



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-56) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (68-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and seven of the last nine games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...the loss last night coupled with a Boston win drops the A's out of a playoff spot for the first time since April 16...are one game behind the Red Sox in the American League Wild Card race and 3½ games behind the Yankees...are in second place in AL West and trail Houston by 3½ games for the third consecutive day...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 60 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 60 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of the last three games despite leading after seven innings...it is the first three-game stretch in Oakland history where the A's have led each game entering the eighth inning but gone on to lose the game...now have six losses when leading after seven innings this year, which is tied for second most in the American League (Houston, 7)...are 18-22 (.450) in one-run games...have the most one-run losses in the AL and are tied for third most in the majors...are tied with Seattle for the most one-run games in the AL...are 11-9 in one-run games and home, 7-13 on the road...are 26-32 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which the third best record in the AL...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Seattle for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to Colorado (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's are 11-9 (.550) in August, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 28-for-30 (93.3%) in stolen base attempts and are tied with Kansas City for the most steals in the majors this month...the 28 steals are the most by an A's team in any month since they stole 36 bases in September of 2010...lead the AL in hit by pitches (18), rank third in runs (103), on-base percentage (.339) and fewest strikeouts (152), tied for third in walks (72) and fourth in OPS (.772).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in six consecutive games (12 stolen bases total) for the first time since July 18-25, 2012 when they did it in seven straight games...are 30-for-32 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts in the 23 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and rank second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 31)...Marte has accounted for 17 of the 30 steals...are now 73-for-86 (84.8%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 85.2%)...the 73 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.31 ERA (249 er in 676.2 ip) over the last 76 games dating back to May 26, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have a 3.69 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the AL...rank third in opponents OPS (.681) and slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (341) and pitches per inning (15.9) and the second fewest home runs (134)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-0 with a 2.01 ERA (5 er in 22.1 ip) and .177 (14-for-79) opponents batting average in four games on the homestand after going 2-5 with a 5.63 ERA and .303 opponents average in 10 games on the last road trip...are 47-42 with a 3.71 ERA (295 er in 715.2 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and complete games (3) and rank fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.687)...lead the majors with 715.2 innings...are on pace for 920 innings, which would be the fewest by a ML leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has been charged with the loss in three consecutive games for the first time since May 28-31, 2019...has just 14 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...has three straight games with a blown save for the first time since Aug. 31-Sept. 3, 2019...has 20 blown saves for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...is 1-3 with two saves, five blown saves and a 4.62 ERA (20 er in 39.0 ip) over the last 11 games...has a 3.65 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.670)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.429) and the third

highest batting average (.245)...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (35.8%).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .199 (51-for-256), including .148 (9-for-61) with runners in scoring position, over the last eight games and have scored 22 runs (2.8 per game)...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs (7.9 per game)...are hitting .235 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League, but have a .256 average with RISP, which is seventh highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 78 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (428) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (121), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last 10 games and have 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (49)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-1) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0)...are 35-28 (.556) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3)...are batting .225 (449-for-1996) with a .701 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the third highest road batting average and fourth highest road OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-19 (.596) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-37 (.532) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)...are 6-8 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days that concludes today...have used the injured list 21 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...have used a different lineup in each of the last 63 games and have 123 different lineups over the first 126 contests.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 4-7 against the Mariners...are 3-4 in Seattle and 1-3 in Oakland...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 20-20 against Seattle over the last three years...are 66-88 (.429) dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-312 against the Mariners...that includes 198-139 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.492), seventh in ERA (1.90), eighth in slugging percentage (.257) and ninth in batting average (.168)...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.989) and putouts (135), is tied for the lead in total chances (354) and double plays (34) and ranks fourth in assists (215)...**Starling Marte** is hitting .388 (54-for-139) with 22 stolen bases in 34 games since the All-Star Break...leads the majors in batting and steals and ranks third in on-base percentage (.434)...**Matt Olson** hit his 17th home run off a left-handed pitcher last night...that sets an Oakland single-season record for home runs off a lefty, breaking the mark of 16 held by Reggie (1969) and McGwire (1987)...leads the majors in home runs (17) and RBI (38) off left-handers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969**, a doubleheader turns into a tripleheader as the A's need 18 innings to win the second game of the twinbill, 9-8...the doubleheader, which starts at 1:34 ends at 9:06 when Ted Kubiak's RBI single ends the 5 hour and 8 minute second game...in **1986** Mark McGwire collects his first major league hit, a second inning single off Tommy John, in the A's 11-4 victory at New York...in **2003** the A's set a franchise record and tie a major league record by hitting two grand slams in a 17-2 win at Toronto...Ramon Hernandez has a grand slam in the first and Miguel Tejada hits his sixth career slam in the sixth inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (9-11, 3.57 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 5-4 with a 3.13 ERA (21 er in 60.1 ip) and .236 (54-for-229) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts dating back to June 22 and has allowed just three home runs over that span...went 4-7 with a 3.89 ERA, .273 opponents average and nine home runs allowed over his first 14 stats...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.368), sixth in OPS (.673) and eighth in ERA (3.57), but is tied for fifth in most losses (11)...is the first A's pitcher to lose 11 games since 2017 when Daniel Gossett also lost 11.

