



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-35) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (51-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Texas to start the homestand and are now 4-8 over the last 12 games...are 48-35 (.575) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 1½ games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20...have spent 58 days alone in first place, three days tied for first, 12 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

DOUBLE PLAYS: Jed Lowrie grounded into a double play yesterday, snapping an Athletics franchise record streak of 14 consecutive games without a GIDP...it was the A's first GIDP since June 14 although they had a GIDP on June 20 at New York (AL)...it fell two short of the longest streak by an American League or National League team since the stat became official (1933 in NL, 1940 in AL)...the Red Sox had a 16-game streak earlier this year (May 26-June 12), matching the 1980 Dodgers (June 8-24)...the A's have 51 GIDP for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .183 (36-for-197) with 21 runs scored (3.5 per game) over the last five games...went 1-for-14 with runners in scoring position yesterday and were 1-for-20 in the three-game series against the Rangers...lead the American League in hit by pitches (48), rank second in sacrifice flies (28), tied for fourth in triples (12) and fifth in walks (288)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (18), RBI (14), sacrifice flies (2) and plate appearances (78) and are tied for second in extra base hits (4)...are batting .250 (12-for-48) with the bases loaded, which is second lowest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.40 ERA (107 er in 283.0 ip) over the last 32 games after logging a 4.24 ERA over the first 51 contests...have a 3.92 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.308), slugging percentage (.400) and OPS (.708)...have the fewest walks (223), rank second in fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-7 with a 2.91 ERA (51 er in 158.0 ip) over the last 26 games dating back to June 2...are 33-28 with a 3.75 ERA (197 er in 473.1 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fourth in ERA...lead the majors in innings pitched (473.1) and are tied with the White Sox and Rockies for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with four pitchers with 16 or more starts (Dodgers, Red Sox)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...are one of two teams with five pitchers with six or more wins (White Sox).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 6.61 ERA (23 er in 31.1 ip) and .320 (40-for-125) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...has converted 21-of-32 (65.6%) save opportunities overall, which is the fifth best percentage in the American League...has three losses over the last 12 games after taking just four losses over the first 71 contests...the seven losses are the fewest in the majors...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.521), the second highest batting average (.283) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.354).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors over the last 18 games and have 36 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...also have the third fewest double plays (60)...A's pitchers have five pickoffs, which is tied for third most.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-17 (.528) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-18 (.617) in games decided by three runs or more...are 12-10 (.545) in one-run games and the 12 wins are tied for third most in the American League...have six walk-off wins, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Rockies, 8)...now have 89 in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-5 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-2 in extra inning games and the four games are second fewest in the AL to the Royals (2).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game homestand against Texas (1-2) and Boston (three games)...went 8-1 on the last homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (3-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...it was the first time the A's won eight games on a homestand since going 8-2 against Tampa Bay, Texas and Houston from Aug. 30 to Sept. 8, 2013...are 26-20 (.565) at home and the 46 home games are the most in the majors...following this homestand, the A's will play 26 of their next 36 games on the road...that begins with a six-game road trip to Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)

starting Tuesday that will take the A's into the All-Star Break...went 4-6 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Texas (2-2) and San Francisco (1-2) and are 22-15 (.595) on the road...have the second best road record in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-3 (.769) on Fridays, which is the second best record in the majors to the Red Sox (9-2, .818)...are 22-11 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-24 (.520) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League (White Sox, 18-7/.720) and the 33 games are second most (Astros, 35)...are 36-13 (.735) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL (Rays, 31-11/.738)...are 30-19 (.612) in night games, 18-16 (.529) during the day...are 30-6 when out-homer the opposition, 6-22 when they are out-homered...have used 80 different lineups over the first 83 games...have an average time of game of 3:04, which is second fastest in the AL...Frank Schwindel made his A's debut on Wednesday to become the 2,000th player in Athletics history.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's finished the month of June with a 17-9 record (.654) record, which was second best in the American League (Astros, 19-9) and tied for fourth best in the majors...it was their third consecutive winning June and have won 17 games in each of those Junes...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have 10 consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...have just one losing month dating back to 2018 (11-15 in April of 2019)...had the second lowest ERA (3.55) and OPS (.697) in the AL and issued the fewest walks (66)...starters had a 2.92 ERA, which was the lowest in the majors...the offense tied for second in the AL in hit by pitches (14) and ranked fifth in runs (140) and on-base percentage (.326)...hit .314 with runners in scoring position, which was second best in the majors (Cleveland, .347)...grounded into six double plays, which was the fewest in the majors...the last time the A's grounded into fewer than 10 double plays in a month with 12 or more games was in April, 1987 (5 in 23 games)...out-scored the opposition 140-94 (+46) after being out-scored 242-231 (-11) in April and May.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Canha, Fiers, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four all but one day since the fifth game of the season (three on June 16).

