2008 A'S CHRONOLOGY

March 25

A's 5 vs. Boston 6 (@ Tokyo Dome, 10)
(0-1, 4th, -0.5)

The A's lose their first game of the season as they host the Red Sox in Japan. Joe Blanton makes his first Opening Day start and allows three runs and seven hits with one walk and three strikeouts over five and two-thirds innings of work for the no decision. Mark Ellis starts the scoring with a solo shot in the first inning, followed later by a RBI-ground out from Bobby Crosby to put two on the board. Blanton allows three runs in the top of the sixth to give up the lead, but the A's come back in the bottom of the inning with a single from Crosby followed by a two-run homer from Jack Hannahah to regain the lead at 4-3. Alan Embree (1.1 ip) and Keith Foulke (1.0 ip) work scoreless outings before handing the ball to Huston Street in the ninth inning who allows a home run to the second batter he faces to send the game to extra innings where he later allows a two-run double in the 10th that would cost the A's the game. Emil Brown has an RBI-double in the bottom of the inning but is tagged out at third base on the throw.

March 26

A's 5 vs. Boston 1 (@ Tokyo Dome)
(1-1, 1st, -)

The A's win their first contest of the season as Rich Harden goes six strong innings allowing only one run on three hits, walking three while striking out nine to earn the win. Chris Denorfia starts the scoring in the second inning by bringing home Bobby Crosby who doubled in the inning. Emil Brown continues the scoring the following inning with his first home run as an Athletic, a three-run shot. Harden allows only a solo home run to Manny Ramirez in the sixth inning before handing the ball over to Santiago Casilla, Keith Foulke and Alan Embree who each toss a scoreless inning to close out the game and split the A's two-game opening series in Japan.

April 1

A's 1 vs. Boston 2
(1-2, 4th, -0.5)

Joe Blanton makes the 100th start of his career but is tagged with his first loss of the season in the A's home opener. Jack Cust leads off the bottom of the second with his first long ball of the year for the A's lone run in the game. Blanton throws six innings, allowing two runs on seven hits and one walk while striking out three. Santiago Casilla pitches a scoreless seventh and eighth inning before Keith Foulke tosses a scoreless ninth. Kurt Suzuki singles to lead off the bottom of the third and Bobby Crosby singles to lead off the bottom of the eighth for the A's only other hits in the game. Travis Buck strikes out in all four of his plate appearances. Daric Barton also strikes out to close out the game and to end his streak of reaching base in each of his first 20 Major League games.

April 2

A's 0 vs. Boston 5
(1-3, 4th, -1.5)

The A's are shut out and swept for the first time this year in the finale of their two-game series with Boston. Rich Harden throws five scoreless innings allowing four hits and four walks while striking out six for the no decision.

Andrew Brown tosses two-thirds of an inning in relief of Harden. Alan Embree enters the game with two out and two on in the sixth in relief of Brown and stranded both runners to get out of the inning. Embree would then allow a double to start off the seventh and a home run to break the scoreless game. With those runs, the lefty is tagged with his first loss of the year. Lenny DiNardo starts off the eighth by allowing four straight singles and is replaced before recording an out, finishing with two earned runs. Santiago Casilla relieves DiNardo and allows only one hit and one of DiNardo's inherited runners to score in his inning of work. Huston Street pitches the ninth and allows a solo home run to cap off the scoring for Boston at five.

He allows back-to-back singles to lead off the sixth before he is taken out of the game with slight biceps tendonitis. Kurt Suzuki gets Oakland on the board first by scoring from third base on a passed ball in the second inning. The scoring continues for the A's in the fifth as the first four batters of the inning reach base followed by a sacrifice fly from Jack Hannahah and RBI-singles from both Kurt Suzuki and Ryan Sweeney to put the A's up 5-0. Santiago Casilla relieves Duchscherer in the sixth and induces a double play that allows one of his inherited runners to score. Keith Foulke gets the ball in the seventh and allows a home run to the first batter he faces before retiring the next three to complete his inning of work. Huston Street pitches the ninth, allowing a solo home run before closing out the game.

April 5

A's 6 vs. Cleveland 1
(3-3, 2nd, -1.0)

Oakland scores three runs in the first inning which is all the offense necessary to secure the win. Dana Eveland makes his debut as an Athletic and tosses seven strong innings, yielding one run on six hits and one walk while striking out seven to earn the win. Emil Brown starts off the scoring for the A's with an RBI-single in the first to bring home Daric Barton who had tripled, followed later in the inning by a two-run double from Jack Cust. Mark Ellis would tack on another run in the fifth with a solo shot, his second home run of the year, and would later single home two more runs in the eighth to cap off the scoring for the A's. Keith Foulke works a scoreless and hitless eighth and Andrew Brown retired the Indians in a row in the ninth to finish the game.

April 6

A's 1 vs. Cleveland 2
(3-4, 3rd, -1.0)

Joe Blanton works six and two-thirds innings but is tagged with his second loss of the season after scattering two runs on seven hits and four walks with two strikeouts.

Jack Cust brings two runs to the plate with a ground out in the sixth to break a 6-6 tie. Reliever Alan Embree, despite giving both runs back to the Indians in the eighth, would end up with the win thanks to Sweeney's effort in the ninth inning. Mike Sweeney got Oakland on board first with a RBI-double in the first inning. The A's would then put up five in the second with an RBI-ground out by Kurt Suzuki, RBI-doubles from Ryan Sweeney and Travis Buck, an RBI-triple from Mark Ellis and a sacrifice fly by Daric Barton. Chad Gaudin makes the start and goes four innings, allowing six runs, five earned, on eight hits and one walk with three strikeouts gets the no decision. Andrew Brown follows with two scoreless innings of work in the fifth and sixth, and Keith Foulke tosses a scoreless seventh. Huston Street throws a scoreless ninth inning for the A's first save of the year.

Oakland scores their game-winning run in the ninth inning for the second consecutive night as Mark Ellis' four hits help to complete an A's come-from-behind win. With the A's down 3-2, Ellis sparked a four-run rally in the top of the ninth inning with a game-tying triple to deep right. Emil Brown reaches on a fielder's choice two batters later to score Ellis and give Oakland a 4-3 lead. Greg Smith gives up only two hits in six innings of work with five walks and five strikeouts in his stellar Major League debut. Smith survives a rough first inning when he saw the Blue Jays score three runs, two of which are earned, before settling down and pitch five shutout innings. Santiago Casilla pitches a scoreless seventh. Fernando Hernandez pitched a scoreless eighth to earn the win and Huston Street tossed a scoreless ninth to earn his second save of the season.

April 10

A's 3 @ Toronto 2 (12)

(6-4, 1st, --)

Travis Buck produces all the offense the A's would need to complete the sweep, going 3 for 6 with three doubles and three RBI. Dana Eveland makes another solid start but ends up with the no decision after working six-plus innings of scoreless baseball, surrendering three hits, three walks with six strikeouts; the lefty leaves the game with a 1-0 lead. The A's get their first run in the fifth

with one of Buck's doubles that drives in Ryan Sweeney. Santiago Casilla works a scoreless two-thirds of an inning in relief of Eveland to finish the seventh. Alan Embree pitches the eighth and allows a triple to the first batter he faces, followed by a sacrifice fly that ties the game at 1-1 for the Blue Jays. The A's score five in the second thanks to RBI-doubles from Jack Cust, Mark Ellis and Daric Barton, along with a RBI-single from Chris Denorfia and a sacrifice fly from Mike Sweeney. Mark Ellis brings in another run on a sacrifice fly the following inning and Donnie Murphy two-run single in the fourth caps off the scoring for the A's and give Blanton a 9-1 lead. Blanton starts the eighth inning and records two outs before leaving the game after allowing two runs to score that inning and with two runners on. Fernando Hernandez relieves Blanton but hits the first batter he faces and walks in a run before he is pulled for Santiago Casilla. Casilla gives up a double to the first batter he faces and surrendered two more runs. Huston Street relieves Casilla that inning and retires his first batter to end the Indians' rally. Street retires Cleveland in order in the ninth to pick up his third save of the year.