DON'T WALK: Walked a career-high four batters in his last start after walking two batters or fewer in each of his first 23 starts this year...his streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer was second longest by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...has issued just 29 free passes in 141.1 innings, an average of 1.85 walks per nine innings...that is the fourth lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.6 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors...has walked just 43 batters in 186.2 career innings (2.07 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 12 home runs in 141.1 innings and his average of 0.76 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the American League...eight of the 12 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...eight have come at home...has hit nine batters, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .314 (33-for-105) with runners in scoring position, which is third highest in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-9 with a 5.25 ERA (41 er in 70.1 ip) and .292 (84-for-288) opponents batting average in 13 starts against American League West competition, 6-2 with a 1.90 ERA (15 er in 71.0 ip) and .221 (58-for-263) opponents average in 11 starts against everyone else...his nine intradivision losses are the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since Mike Moore went 4-9 against the West in 1990...the Athletics record is 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.25 intradivision ERA is sixth highest in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest compared to 8-4 with a 2.59 ERA (26 er in 90.1 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more...eight of the 12 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 12-12 (.500) in his starting assignments...is 9-2 in 13 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-9 in 11 starts with support of two runs or fewer

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of four times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...tossed 4.0 innings in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on July 25...it was the shortest start of his career...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...allowed a season-high tying five runs on eight hits in an 8-6 loss at Texas on Aug 13.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win at Chicago (AL) last Thursday...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI double to Jimenez in the first but Oakland scored single runs in the third and fourth innings to take a 2-1 lead...he allowed a two-run home run to Vaughn in the fifth but Chapman homered in the sixth to tie the game and Olson hit a two-run home run in the seventh for the win...was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh with a 5-3 lead.

two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by France and Crawford...the A's tied the game with two runs in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a RBI double by Murphy and a RBI single by Kelenic...was relieved by Smith with runners on first and second and two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2...also lost a 4-3 decision at Seattle on July 25...tossed 4.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...retired eight of the first nine batters and had a 2-0 lead with two outs and the bases empty in the third inning...the next six batters went single, walk, hit by pitch, two-run single, RBI single and RBI single...left after four innings with the A's trailing 4-2.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9, recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day and was optioned again on Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

THURSDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.25 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA in three starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.25 ERA is second lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors among rookies...ranks third in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and batting average (.217) and fourth in OPS (.677) and slugging percentage (.385)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over San Francisco last Friday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against the Yankees, a start in the A's 5-3 win at New York earlier this year on June 18 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so).

- Allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26 Saturday...has now allowed two runs in 12 games with the A's (12.2 ip, 9 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants Saturday...marked just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 37 of his last 39 appearances (5 er in 37.0 ip, 1.22 ERA) and 50 of 55 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.492), eighth in slugging percentage (.257), 12th in on-base percentage (.235), and is ninth in batting average (.168).
