## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-7) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (6-1)

FRIDAY, APRIL 9, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have started the season 1-7, which matches the worst record after eight games in Athletics history (1951, 1952, 1979)...started 1-9 in 1979, 1-8 in 1952 and 1-12 in 1951...are a season-high tying six games under .500 (also 0-6 on April 6)...have not been more than six games under .500 since finishing the 2017 season 12 games under at 75-87 ...are in sole possession of last place in the American League West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 5½ games...never trailed by more than one game last year...have spent one day tied for fourth and seven days in fifth...began the season with a six-game losing streak, which matched the longest season-opening losing streak in Athletics history (1916)...did not lose more than three in a row all last year...were swept in a four-game series by Houston to start the season, which was the first time the A's were swept in a four-game series since July 24-27, 2017 at Toronto...it was the first time it happened in Oakland since June 19-22, 2017 by Houston...this is the A's 54th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in the previous 53 years in Oakland...only the Atlanta Braves (20), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 121st season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on their first road trip of the season, a five-game trip to Houston (0-1) and Arizona (two games)...were 14-14 (.500) on the road in 2020...went 1-6 on the season-opening seven-game homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2)...it was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...started the 2001 season 2-10 but ended up winning 102 games...did not lose more than two straight home games all last year when they went 22-10 (.688)...that was the sixth best home record in the majors and the second best home winning percentage in Oakland history.

**THE FIRST 10:** The A's begin the season with 10 games in 10 days against two 2020 playoff teams...were swept by Houston in a four-game series to start the season, lost two of three to the defending World Champion Los Angeles Dodgers and conclude the stretch with this three-game series against Houston...then have two off days over a four-day stretch (April 11 and 14)...the April 11 off day is the A's first scheduled Sunday off day since Aug. 26, 2012 following a three-game series at Tampa Bay.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have collected six hits or fewer in eight of the first nine games and are batting .170, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cubs, .157)...it is the lowest mark in Athletics history over the first eight games of the season (previous: .180 in 1908)...have the lowest slugging percentage in the majors (.261) and the lowest OPS (.526) in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in most hit by pitches (6) and fewest home runs (3) and have the second lowest on-base percentage (.266) and second fewest runs scored (19)...had two pinch hits yesterday and are 4-for-9 (.444) with a walk, a home run and four RBI in the pinch this year...lead the AL in pinch hits, pinch homers and pinch RBI and are tied with Minnesota for the lead in pinch plate appearances (10).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed six or more runs in six of the first eight games and have a 7.13 ERA, which is the highest in the majors (Pirates, 6.83)...have issued a Major League-leading 35 walks and have the highest opponents on-base percentage (.381)...have yielded a ML-leading 16 home runs and have the highest opponents slugging percentage (.532)...A's starting pitchers are 0-7 over the first eight games and Oakland is one of three American League teams without a win from their starters (Los Angeles, Tampa Bay)...A's starters also went winless over the first eight games last year, which was the third longest-season opening streak in Oakland history (recorded their first win in the ninth game)...the longest season-opening streaks without a win from a starter is 10 in 1979 and 1997...Deolis Guerra allowed a home run to the first batter he faced yesterday and the A's bullpen has now allowed four home runs against first batters faced...had just five such home runs all last year...first batters faced against A's relievers are 12-for-24 (.500) with six walks and a hit by pitch (.613 on-base percentage)...the bullpen has allowed 12 runs in the ninth inning after yielding just nine runs in the ninth inning all last year.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen base attempts and are tied for third in the American League in stolen bases...last year, the A's were

successful in 26-of-29 (89.7%) stolen base attempts, which was the best percentage in Major League history...were a perfect 13-for-13 in stolen base attempts on the road in 2020...have been successful in each of their last 19 stolen bases attempts on the road and have not been caught stealing in a road game since Aug. 27, 2019 at Kansas City.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's lost by four runs yesterday and all seven of their losses have been by at least four runs...have been outscored 59-19 and the minus 40 run differential is the lowest in Athletics history after the first seven games...the previous low was -34 by the 1955 Kansas City A's but that club lost the ninth game of the season 29-6 to fall to -57 after nine games...the A's lone win was a one-run victory on Wednesday against the Dodgers...that was a 4-3 walk-off win in 10 innings...last year, the A's led the majors with six walk-off wins and six extra inning wins...have turned eight double plays, which is tied with Kansas City, Tampa Bay and San Diego for the most in the majors...turned just 33 double plays last year, which was the fewest in the majors.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's placed A.J. Puk on the injured list yesterday and have now placed four players on the IL since the season started...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith), which is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