The A's get another run in the next inning by a pinch-hit walk from Chris Denorfia with the bases loaded. Denorfia would remain in the game as Ryan Sweeney leaves with an injured leg. The A's once again rally in the seventh inning with Emil Brown's RBI-single and a three-run blast from Bobby Crosby for his first home run of the year. Joey Devine and Alan Embree each pitch a scoreless inning each of relief and Andrew Brown allows an unearned run to score in the ninth as he pitches the final two innings of the game.

April 13

A's 1 @ Cleveland 7

(8-5, 1st, +1.0)

Chad Gaudin goes six innings and allows three runs on four hits and four walks with four strikeouts for the loss to snap the A's five-game winning streak. Mark Ellis had a run-scoring single in the fourth to plate Travis Buck who had tripled to lead off the inning. That is all the offense the

A's can muster against Cleveland's Cliff Lee who retired the A's in a row in seven of his eight innings pitched. Fernandez Hernandez pitches two innings in relief of Gaudin and allowed four runs on four hits and two walks. Kurt Suzuki manages the only other hit for Oakland to leadoff the ninth inning.

April 14

A's 2 @ Chicago 1
(9-5, 1st, +1.0)

Greg Smith tosses seven strong innings, allowing only one run on six hits and one walk while striking out four to earn his first win of the season. Smith did his best to keep Chicago off the base paths, picking off Nick Swisher at first base in the third and Jermaine Dye who was caught stealing second base in the seventh. Kurt Suzuki goes 4 for 4 and gets Oakland on the board first with a run-scoring single in the fourth inning to plate Mike Sweeney. Emil Brown singles in Sweeney again in the sixth inning to give the A's a 2-0 lead. Chicago would get a run back in the bottom of the frame, their lone run of the game. Santiago Casilla records the first two outs of the eighth and Alan Embree gets the final out that inning before giving way to Huston Street who tosses a scoreless ninth to pick up his fourth save of the year.

April 15

(9-6, t-1st, --)

It takes the A's nine innings to score their first and only run of the game but it prove to be a lost cause as they split their two-game series with the White Sox in Chicago. Emil Brown brings home Daric Barton on sacrifice fly in the ninth and Bobby Crosby comes up next with one out and one on but grounds into a double play on the first pitch he sees to end the game. Dana Eveland makes the start and lasts four and two-thirds innings, scattering four runs, three earned, on five hits and three walks with two strikeouts en route to his first loss of the year. Eveland serves up a three-run homer to Carlos Quentin to put the A's down 0-3 early. Joey Devine tosses a scoreless inning and a third and Kirk Saarloos hurls two scoreless innings to shut down Chicago in relief of Eveland.

April 16

A's 2 vs. Seattle 4
(9-7, t-1st, --)

Joe Blanton goes eight innings but allows four runs on 12 hits while striking out two for his third loss of the season. Seattle scores three runs in the first inning, which would be all the offense their starting pitcher, Felix Hernandez, would need. The A's score in the second inning with a RBI-single from Kurt Suzuki as Hernandez retired 16 of the next 18 batters before allowing RBI-single from Daric Barton in the eighth inning. Hernandez strikes out eight and goes the distance for a complete game victory. Andrew Brown retires the Mariners in order for a scoreless inning of work in the ninth.

April 17

A's 1 vs. Seattle 8
(9-8, t-2nd, -1.0)

The A's drop their second in a row to Seattle and are swept in the two-game series. Lenny DiNardo makes the start, lasting only two and a third innings. He is unable to get through the third inning after loading the bases twice and walks in a run before he is lifted. DiNardo would

be charged with five runs, four walks and two strikeouts for his first lost of the year. Kirk Saarloos works five and two-thirds innings in relief of DiNardo and allows three runs, two earned, on four hits and two walks. Emil Brown triples home the A's lone run in the fourth inning, scoring Jack Cust. Joey Devine retires the Mariners in order for a scoreless inning of work in the ninth.

April 18

A's 13 vs. Kansas City 2
(10-8, 2nd, -1.0)

Bobby Crosby records five RBI, finishing 3 for 4 with three runs scored, as the A's rally from behind in the sixth inning to take the lead and win the game. Oakland gets on the board in the first inning with a RBI-single from Emil Brown to plate first-time leadoff hitter Kurt Suzuki. Chad Gaudin makes the start and surrenders two runs, one earned, against one walk with eight strikeouts over seven solid innings of work, en route to his first win of the season. The A's enter the sixth inning down 2-1 but receive singles from their first three hitters of the inning, followed by a two-run double by Crosby. After a sacrifice fly from Travis Buck and a run-scoring single from Jack Hannahan the A's finish the inning up 5-2. The A's scoring would not end there, as they erupt for eight runs in the eighth inning with a two-out rally, capped by a two-run double by Brown and a three-run blast by Crosby, his second home run of the year. Blanton then allows a solo home run in the next inning to tie the score at 4-4. The righty works seven and two-thirds innings, allowing nine hits, five runs, four earned runs, while striking out seven. Blanton gives the ball to Alan Embree with two outs and runners on first and third in the eighth. Embree allows a single to the only batter he faces which gives Minnesota a 5-4 lead and slaps Blanton with his fourth loss of the year. The A's rally in the seventh inning, scoring nine runs to secure the victory over the Texas Rangers. Mark Ellis starts the seventh with a single, followed by seven straight

Athletics safely reaching base. With the bases loaded and zero out, Jack Hannahan hammers a two-run double to right field. Bobby Crosby follows suit, driving in two runs to give Oakland an 8-7 lead. Jack Cust hits his ninth home run of the season, a two-run blast, to extend the A's lead. Oakland bats around, with Ellis capping the inning with a solo home run. Pitching in relief, Chad Gaudin allows just one hit in the sixth inning to earn his fourth win of the season. The Rangers score two runs in the first inning off starter Greg Smith, but the A's battle back to gain the advantage 4-2 before Texas scores five runs in the sixth. All that did was set up A's offensive explosion the following inning.

June 2

A's 3 vs. Detroit 2
(31-27, 2nd, -3.5)

Bobby Crosby collects his third career walk-off hit and gives the A's a 3-2 win over the Detroit Tigers. Kurt Suzuki leads off the ninth inning with a single off Francisco Crueceta, who was tagged with the loss, and advances to second on a sacrifice bunt from Jack Hannahan. Huston Street earns his first win of the season pitching a scoreless ninth in relief of Rich Harden. Harden scatters five hits, surrenders two runs in six and two-thirds innings of work. Mark Ellis drives in the game's first run with a sacrifice fly in the first inning to bring home Hannahan. Curtis Granderson leads off the sixth with a solo home run and the Tigers seize the lead the same inning on Jeff Larish's RBI-single. Daric Barton ties up the game with a solo home run in the seventh off Kenny Rogers, who historically has pitched well against the green and gold. Keith Foulke tosses a scoreless one and a third inning of work.

June 3

A's 5 vs. Detroit 4 (11 innings)
(32-27, 2nd, -3.5)

The A's finish the game in walk-off fashion for the second straight night as they edge the Detroit Tigers, 5-4. In the bottom of the 11th, Kurt Suzuki reaches base on a fielder's choice, Mark Ellis singles and Bobby Crosby walks to load the bases for Jack Cust, who takes two home run caliber hacks before hitting an infield single to Miguel Cabrera. The first baseman comes in to field the high chopper and with no one covering first base, Cust slides in safely, as Suzuki scores the game-winning run for the second consecutive game to conclude the wacky night. Both teams combine to walk 22 batters — it was first time the A's issue 12 walks and still hold on to win since April of 1982. Chad Gaudin gets the win, surrendering three hits over two scoreless innings to finish off the game. Dana Eveland starts and goes four and a third innings, allowing three runs on three hits and walking seven.

