

# OAKLAND ATHLETICS GAME INFORMATION

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## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (43-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (42-40)

FRIDAY, JUNE 28, 2019 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:07 P.M. PDT RHP MIKE FIERS (7-3, 4.20) VS. RHP NOE RAMIREZ (3-0, 2.95) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KTRB 860 AM/KHTK 1140 AM) — A'S CAST ON TUNEIN

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost the opener of this four-game series last night and are now 3-3 over the last six games...however, have won seven of the last 10 contests and 10 of the last 15 and are 43-39 (.524) overall...the four games over .500 are one short of the season-high of five (43-38 on June 26)...are in third place in the American League West for the 25th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by seven games...are 2½ games behind Texas for the second Wild Card...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 41 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 14-11 (.560) in the month of June and need one more win to clinch a winning record in June for the second consecutive season (were 17-10 last year)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the American League this month (25) and also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.387) and OPS (.699)...the offense ranks second in extra base hits (94) and third in doubles (52)...have tallied 100 extra base hits in June twice in Oakland history (116 in 1996, 102 in 2017).

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: The A's are 2-1 in this stretch that features four series in four different cities...the stretch began on Tuesday and takes the club into the All-Star Break...it features games in St. Louis (2-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-0), Oakland (three games vs. Minnesota) and Seattle (three games).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 77 home runs over the last 41 games dating back to May 13, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors over that span behind the Twins (78)...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 128 for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which is tied for the most in the majors...Phegley and Piscotty have nine home runs each and the Athletics record for most players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .259 (350-for-1350) with a .488 slugging percentage (85 doubles, four triples, 72 home runs) and an average of 5.6 runs per game (217 runs) over the last 39 games dating back to May 16...hit .236 with a .396 slugging percentage and 4.4 runs per game over the first 44 contests...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (42) and fewest strikeouts (638) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (67)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (55) and doubles (3), tied for second in home runs (3) and walks (7), third in RBI (12) and extra base hits (6) and tied for third in hits (11).

*PITCHING*: The A's had a season-high three wild pitches last night and now have 40 for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (51)...also rank second in the AL in fewest home runs (93), third in opponents slugging percentage (.398), fourth in opponents batting average (.242) and OPS (.712) and fifth in shutouts (5)...have a 3.56 ERA (53 er in 134.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 5.61 ERA over the previous 13 contests.

STARTING PITCHING: Tanner Anderson allowed seven runs last night, which matches the season-high by an A's starter (fourth time)...it's the second time it has happened in the last four games (Brett Anderson on Sunday)...starters are now 1-3 with a 7.56 ERA (21 er in 25.0 ip) and .336 (36-for-107) opponents batting average over the last six games...overall, starters rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and wins (31) and fourth in opponents batting average (.240), OPS (.711), winning percentage (.574) and innings pitched (441.2).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last four games and now have a .985 fielding percentage, which is third best in the American League...however, have turned just 51 double plays, which is third fewest...have the fourth fewest unearned runs (21).

*ON THE BASES:* A's opponents have been caught stealing 24 times, which is second most in the majors to the Phillies (25)...however, Oakland has allowed 57 stolen bases, which is second most to the Mets (70)...on offense, the A's are 27-for-40 (67.5%) in stolen base attempts...have the third lowest stolen base percentage in the American League and the third fewest stolen bases and attempts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...went 6-4 on the last road trip and are now 14-5 over their last 19 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-14 on the road...are 19-20 (.487) on the road compared to

24-19 (.558) at home...return home following the game Sunday for a brief three-game homestand with Minnesota that starts on Tuesday...went 6-4 on the last homestand, a season-long 10-game stand against Seattle (1-2), Baltimore (3-0) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...are 6-9 over the last 15 home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .254 (361-for-1420) and are averaging 5.48 runs per game on the road (219 runs in 40 games), compared to .240 with an average of 4.47 runs per game at home...are averaging the fourth most runs per game on the road in the American League...have a 4.71 ERA (182 er in 347.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.76 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 14-7 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 29-32 (.475) against right-handers...have faced just one lefty over the previous 16 games...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (17-6)...are batting .281 with an .852 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .236 with a .728 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL, but the fourth lowest batting average against righties...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (38).

