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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-39) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (42-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night and have won 3 of the first 4 games on this road trip and are now 4-3 over the last seven games...however, have won eight of the last 11 contests and 11 of the last 16 and are 44-39 (.530) overall...the five games over .500, tied for the season-high of five (43-38 on June 26)...are in third place in the American League West for the 26th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by seven games...are 2½ games behind Texas for the second Wild Card...have spent eight days in second in the West this year, one day tied for second, 42 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

MATT-ER OF TIME: Matt Olson is hitting .317 (26-for-82) with 13 runs, 7 doubles, 9 home runs, 20 RBI with a .398 on-base mark, .732 slugging percentage and a 1.130 OPS in 23 games since June 5...among American Leaguers in June, he's tied for the lead with 16 extra-base hits, T3rd in home runs, RBI and 8th in slugging percentage (.648)...his 16 home runs since May 12 are tied for the most in the Majors with New York-NL's Pete Alonso.

UNDER THE HALO: Robbie Grossman is hitting .358 (29x81) with 18 runs, 8 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, a .409 on-base percentage, .531 slugging park and a .940 OPS in 23 career games at Angel Stadium...in those 23 games, he has 11 multi-hit games...his .358 average is the 2nd-best at Angel Stadium among active players (min. 20 games), behind Matt Wieters (.363) and ahead of Jose Altuve (.332).

SETTING THE TABLE: Marcus Semien has reached base 136 times this season, the 6th-most in the American League behind Mike Trout (160), Mookie Betts (143), Alex Bregman (142), Carlos Santana (142) and Xander Bogaerts (139)...he ranks 6th in the AL with 93 hits and 12th with 43 walks.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's are 15-11 (.577) in the month of June and have clinched a winning record in June for the second consecutive season (were 17-10 last year)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the American League this month (25) and also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.383) and OPS (.693)...the offense ranks second in extra base hits (97) and fourth in doubles (52)...have tallied 100 extra base hits in June twice in Oakland history (116 in 1996, 102 in 2017).

ROAD WARRIORS: Oakland is 15-5 over its last 21 road games (lead 5-3 in May 19 postponed game) since May 16...the 15-5 (.750) mark is the best road record in the Majors, ahead of Boston (13-6/.684)...began the season 5-15 on the road, including 11 losses in the 12 games immediately before this winning stretch.

FOUR SERIES IN FOUR CITIES: The A's are 3-1 in this stretch that features four series in four different cities...the stretch began on Tuesday and takes the club into the All-Star Break...it features games in St. Louis (2-0), Los Angeles-AL (1-1), Oakland (three games vs. Minnesota) and Seattle (three games).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 80 home runs over the last 42 games dating back to May 13, which is tied with the Twins for the most in the Majors in that span...hit 51 home runs over the first 42 contests and have 131 for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have seven players with 10 or more home runs, which is tied for the second most in majors...Phegley and Piscotty have nine home runs each and the Athletics record for most players with 10 or more home runs in a season is nine in 2000 and 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .258 (356-for-1382) with a .488 slugging percentage (85 doubles, four triples, 75 home runs) and an average of 5.6 runs per game (224 runs) over the last 40 games dating back to May 16...hit .236 with a .396 slugging percentage and 4.4 runs per game over the first 44 contests...rank third in the American League in hit by pitches (42) and fewest strikeouts (649) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (67)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in plate appearances (55) and doubles (3), tied for second in home runs (3) and walks (7), third in RBI (12) and extra base hits (6) and tied for third in hits (11).