June 4

A's 10 vs. Detroit 2
(33-27, 2nd, -3.5)

The A's complete their fifth sweep of the season, beating the Detroit Tigers, 10-2, thanks to a two-out six-run rally in the seventh inning. Mark Ellis starts the inning with a walk and then scores on Daric Barton's two-out single. Travis Buck, who hit his second home run of the season in the sixth inning, reaches on an infield single in the seventh to load the bases for Carlos Gonzalez. Gonzalez hits a bases clearing double and becomes the first player in Oakland history to hit five doubles for his first five

career hits. Rob Bowen's RBI-single scores the outfielder. Jack Hannahan adds a double to score Bowen as the A's bat around. Despite issuing more than two walks for the first time in his career (5), Justin Duchscherer is credited with his fifth win of the season, going six-plus innings and limiting the Tigers to just two runs on three hits. Alan Embree finishes the seventh inning for Duchscherer and Brad Ziegler and Kiko Calero pitch a scoreless eighth and ninth inning respectively, to wrap up the game.

June 5

Off day
(33-27, 2nd, -3.5)

June 6

A's 1 vs. Los Angeles 3
(33-28, 2nd, -4.5)

Jack Cust hits his 10th home run of the season, a solo shot in the seventh inning, as the A's lose to the Angels. Joe Blanton makes a solid start, working seven innings and yields three runs, two earned, on seven hits and a walk. He is tagged with his eighth loss of the season. The A's manage only five hits and no walks against Angel pitching, leaving a total of four men on base in the game. Kurt Suzuki and Daric Barton each hit a double but neither make it past second base. Chad Gaudin works two scoreless innings in relief of Blanton for the A's bullpen, as Oakland falls four and a half games back behind the Angels in the American League West.

June 7

A's 3 vs. Los Angeles 5
(33-29, 2nd, -5.5)

Oakland mounts a rally late in the game on a pair of home runs from Travis Buck, a two-run blast to left field in the eighth inning, and Jack Cust's 11th home run of the season, a solo shot off Francisco Rodriguez in the ninth. But the A's ultimately fall 5-3 to the Angels. Greg Smith suffers his fifth loss of the season, going six and a third of an inning, giving up five runs on seven hits. Brad Ziegler and Keith Foulke each turn in scoreless innings of relief. Maicer Izturis leads off the game with a home run for the second straight night and becomes the first Angel to hit a lead off home run from different sides of the plate on consecutive games. Carlos Gonzalez leads the A's offensively and finishes the night going 2 for 4 with both his hits being doubles. He becomes the first Major Leaguer to record an extra base hit for his first seven career hits since Johnny Mize did so in 1936.

June 8

A's 7 vs. Los Angeles 3 (12 innings)
(34-29, 2nd, -4.5)

With the bases loaded in the 12th inning, Mark Ellis takes the first offering from Angles' Chris Bootcheck and smacks it down the left field line. The ball barely remains fair as it bounces off the foul pole and Ellis' grand slam seals the A's win over the Los Angeles Angels 7-3, in extra innings. It was the second baseman's third career grand slam, his second career walk-off home run, and was the fifth game-ending grand slam in Oakland history. It was the first walk-off grand slam for Oakland since Mark McGwire hit one out on June 30, 1995, also against the Angels. Brad Ziegler (1-0) earns his first Major League win, pitching a scoreless 11th and 12th. Rich Harden pitches six solid innings; including striking out the side on nine pitches in the first inning, and allowing three runs on

six hits but receives a no decision. Ellis scores the game's first run in the first inning when he doubles and then scores on Eric Chavez's single to snap Ervin Santana's 23 scoreless innings over the A's.

June 9

Off day

(34-29, 2nd, -4.0)

June 10

A's 1 vs. New York 3

(34-30, 2nd, -5.0)

The New York Yankees continue their dominance of the A's at McAfee Coliseum with a 3-1 win in the opening night of the three-game series. Chien-Ming Wang goes seven-plus innings and surrenders one run on seven hits. The Yankees strike first, scoring two runs in the opening inning to give New York the early lead, a lead they never relinquished. Mark Ellis leads the A's offensively, collecting three hits and driving in the A's only run of the game. Jack Cust reaches based on a single, advances to second on Eric Chavez' groundout and then scores on Ellis's RBI-double. Oakland leaves eight men on base. Dana Eveland endures the loss, pitching six innings, allowing two runs on four hits, walking six batters and fanning three. The loss for Eveland is his fifth of the season. Chad Gaudin works a scoreless inning and a third in relief of Eveland before Andrew Brown works a scoreless two-thirds of an inning. Keith Foulke allows a solo home run in his inning of work in the ninth inning.

June 11

A's 8 vs. New York 4

(35-30, 2nd, -5.0)

A few records fall in the A's 8-4 win over the New York Yankees. Jason Giambi hits his 192nd home run in the second inning off Justin Duchscherer to tie Tino Martinez for 14th place on New York's all-time home run list, which gives the Yankees the early 1-0 lead. But the A's explode the following inning, when Giambi's error allows Travis Buck to reach first base. After Kurt Suzuki fouls out, six straight Athletics pound out hits and score six runs to chase Darrell Rasner from the game. Duchscherer pitches seven innings giving up one run to earn his sixth win of the year. Kiko Calero enters in the ninth and gives up three runs, two earned, in one-third of an innings' work. Alan Embree finishes off the game, appearing in his 808th career game to pass Nolan Ryan and take sole possession of 38th place all-time in games pitched.

June 12

A's 1 vs. New York 4

(35-31, 2nd, -5.5)

The New York Yankees wins the rubber match of the three-game series, beating Oakland, 4-1, thanks to Hideki Matsui's grand slam in the sixth inning off Joe Blanton. It is Matsui's fifth career grand slam as the designated hitter celebrates his 34th birthday. Blanton, who had cruised through five scoreless innings before Matsui's slam, is charged with the four runs and six hits in six-plus innings of work and suffers his ninth loss of the year. Andy Pettitte and Mariano Rivera combine to limit the A's to just one run on five hits. Mark Ellis opens the second inning with a double and advances to third on Emil Brown's groundout. Carlos Gonzalez singles to score Ellis for the A's lone run of the game. Andrew Brown tosses a scoreless seventh

inning, striking out two in relief of Blanton, and Brad Ziegler pitches a 1-2-3 ninth.

June 13

A's 5 at San Francisco 1

(36-31, 2nd, -4.5)

The A's continue their dominance of the San Francisco Giants with a 5-1 win. Greg Smith, despite struggling with his command throughout the game, claims the win going five innings, yielding one run on three hits. However, he did issue six walks. With the bases loaded in the second inning, Omar Vizquel stole home to score the Giants' only run of the game. Barry Zito remains winless against his former club. Daric Barton starts the third inning with a single and scores on Ryan Sweeney's RBI-single. Jack Cust and Eric Chavez each drive in a run for the A's that same inning. Cust adds a sacrifice fly to score Mark Ellis in the seventh inning to round off the A's scoring. Chad Gaudin works two scoreless innings in relief of Smith and Keith Foulke retires the Giants in a row in the eighth. In the ninth, Huston Street has to battle the elements in addition to the Giants' lineup as AT&T Park's infield sprinkling system comes on right before Street delivers his first pitch to the final batter of the game. The A's closer, however, perseveres to give the A's the win.

