**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won three of the last four games, six of the last eight and 17 of the last 25...are 34-19 (.642) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best record in the American League...are a season-high tying 25 games over .500 for the second time this year (84-59 on Sept. 8)...are 85-60 (.586) overall, which is the fifth best record in the AL and seventh best in the majors...currently have the second AL Wild Card spot, ½ game ahead of third place Cleveland and 1½ game behind first place Tampa Bay...have been in second place in the AL West every day dating back to July 2 and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...have spent 76 days in second in the West, one day tied for second, 44 days in third, six days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, seven days tied for fourth and 17 days in fifth.

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** The A's had 46 total bases last night, which broke the franchise record of 44, set on May 1, 1929 vs. Boston and matched on June 27, 1996 vs. California...tied Oakland records for hits (25) and at bats (51) in a nine-inning game...the other time it happened was on June 14, 1969 at Boston, also a 21-7 win...the 21 runs tied for second most in Oakland history and fell two short of the record of 23 on Sept. 30, 2000 against Texas...each A's starter had at least two hits, marking the first time that has happened for the A's since at least 1905...it was the eighth time in Oakland history (1968-present) each starter had at least one RBI...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it was the third time in Major League history a team lost by 14 or more runs one game and then came back to defeat the same team by 14 or more runs in the next game (Sept. 10-11, 1894, BOS vs. CHI; April 18-19, 1922, CLE vs. STL)...since 1908, it was the sixth game in ML history where four players hit two or more home runs...it's the second time the A's and Astros have done it this year (Aug. 15 at Oakland)...it's the second game in ML history with two players with two or more home runs on each team, with the Aug. 15 A's vs. Astros game being the first...it's the second time this year the A's and Astros have combined for 10 home runs in a game.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's hit a season-high tying six home runs last night (June 18 vs. BAL, July 17 vs. SEA)...had just 12 games of six or more home runs in the first 118 years of Athletics baseball...it was their eighth game with five or more home runs this year and Oakland is the fourth team in Major League history with at least eight five-homer games in a season (MIN 11 in 2019; NYY 8 in 2019, BOS 8 in 1977)...Khris Davis hit his 20th home run last night, making the A's the ninth team in Major League history with seven or more players with 20 or more home runs...only the Twins, with eight this year, have more...have set franchise records for most players with 20 or more home runs (7) and most players with 10 or more home runs (10)...Matt Olson hit his 30th and 31st home run of the season last night, giving the A's two players with 30 or more home runs (Chapman, 32)...its the 13th time in Oakland history the A's have two players with 30 or more home runs (last: Thomas and Swisher in 2006)...Marcus Semien hit his 27th home run and the Athletics record for players with 30 or more home runs is three (1996, 1999, 2001).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .276 (147-for-532) with 108 runs scored over the last 15 games (7.2 per game)...have been hit by a pitch 14 times over that span and have 81 for the season, which is the most in the American League, third most in the majors and second most in Athletics history to the record of 88 in 2001...also rank third in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1172), fourth in home runs (230) and fifth in runs (765), extra base hits (511), OPS (.777) and slugging (.450)...are third in most grounded into double plays (128) and fewest stolen bases (43).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 11 home runs in the last two games, 24 in the last 10 and 183 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League but is sixth most in Oakland history...rank third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.409), fourth in ERA (4.09), OPS (.720), batting average (.245), on-base percentage (.311) and fewest strikeouts (1140), tied for fourth in shutouts (9) and fifth in fewest walks (433).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 10-1 despite a 4.16 ERA (51 er in 110.1 ip) over the last 20 games dating back to Aug. 20...each of the A's last two losses by starting pitchers have been against Houston (Fiers on Monday, Anderson on Aug. 18)...have not lost to a team other than Houston since Aug. 13 at San Francisco (Anderson)...starters are 61-34 with a 4.07 ERA

overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fourth in ERA and innings pitched (799.2).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 73 errors, which is third fewest in the American League...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 81 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 84 in 2006...the errors have led to 32 unearned runs, which is the fewest in the majors...the fewest in Athletics history is 39 in 1981 and the fewest in a non-strike season is 42 in 1991...are second in the majors in opponents caught stealing (38).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are batting .274 (23-for-84) with seven doubles, a triple, five home runs, 25 RBI and 13 walks...have 13 extra base hits, which ties the Oakland record set in 1968...lead the American League in RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits, rank second in hits and doubles, third in plate appearances (100) and tied for third in walks...the five homers are tied for third most in Oakland history (8 in 1970, 6 in 2013) and the 25 RBI are the most since 1990 (26).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Houston (1-1) and Texas (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (3-1) and New York-AL (1-2) and are now 32-18 (.640) over their last 50 road games after starting the year 5-15 (.250) on the road...are 37-33 (.529) on the road compared to 48-27 (.640) at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Detroit (2-1) and are 30-11 (.732) over the last 41 home games after starting the year 18-16 (.556).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's won by 14 runs last night...it was their fourth win by 14 or more runs this year, which is the most in Athletics history...now have a run differential of +137, which is fourth best in the American League and fifth best in the majors...last year, the A's were +139...are 28-12 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 57-48 (.543) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to Houston (31-9)...have 11 series sweeps, which is fourth most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 2013 when they had 12.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive year as they are 6-11 against the Astros with two games remaining...have hit 25 home runs but have allowed 38, which is their most against any team in a season since the Kansas City A's allowed 39 to the Twins in 1964...the two teams have combined for 63 home runs, or 3.7 per game...have been outscored 98-67 and have a -31 run differential against Houston compared to +168 against all other teams...went 4-5 in Oakland and are 2-6 in Houston...have won five of the last eight games after losing eight of the first nine...four of the A's six wins have been by one run...are 35-58 (.376) against Houston over the last five years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 66-71 all-time, including 35-34 in Oakland and 31-37 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** has 32 home runs, which ties the Athletics franchise record for home runs as a third baseman (Eric Chavez in 2001)...**Liam Hendriks** has 110 strikeouts, which is one short of the Major League record for strikeouts by an Australian born pitcher (111, Damian Moss, ATL, 2002)...has 108 strikeouts in relief, which are fourth most in Athletics history by a reliever and the most since Rollie Fingers had 113 in 1976...**Matt Olson** hit his 30th and 31st home runs of the season last night to join Mark McGwire (eight times) and Jason Giambi (two times) as the only first basemen in Oakland history to hit 30 homers...**Marcus Semien** has scored 107 runs, which is fifth most in the American League, tied for 13th in Oakland history and the most by an Athletic since Miguel Tejada had 108 in 2002.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in the A's 9-7 win over Detroit, an American League record that he would match 11 days later...in **1936** Hod Lisenbee ties a major league record by allowing 26 hits in a 17-2 loss to Chicago...in **1970** Vida Blue tosses his first career complete game, a 3-0, one-hit shutout at Kansas City...in **1976** Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 1-0 win at Texas...the streak is part of a string of 38 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1999** Doug Jones records the final out of the A's 5-4 victory at Tampa Bay to become the 11<sup>th</sup> pitcher in major league history to record 300 saves...in **2006** Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game to set an Athletics record for consecutive games with a home run.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (11-9, 4.08 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Picked up his 11th win of the season Aug. 30, which matches his career high from his rookie season of 2009 with the A's...his 28 starts and 161.0 innings pitched are the third best totals of his career...had 31 starts and 180.1 innings pitched with the Dodgers in 2015 and 30 starts and 175.1 innings pitched as a rookie with the A's in 2009...his .265 opponents batting average and .317 on-base percentage are his lowest marks since 2012 with the A's (.225 and .270)...his 19 home runs are one short of his career high of 20 (2009) and his 45 walks are one short of his high of 46 (2015).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed 18 home runs over his last 20 starts and 118.0 innings after surrendering just one home run over his first eight starts and 43.0 innings...has yielded 19 home runs overall and his average of 1.06 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League...13 of the 19 home runs are solo shots.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 9-5 with a 3.28 ERA (38 er in 104.1 ip) and .234 (93-for-397) opponents batting average in 17 starts at night compared to 2-4 with a 5.56 ERA (35 er in 56.2 ip) and .319 (73-for-229) opponents average in 11 starts during the day...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA at night and fifth in opponents OPS (.644).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 7-3 with a 3.39 ERA (32 er in 85.0 ip) and .240 (79-for-329) opponents batting average in 14 starts on the road compared to 4-6 with a 4.86 ERA (41 er in 76.0 ip) and .293 (87-for-297) opponents average in 13 starts at home...ranks eighth in the American League in road ERA, ninth in opponents OPS (.655) and tied for ninth in wins.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Has struck out five batters or fewer in each of his 28 starts and has just 81 strikeouts in 161.0 innings...his average of 4.53 strikeouts per nine innings is the lowest mark in the majors (Nova, CWS 5.37) and the lowest by an A's pitcher since Tom Candiotti had a mark of 4.39 in 1998...his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.80 is fourth lowest in the majors...now has a streak of 33 consecutive starts with five strikeouts or fewer dating back to Aug. 27, 2018, which is the longest such streak by an A's starting pitcher since Bob Welch had a 45-game streak from Sept. 30, 1991-Aug. 24, 1993.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-6 with a 3.38 ERA (42 er in 112.0 ip) in 19 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-3 with a 5.69 ERA (31 er in 49.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...over the last two years, he is 12-9 with a 3.62 ERA (69 er in 171.2 ip) in 31 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-5 with a 5.68 ERA (44 er in 69.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received three runs of support or fewer in 15 of his last 20 starts...however, has starts with 16, 13 and 11 runs of support and his season run support average of 6.32 (113 rs in 161.0 ip) is ninth highest in the American League...is 11-3 in 20 starts with run support of two runs or more.