LATE IN THE GAME: The A's are tied with the Mets for the most walk-off losses in the majors (6) and rank second with 12 last at bat losses (Kansas City, 13)... have five walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the American League... have six extra inning losses, which is tied with the Royals for the most in the majors...have allowed 18 runs in extra innings (17 er in 20.2 ip, 7.40 ERA), which is the most in the majors...have lost five times when leading after seven innings, which is tied for third most in the majors...are 0-28 when trailing after seven innings and are one of three teams without a win (Baltimore, Tampa Bay).

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used just 36 players, which is tied with Houston and Arizona for second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 31)...have used just 14 relievers, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times...currently have seven players on the IL (Cotton, Estrada, Gossett, Herrmann, Hundley, Manaea, Treinen), including four on the 60-day DL (Cotton, Gossett, Herrmann, Manaea)...Herrmann is currently on a rehab assignment...have had at least five players on the DL every day dating back to April 26, 2018.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 4-3 in Oakland and 2-2 in Anaheim...have lost each of the previous five season series, which is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...are 46-60 (.434) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 19-33 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 443-381 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in Oakland and 211-201 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 492-458 against the Angels.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is batting .362 (17-for-47) with six doubles, a triple and three home runs over his last 13 games...is tied for second in the American League in extra base hits (41), tied for fourth in total bases (163), tied for seventh in home runs (19), tied for eighth in doubles (20) and tied for 10th in runs (53)...Khris Davis leads designated hitters in home runs (16) and is tied for the lead in RBI (39)...has 292 career games at designated hitter with the A's, which ties Erubiel Durazo for fourth most in Athletics history...Liam Hendriks has not allowed a run in his last 10 games (10.1 ip) and in 22 of his last 23 relief appearances (0.33 ERA)...has the second lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.06)...Matt Olson has hit 14 home runs in his last 42 games dating back to May 12, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors over that span...Josh Phegley has 30 of his 41 RBI on the road and is tied for third in the AL in road RBI...Marcus Semien leads the majors with 83 games played and has now started each of the A's last 164 games dating back to June 28 of last year.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (7-3, 4.20 ERA)

FIRST EIGHT STARTS/LAST NINE STARTS: Went 2-3 with a 6.81 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 against Cincinnati and is 5-0 with a 2.51 ERA (16 er in 57.2 ip) and .169 (33-for-195) opponents batting average over his last nine starts...ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average dating back to May 7, fourth in ERA and tied for sixth in wins.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Currently has a five-game winning streak dating back to his no-hitter, which matches the A's season-high and matches the longest winning streak by an A's starter over the last three years...the streak includes a start in the suspended game May 19 at Detroit, in which he is the pitcher of record with the A's leading 5-3 in the bottom of the seventh...a win in that game or today would extend his streak to six games, which would match his career high from July 21-Sept. 11, 2018.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) and .207 (18-for-87) opponents batting average in four starts in June...has won four games in a month twice in his career, both times in August (4-2 in 2012 and 4-1 in 2014)...went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts in April but is 5-1 with a 2.74 ERA (19 er in 62.1 ip) and .180 (38-for-211) opponents average in 10 starts since then...is now 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA in 25 career appearances in April and 48-35 with a 3.50 ERA (278 er in 715.1 ip) from May through August.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-1 with a 3.28 ERA (22 er in 60.1 ip) and .194 (42-for-217) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 5.82 ERA (22 er in 34.0 ip) and .278 (35-for-126) opponents average in seven starts during the day...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents batting average and OPS (.574) at night, seventh in ERA and tied for ninth in wins.

*DAYS REST:* Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.58 ERA (15 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest...is also 2-1 with a 5.46 ERA (18 er in 29.2 ip) in six starts on four days rest and 1-2 with an 8.03 ERA (11 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts on six days rest or more.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has allowed 10 home runs in 169 at bats against right-handed hitters, five in 174 at bats against left-handers...10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has walked just four batters to lead off an inning...opponents are hitting .242 (15-for-62) with runners in scoring position but that drops to .143 (4-for-28) with RISP and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.08 ERA (18 er in 52.2 ip) and .195 (36-for-185) opponents batting average in nine starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 5.62 ERA (26 er in 41.2 ip) and .259 (41-for-158) opponents average in seven starts on the road...is tied for third in the American League in home wins, ranks fourth in opponents batting average and seventh in OPS (.584)...has the fourth highest road ERA...is now 9-3 with a 3.18 ERA (40 er in 113.0 ip) and .209 (84-for-402) opponents batting average in 20 career appearances, 19 starts, in the Coliseum.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, which will tie him for the most in the majors among non-openers...hit an Oakland-record tying three batters in his last start last Saturday against Tampa Bay (11th times, previous: Raul Alcantara, Sept. 5, 2016)...now has seven hit batters for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the American League...has 992.1 innings pitched and needs 7.2 to reach 1,000 for his career...is 12-5 with a 4.09 ERA (67 er in 147.1 ip) in 27 games, including 26 starts, since he was acquired by Oakland Aug. 6, 2018...the wins are tied for eighth most in the AL over that span.