June 14

A's 4 at San Francisco 0

(37-31, 2nd, -3.5)

Rich Harden allows one hit, fans nine in six innings and, with help from Brad Ziegler, Alan Embree, Keith Foulke and Huston Street, blank the Giants, 4-0. It is Harden's fourth win of the season. The Giants' Matt Cain gets the loss despite going seven innings, allowing three runs on six hits with 11 strikeouts. Ryan Sweeney singles in the first and scores the game's opening run on Jack Cust' RBI-double. Kurt Suzuki hit his first career triple in the seventh inning and comes home on a Daric Barton two-out sacrifice fly. In the eighth inning, with runners on the corners and one out, Mark Ellis scores on a wild pitch. The same thing happen the following frame when Carlos Gonzalez reaches base on a single, advances to third on Suzuki's single, and scores a wild pitch.

June 15

A's 5 at San Francisco 3

(38-31, 2nd, -3.5)

Eric Chavez goes 3 for 4 with one run scored and two RBI to help the A's complete their sweep of the Giants with a 5-3 win. Coming off the disabled list, Kevin Correia suffers the loss after surrendering five runs on seven hits in five-plus innings of work. Dana Eveland fares much better, going six-plus innings, scattering one run on six hits for the win. Chavez and the A's break the game open in the sixth inning scoring four runs, all started by the third baseman's RBI-single. With runners on first and second, Bobby Crosby jacks a RBI-double to center followed by Carlos Gonzalez's RBI-single to score Chavez. Daric Barton concludes the innings' scoring with a fielder's choice to short driving home Crosby. Brad Ziegler relieves Eveland in the seventh and records the first two outs before handing the ball to Alan Embree, who gets the final out of the inning. Keith Foulke pitches a scoreless eighth and Huston Street earns his 13th save of the season, pitching a 1-2-3 ninth.

June 16

(38-31, 2nd, -3.0)

June 17

A's 15 at Arizona 1
(39-31, 2nd, -3.0)

The A's explode for 15 runs on 15 hits, 11 of which are for extra bases and six of them home runs, as they defeat the Arizona Diamondbacks 15-1. Arizona's ace Brandon Webb is chased from the game in the fourth inning, his shortest outing since September 17, 2004 when he went only two innings. Mark Ellis leads the A's offense with two home runs and finishes 3 for 4, scoring four runs with four RBI. The second baseman starts the game with a double and then scores the first of the A's 15 runs on Eric Chavez groundout. Oakland scores at least a run in every inning except the sixth and the seventh, including an explosion of six runs in the ninth inning. Justin Duchschere pitches eight strong innings and limited the Diamondbacks to just one run on five hits; the righty also strikes out six batters to get his seventh win of the season. Andrew Brown pitches a scoreless ninth in relief to close out the game for the A's.

June 18

A's 1 at Arizona 11
(39-32, 2nd, -3.0)

After the previous night's offensive blowout, the A's bats go cold when Dan Haren pitches seven stifling innings, striking out eight and holding his former club to just one run on four hits. Arizona doesn't waste time getting on the scoreboard, driving in five runs in the first inning with four straight D'backs reaching base to start the game. Haren helps his own cause when he smacks a three-run double to center in the third inning. Joe Blanton lasts just three innings, giving up eight runs on seven hits and is tagged with his 10th loss of the season. The A's score their lone run of the game in the seventh inning when Carlos Gonzalez doubles and then comes home on Kurt Suzuki's RBI-single. Brad Ziegler pitched one inning in relief of Blanton. Chad Gaudin went two innings and surrenders three runs, including a two-run home run, and Kiko Calero tosses two innings, striking out three to finish off the game for the A's.

June 19

A's 1 at Arizona 2
(39-33, 2nd, -3.5)

Greg Smith allows only a run on three hits and three walks while striking out four over five innings but he does not factor into the decision. Jack Cust singles in Mark Ellis in the sixth inning for the A's lone run of the game. Jack Hannahan and Ryan Sweeney are the only two Athletics to collect multiple hits in the game for Oakland. Brad Ziegler tosses an inning and a third of scoreless relief of Smith before Alan Embree gets the final two outs to finish off the seventh inning. Keith Foulke allows a solo home run to the first batter he faces in the eighth inning and suffers his second loss of the season.

June 20

A's 7 vs. Florida 6 (11 innings)
(40-33, 2nd, -3.5)

Kurt Suzuki delivers the game-ending hit, driving in Jack Hannahan in the 11th inning to propel the A's to the 7-6 victory over the Florida Marlins. Eric Chavez reaches

based on Luis Gonzalez's error to start the 11th; Hannahan replaces Chavez as a pinch runner and scores on Suzuki's walk-off single. The catcher finishes 4 for 5 with a home run and five RBI. Suzuki hits his third home run of the season, a two-run shot to left field, in the fourth inning followed by Carlos Gonzalez's solo home run. It is the A's first back-to-back home runs of the season and it gives Oakland a 3-0 lead. Rich Harden lasts five and two-thirds innings, allowing one run on five hits and two walks while striking out five. Brad Ziegler records the final out of the sixth inning. Harden's pitching efforts is wasted as Florida battles back with four home runs, including Dan Uggla collecting his 22nd and 23rd home of the season. Uggla's second home run of the night comes in the ninth off Huston Street to force extra innings, giving Street his third blown save of the year. Andrew Brown works two scoreless innings and earns his first win of the season after Suzuki doubles in the winning run in the eleventh.

June 21

A's 4 vs. Florida 6
(40-34, 2nd, -4.5)

For the second straight night, the Florida Marlins rally late in the game. And this time they come out on top with the 6-4 win over the A's. Dan Uggla hits the go-ahead, three-run double in the ninth inning off Huston Street to secure the victory for the Marlins. Street suffers his second loss of the season, giving up those three runs on two hits and walks two in two-thirds of an inning of work. The A's attempt a comeback in the bottom of the ninth when Bobby Crosby singles and then is driven home on Kurt Suzuki's RBI-single. Florida's Kevin Gregg then loads the bases via walks before forcing Ryan Sweeney to ground out to end the game. Dana Eveland did not get a decision after struggling with his command throughout the game, scattering eight hits, two runs, two walks and four strikeouts in six-plus innings. Brad Ziegler works a scoreless two-thirds of an inning in relief before Alan Embree allows a solo home run during his inning of work in the eighth to absorb his third blown save of the season as the Marlins tie the game at 3-3. Huston Street enters in the ninth but lasts only two-thirds of an inning, allowing three runs for his second loss of the year. Chad Gaudin records the final out of the ninth for the A's bullpen.

June 22

A's 7 vs. Florida 1
(41-34, 2nd, -4.5)

Justin Duchschere secures his eighth win of the season, pitching the A's to victory with a dominating performance. He allows only one run, a home run to Jeremy Hermida, and six hits as the A's defeat the Florida Marlins, 7-1. Bobby Crosby has a RBI-single in the first to get Oakland on the board. The A's would follow with a four-run third inning that features a passed ball to score Donnie Murphy from third base and a failed double play attempt. Kurt Suzuki grounds out to first baseman Jorge Cantu, who then tries to complete a double play at home. Catcher Mike Rabelo misses the tag of Ryan Sweeney, who scores, and Emil Brown adds a two-run single. Carlos Gonzalez and Mark Ellis put on the double steal in the sixth inning, with Gonzalez stealing home and Ellis second base. Cust would single in the inning to bring home Ellis and cap the scoring for the A's. Andrew Brown records the final out of the eighth inning in relief of Duchschere and Chad Gaudin pitches a scoreless ninth to close out the game. Ellis and Manager Bob Geren were both ejected

after Ellis struck out looking with runners on second and third to end the seventh inning. Ellis' ejection was the first for Oakland on the season and the first of his seven-year career.

