OAKLAND ATHLETICS (77-67) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (66-78)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and seven of the last 10 games and are now 9-18 dating back to Aug. 15...are 77-67 (.535) overall, which is the eighth best record in the American League but 11th best in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race...are 3½ games behind the Blue Jays, Yankees and Red Sox, who are in a virtual three-way tie for the two Wild Card spots...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying seven games for the second consecutive day (also Sept. 7)...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, six days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 21-10 (.677) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 21-8/.724)...this three-game series with the Royals is the A's last series against a non-division foe...close out the season with 16 games against AL West teams (three vs. Angels, seven vs. Mariners, six vs. Astros)...are batting .252 (256-for-1016) with a .794 OPS and an average of 5.4 runs per game (167 runs in 31 games) against teams from the Central compared to .234 with a .706 OPS and an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 85-30 (.739) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .256 (295-for-1154) with 178 runs scored over the last 34 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.24 runs per game)...rank fourth in the American League in runs scored over that span...are batting .238 overall, which is fifth lowest in the AL...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...are tied for third in the AL in sacrifice flies (43), ranks fourth in fewest strikeouts (1204) and fifth in doubles (247) and fewest grounded into double plays (91)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (29) and plate appearances (138), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

OUCH: The A's were hit by a pitch for the 86th time last night, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...it is third most in Athletics history...the record is 88 in 2001 and the A's had 87 in 2019...Mark Canha has set an Athletics record and is tied for the Major League lead with 23 hit by pitches.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 39-for-43 (90.7%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 39 steals...are 82-for-97 (84.5%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 88.1%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 82 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.82 ERA (78 er in 103.0 ip) in September, which is second highest in the majors (Orioles, 6.93)...have allowed 21 home runs in 12 games in September and 39 over the last 21 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.704) and slugging percentage (.397)...have the fewest walks (388), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (166)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in eight of the last 13 games...in four of those eight games of fewer than five innings, the starters have left with the lead...are 3-3 with a 5.71 ERA (40 er in 63.0 ip) over the last 13 games and 51-47 with a 3.91 ERA (349 er in 803.0 ip) overall...rank fourth in the American League in wins and fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.709)...lead the majors with 803.0 innings...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-9 with four saves, nine blown saves and a 6.58 ERA (58 er in 79.1 ip) over the last 21 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 26 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30)...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.689)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.430) and fifth highest batting average (.245) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (158).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 61 errors, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (60)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers for the fewest in the majors...the fewest outfield assists in a full season in Oakland history is 12 in 2003...have the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (107).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's led 6-0 entering the bottom of the third last night but lost 10-7...it was the second time this year the A's had a six-run lead and lost (Sept. 3 at Toronto)...are 19-25 (.432) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run decisions (44)...are 30-38 (.441) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 47-29 (.618) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 21 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Mariners for the best record in the AL (14-6, .700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Kansas City (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-33 (.529) on the road...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-34 (.541 at home)...rank third in the American League in OPS on the road (.749) and fourth in batting average (.247) and runs (348)...have the third lowest batting average (.228) and OPS (.700) at home and the fourth fewest runs (309).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 32-22 (.593) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-45 (.500) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (24-15/.615)...have used the injured list 23 times and currently have five players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 684 games to IL placements, an average of 29.7 games per stint...have used 136 different lineups in 143 games...have employed 48 players this year (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...lost the first game in Kansas City last night after winning three of four in Oakland in June...need one more win to clinch their third consecutive season series win and fourth in the last five years...have won 22 of their last 31 games against the Royals and have out-scored Kansas City 190-107 over that span (6.1 runs per game to 3.5 runs)...have won 11 of the last 15 games in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 330-269 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 180-120 in Oakland and 150-149 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among ML relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.228), third in OPS (.493), seventh in ERA (1.78), eighth in batting average (.171) and 10th in slugging (.265)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (403) and putouts (152) and ranks second in double plays (37)...**Starling Marte** is batting .345 (58-for-168) with 23 stolen bases and 17 multiple hit games in 40 games since he was acquired from Miami on July 28...the highest single season batting average in Oakland history by a player with at least 100 plate appearances is .350 by Catfish Hunter in 1971...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the AL in OPS (.911), tied for fifth in home runs (34), sixth in slugging (.542) and on-base percentage (.369) and tied for sixth in RBI (99).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommel defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in **1971** the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136...in **2020** the A's lose at Colorado 3-1 to complete a stretch where they played four games in three different cities in three different time zones over a three-day span of 56 hours and 47 minutes.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (9-9, 3.79 ERA)

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER: Is 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) and .196 (10-for-51) opponents batting average in two starts in September after going 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...his August ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...is now 11-3 with a 2.14 ERA (27 er in 113.1 ip) in 19 career starts in September compared to 8-12 with a 6.01 ERA in 26 career starts in August...his September ERA is his lowest for any month and the wins match his most (June)...his August losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.70), tied for fifth in games started (28), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.13), ninth in strikeouts (174) and on-base percentage (.298) and 10th in opponents OPS (.710) ...is the only AL pitcher and one of four in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY).

THE FIRST 14 AND THE LAST 14: Was 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts through June 14 but is 3-7 with a 4.66 ERA (39 er in 75.1 ip) in 14 starts since then...allowed eight home runs over his first 14 starts, 15 since then...struck out 78 over his first 14 (8.63 per nine innings) but has 96 since then (11.47 per nine innings).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .171 (24-for-140) batting average and .534 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .272 (128-for-470) with a .762 OPS against right-handers...his batting average and OPS against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .144/.466)...has issued 30 of his 37 walks to righties.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA (9 er in 27.0 ip) in five starts against American League Central teams this year and now has an 11-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 2.00 ERA (19 er in 85.1 ip) and .208 (65-for-312) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 14 starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 12-2 with a 2.55 ERA (29 er in 102.1 ip) in 17 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season today, which matches his career high...already has career highs in strikeouts (174) and home runs (23) and his 156.2 innings pitched are four short of his best of 160.2 in 2018...the A's are 7-3 in his no decisions and are 16-12 (.571) in his starting assignments...are 27-17 (.614) when he starts over the last three years...has allowed one run or fewer in 13 of his 28 starts but has received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his starts...is 0-7 with one run of support or fewer, 9-2 with two runs of support or more...has walked two batters or fewer 22 times, including nine starts with one walk and eight with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

CAREER NOTES: Is scheduled to make the 125th start of his career today, which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...his 621 strikeouts and 48 wins are also the most by an A's pitcher over that span...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more starts, wins and strikeouts are Barry Zito (224 starts, 102 wins, 1098 strikeouts), Tim Hudson (183, 92, 899) and Mark Mulder (150, 81, 668).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland, Sept. 3 at Toronto)...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the los-

ing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings... the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win over Chicago (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Abreu in the third inning but then retired 12 of the final 14 batters he faced...was relieved by Romo to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 3-1.

in the second but he gave both of those runs back in the third when Merrifield scored on a wild pitch and Perez homered...those were the only runs he allowed in 7.1 innings and he retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...the win came on Sept. 14, 2016 when he combined with Axford, Hendriks and Smith on a four-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Kansas City...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...was originally drafted by the Royals as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was traded to the A's with Aaron Brooks for Ben Zobrist and cash, July 28, 2015.

RHP Paul Blackburn (0-2, 5.24 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in three starts in August...is 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .441 opponents average in two starts in September...is now 0-6 with a 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average over his last 11 games, including eight starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-5 A's win over Texas last Friday in Oakland (2.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (10.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Kansas City, both in Oakland...the win came in his last start on June 7, 2018, a 4-1 A's win (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 so)...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.
