OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-25) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (18-25)

SATURDAY, MAY 18, 2019 — COMERICA PARK — 4:10 P.M. EDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (0-1, 6.75) VS. LHP MATTHEW BOYD (4-3, 3.15) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight games after dropping three in a row... are 6-4 over the last 10 games...are 21-25 overall...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...that is ½ game short of the season high of 10 on May 15...have been in last or tied for last every day dating back to April 30...have spent two days in second this year, 11 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, six days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth...are 11-17 (.393) since the rain out in Texas on April 13 after starting the year 10-8 (.556).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 4-1 vs. the AL Central teams and are scheduled to play each of their next five games against the Central...travel to Cleveland for a three-game series following this four-game set with Detroit...are now 56-20 (.737) against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.

STARTING THINGS UP: Oakland's starters have posted a 3.05 ERA (34 ER, 100.1 IP) with 86 strikeouts in the last 17 games since April 28...they tossed 6.0+ innings in 10 of those 17 games, including back-to-back games the last two days (8.0 & 8.2)...have allowed two runs or less in 10 of those 17 starts...the 3.05 ERA in that stretch is the 2nd-lowest in the AL behind MInnesota (2.75).

UNRULY VISITORS: Oakland has hit 37 home runs on the road, the 4th-most in the American League and tied for fifth in the Majors...have hit 12 home runs during the first four games of this road trip, including a season-high tying five homers on Monday in Seattle and Thursday in Detroit...Khris Davis leads the club with seven road homers, while Josh Phegley has five.

SOUTHPAW SLUGGERS: Oakland is hitting .263 (107x407) with 21 doubles, 24 home runs, 59 RBI and an .826 OPS against left-handed pitchers this season...the 24 homers are lefties are the most in the Majors...the .826 OPS is the 3rd-best in the American League (4th in Majors)...Stephen Piscotty is leading the club against lefties, hitting .370 (17x46) with 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.064 OPS this season against left-handers

COMING HOME ON THE ROAD: The A's are batting .253 (203-for-801) and are averaging 5.82 runs per game on the road (128 runs in 22 games) compared to .227 and 3.75 runs per game at home...are averaging the third most runs per game on the road in the AL and fourth most int he Majors behind Chicago-NL (6.57), Minnesota (6.29) and Seattle (5.88).

LEFT AND RIGHT COMPARISON: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the final three games of this series after facing just two lefties over the previous 20 games...when an opponent starts a lefty, are 9-5 (.643) for the season, which is the third best record in the American League...are 12-20 (.375) against right-handers, which is tied for second worst (Toronto, 10-21)...the 14 games against lefties are tied for second most...are batting .263 with an .826 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .232 with a .693 OPS against right-handers.

FOUR-GAME SERIES: This series with Detroit is the A's fourth four-game series of the season...have won three of four in each of the previous three fourgame series (Los Angeles, March 28-31; Boston, April 1-4; Baltimore, April 8-11)...are 8-0-2 over their previous 10 four-game series dating back to June

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high tying five home runs Thursday for the second time in the previous three games...have four five-homer games for the season, which marks the third time in Athletics history the A's had at least four games with five or more home runs (7 in 1996, 4 in 1999)...have 12 home runs in the last four games after hitting nine over their previous 14 contests....the A's are 1-15 when going homerless, which is the third worst record in the majors (Houston, 0-7; Seattle, 0-7)...are 2-15 when getting outhomered, which is second worst in the American League (Houston, 1-9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this nine-game road trip to Seattle (0-2), Detroit (2-0) and Cleveland (three games) and have lost 11 of their last 14 road games...are 7-15 (.318) on the road for the season, which is tied with Texas for the second worst road record in the American League (Kansas City, 5-15)...this is the third of four straight nine-game road trips to start the year, which are the A's longest road trips of the season...went 1-8 on the last road trip to Toronto (0-3), Boston (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2), which was their worst road trip of eight or more games since going 1-9 against Boston, Baltimore and Chicago from June 2-12, 2011...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-1) and Cleveland (2-1) and are 14-10 (.583) at home.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.43 ERA (51 er in 134.0 ip) in 14 games in May after posting a 4.89 ERA in April...have the fifth lowest May ERA in the American League...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last 11 games and are 3-3 with a 2.75 ERA (21 er in 68.2 ip) and .195 (47-for-241) opponents batting average over that span...the A's used an "opener" for the first time this year last Saturday against Cleveland and won...went 4-5 when using an opener last year.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a positive run differential for the season (+10) despite being four games under .500...nine of the previous 11 games had been decided by two-runs or fewer...are 10-13 (.435) in games decided by two runs or fewer...23 of the A's 46 games this year have been decided by two runs or fewer, which is second most in the American League (Seattle, 27)...are 10-13 in those games, including 7-8 in one-run games...also have the second most one-run games in the AL (Seattle, 18).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played four extra inning games in the last 11 games and are 2-4 in extra innings for the season...the six games are tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 8)...in three of those games, the A's had the lead in extra innings only to go on to lose the game...no other Athletics team since at least 1906 has lost more than two such games in one season...have four walk-off wins and five walk-off losses and the losses match Oakland's season total from last year...lead the majors in walk-off games (9) and losses and are tied for the lead in wins...are 4-8 in games decided in the last at bat...the losses are tied for the most in the majors and the 12 games