June 23

Off Day
(41-34, 2nd, -5.0)

June 24

A's 5 vs. Philadelphia 2
(42-34, 2nd, -5.0)

The Oakland A's score all five runs on home runs as they defeat the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-2, in a matchup of the one-time cross-town rivals. Philadelphia gets on the board first with a solo home run by Pat Burrell in the fourth. Jamie Moyer strikes out nine hitters, giving up three runs on five hits, but takes the loss despite limiting Oakland to just one hit going into seventh inning. Emil Brown gave the A's the lead with his three-run home run in the seventh, scoring Ryan Sweeney and Bobby Crosby, who each reach base on singles. Joe Blanton snaps a personal four-game losing streak, going seven innings and giving up one run on four hits. Shane Victorino scores the Phillies' other run on a Ryan Howard RBI-single in the top of the eighth off Alan Embree and Jack Cust adds a two-run opposite field home run that same inning to round out the scoring for the A's. Huston Street retires Philadelphia in order in the ninth to notch his 14th save of the season.

June 25

A's 0 vs. Philadelphia 4
(42-35, 2nd, -5.0)

The Philadelphia Phillies snap a six-game losing streak with the 4-0 win over the A's. Oakland is shut out for the seventh time this season as Phillies' Kyle Kendrick has a no-hitter going into the fifth inning when it is broken up by Jack Hannahan's ground-rule double, Oakland's only extra-base hit of the game. After walking Jack Cust in the first inning, Kendrick retires 11 consecutive batters before Hannahan's hit. Chase Utley breaks out of his 1 for 29 slump with four hits this game. Greg Smith is tagged with his sixth loss after pitching five-plus inning and giving up four runs on seven hits; Smith also walks two batters and fans three Philles before giving way to Chad Gaudin and the A's bullpen. Gaudin would go on to pitch a scoreless seventh before Santiago Casilla and Andrew Brown each toss a shutout inning in the eighth and ninth, respectively.

June 26

A's 5 vs. Philadelphia 0
(43-35, 2nd, -4.5)

Rich Harden and the A's return the favor in the rubber match between the two clubs, shutting out the Philadelphia Phillies 5-0. Harden goes eight solid innings, yielding just two hits while striking out 11 batters to earn his fifth win of the year. The A's didn't waste any time getting their offense started, scoring two runs in the first inning. Mark Ellis walks and scores on Ryan Sweeney's double. Jack Cust's RBI-single brings Sweeney home, however, Sweeney leaves the game with a sprained left ankle after scoring on a slide at the plate. Carlos Gonzalez adds to the A's lead with a solo home run in the sixth inning and Oakland tacks on two more runs in the eighth inning. Eric Chavez walks to start the eighth and scores on Jack Hannahan's RBI-double. The third baseman then scores

the A's fifth run of the game, aided by a fielding error by Shane Victorino. Andrew Brown pitches a scoreless ninth in relief of Harden to maintain the shutout for the A's.

June 27

A's 4 vs. San Francisco 1
(44-35, 2nd, -3.5)

The A's once again dominate their Bay Area rival with a 4-1 win at McAfee Coliseum, and extends their winning streak in the Bay Bridge series to seven straight games over the San Francisco Giants. Dana Eveland goes seven-plus inning, allowing one run on five hits to earn his sixth win of the season. The Giants score first in the third inning, but the A's respond in the fourth when Carlos Gonzalez doubles and then comes home on Jack Hannahan's RBI-single. Keiichi Yabu, pitching in relief of starter Kevin Correia, surrenders consecutive hits to Bobby Crosby, Carlos Gonzalez and Emil Brown. All three would later score and Brad Ziegler works a scoreless two-thirds of an inning in relief of Eveland. Huston Street pitches a perfect ninth inning with one strikeout to earn his 15th save of the season and to secure the win for the A's.

June 28

A's 0 vs. San Francisco 1
(44-36, 2nd, -3.5)

It is a classic pitchers' duel between aces Justin Duchscherer and San Francisco's Tim Lincecum, but the A's come out on the wrong end of the 1-0 game. Duchscherer pitches brilliantly and allows only three Giants to reach base; he goes eight solid innings of two-hit work, with the other base runner reaching base via a walk, but is tagged with his fifth loss of the season and his first loss at home. The last time A's pitchers allowed two hits and lost was July 20, 1994 when they also lost 1-0 to the New York Yankees. Fred Lewis starts the fourth inning with a single and then Ray Durham doubles shortly after. Lewis then scores the game's lone run when Randy Winn reaches based on a fielding error by Daric Barton. It was all the offense the Giants need that day with Lincecum — who surrenders five hits and strikes out 11 batters in seven innings of work — on the mound. Kurt Suzuki collects three hits and Mark Ellis reaches third base twice in the game but only be stranded both times. The A's strike out a total of 14 times, including three a piece by Carlos Gonzalez, Emil Brown and Jack Hannahan. Keith Foulke tosses a scoreless ninth in relief of Duchscherer. Rajai Davis steals his second bag of the game in the bottom of the ninth to move into scoring position with only one out but Daric Barton strikes out and Ellis grounds out to end the game.

June 29

A's 1 vs. San Francisco 11
(44-37, 2nd, -4.5)

Joe Blanton and the A's start the game well but then hit a buzzsaw in the fourth inning en route to an 11-1 loss to the San Francisco Giants. Blanton retires 11 straight batters before surrendering seven runs on eight hits as the Giants bat around in the both fourth and fifth innings. Jack Cust hits a solo home run in the second inning for the A's only run of the game as Jonathan Sanchez limits the A's to just that one run on four hits and strikes out six in seven innings. Blanton suffers his 11th loss of the season which ties an Oakland record for the second most losses before the All-Star Break. Santiago Casilla works the seventh inning and allows a two-run home run. One positive note

in the blowout was Brad Ziegler, who pitched a 1-2-3 eighth inning, extending his career-opening scoreless streak to 13 innings, passing Steve Ontiveros for the third longest such streak in Oakland history. Chad Gaudin pitches a scoreless ninth to finish the game for the A's bullpen.

June 30

A's 6 at Los Angeles 1
(45-37, 2nd, -3.5)

Greg Smith pitches the second complete game of his career and helps the A's defeat the Angels 6-1. Smith's previous complete game also came against Los Angeles when he was tagged with a 2-0 loss, but tonight the lefty limits the Angels' offense to one run, a solo home run from Mike Napoli, and four hits to earn his fifth win of the season. Bobby Crosby opens the second inning with a double, advances to third on a Carlos Gonzalez single, and scores on Mark Ellis' groundout. Daric Barton drives Gonzalez home with a two-out single to center to give the A's the 2-0 led. The A's strike again late in the game in three consecutive innings to tack on four more runs. In the seventh, Eric Chavez hits a two-run single, Ryan Sweeney slams a RBI-double to in the eighth inning and Ellis' single, aided by a Howie Kendrick error, scores Crosby in the final inning.

July 1

A's 3 @ Los Angeles 5
(45-38, 2nd, -4.5)

The A's squander an early 2-0 lead when the Angeles tie the game up in the bottom of the third inning. Bobby Crosby scores Ryan Sweeney on an infield single in the first inning and Mark Ellis scores on Sweeney's RBI-single in the second. Ellis collects two hits, two runs and an RBI. One of Ellis' hits is a solo home run, his ninth of the season, in the eighth inning to regain the lead for the A's. But the Angels score three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to secure the victory. Rich Harden goes five innings, scattering five hits and allowing two runs while striking out five, but does not register a decision. Brad Ziegler pitches two scoreless innings in relief and collects three strikeouts before giving way to Alan Embree in the eighth inning. July 2

A's 4 @ Los Angeles 7
(45-39, 2nd, -5.5)

The Oakland bullpen once again surrenders the tying and go-ahead run late in the game. In the sixth inning, Keith Foulke serves up an RBI-double and then surrenders a two-out, two-run homer as the Angels hold on to win. Dana Eveland starts for Oakland and pitches five and two-thirds innings, allowing three runs on four hits, walks one and strikes out four. The A's score their first run when Emil Brown doubles and baserunner Bobby Crosby scores on an Angels' throwing error. Mark Ellis' two-run single in the top of the sixth pushes the A's ahead of Los Angeles 3-2 before the Angels take control of the game late. Oakland gets one run back in the seventh when Rob Bowen reaches base on another throwing error that leads to Carlos Gonzalez arriving home safely. Santiago Casilla pitches the seventh inning and gives up a run and Chad Gaudin also gives up a run on one hit over his inning of work in the eighth.

