) on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts ... will be making his second career start against St. Louis, his first since 2016 ... it will be his first career start at Busch Stadium ... took the loss on Sept. 9, 2016 after allowing five runs (two earned) on eight hits with no walks and seven strikeouts across seven innings of work ... is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA (54.1 IP, 21 ER) on the road this season ... in 26 career appearances, 25 starts on the road is 7-7 with a 4.46 ERA (135.1 IP, 67 ER).