**NO-HITTER:** Tossed his second career no-hitter May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati to become the 34th pitcher in Major League history with multiple regular season no-hitters...is the seventh with a no-hitter for multiple teams...was named American League Co-Player of the Week with George Springer May 13...it was his second career Player of the Week honor with the first coming Aug. 23, 2015 following his first no-hitter...this no-hitter was the 13th in Athletics history, including the eighth in Oakland history.

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starter against Seattle on March 20 in Tokyo and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-7 loss...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 12th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 14 years...then put together wins in back-to-back starts on March 28 against Los Angeles and April 2 against Boston to give him a 2-1 record, a 3.00 ERA and a .189 opponents batting average over his first three starts...then allowed a season-high six runs in three consecutive starts from April 7-20 and went 0-1 with a 16.20 ERA and .442 opponents batting average...began that streak by tossing just 1.2 innings in a no decision at Houston April 7, matching the shortest start of his career (June 2, 2013 at Philadelphia)...yielded a season-high nine hits in just 3.1 innings in a 10-1 loss to Toronto on April 20...it was his first loss in the Coliseum since July 18, 2016 while pitching for Houston, snapping a six-game Coliseum winning streak...went 1-1 with a 7.83 ERA in five starts in April...the ERA was

his highest in a month of 10 or more innings (previous: 7.44 in Aug. 2017)... it was second highest in the majors this year among pitchers with 20 or more innings in April (Nova, CWS 8.42)...then went 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA and .161 opponents batting average in six starts in May...had the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League in May (Verlander, HOU .124)...tossed his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win on May 7 in Oakland against Cincinnati...walked two and struck out a season-high tying six...also tossed a season-high 131 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder had 132 in a three-hit shutout against Toronto on May 2, 2001...left his May 13 start at Seattle with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save (May 31 and June 22)...was the starting pitcher in the A's game at Detroit on May 19, which was suspended in the bottom of the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-3...is the pitcher of record.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland...allowed just one run in six innings of work and it came on a Choi sacrifice fly in the third inning...was relieved by Buchter to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 2-1 and Buchter allowed a solo home run to Choi for the blown save...Oakland came back with two in the bottom of the seventh for the win.

FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-4 with a 5.19 ERA (67.2 ip, 69 h, 40 r, 39 er, 19 bb, 51 so, 13 hr) in 12 career appearances, 11 starts...is 2-3 with a 9.42 ERA (30 er in 28.2 ip) in six games in Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts in his home ballparks...is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 7 so) in two starts this year...the first win came on March 28 in Oakland when he combined with Trivino, Soria and Treinen on a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...tossed six of the innings and allowed just one

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (7-5, 4.26 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, which will match his season total from last year...has 88.2 innings pitched, which are his most since 2015 with the Los Angeles Dodgers (180.1)...has seven wins after combining for seven over his previous three seasons...is 5-2 with a 3.13 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in nine starts at night, 2-3 with a 6.09 ERA and .324 opponents average in seven starts during the day...did not strike out a batter in his last start and his average of 4.57 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors... was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 loss to Tampa Bay last Sunday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...is 3-3 with a 3.19 ERA (73.1 ip, 60 h, 26 r, 26 er, 16 bb, 49 so, 4 hr) in 14 career appearances, including 11 starts against Los Angeles...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's win in Oakland on March 30 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 4 so).

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-16, 4.15 ERA (142 er in 308.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 18-for-34 (52.9%)

- The A's bullpen has a 1.61 ERA (5 ER, 28.0 IP) with 30 strikeouts over its last six games...had a 5.60 ERA (50 ER, 80.1 IP) with 77 strikeouts in 22 games from May 28 to June 20.
- Is 18-for-34 (52.9%) in save opportunities for the season...the 16 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 20)...the save percentage is third lowest in the majors (Mets, 47.4%; Red Sox, 51.5%).