July 3

A's 3 @ Chicago 2
(46-39, 2nd, -5.0)

A pair of home runs is all the A's need to defeat the Chicago White Sox. Jack Cust's 14th home run of the season, a two-run shot, in the fourth inning evens up the score at two apiece after starter Justin Duchscherer surrenders two runs, including a lead-off homer to Dewayne Wise, in the opening frame. Donnie Murphy hits a solo home run in the fifth inning to break the tie. After a shaky opening frame, Duchscherer settles down to earn his ninth win of the season, pitching seven innings, giving up two runs on five hits and two walks while striking out four. Alan Embree comes in to relieve Duchscherer in the eighth and gets the first out before surrendering a double. Huston Street is brought in get the final five outs of the game; he gives up one hit but strikes out three to earn his 16th save of the season.

July 4

A's 7 @ Chicago 1
(47-39, 2nd, -5.0)

The A's offense pounds out 17 hits en route to a 7-1 victory over the White Sox in the second game of their four-game series. Jack Cust and Donnie Murphy each collect two hits and drive in two runs while Wes Bankston and Emil Brown both have three-hit games. Every A's hitter records a hit with the exception of Mark Ellis, who instead draws four walks. Oakland does however leave 13 runners stranded in the game. Joe Blanton wins his fifth game of the season after tossing seven solid innings, surrendering one run on six hits and two walks while striking out five. Brad Ziegler and Santiago Casilla pitch a scoreless eighth and ninth inning, respectively, to shut down the White Sox the rest of the way.

July 5

A's 1 @ Chicago 6
(47-40, 2nd, -5.0)

Ryan Sweeney's solo home run in the ninth inning keeps the A's from being shut out by the White Sox as they lose 6-1. All but two of the game's seven runs come off homers. Oakland only manages four hits off Chicago's pitching staff with Wes Bankston and Sweeney each collecting two. Sweeney reaches base in all four of his plate appearances, drawing two walks in addition to his pair of hits, one of which is his third home run of the year. Former Athletic Nick Swisher goes 1 for 3 with a home run, one RBI and scores two runs against his old ball club. Greg Smith takes the loss, his seventh of the year, after allowing four runs on five hits, two home runs and six walks while striking out five over five innings pitched. Chad Gaudin and Jerry Blevins each toss a scoreless inning in relief. Andrew Brown works the eighth inning and allows a solo home run.

July 6

A's 3 @ Chicago 4
(47-41, 2nd, -6.0)

The A's attempt a comeback in the ninth but ultimately fall short a run for back-to-back losses against the White Sox. Rob Bowen's two-run double in the seventh inning scores the A's first runs of the game. Trailing in the ninth, Mark Ellis drives home Jack Hannahan with a RBI-single to make it a one-run game, but with runners on first and second Jack Cust flies out to end the game. Rich Harden is tagged with his first loss of the season after throwing

five innings, allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits and four walks while striking out four. Santiago Casilla, pitching in relief of Harden, gives up a run over an inning and a third pitched. Jerry Blevins tosses a final scoreless one and two-thirds innings.

July 7

A's 4 vs. Seattle 3
(48-41, 2nd, -6.0)

Oakland erases an early 3-0 deficit to win 4-3 and snap their eight-game home losing streak to the Mariners. Richie Sexson belts a three-run home run off starter Dana Eveland in the first inning to give Seattle the early lead; it is Eveland's first home run allowed since May 21. But Eveland settles down after the rough first inning to earn the win after going five-plus innings, allowing three runs against nine hits and four walks. Mark Ellis' RBI-single in the third scores the A's first run and Oakland takes control of the game with a three-run fifth inning that is highlighted by Wes Kingston's first career home run, a two-run shot to left field, and Ryan Sweeney's run-scoring single. Brad Ziegler, Alan Embree, and Huston Street combine to shut down Seattle the remainder of the game with Street getting his 17th save of the season.

July 8

A's 2 vs. Seattle 0
(49-41, 2nd, -5.0)

Justin Duchscherer tosses the first complete game of his career, a two-hit shutout, to lead the A's past the Mariners 2-0. Oakland strikes early, scoring their first run in the first inning on an Emil Brown RBI-single and a sacrifice fly from Donnie Murphy in the second that scores Kurt Suzuki, which is all the A's would need for the victory. With the win, Duchscherer, who allows just the two hits and strikes out four, becomes the fifth Oakland pitcher since 1993 to earn 10 wins before the All-Star Break. Offensively for the A's, Ryan Sweeney, Suzuki and Jack Hannahan each collect two hits off Seattle's Carlos Silva, who also pitches a complete game.

July 9

A's 4 vs. Seattle 6
(49-42, 2nd, -5.0)

Joe Blanton surrenders five runs in the fifth inning as the A's lose 6-4 to Seattle. Blanton is tagged with his 12th loss of the season, matching his season total from 2005 and 2006, after surrendering six runs on nine hits with two strikeouts over six innings of work. Jack Cust gets the A's on the board with a solo home run in the second inning, snapping a 0 for 18 hitless streak. Donnie Murphy drives in three more runs for Oakland with a bases-clearing double in the fourth inning. Jerry Blevins, Santiago Casilla and Andrew Brown each toss a scoreless inning in relief to shut down Seattle the rest of the way.

July 10

A's 3 vs. Seattle 2 (11)
(50-42, 2nd, -5.0)

Three late solo home runs account for all the A's offense, including Emil Brown's first career walk-off homer in the 11th inning. Jack Cust hits his 17th home run of the season to open the ninth and bring the A's within one before Kurt Suzuki slams a pinch-hit home run to left field to tie the game. Suzuki's blast is Oakland's first pinch-hit home run since August 28, 2006. Greg Smith makes the start and gets the no-decision despite tossing a scoreless six

innings, allowing just four hits and one walk. Brad Ziegler pitches a scoreless seventh inning before giving way to Santiago Casilla who gives up a run after recording only one out in the eighth. Jerry Blevins is called upon to finish out the inning. Alan Embree gives up the tying run in his inning of work in the ninth before Huston Street tosses a scoreless 10th and 11th inning, allowing only one hit to earn his second win of the season.

July 11

A's 9 vs. Los Angeles 2
(51-42, 2nd, -4.0)

Sean Gallagher earns his first win in his Oakland debut as the A's defeat their division rival Los Angeles. Gallagher goes seven innings, allowing two runs on two hits, three walks and fans seven. The A's put up six runs in the third and chase the Angels' Jon Garland from the game. In the third, six of the first seven A's batters reach base safely and all come around to score. Matt Murton, also recently acquired with Gallagher in the Rich Harden trade and making his debut with Oakland, has a two-run single in the inning. The A's belt out 15 hits led by Emil Brown and Jack Hannahan, who both have three-hit games. Hannahan collects three RBI on the day. Andrew Brown and Dallas Braden each pitch a scoreless inning in relief of Gallagher to secure the win.

July 12

A's 1 vs. Los Angeles 4
(51-43, 2nd, -5.0)

Oakland scores their only run of the game in the eighth inning when Emil Brown hits a two-out single and is followed by a RBI-double from Carlos Gonzalez. Both players are the A's only batters to have multiple hits in the game, with each collecting two. Dana Eveland is tagged with his sixth loss of the year after tossing five and one-third innings, allowing two runs on five hits, five walks and five strikeouts. Santiago Casilla works one and a third inning in relief of Eveland and surrenders one run on two hits and a walk. Brad Ziegler gets the ball next and works a scoreless one and a third innings. Huston Street shuts down the Angels in the ninth.

