OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-15) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (22-15)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 12, 2021 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 EDT

RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (2021 DEBUT) VS. LHP EDUARDO RODRIGUEZ (5-0, 3.82)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games and six of the last nine and are a season-high tying seven games over .500 for the fifth time this year (last: 21-14 on May 8)...are 8-8 since their 13-game winning streak but are 22-9 (.710) over the last 31 games after starting the season 0-6...are 22-15 (.595) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (White Sox, 20-13/.606)...are in first place in the AL West and have a season-high tying 2½ game lead for the third time in the last four days...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 22 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 18...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 20 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's played their third one-run game in the last four games last night and won 3-2 to improve to 9-3 (.750) in one-run games...that is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (12-4, .750) and three runs or fewer (15-4, .789)...however, are 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 74-55 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+19) but have been outscored 107-79 in the other games (-28)...have an overall run differential of -9...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tonight for the eighth time in the last 10 games, 10th time in the last 13 and 13th time in the last 18 games...faced a lefty in six straight games from May 2-7, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time)...are 10-6 (.625) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 12-9 (.571) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League...are batting .236 (105-for-445) with a .747 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .208 (154-for-740) with a .658 OPS against right-handers...have the fifth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the second lowest against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to Boston (1-0) and Minnesota (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 9-4 (.692) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors to the Red Sox (12-5, .706)...went 5-5 the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1), which was their longest homestand of the season...are now 13-11 (.542) at home, which is fifth best in the AL...have a 3.19 ERA (40 er in 113.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL to Baltimore (3.11)...have a 4.58 ERA at home, which is fourth highest.

FREE PASSES: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 26 games, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 25, Aug. 2-29, 2012)...have walked 29 batters in 148.0 innings during the streak (1.76 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.30 walks per nine innings overall, which is second lowest in the American League to the Yankees (2.25)...as a team, A's pitchers have walked 101 batters, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...A's batters have drawn 131 walks, which is second most.

THE LONG BALL: Last night, the A's won for just the second time this year when being out-homered (April 21 vs. Minnesota)...are 2-11 when they are out-homered and 18-2 when hitting more home runs than the opposition...have gone homerless in back-to-back games for the second time this year (April 3-4)...have not gone homerless in three straight games since July 24-26, 2019...have hit 46 home runs, which ranks fifth in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9-for-30 (.300) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied with the Rays for the lead in plate appearances (31) and have one of three pinch home runs...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (107-for-507) with 53 runs scored over the last 16 games (3.3 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .219 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (24), rank second in walks (131), third in stolen bases (22), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in home runs (46) and fewest strikeouts (331).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.13 ERA (73 er in 210.0 ip) over their last 24 games dating back to April 16 after posting a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have the fifth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.248) but the third lowest average with runners in scoring position

(.214)...rank second in most wild pitches (24), tied for second in shutouts (4) and tied for third in fewest walks (101).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-7 with a 3.28 ERA (53 er in 145.1 ip) over the last 25 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 14-14 with a 4.24 ERA overall...have the second most losses in the American League (Tigers, 19) but are tied for the second most wins...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (203.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 213 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in three of the last four games (1 er in 10.1 ip, 0.87 ERA) after yielding 12 runs in the previous two contests...has converted 11-of-12 (91.7%) save opportunities, which is the best percentage in the majors...is tied for second in the American League in saves...has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 29 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 19-of-46 (41.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.290), on-base percentage (.385) and slugging percentage (.550) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last five games after making just three over the previous eight contests...rank fifth in the American League in fielding percentage (.985) but have -24 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -26)...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the AL in pickoffs (2)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

THE SCHEDULE: The A's are in a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams that concludes tomorrow...are 10-8 over that stretch...the last homestand began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 6-5 over that span, including 5-5 at home.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's won the first meeting of 2021 last night after going 3-4 against the Red Sox in 2019...won three of four in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Fenway...are 14-19 against Boston dating back to 2015, which includes 10-7 at home and 4-12 on the road...had their four-game losing streak at Fenway snapped last night...have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...are 248-300 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-123 in Oakland, 97-176 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 890-1081 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for fourth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...is tied for second in the American League in runs (28), tied for fifth in stolen bases (6) and tied for eighth in walks (20)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in batting with runners in scoring position (.500) and is tied for second in multiple hit games (13)...is tied for sixth in the AL in doubles (10)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.83 ERA, which is seventh lowest among AL relievers...**Lou Trivino** is tied for fourth in the American League in games pitched (17) and tied for seventh with a career-high six saves.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1910** Chief Bender tosses a no-hitter in the A's 4-0 win over Cleveland...the future Hall of Famer walks just one and finishes the season 23-5, one of two career 20-win seasons...in **1915** catcher Wally Schang sets an American League record by throwing out six attempted base stealers...in **1931** Al Simmons drives in a run for the 11th consecutive game as Lefty Grove defeats Chicago, 5-2 en route to a 31-win season...the win moves the A's into first place for good as the Athletics win their third straight American League pennant...in **1992** Dave Stewart records his 1000th strikeout in an Oakland uniform in the A's 3-0 loss at Toronto...he becomes the third pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 1000.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today and will be making his first career start...it will be the third appearance of his career as he made two relief appearances last year.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was Opening Day starter for the Aviators last Thursday at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento...allowed a RBI single to Thairo Estrada in the third...was relieved by Matt Blackham in the fifth inning with a runner on third and two outs and the Aviators trailing 1-0...Blackham allowed that runner to score plus one of his own

SPRING TRAINING: Was 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 3 so) in two games, one start, this spring...opponents went 3-for-11 (.273) with no walks and a hit by pitch...pitched in relief on Feb. 28 against the Dodgers (1.0 ip, 2 h) and then started against the Angels on March 5 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...was optioned to Las Vegas March 15.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 double-header against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-1, 3.07 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eight start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA over his last six starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...has allowed one run in two of his three no decisions and had one run of support in each of those two starts...is averaging 1.76 walks per nine innings for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Tampa Bay last Friday (7.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...retired each of the first 18 batters and had a no-hitter until Brosseau doubled to start the eighth...is 3-2 with a 6.84 ERA (26.1 ip, 34 h, 22 r, 20 er, 3 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) in five career starts against Boston...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 13.14 ERA (18 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts in Fenway Park...has not faced Boston since 2018 when he went 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 14 so) in two starts.