A'S vs. RED SOX: The A's and Red Sox meet in Oakland for the first time since April 4, 2019, a span of 820 days...Oakland leads the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Boston May 11-13...went 3-4 against the Red Sox in 2019...won three of four in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Fenway...are 15-20 against Boston dating back to 2015, which includes 10-7 at home and 5-13 on the road...have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...are 249-301 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-123 in Oakland, 98-177 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 891-1082 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is batting .280 (46-for-164) over his last 49 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Matt Chapman** has reached base safely in each of his last 18 games and is batting .300 (21-for-70) with 17 runs, six home runs and 18 RBI over that span...also has eight walks, a hit by pitch and sacrifice fly for a .375 on-base percentage...has a career-high 42-game errorless streak...**Sean Murphy** has 38 of his 40 RBI as a catcher and he leads Major League catchers in RBI...**Matt Olson** is tied for third in the American League in home runs (20), ranks sixth in slugging (.566), seventh in OPS (.938), tied for seventh in sacrifice flies (5) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (38)...**Lou Trivino** was named AL Reliever of the Month for June today after compiling a 0.71 ERA and six saves in 13 appearances.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969** Reggie Jackson hits three home runs in the A's 5-0 win against Seattle...the three-homer game is the first in Oakland history and it gives Reggie 33 round trippers in the A's first 72 games...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 303rd career home run to break Jimmie Foxx's all-time Athletics record of 302...also, Jason Giambi is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 11-6 victory at Seattle...he has three singles and a pair of doubles...in **2019** Chris Herrmann becomes the first player in Athletics history to hit a grand slam in his A's debut.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (7-7, 4.72 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-5 with a 4.53 ERA (23 er in 45.2 ip) over his last eight starts after going 5-2 with a 4.93 ERA over his first eight starts...his seven wins are tied for sixth in the American League but his seven losses are tied for sixth most...is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season today, which will be a new career-high (had 16 in 2019)...already has career highs in losses (7), hits (30), runs (51), walks (24) and home runs (14).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .219 (28-for-128) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .286 (65-for-227) with 11 of his 14 home runs after that...has a .344 (32-for-93) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three, four and five hitters to a .203 (25-for-123) average.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) and .296 (60-for-203) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings and a 2.88 ERA (13 er in 40.2 ip) and .217 (33-for-152) opponents average in even numbered innings.

BY MONTH: Went 2-2 in five starts in April, 3-3 in six starts in May and 2-2 in five starts in June...however, had a 6.20 ERA in April, 3.18 in May and 5.28 in June.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at San Francisco last Saturday...shut out the Giants on one hit and two walks over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Wade in the fifth inning...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth with the score tied 2-2.

MONTAS vs. BOSTON: Is 0-1 with a 1.13 ERA (8.0 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only appearance in 2019, a 9-4 A's loss at Boston on April 29...surrendered seven runs in 4.1 innings but only one of the runs was earned...the six unearned runs tied for second most in Oakland history and were the most since Brett Anderson also had six on May 15, 2009 vs. Detroit...had a 4-0 lead when his own error and a Profar error led to six unearned runs in the third...also allowed a RBI single to Chavis in the fifth...his other two outings came in relief in Oakland in 2017...tossed 0.2 innings on May 18 (1 h, 1 bb, 1 so) and then fashioned 3.0 scoreless innings on May 20 (2 h, 5 so).

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 18-1 in 22 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (6-7, 3.64 ERA): Went 3-0 with a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak is the longest of his career...went 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA in 11 starts in April and May...his seven losses are tied for sixth most in the AL...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 16 starts, including nine starts with one walk and three starts with no walks...has issued just 17 free passes in 94.0 innings and his average of 1.63 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...is scheduled to start on five days rest tomorrow...is 4-0 with a 1.67 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA in eight starts on four days rest...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's win at San Francisco last Sunday (8.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 8 so)...has faced the Red Sox once in his career and it came in relief at Philadelphia on Sept. 15, 2019 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb).