July 13

A's 3 vs. Los Angeles 4
(51-44, 2nd, -6.0)

Huston Street gives up the tying and go-ahead runs in the ninth inning as the A's drop the rubber match of their three-game series against the Angels. Oakland gets the early lead, scoring two runs in the first inning on RBI-singles from Emil Brown and Carlos Gonzalez. Justin Duchscherer tosses seven and two-thirds innings and surrenders two runs on five hits, one home run and two walks while striking out three for the no-decision. Duchscherer has his 18-inning scoreless streak snapped in the fourth when Howie Kendrick drives home the Angels' first run. Brad Ziegler records the final out of the eighth in relief of Duchscherer. With Oakland leading 3-2 entering the ninth, Street allows the first two batters he faces to reach base and then a sacrifice fly to tie the game and a RBI-single to give the Angels the lead. He is tagged with his fourth blown save and third loss of the year.

A's 1 @ New York 7
(51-45, 2nd, -7.0)

Greg Smith lasts only three and two-thirds innings, allowing six runs on eight hits and five walks for his eighth loss of the season. The A's start the scoring in the first inning with a RBI-ground out from Ryan Sweeney that plates Mark Ellis, but that would be the only time in the game Oakland moves a runner past second base. Jerry Blevins relieves Smith and tosses a scoreless inning and a third. Dallas Braden relieves Blevins and allows a run over his inning of work in the sixth. Andrew Brown and Lenny DiNardo toss a scoreless seventh and eighth inning respectively to shut down New York the rest of the way. Oakland leaves seven men on base.

July 19

A's 3 @ New York 4 (12)
(51-46, 2nd, -8.0)

Ryan Sweeney comes through with the go-ahead RBI in the top of the ninth for Oakland but Huston Street finds himself with a blown save as the A's drop their fourth game in a row. Sean Gallagher makes the start and works five innings, allowing two runs on seven hits and four walks while striking out seven. Alan Embree, Santiago Casilla and Brad Ziegler each toss a scoreless inning in the sixth, seventh and eighth for the A's bullpen, before Huston Street allows a run to score on three hits and a walk in the ninth for his fifth blown save of the year. Jerry Blevins throws a scoreless 10th and Lenny DiNardo a scoreless 11th before hitting a batter with the bases loaded and one out in the 12th for his second loss of the season. The A's get their first run in the fifth on a sacrifice fly from Ryan Sweeney and tack on another in the seventh after Wes Bankston scores on a wild pitch. Sweeney finishes the day 2 for 4 with two RBI.

July 20

(51-47, 2nd, -9.0)

Oakland drops their fifth game in a row as they are swept by the Yankees in their three-game series. Justin Duchscherec makes the start and allows two runs on six hits and three walks while striking out four, but is left with his sixth loss of the year as the A's manage only one run in the game. Oakland gets its lone run in the sixth on a RBI-single from Ryan Sweeney. The A's leave a total of two men on base in the game as they manage only five hits and no walks. Alan Embree relieves Duchscherec and tosses a scoreless eighth inning. Rajai Davis is caught stealing second base with two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning to end the game.

July 21

A's 0 @ Tampa Bay 4
(51-48, 3rd, -9.0)

The A's drop their sixth consecutive game as they are shut out in the first game of their three-game set against the Rays. Ryan Sweeney and Jack Cust collect the A's only two hits in the game. Oakland does get their leadoff batter aboard via walk in four innings but would leave five men total on base in the game. Dana Eveland works five innings and allows all four of Tampa Bay's runs against seven hits, two home runs and four walks while striking out four for his seventh loss of the year to even his record at 7-7. Andrew Brown works two scoreless innings in relief of Eveland, and Santiago Casilla loads the bases

with one out in the eighth but strikes out his next two batters to complete his scoreless inning of work.

July 22

A's 8 @ Tampa Bay 1
(52-48, 2nd, -9.0)

Oakland snaps their six-game losing streak with an 8-1 win over Tampa Bay. Jack Hannahan leads the A's offensively, going 2 for 4 with a three-run home run in the fourth inning to score the A's first runs of the game, and finishes the night with a career-high four RBI. Oakland pads their lead with four more runs in the eighth inning when Kurt Suzuki has an RBI-double, Bobby Crosby hits a sacrifice fly, and Hannahan singles in Rajai Davis and Carlos Gonzalez, who scores on an error by Tampa Bay. Ryan Sweeney scores in the ninth inning on another error from the Rays. Dallas Braden surrenders four hits, four walks and strikes out one over five innings to earn his second win of the year. Jerry Blevins works a scoreless sixth before Brad Ziegler works a scoreless seventh and eighth to extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 23 2/3 innings. Huston Street shuts down the Rays in the ninth to secure the victory.

July 23

A's 3 @ Tampa Bay 4
(52-49, 2nd, -10.0)

The A's mount a ninth-inning rally but fall one run short in the series-finale against the Rays. Emil Brown starts off the second inning with a solo home run, his eighth of the year, and Carlos Gonzalez follows with a solo shot of his own, his third of the year. Greg Smith works six-plus innings, allowing four runs on five hits, two home runs and two walks while striking out four for his ninth loss of the season. Smith starts the seventh and allows a double to the first batter he faces before handing the ball to Santiago Casilla who allows Smith's runner to score. Alan Embree records the final two outs of the seventh before Jerry Blevins tosses a scoreless eighth. Oakland enters the ninth down 4-2 and gets a run on a sacrifice fly from Emil Brown. Bobby Crosby grounds out with a runner at first to end the game.

July 24

A's 6 vs. Texas 14
(52-50, 3rd, -11.0)

Sean Gallagher makes the start and works five and a third innings, allowing five runs, one earned, on nine hits, five walks and two home runs while striking out five for the no-decision. The A's get on the board first with a five-run third inning featuring RBI-singles from Carlos Gonzalez and Brooks Conrad and a two-run single by Jack Hannahan. Jerry Blevins relieves Gallagher and allows a run to score over his inning and a third for his first loss of the season. Brad Ziegler tosses an inning and a third in relief of Blevins to match George McQuillan's 101-year old major league record with 25 consecutive scoreless innings to start a career. Alan Embree tosses a third of an inning and allows four runs before Andrew Brown allows four runs in two-thirds of an inning, as the A's fall to third place in the American League West.

July 26

A's 4 vs. Texas 9
(52-51, 3rd, -12.0)

Justin Duchschere makes the start and surrenders a career-high eight runs on nine hits, two walks and two home runs while striking out six in six innings for his seventh loss of the year. Bobby Crosby brings the first A's run to the plate on a RBI-single in the third inning, followed by a sacrifice fly from Wes Bankston. Emil Brown tacks on another run in the fifth with a solo home run, his ninth of the year. Mark Ellis scores the A's final run of the game with a solo home run to lead off the ninth inning, his tenth of the season. Lenny DiNardo works three innings in relief of Duchschere and allows a solo home run.

July 27

A's 6 vs. Texas 5
(53-51, 3rd, -11.0)

Kurt Suzuki goes 3 for 4 with three RBI as the A's jump to an early 6-1 lead. Dana Eveland starts and throws four and two-thirds innings, allowing five runs on eight hits and two walks while striking out five for the no-decision. Jack Cust starts the scoring for the A's in the first inning with a two-run home run, his 19th of the year. Jack Hannahan continues the scoring in the next inning with an RBI-double to plate Bobby Crosby, followed a batter later by Kurt Suzuki with a three-run shot, his fifth of the season. Jerry Blevins records the final out of the fifth inning and tosses a scoreless sixth that would earn him the first win of his Major League career. Dallas Braden gets the start and works six and two-thirds innings, allowing four runs on a pair of two-run home runs while striking out seven, but is tagged with his first loss of the season. Carlos Gonzalez gets Oakland on the board in the fourth inning with a double to score Kurt Suzuki from first base. Ryan Sweeney drives in the A's only other run in the eighth with a single to plate Eric Patterson. Santiago Casilla relieves Braden in the seventh and records the final out of the inning and two more in the eighth. Alan Embree records the final out of the eighth in relief of Casilla and tosses a scoreless ninth to finish the game for the A's bullpen, as Oakland drops the first game of their three-game set against Kansas City.