**TAXI SQUAD:** The A's taxi squad for the first road trip includes pitchers James Kaprielian and Miguel Romero, catcher Austin Allen and infielders Pete Kozma and Vimal Machin...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...Jesus Luzardo, who was 23 years and 183 days on April 1, is the youngest...Sergio Romo was the oldest at 38 years, 29 days...17 players returned from last years Opening Day roster, which matches the total from last year when Opening Day rosters were at 30...from 1992-2019, when rosters were 25 men, the most returning players from the previous years Opening Day roster was 16 in 2007...opened the season with 13 pitchers and 13 position players.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors and matched the most by an A's team over the last six springs (also 2017)...compiled a 4.17 ERA, which was the lowest in the Cactus League and fifth lowest in the majors...also had the lowest opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.312) and OPS (.714) in the CL...offensively, the A's led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161), doubles (67) and sacrifice flies (13)...topped the CL in fewest strikeouts (220)...opponents were successful in just 6-of-17 (35.3%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest mark in the majors.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 0-5 against the Astros...lost the first game in Houston last night after being swept in a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...it was the second time the A's were swept by Houston in a four-game series (June 19-22, 2017 at Oakland)...are scheduled to play the Astros in seven of the first 10 games this year and six of the final nine but just six of 143 games in between...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 44-66 (.400) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 75-79 all-time, including 42-39 in Oakland and 33-40 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** has played in each of the A's first eight games after playing in just nine games over the previous two seasons (0 in 2020, 9 in 2019)...**Stephen Piscotty** has hit safely in each of his last four games (4-for-8, .500) after going 0-for-8 over his first three contests...**J.B. Wendelken** pitched in his fifth game yesterday, which is tied for the most in the majors

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1974** Joe Rudi ties an Oakland record with three doubles as the A's defeat Kansas City 6-4...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 8-6 win over Seattle...in **2008** Fernando Hernandez becomes the first reliever in Oakland history to record a win in his Major League debut when he pitches a scoreless eighth inning in the A's 6-3 win at Toronto.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 9.64 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...started the A's fourth game this year after starting the second game of the season in each of his previous three seasons in which he was on the Opening Day roster.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

**MANAEA vs. HOUSTON:** Is 3-6 with a 3.66 ERA (76.1 ip, 70 h, 35 r, 31 er, 24 bb, 66 so, 9 hr) in 14 career regular seasons starts...has received no run support in four of those starts and two runs or fewer nine times...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.98 ERA (24 er in 43.1 ip) in eight starts in Oakland, 2-2 with a 1.91 ERA (7 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in Houston...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 9-2 A's loss in Oakland last Sunday (see last start above)...went 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA in one regular season start last year...also started and lost Game 2 of the ALDS on Oct. 6 at Dodger Stadium, a 5-2 A's loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

nents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.26 ERA (22 er in 37.2 ip) and .264 (39-for-148) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes.

**2020 NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 17-6 with a 3.39 ERA (79 er in 210.0 ip) and .214 (167-for-779) opponents batting average in 36 career day games compared to 22-26 with a 4.21 ERA (160 er in 342.1 ip) and .268 (366-for-1326) opponents average in 62 career starts at night.

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 21-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road.

**2020 AL AND NL:** Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 34-24 with a 3.86 ERA (193 er in 449.2 ip) in 79 games against the AL.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 4-30 in 48 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 35-2 in 49 starts with support of three or more...the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 11-6 (.648) when he starts over the last three years.

**2020 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the season as the A's number two starter and took the loss in each of his first two starts, going 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA in July...his first loss on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) was his first since Aug. 19, 2018 against Houston and it snapped a career-high tying five-game winning streak...lost again on July 31 at Seattle when he allowed a season-high five runs in 4.1 innings...it was the first time he lost consecutive decisions since May 25-30, 2018...then went 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA in five starts in August...walked three batters Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), his only outing with more than one walk...also allowed a season-high seven hits in a season-low 2.2 innings in that contest...had his third straight no decision on Aug. 15 at San Francisco, giving him an 0-2 record, a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents batting average over his first five starts...then won each of his next four starts from Aug. 20-Sept. 10...allowed one earned run in each start and compiled a 1.61 ERA and .210 opponents average during the winning streak, which fell one short of his career high of five...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings Sept. 10 against Houston...retired each of the first 15 batters he faced before Reddick doubled to lead off the sixth...struck out a season-high seven batters on Sept. 15 at Colorado but was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss...it snapped his four-game winning streak and it also snapped an eight-game winning streak in the month of September...it was his first September loss since Sept. 12, 2017 at Boston...tossed a season-high 91 pitches in his final start on Sept. 23 at Los Angeles (NL)...went 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in four starts in September and is now 10-3 with a 2.17 ERA (24 er in 99.1 ip) in 17 career starts in September...the wins are his most for any month and his ERA is his lowest...was on the A's roster for the American League Wild Card Series but did not pitch...started and lost Game 2 of the ALDS against Houston on Oct. 6 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

**2020 RECAP:** Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...has walked just 50 batters in 249.0 innings over the last three years (1.81 per nine innings).

**2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 17 starts over the last three seasons, he has a 2.49 ERA (14 er in 50.2 ip) and .221 (40-for-181) oppo-

**RHP Frankie Montas (0-1, 23.63 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...took the loss in his first start last Monday against the Dodgers in Oakland, a 10-3 A's loss (2.2 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...now has a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...is 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA (40.0 ip, 43 h, 22 r, 20 er, 15 bb, 30 so, 5 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts, during the regular season against Houston...also has a loss in one postseason start (5 er in 3.2 ip)...went 2-1 with a 4.11 ERA in three regular season starts last year...went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents batting average over his first four starts...was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has a 1.38 ERA (5 er, 32.2 ip) in 39 career outings against Houston.
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and after yesterday's outing, now has a 15-game, 12.2-inning scoreless streak in day games.
