## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-34) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (31-49)

THURSDAY, JULY 1, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two of the last three games but are 4-7 since their seven-game winning streak...are 48-34 (.585) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by ½ game...were last in first on June 20 when they were tied with the Astros...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 11 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**A'S IN JUNE:** The A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...it was their third consecutive winning June and have won 17 games in each of those Junes...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...had the second lowest ERA (3.55) and OPS (.697) in the AL and issued the fewest walks (66)...starters had a 2.92 ERA, which was the lowest in the majors...the offense tied for second in the AL in hit by pitches (14) and ranked fifth in runs (140) and on-base percentage (.326)...hit .314 with runners in scoring position, which was second best in the majors (Cleveland, .347)...grounded into six double plays, which was the fewest in the majors...the last time the A's grounded into fewer than 10 double plays in a month with 12 or more games was in April, 1987 (5 in 23 games)...have out-scored the opposition 140-94 (+46) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .250 (349-for-1397) with 207 runs scored over the last 42 games (4.93 runs per game) after hitting .219 with 164 runs scored over the first 40 contests (4.10 runs per game)...lead the American League in hit by pitches (45), rank second in sacrifice flies (28), tied for fourth in triples (12) and fifth in walks (285)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (77) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.25 ERA (99 er in 274.0 ip) over the last 31 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.87 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306), slugging percentage (.396) and OPS (.702)...have the fewest walks (220) and the third fewest home runs (90)...rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and third in shutouts (7).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 3-2 with a 1.62 ERA (7 er in 39.0 ip) and .162 (22-for-136) opponents batting average over the last six games and are 14-6 with a 2.76 ERA (47 er in 153.0 ip) over the last 25 contests dating back to June 2...are 33-27 with a 3.71 ERA (193 er in 468.1 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank third in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (468.1) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors (Dodgers, Red Sox) with four pitchers with 16 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen had its first save since June 18 last night and now has one save, four blown saves, a 6.26 ERA (19 er in 27.1 ip) and .312 (34-for-109) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has three losses over the last 11 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the seven losses are the fewest in the majors...ranks second in the AL in fewest walks (93) and tied for second in fewest home runs (33)...has allowed 31-of-91 (34.1%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth highest in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.505), the second highest batting average (.278) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.350).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just two errors over the last 17 games and have 36 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the third fewest double plays (59).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 19-17 (.528) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-17 (.630) in games decided by three runs or more...are 12-10 (.545) in one-run games and the 12 wins are tied for third most in the American League...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 7)...now have 89 in the

Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-5 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-2 in extra inning games and the four games are second fewest in the AL to the Royals (2).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-1) and Boston (three games)...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 26-19 (.578) at home compared to 22-15 (.595) on the road...the 45 home games are tied with the Padres for the most in the majors...have the second best road record in the American League...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2)...following this homestand, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 16-16 (.500) against American League West competition compared to 32-18 (.640) against all other teams...are 22-11 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-23 (.533) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL (White Sox, 18-7/.720) and the 33 games are second most (Astros, 35)...are 36-13 (.735) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL (Rays, 31-11/.738)...are 30-6 when out-homer the opposition, 6-21 when they are out-homered...have used 79 different lineups over the first 82 games.

**2,000 ATHLETICS:** Frank Schwindel started at designated hitter last night to become the 2,000th player in Athletics history...Bert Campaneris has played the most games in Athletics history (1,795)...Schwindel is number 992 in Oakland history.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The season series is even at three games each...have split the first two games in Oakland after splitting a four-game series in Texas last week...the A's did not play the Rangers over the first 73 games this year, but today is the seventh of 10 meetings with Texas over a 19-game stretch from June 21 to July 11...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...went 4-3 in Arlington last year and 3-0 in Oakland...have won 17 of the last 22 games and are 32-13 over the last 45 contests...have won eight of the last 10 games and 26 of the last 33 in Oakland...are 47-26 (.644) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 388-379 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 204-177 in Oakland and 184-202 in Texas...are 6-5 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 485-463 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** is batting .288 (46-for-160) over his last 48 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Matt Chapman** had his hitting streak snapped at a career-high 16 games yesterday...batted .323 (21-for-65) with 15 runs, four doubles, a triple, six home runs and 18 RBI during the streak...has a 41-game errorless streak at third base, which matches his career high (June 23-Aug. 15, 2019)...**Sean Murphy** has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and he leads Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** tied for third in the American League in home runs (20), ranks fifth in slugging (.568), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (5), sixth in OPS (.938), tied for seventh in extra base hits (38) and tied for 10th in RBI (53)...**Lou Trivino** had his scoreless streak snapping at 11.2 innings yesterday and his streak of no earned runs halted at 20.0.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1902** Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches...he turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore, his first victory as an Athletic...in **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Essian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief...in **2007** Dan Haren extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 11-5 win at New York.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-4, 2.91 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts (including one run or fewer six times)... is 3-2 with a 1.24 ERA (6 er in 43.2 ip) and .197 (31-for-157) opponents batting average over that span...has a total of one run of support in his two losses over that stretch and the bullpen blew the save in one of his two no decisions...for the season, has allowed one run or fewer in 10 of his 16 starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.91), sixth in opponents OPS (.655), seventh in slugging percentage (.361), tied for eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (96)...has allowed just eight home runs in 92.2 innings and his average of 0.78 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest...is one of two pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF) and one of four with two or more complete games (Marquez, COL 3; Wainwright, STL 2; DeSclafani, SF 2)...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