PITCHING: The A's have 41 wild pitches for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (53)...also rank second in the AL in fewest home runs (93), second in opponents slugging percentage (.396), fourth in opponents batting average (.242) and OPS (.710) and fifth in shutouts (5)...have a 3.40 ERA (54 er in 143.0 ip) over the last 16 games after logging a 5.61 ERA over the previous 13 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last five games and now have a .986 fielding percentage, which is third best in the American League...however, have turned just 51 double plays, which is third fewest...have the fourth fewest unearned runs (22).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-0) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...went 6-4 on the last road trip and are now 15-5 over their last 20 road games (includes May 19 suspended game) after starting the year 5-15 on the road...are 20-20 (.500) on the road compared to 24-19 (.558) at home...return home following the game Sunday for a brief three-game homestand with Minnesota that starts on Tuesday...went 6-4 on the last homestand, a season-long 10-game stand against Seattle (1-2), Baltimore (3-0) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...are 6-9 over the last 15 home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .253 (367-for-1452) and are averaging 5.51 runs per game on the road (226 runs in 41 games), compared to .240 with an average of 4.47 runs per game at home...are averaging the fourth most runs per game on the road in the American League...have a 4.62 ERA (183 er in 356.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.76 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 14-7 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 30-32 (.484) against right-handers...have faced just one lefty over the previous 17 games...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to Houston (17-6)...are batting .281 with an .852 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .235 with a .729 OPS against right-handers...have the third best batting average and OPS against lefties in the AL, but the sixth lowest batting average against righties...rank third in the AL in home runs off lefties (38).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used just 36 players, which is tied with Houston and Arizona for second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 32)...have used just 14 relievers, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series, 7-5...are 4-3 in Oakland and 3-2 in Anaheim...have lost each of the previous five season series, which is the Athletics (Kansas City and Oakland) longest season series losing streak against the Angels...are 47-60 (.439) against the Angels over the last six seasons...that breaks down to 27-27 in Oakland and 20-33 on the road...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 444-381 against the Angels...that includes 232-180 in Oakland and 212-201 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 493-458 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman is batting .340 (17-for-50) with six doubles, a triple and three home runs over his last 14 games...is tied for second in the American League in extra base hits (41), tied for fourth in total bases (163), tied for seventh in home runs (19), tied for ninth in doubles (20) and tied for 10th in runs (54)...**Khris Davis** leads designated hitters in home runs (16) and is tied for the lead in RBI (39)...has 292 career games at designated hitter with the A's, which ties Erubiel Durazo for fourth most in Athletics history...**Liam Hendriks** has not allowed a run in his last 10 games (10.1 ip) and in 22 of his last 23 relief appearances (0.33 ERA)...has the second lowest relief ERA in the AL (1.06)...**Josh Phegley** has 30 of his 41 RBI on the road and is tied for third in the AL in road RBI...**Marcus Semien** leads the majors with 84 games played and has now started each of the A's last 165 games dating back to June 28 of last year.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** Bill Lamar extends his hitting streak to an Athletics franchise record 29 consecutive games...in **1990** Dave Stewart pitches the fifth no-hitter in Oakland history in the A's 5-0 win at Toronto...after walking the first two hitters he faced, Stewart retired 25 in a row before a two-out walk in the ninth...in **1996** the A's hit three home runs at California, giving Oakland 18 home runs in their last four games, which ties the American League record...in **2003** Eric Byrnes becomes the fifth player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle and ties an Oakland record with five hits in a 5-2 win at San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (7-5, 4.26 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, which will match his season total from last year...has 88.2 innings pitched, which are his most since 2015 with the Los Angeles Dodgers (180.1)...has seven wins after combining for seven over his previous three seasons...has his most wins since going 10-9 for the Dodgers in 2015...the A's are 10-6 (.625) in his starting assignments.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.13 ERA (19 er in 54.2 ip) and .230 (48-for-209) opponents batting average in nine starts at night, 2-3 with a 6.09 ERA (23 er in 34.0 ip) and .324 (45-for-139) opponents average in seven starts during the day.

