

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP FELIX PEÑA

1-3, 4.97 ERA

Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in six of eight starts this season

- **IN THE ROTATION:** Making 11th appearance (ninth start) of the season for Angels; eight game (sixth start of 2018 at home...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **HOME vs. ROAD:** In his three road starts this season, is 1-1 with a 1.84 ERA (14.2 IP – 3 ER); has pitched to a 6.94 ERA (23.1 IP – 18 ER) at Angel Stadium this year.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Carried no hitter into 6th inning of last start on Saturday at Cleveland but was charged with loss after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with three walks and one strikeout; no-hit bid broken up on solo HR by **Leonys Martin** leading off 6th.
- **WIN ANNIVERSARY:** Earned first win as a starter on June 29 at Baltimore after working 5.1 scoreless innings...His only other Major League win came exactly one year earlier on June 29, 2017 in relief for Cubs at Washington.
- **AS A STARTER:** In first six starts after joining Angels rotation, pitched to a 2.73 ERA (29.2 IP – 9 ER) and allowed three-or-fewer runs in all six outings, before yielding seven runs in the 1st inning of start on July 29 vs. Seattle.
- **RUN SUPPORT:** Angels have scored just two total runs of support (while he is in the game) across his last five starts...Is averaging 1.5 runs of support per start this season, with six of his 12 total runs of support coming on June 29 at Baltimore.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** Only previous game vs. A's was relief appearance in Angels debut on April 8 (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Only run allowed was solo HR by **Matt Joyce**.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In seven games (five starts) at Angel Stadium, is 0-2 with a 6.94 ERA (23.1 IP – 18 ER)...In his five starts, is 0-2 with a 6.53 ERA (20.2 IP – 15 ER)...Allowed career-high seven runs in last home start on July 29.
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Finished the first with a 1-0 record and 3.42 ERA (26.1 IP – 10 ER) in seven games (five starts) for Angels.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP – 13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- **PREVIOUS HALOS STINTS:** Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- **DOMINICAN NATIVE:** Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since **Ervin Santana** in 2012; the other three are **Bartolo Colon**, **Ramon Ortiz** and **Hector Carrasco**.
- **STARTER #11:** With his first start on June 19, became 11th different starting pitcher for Angels this season...LAA has now used 12 different starters, which is tied for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 15).
- **MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.

AGE: 29

- Worked one scoreless inning Tuesday night in first appearance of homestand.

AGE: 26

- Made Major League debut Tuesday night and pitched two scoreless innings.
