AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 0-1 on their nine-game, 10-day road trip...continue their three-game set at Oakland tonight...will play 3G at Seattle (Fri.-Sun.) and 3G at Minnesota (9/10-12)...went 3-4 on their recent seven-game homestand.

- ▶ Have lost two straight, but are 11-6 in their last 17G and 18-10 in 28G since 8/6...are 77-43 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 86-52 (.623), have the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (95-44, .683)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held the Majors' two best records for 26 consecutive days (since the end of play on 8/9), and held at least a share of the two best records for 110 of the last 124 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 34G over .500, 2G below their season-high watermark...have been 36G over .500 three times this season (last: 86-50 at the end of play on Saturday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10.
- ▶ Are 8.5G behind Boston in the AL East...lead Oakland by 3.5G for the first AL Wild Card spot.
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road (are 0-1 so far).
- ▶ Have lost only 8-of-41 series since 4/19 (25-8-8).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (53-9, .855).
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-best mark when scoring first (60-12, .833), behind Boston (64-11, .853).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost the opener of their nine-game road trip on Monday, a 6-3 defeat at Oakland...**LHP CC Sabathia** (3.1IP, 7H, 5R/4ER, 2BB, 4K) started and took his first loss since the beginning of 2017 when making a start following a team loss...**1B Luke Voit** (1-for-4) hit a two-run HR in the second inning...**RF Andrew McCutchen** (1-for-4, 1R, 1SB) recorded his first hit as a Yankee with a single to lead off the game...**SS Adeiny Hechavarria** (1-for-2) also got his first hit as a Yankee...**3B Miguel Andujar** (0-for-3, 1BB) extended his on-base streak to 17G...**RHP Jonathan Loaisiga** tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in relief (1H, 4K).

PLAY LIKE A CHAMPION TODAY: The Yankees (.623) and Oakland (.597) have two of the four best records in the Majors despite both clubs being in second place.

- ▶ The Yankees' .623 winning percentage would be the third-highest in the Division Era (since 1969) by a team that did not win its division, behind only the 1993 San Francisco Giants (103-59, .636) and the 2001 Oakland A's (102-60, .630)...since 2005, the only team to post a winning percentage of at least .600 and not win its division was the 2015 Pittsburgh Pirates (98-64, .605).

JUST DÚ IT: 3B Miguel Andujar was named **AL "Rookie of the Month" for August** today, after batting .320 (39-for-122) with 21R, 7 doubles, 10HR, 29RBI, 4BB and 1SB in 30 games...tied for the AL lead in HRs (with Oakland's Kris Davis), tied for the MLB lead in RBI (with Texas' Rougned Odor), tied for second in the Majors in hits...also won the award in June 2018.

- ▶ Yankees rookies have won eight of the last 13 AL "Rookie of the Month" Awards (Judge-4, Andujar-2, Torres, Sánchez).
- ▶ Marked the fifth time in Yankees history that a rookie hit at least 10HR in a calendar month, following Aaron Judge (15HR in Sept. 2017, 10HR in April 2017, 10HR in June 2017) and Gary Sánchez (11HR in August 2016)...was tied for the third-highest RBI total by a Yankees rookie in a month, joining Bob Meusel (42RBI in July 1920), Judge (32RBI in Sept. 2017), Hideki Matsui (29RBI in June 2003), Bill Johnson (29RBI in July 1943) and Joe DiMaggio (29RBI in June 1936).
- ▶ Was the second rookie in Yankees history to hit .320-or-better with at least 10HR in a month (Judge, June 2017).
- ▶ Has reached base safely in a career-high 17 consecutive games (since 8/17), batting .333/.373/.565 (23-for-69) with 14R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 17RBI and 5BB over that span.
- ▶ Leads Major League rookies in hits (146), doubles (38), RBI (76), SLG (.527) and is tied for the lead in HRs (23)...ranks fourth among Yankees all-time rookie leaders in doubles and HRs and is third with 63XBH...needs 4H to become the 15th Yankees rookie with 150H in a season.
- ▶ In 43G since the All-Star break, is batting .337 (57-for-169) with 32R, 11 doubles, 11HR and 37RBI...in that span, is tied for third in the Majors in hits.

GLEYSER DAY WEEKEND: INF Gleyber Torres was named **AL "Player of the Week" for 8/27-9/2** after hitting safely in all 7G while batting .478/.571/.870 (11-for-23) with 3R, 3HR, 10RBI, 5BB and 1SB...marked his first career weekly award...had 2RBI in 5-of-7 games, including four straight from 8/30-9/2 that was tied for the longest multi-RBI streak by a Yankee this season (also Romine and Gregorius) and tied for the seventh-longest such streak in Yankees history.

- ▶ Has multiple hits in 3-of-6 and 8-of-16...is batting .386/.478/.596 (22-for-57) with 9R, 4HR, 13RBI, 10BB and 2SB in his last 16G (since 8/18).
- ▶ Has 22HR this season, third-most among MLB rookies and fifth-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season.

SUMMER BREAK: Starting with Monday's loss at Oakland, the Yankees play 16 of their final 25 games against teams above .500 (are 0-1 so far)...included in this stretch are 13-of-16 road games against teams with winning records (0-1).

- ▶ From 7/26-9/2, the Yankees played 30-of-37 games against teams currently under .500, going 22-15, with a 21-9 mark vs. teams under .500 and 1-6 mark vs. teams at .500-or-better...**rank fourth in the Majors this season with a 53-26 (.671) record vs. teams under .500.**

STOPPING THE STOPPER: LHP CC Sabathia took the loss on Mon. at Oakland (3.1IP, 7H, 5R/4ER, 2BB, 4K)...marked his first loss when starting after a Yankees loss since the beginning of 2017 (had been 12-0 in 22 starts).