STRIKEOUTS: Did not strike out a batter in his last start and has just 45 strikeouts in 88.2 innings this year...his average of 4.57 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Mike Fiers, 5.88)...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.45 is second lowest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received three runs of support or fewer in seven of his last eight starts...however, has starts with 16 runs of support and 13 and his season run support average of 7.41 (73 rs in 88.2 ip) is third highest in the American League.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed nine home runs in 88.2 innings and his average of 0.91 home runs per nine innings is 10th lowest in the American League...six of the nine home runs are solo shots.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-4 with a 3.58 ERA (22 er in 55.1 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 5.40 ERA (20 er in 33.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...was slotted in as the A's third starter when the club returned home and made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...broke the previous record of 33.0 set by Matt Keough (Sept. 5, 1979-April 16, 1980)...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...then defeated the Orioles 13-2 at Baltimore on April 9 for his third win in his third start...the only other time in his career he won at least his first two starts in a season was in 2012 when he won his first four starts after missing the first 4½ months of the season following "Tommy John" surgery...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his next six starts through May 14...left with a 7-3 lead on April 14 at Texas but Soria blew the save in the eighth inning...it was his first of two starts in which the bullpen blew the save (June 12 at Tampa Bay, Hendriks)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 games Toronto when he lasted a season-low 2.2 innings following an ankle injury...it snapped a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...made his next scheduled start April 27 at Toronto but allowed a season-high 10 hits for his second consecutive loss...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...snapped his two-game losing streak May 3 at Pittsburgh when he picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory...walked a season-high five and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 13-inning win over Cincinnati May 8 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the sixth time in his career as a starter (number seven came on June 23 against Tampa Bay...struck out a season-high five but also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on May 14...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...picked up the win in that start to begin a six-start stretch through June 18 where he went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113)...struck out a season-high tying five batters in a no decision on June 7 at Texas...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in a 16-2 win over Baltimore June 18 in Oakland.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-2 loss to Tampa Bay last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a season-high seven runs on nine hits and two walks in 3.0 innings...yielded three runs in the third on a two-run home run by d'Arnaud and a RBI double by Garcia...was then charged with four of the Rays five runs in the fourth inning.

ANDERSON vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-3 with a 3.19 ERA (73.1 ip, 60 h, 26 r, 26 er, 16 bb, 49 so, 4 hr) in 14 career appearances, including 11 starts...is 1-2 with a 4.29 ERA (17 er in 35.2 ip) in seven games at Angel Stadium and 2-1 with a 2.15 ERA (9 er in 37.2 ip) in seven games in his home ballpark, all in the Coliseum...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-2 A's win in Oakland on March 30...tossed six scoreless innings and allowed just three hits while walking two...allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...went 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in three starts last year.

2018 RECAP: Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville before he was selected on May 2...went 4-5 with a 4.48 ERA in 17 starts with Oakland in a season that was interrupted by two stints on the disabled list...was out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder and Aug. 28 to Sept. 12 with a strained left forearm...walked just 13 batters in 80.1 innings for an average of 1.46 walks per nine innings...that was a career low and was second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched (Kluber, CLE 1.46)...struck out just 47 but his 3.62 strikeout-to-walk ratio was a career high...his starts and innings pitched were his most since 2015 when he made 31 starts and tossed 180.1 innings with the Dodgers...had a 1-2 record, a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents batting average in six starts at the All-Star Break last year...then went 3-3 with a 3.81 ERA and .251 opponents average in 11 starts after the break...issued eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings) and then walked just five batters in 56.2 innings after the break (0.79 per nine innings)...has a 26-35 career record before the break, 27-22 after the break...allowed a .285 opponents batting average, including .257 (18-for-70) against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (72-for-246) against right-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...yielded a .333 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .280 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 32.1 innings...struck out 36 (10.02 per nine innings) and walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average included a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (4-3, 3.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season today, which matches his career high from 2015...has four wins, which equals his career total in 40 games (30 starts) entering this season...is 2-2 with a 5.66 ERA and .237 opponents average over his last seven starts after going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first five starts...has allowed a .210 opponents batting average, which is fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...is 3-1 with a 3.20 ERA in six starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA in six starts at night...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-3 A's win at St. Louis on Tuesday (3.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.47 ERA (15.2 ip, 21 h, 17 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts, against Los Angeles...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-5 A's win in Oakland on May 27 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Is 18-for-34 (52.9%) in save opportunities for the season...the 16 blown saves are tied for second most in the majors (Mets, 20)...the save percentage is third lowest in the majors (Mets, 47.4%; Red Sox, 51.5%).
- Is tied for third fewest wins in the American League (12) and has the fourth most losses (16)...is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (33).
- Has the 2nd-lowest slugging percentage against first batters (.313) among Major League bullpens.