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the first two meetings of 2019 to extend their winning streak against the Tigers to 14 games...that is third longest in Oakland history and tied for fifth longest in Athletics history against any team...it is the A's longest against the Tigers... have a nine-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is the Athletics longest winning streak at any Detroit ballpark (8, Aug. 3, 2001-May 13, 2003, also at Comeria) and is tied for the third longest at any road ballpark...won the season series last year, 7-0...it was the fourth time in Athletics history the A's went undefeated in a season series of seven or more games (12-0 vs. New York in 1990, 7-0 vs. Baltimore in 2004, 7-0 vs. Toronto

in 2018)...went 3-0 in Oakland and 4-0 in Detroit...have won each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four and are 21-7 against Detroit dating back to 2015...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-247 against the Tigers...that includes 145-111 in Oakland, 119-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 43-28 (.606) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark...all-time, the A's are 934-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Phegley is batting .367 (22-for-60) with all five of his home runs and 23 of his 26 RBI on the road...he leads American League catchers and ranks third in the majors in RBI (26)... Marcus Semien has committed just one error and leads AL shortstops with a .994 fielding percentage.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in 2014 Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-1, 6.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas last Sunday and is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was 1-2 with a 5.73 ERA in four games, including three starts, this spring when he was optioned to Las Vegas March 11...went 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games with the Aviators.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Took the loss in his last start last Sunday against Cleveland, snapping a nine-game winning streak in interdivision games...it was his first loss against a non AL West team since May 29, 2017 at Cleveland...was 0-6 with a 6.70 ERA and .287 opponents batting average in 11 games against American League West competition last year, 7-0 with a 2.04 ERA and .188 opponents average in 11 games against all other teams... is now 1-12 with a 6.20 ERA (71 er in 103.0 ip) in 21 career games against the West compared to 11-6 with a 3.52 ERA (52 er in 133.0 ip) in 23 games against the rest of baseball...his only win against an AL West team came on Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss to Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Santana RBI double and a Luplow sacrifice fly...the A's came back with two in the third to tie the game and he blanked Cleveland on one hit over innings 2-5...was relieved by Bucther with one out in the sixth inning and runners on first and third and Buchter allowed a three-run home run to Perez.

2019 WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in seven games, including six starts, with Las Vegas...struck out 44 batters in 39.0 innings (10.15 per nine innings)...at the time of his May 12 promotion, he was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts, ranked third in opponents batting average, fifth in ERA and seventh in innings pitched (39.0)...went 2-0 with a 4.24 ERA over his first three games and 1-2 with a 1.64 ERA over his final four starts...his opponents batting average includes a .193 (16-for-83) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .203 (13-for-64) against left-handers...tossed at least six innings in five of his seven appearances, allowed two runs or fewer four times and yielded three hits or fewer four times.

2019 LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Was the Aviators Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 9-8 win at El Paso on April 4...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings and left with a 6-4 lead...made his lone relief appearance on April 9 against Sacramento in relief of a rehabbing Chris Bassitt...allowed one unearned run on one hit in 6.0 innings of relief and struck out a season-high nine for the win...that began a three-game winning streak where he went 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA and .149 opponents batting average over a three-start stretch from April 9-20...tossed a season-high 99 pitches and allowed five runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings April 15 against Fresno but still picked up the win...logged a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits in an 11-0 win at Fresno April 20...had his three-game winning streak snapped April 26 against El Paso when he had season highs in runs (6) and hits (8) and season lows in innings pitched (3.0) in an 8-6 loss...lost his second consecutive start May 1 at Reno...allowed just two runs in 6.0 innings in a 2-0 loss...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his final start May 7 against Salt Lake but had a no decision.

2018 RECAP: Was in the A's Opening Day starting rotation but was optioned to Triple-A Nashville following a mid-season stint on the disabled list before returning to Oakland in late August, working primarily as a long man in "opener" games...went 7-6 with a 4.05 ERA and .234 opponents batting average in 22 games, including 17 starts, in his third season in the majors and tossed 115.2 innings...was 5-11 with a 5.24 ERA, .265 opponents batting average and 115.0 innings in 21 starts over his first two seasons...struck out just 72 batters in 115.2 innings and his average of 5.60 strikeouts per nine innings was second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 4.98)... walked just 26 (2.02 per nine innings) and is averaging 2.14 walks per nine innings over the last two years (39 bb in 164.0 ip) after walking 4.13 per nine innings in his first season.