PITCH IN: LHP CC Sabathia today was named **the Yankees' nominee for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award**.

- ▶ Through his PitCch In Foundation, he and his wife, Amber, have hosted a number of events and made sizable donations on an annual basis since establishing the foundation in 2009.
- ▶ On Thursday, CC and Amber will host a backpack giveaway, pep rally and career panel at their alma mater, Vallejo High School, in Vallejo, Calif....among the career panelists will be the Sabathias, hip hop artists E-40 and Mistah F.A.B., and executives from Haddad Brands and Kaiser Permanente.
- ▶ The league-wide winner of the Roberto Clemente Award, who will be announced during the 2018 World Series, is selected from the group of 30 nominees via a blue-ribbon panel that includes individuals connected to the game.
- ▶ No Yankee has won the award since Derek Jeter in 2009...**OF Andrew McCutchen** is the only current Yankee who has won the award (2015 with Pittsburgh).

SAINT 'LOUIS': 1B Luke Voit has homered in each of his last 2G...has homered in three of his last 5G and 5-of-11 since 8/24 (6HR).

- ▶ Since making his Yankees debut on 8/2, is batting .327/.393/.655 (18-for-55) with 11R, 6HR, 14RBI and 6BB.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 225HR...is the eighth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 264HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).

- ▶ Have hit 23HR in the last 12G and 50HR in the last 28G (since 8/6).

HAPP-Y DAYS: LHP J.A. Happ is 5-0 with a 3.38 ERA (34.2IP, 30H, 13ER, 8BB, 35K, 7HR, 4HP) in six starts as a Yankee.

- ▶ Was the first Yankees pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee (according to *Elias*).
- ▶ Is tied for sixth in the Majors with 15 wins, but has made just nine of his 26 starts on the road, going 5-2 with a 2.65 ERA (51.0IP, 15ER).
- ▶ Has a career-high 163K this season, surpassing his previous high of 163K in 2016 with Toronto.

BEST OF THE WEST: The Yankees are a Major League-best 19-8 (.704) vs. the AL West this season...are 7-4 in 11 road games vs. AL West clubs this season, matching their win total from 2017 (7-10).

- ▶ This series is the third in a stretch of five straight vs. AL Central and AL West opponents...will finish the season with five consecutive series vs. AL East teams.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 4, 1993: Jim Abbott becomes just the third Yankees left-hander to throw a no-hitter, beating the Indians 4-0 at Yankee Stadium. It marked only the fourth no-hitter in Yankee Stadium history and was the club's seventh overall.

Sept. 4, 1923: "Sad" Sam Jones throws the second no-hitter in franchise history during a 2-0 win at the Philadelphia Athletics' Shibe Park (9.0IP, 1BB, 0K).

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 5, 2007: Bob Sheppard works his final game as Yankees PA announcer, a 10-2 win over Seattle. Alex Rodriguez hits 2HR in an eight-run seventh inning, marking the first two-homer inning by a Yankee since Cliff Johnson on 6/30/77 at Toronto.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 2-2 through four of six games vs. the Athletics in 2018...are 2-6 in the last 8G vs. the A's...are 16-28 in their last 44 meetings...had gone 30-7 in the previous 37 matchups prior to that stretch...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have won just one of the last five season series with the A's (4-3 in 2016)...are 5-4-1 vs. Oakland over the last 10 season series (since 2008)...**AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Are 0-1 at Oakland Coliseum this year...are 6-17 there since 7/19/12, after going 13-1 from 8/18/09-5/27/12...went 0-4 at Oakland Coliseum in 2017...in 2016, snapped a four-series losing streak at the Coliseum, their longest since dropping 12 series in a row from 8/26/85-5/1/91...are 127-137 all-time at Oakland...**IN POSTSEASON:** The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0).

LHP J.A. Happ will make his seventh start as a Yankee and 27th start of the season tonight at Oakland...the 35-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...did not record a decision in the Yankees' 8-7 loss vs. Detroit on Thursday (4.1IP, 10H, 5ER, 0BB, 3K, 3HR, 1WP)...is 5-0 with a 3.38 ERA (34.2IP, 30H, 13ER, 8BB, 35K, 7HR, 4HP, 2WP) in six starts with the Yankees...was the first Yankee pitcher since Bob Turley in 1955 to *both start and win each of his first five appearances as a Yankee* according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*...missed nine team games on 10-day D.L. from 8/2 (retro to 7/30)-8/9 with hand, foot and mouth disease...is tied for sixth in the Majors with 15 wins, the second-highest total of his career (20-4 in 2016)...has recorded at least 8K in four of his last seven starts...was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for INF Brandon Drury and OF Billy McKinney on 7/26/18...his first name is pronounced "JAY"...according to STATS, LLC, is the fourth pitcher to make starts for both the Yankees and Blue Jays in the same season, and the first since David Cone in 1995...finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4 with Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in the Majors...is one of six pitchers to record double digit wins in each of the past five seasons...the Yankees are his sixth Major League team, also the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015) and Pirates (2015)...was originally selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern (Ill.) University.

LAST START: Made his sixth start as a Yankee and did not record a decision in Thursday's loss vs. Detroit (4.1IP, 10H, 5ER, 0BB, 3K, 3HR, 1WP)...marked his shortest start and most runs allowed in six starts since joining the Yankees on 7/26...tied a career high in home runs (eighth time, first since 7/9/17 vs. Houston)...was his first start as a Yankee without a win, but remains undefeated in his last seven starts...established a new season high with 165K...surpassed 1,500.0 career innings pitched.