**IN JUNE:** Went 3-2 despite a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts in June...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...based on a minimum of 30 innings, his ERA was the lowest by an A's pitcher in June since Lefty Grove had a 0.51 ERA in June of 1926...had the lowest ERA in the majors in June...had the lowest opponents OPS (.496), slugging percentage (.250), on-base percentage (.246) and batting average in the AL...is now 11-4 with a 2.68 ERA in 19 career starts in June...the wins are his most in any month and the ERA is second lowest to his 2.17 in September.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .143 (12-for-84) batting average and .451 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .277 (75-for-271) with a .718 OPS against right-handers...his average and OPS against lefties are third lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .210 (13-for-62) with runners in scoring position, which is ninth lowest in the AL.

**SUPPORT:** Has received one run of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts and is 0-4 in those starts...is 6-0 in nine starts with two runs of support or more...has six no decisions and has allowed just one run in four of the no decisions...has received one run of support in three of his no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 11-5 (.688) in his starting assignments...are 22-10 (.688) when he starts over the last three years.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts, including five starts with one walk and three with no walks...has walked just 24 batters in 92.2 innings for an average of 2.33 walks per nine innings...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 52 of his 59 starts (17 with no walks, 22 with one)...has 71 walks in 337.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.90 per nine innings.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-1 with a 2.82 ERA (17 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 2-3 with a 3.05 ERA (13 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts on the road...is now 25-14 with a 3.48 ERA (128 er in 330.2 ip) in his career in the Coliseum compared to 20-21 with a 3.95 ERA (136 er in 309.2 ip) on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (9 er in 58.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 6.17 ERA (16 er in 23.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 2.37 ERA (26 er in 98.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.67 ERA (21 er in 33.1 ip) in seven starts on five days rest.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start on April 4 against Houston... then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the first being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...went 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA and .326 opponents batting average over a four-start stretch from May 2 to 18...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times

in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)... also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span... became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)... had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high tying three batters May 28 against Los Angeles (AL)...finished May 0-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in six starts...is now 5-9 with a 5.51 ERA in 21 career starts in May and the ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August)...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...then tossed 111 pitches in his next start on June 9 against Arizona when he combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched (Kirk Saarloos on Sept. 19, 2006 and Tim Hudson on June 8, 1999)...it was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fifth of his career.

**LAST START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss at San Francisco last Friday...issued a season-high tying three walks...allowed just one run in six innings of work, a Crawford RBI single in the fourth inning... also went 2-for-2 with a double...the double was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...Cueto, Rogers and McGee combined to shut out the A's on six hits.

**MANAEA vs. TEXAS:** Is 7-2 with a 3.41 ERA (74.0 ip, 69 h, 32 r, 28 er, 16 bb, 65 so, 9 hr) in 13 career starts...including 6-0 with a 2.40 ERA (12 er in 45.0 ip) over his last eight starts...the winning streak is tied for second longest in A's history against the Rangers/Senators (11, Zito, Sept. 30, 2000-Sept. 22, 2003)...is 4-0 with a 3.27 ERA (12 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (1 er in 5.0 ip) in one start at Globe Life Field...was 2-2 with a 3.75 ERA in six starts at Globe Life Park...was 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (8.1 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**