2018 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Went 6-6 with a 4.50 ERA in his 17 starting assignments and was 1-0 with a 1.83 ERA in his five relief appearances...did not allow a run in three of his five relief appearances and tossed at least four innings four times...surrendered just one home run in 19.2 innings of relief.

2018 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .221 (44-for-199) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (59-for-241) against right-handers...issued 20 of his 26 walks in 2018 and 27 of his 39 walks over the last three years to righties...held the opposition to a .185 batting average leading off an inning and issued just three walks for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings and the batting average was fourth lowest in the AL...yielded a .293 average with runners in scoring position...13 of the 18 home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .285 opponents batting average and nine of his 18 home runs the first time through the lineup, .151 the second time and .281 after that.

2018 SPLITS: Was 3-4 with a 3.60 ERA in 13 games at home, 4-2 with a 4.87 ERA in nine games on the road...entered the season with a 6.43 career ERA in Oakland, 4.12 on the road...went 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA in two interleague starts...is now 4-3 with a 3.10 ERA (18 er in 52.1 ip) in eight career starts against the National League compared to 8-15 with a 5.15 ERA (105 er in 183.2 ip) in 36 games against the AL

2018 THIS AND THAT: Allowed 15 of his 58 runs in the first inning for a 7.94 ERA and .343 opponents batting average...had a 3.38 ERA and .213 opponents average from the second inning on...had five home runs in the first inning, 13 after that...tied for second among AL pitchers in sacrifice hits allowed (4) and tied for sixth in opponents reaching base on an error (8)...the A's won each of his five no decisions as a starter and were 11-6 (.647) in his starting assignments...are now 16-9 (.640) when he starts over the last three years...went 1-for-3 (.333) with a RBI and a strikeout as a hitter and is 2-for-11 (.182) with a RBI, walk and four strikeouts in his career.

NASHVILLE: Was 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine games, including eight starts... surrendered just two home runs in 45.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...walked one batter or fewer in each of his nine appearances and issued seven free passes total, an average of 1.39 per nine innings...struck out 34 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.86...allowed a .231 opponents batting average, including .204 (22-for-108) against right-handed hitters compared to .279 (17-for-61) against left-handers...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and opponents hit .222 with a .255 on-base percentage and .289 slugging percentage...yielded a .202 average with the bases empty compared to .291 with runners on...opponents hit .303 with runners in scoring position, including .353 with RISP and two outs...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA in four games at Nashville, 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts on the road.

RHP Mike Fiers (3-3, 5.12 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, which will tie him for second in the Majors...is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .151 opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts and was 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average in three starts in between (April 7-20)...is 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .119 opponents batting average in three starts in May after going 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and 44-35 with a 3.52 ERA from May through August...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss in 10 innings at Seattle on Monday (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.93 ERA (27.2 ip, 32 h, 13 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 21 so, 4 hr) in five career starts against Detroit...is 5-2 with a 2.58 ERA in 14 career starts at Comerica Park.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

5-10, 4.16 ERA (79 er in 171.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 6-for-16 (37.5%)

- The pen was charged with its fifth blown save in its last 11 games on Monday and now has 10 for the season, which is the most in the majors.
- Has converted 6-of-16 (37.5%) save opportunities...has the lowest save percentage in the Majors and has the second fewest saves.
- Has not had a save since April 17 against Houston and the streak of 25 consecutive games without a save matches the longest by an A's team over the last 23 years (Sept. 21, 2004-April 16, 2005)...the longest streak in the post-Billy Ball era (1983-present) is a 26-game streak from April 9-May 6.1994.
- Has allowed just 17 home runs in 171.0 innings for a rate of 0.89 home runs per nine innings, the second lowest mark in the American League (fifth in the majors)
- Ranks sixth in the AL in innings pitched (171.0)...has the fourth fewest wins (5) and tied for the most losses (10).
- First batters faced are hitting .255 with a .344 on-base percentage (35-for-137, 18 walks, 1 hbp) vs. the Oakland bullpen so far this season...the batting average is third highest and the OBP is fourth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 23-of-62 (37.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fifth highest in the majors.

- Began the season as the A's fifth starter and went 2-3 with a 5.74 ERA in six starting assignments before pitching in relief of "opener" Liam Hendriks last Saturday (2.25 ERA, 1 er in 4.0 ip).
- His 4.0 innings of relief last Saturday against Cleveland were his most ever as a reliever and the most by an A's reliever this year. Has allowed 39 hits, nearly half of which have been for extra bases (nine
- doubles, 10 home runs)...has a .269 opponents batting average and .538 slugging percentage.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in four games at home, a 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) in three games on the road.