**WITH THE BAT:** Went 4-for-8 with two strikeouts to become just the third American League pitcher in the designated hitter era with four or more hits in a season...joins the Orioles Zach Britton (5 in 2011) and the Twins Eric Milton (4 in 1998)...his .500 batting average is the highest single season mark in Oakland history by a player with eight or more plate appearances...in Athletics history, only Jimmie Foxx (6-for-9, .667 in 1925) and Hank Foiles (4-for-7, .571 in 1960) had a better mark.

**2019 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was one of three inactive pitchers for the opening series in Japan...made his first start March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his home scoreless streak to an Oakland record 34.1 innings...it is also the longest Athletics home scoreless streak since at least 1908...the streak ended in the first inning of his next start April 4 against Boston, marking the first time he allowed a run in the Coliseum since May 7, 2018...was 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA over his first three starts through April 9...then went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his next six starts through May 14...left with a 7-3 lead on April 14 at Texas but Soria blew the save in the eighth inning...it was his first of three starts in which the bullpen blew the save (June 12 at Tampa Bay, August 25 vs. San Francisco)...was charged with his first loss of the season April 21 against Toronto, snapping a career-high tying four-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 19, 2018 (fourth time)...went 4-0 with a 3.50 ERA and .243 opponents average during the streak, which spanned seven starts...finished April 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .307 opponents batting average in five starts...then went 3-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in five starts in May...picked up his 50th career win in the A's 14-1 victory at Pittsburgh May 3...left his start on May 20 at Cleveland after 5.1 innings with a cervical strain but did not miss a start...picked up the win in that start to begin a six-start stretch through June 18 where he went 3-1 with a 2.70 ERA...tossed a season-high 110 pitches in a 7-1 win over Seattle on May 26...the pitches were his most since June 26, 2015 at Miami (113)...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings and allowed two hits when he combined with Liam Hendriks on a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) on June 29...was 9-5 with a 3.86 ERA in 18 starts

at the All-Star Break...had never won more than five games before the break entering this season...was on the paternity list from July 22 to 24 but did not miss a start.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 10-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...allowed two unearned runs in the first inning when Upton had a two-run double following a Chapman error...the A's got one of those runs back in the bottom of the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third and a RBI single to Upton in the fifth...left after five innings trailing 5-1 but the A's scored seven times in the seventh for the win.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Homer Bailey (12-8, 4.87 ERA):** Was acquired from Kansas City on July 14 for minor league infielder Kevin Merrell...is 3-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .222 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-2 with an 8.17 ERA and .308 opponents average over his first five starts with the A's...is 5-2 with a 4.98 ERA in 10 starts overall with Oakland dating back to July 17...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last six starts, which is the longest such streak of his career (4 bb in 35.1 ip, 1.02 per nine innings)...has walked 11 batters in 56.0 innings for Oakland (1.77 per nine innings)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to Detroit in 11 innings last Friday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.83 ERA (57.1 ip, 44 h, 21 r, 18 er, 18 bb, 53 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts against Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 11-1 A's loss at Houston on July 22 (2.0 ip, 8 h, 9 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 2 so).