July 29

A's 2 vs. Kansas City 5
(53-53, 3rd, -13.0)

Greg Smith works seven innings but allows five runs on four hits, two home runs, and two walks while striking out five for his 10th loss of the season. Mark Ellis singles in the first A's run in the fourth inning and Bobby Crosby brings in the only other A's run in the seventh on a RBI-ground out to score Ellis. Jerry Blevins tosses a scoreless eighth inning and Lenny DiNardo a scoreless ninth to finish the game for the A's bullpen. Oakland loses for the second consecutive game to fall to the .500 mark for the first time since April 8, when they were 4-4.

July 30

A's 3 vs. Kansas City 4 (10)
(53-54, 3rd, -14.0)

Huston Street walks the first batter he faces to start the 10th inning before surrendering a double and a sacrifice fly that scores the go-ahead run as the Royals complete the sweep of the A's with a 4-3 win. Oakland generates 13 hits and six walks but squanders most of their scoring opportunities, stranding 15 runners. Sean Gallagher hurls five innings, scattering three runs on five hits, three walks and while striking out four, but does not factor in the decision. Brad Ziegler tosses three scoreless innings to extend his Major League record career-opening scoreless streak to 30 innings. He also becomes the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to throw 30 or more consecutive scoreless innings. Justin Duchschere starts for the A's and works six innings, allowing one run on three walks and five hits while striking out two, but would not factor in the decision. Santiago Casilla tosses a scoreless seventh before Brad Ziegler works a scoreless eighth and ninth. Huston Street and Jerry Blevins toss a scoreless 10th and 11th inning respectively. Alan Embree starts the 12th and gets two outs before allows the game-ending run for his fourth loss of the season.

August 2

A's 2 @ Boston 12
(53-56, 3rd, -15.5)

Emil Brown puts Oakland on the board early in the game with a two-run home run in the first inning, his 10th of the season, but that would be all the offense the A's could muster as they drop their fifth game in a row. Dana Eveland starts and lasts only two innings, allowing nine runs on eight hits, two home runs and two walks for his eighth loss of the season. Lenny DiNardo relieves Eveland in the third inning and allows one of Eveland's runners to score before retiring the side. DiNardo finishes the game for the A's bullpen, working six innings and allowing three runs on six hits, a home run and three walks while striking out two. Designated hitter Frank Thomas is the only Athletic to record multiple hits, going 2 for 4, as the A's collect seven hits and leave five men on base.

August 3

The A's manufacture only two runs on one swing of the bat for the second day in a row, as Daric Barton belts a two-run home run in the fifth inning, his fourth of the year. Santiago Casilla relieves Braden and allows an inherited runner to score before working a scoreless fifth inning. Joey Devine allows a single and a walk without retiring a batter in the sixth inning before Alan Embree retires the next three batters, allowing one unearned run on a sacrifice fly. Greg Smith starts and works six innings, allowing two runs on four hits and two walks while striking out four. Brad Ziegler works a scoreless seventh and eighth to extend his consecutive scoreless inning streak to 34, setting a new record for Oakland relievers. Mark Ellis puts the A's on the board first with a run-scoring single in the second inning and Bobby Crosby adds a two-run triple in the fourth to cap the scoring for Oakland. Rookies Ryan Sweeney and Carlos Gonzalez finish 3 for 5 and 4 for 4, respectively. Street starts the ninth and records two outs before allowing two runs on three hits and a walk for his fifth loss of the season. It is the A's eighth consecutive loss.

August 6

A's 1 @ Toronto 5
(53-60, 3rd, -17.5)

Gio Gonzalez makes his Major League debut and takes the loss after allowing four runs on four hits, a home run and two walks while striking out four in six innings. Gonzalez allows a three-run home run in the first inning but settles down to retire 15 of 16 batters before allowing a single to start the seventh that chases him from the game. Santiago Casilla allows Gonzalez's runner to score before Joey Devine induces a double play to end the inning. Bobby Crosby provides the A's only run with a solo home run, his sixth of the year, to lead off the sixth inning. The A's start off the seventh with two singles and a walk to

load the bases with no outs but Mark Ellis grounds into a force out at the plate followed by a double play from Jack Hannahan. The A's manage only the three hits in the game and leave a total of four men on base as they lose their season-high ninth game in a row.

August 7

A's 4 @ Toronto 6
(53-61, 3rd, -18.0)

Justin Duchscherrer starts and works five innings, allowing four runs on seven hits and two walks while striking out six, but does not factor in the decision. The A's get on the board first in the second inning with a RBI-double from Bobby Crosby, followed by a two-run home run from Daric Barton, his fifth of the season. Ryan Sweeney adds a solo home run to lead off the fifth, his fourth of the year, which caps the scoring for the A's. Jerry Blevins starts the sixth and loads the bases before hitting a batter to force in a run and give the Blue Jays a 5-4 lead. Joey Devine relieves Blevins and allows one of Blevins runners to score on a sacrifice fly. Devine tosses a scoreless seventh before Brad Ziegler adds a scoreless eighth. Blevins is charged with his second loss of the season and the A's drop their season-high 10th consecutive game.

August 8

A's 4 @ Detroit 2
(54-61, 3rd, -18.0)

Dallas Braden allows two runs on five hits and a walk while striking out two over seven innings for his third win of the season. Brad Ziegler completes a six-out save for the first save of his career as the A's snap their 10-game losing streak. Oakland scores three times in the fifth inning on a bases loaded two-run single by Rajai Davis and a RBI-single by Mark Ellis. Emil Brown leads off the sixth with a solo home run, his 11th of the season, to cap the scoring for the A's, but that was all they would need to secure the victory. Ziegler tosses a scoreless eighth and ninth to extend his consecutive inning scoreless streak to 37 innings, tying the Oakland club record set by Mike Torrez in 1976.

August 9

A's 2 @ Detroit 10
(54-62, 3rd, -19.0)

The A's collect 10 hits but scored just two runs and leave eight men on base as they fall to the Tigers. Frank Thomas clubs a solo home run in the first inning, his eighth of the season, but starter Dan Meyer would not be able to hold the lead. Santiago Casilla works a scoreless sixth before Alan Embree allows a three-run home run in the seventh inning. Lenny DiNardo allows four runs, three earned, on five hits in the eighth. Bobby Crosby and Kurt Suzuki come up with back-to-back hits to start the ninth, but the next three A's batters are retired in order to end the game.

August 10

A's 1 @ Detroit 6
(54-63, 3rd, -20.0)

Greg Smith lasts only four and two-thirds innings, surrendering one run on a solo home run, scattering three hits and walking a career-high seven batters while striking

out two for his 11th loss of the year. The A's score their first and only run in the eighth inning on a Mark Ellis single that plates Jack Hannahan. Huston Street relieves Smith in the fifth inning with two out and two on and strikes out the first batter he faced to end the inning. Street then allows three runs in the sixth before Joey Devine ends the threat and tosses a scoreless seventh. Jerry Blevins allows two runs, one earned, in the eighth. Emil Brown doubles to start the ninth but the next three hitters are retired in order as the A's drop the rubber-match of their three-game series against the Tigers.

August 11

August 12

A's 2 vs. Tampa Bay 1

(55-63, 3rd, -20.0)

Rookie Gio Gonzalez makes his first start at McAfee Coliseum and earns his first Major League win after throwing five-plus innings and allowing one run on five hits and four walks while striking out five. Gonzalez starts the sixth and allows a single and a walk to the first two batters before being relieved by Jerry Blevins, who sets down the next three hitters. Blevins also tosses a scoreless seventh. Bobby Crosby provides the A's offense with his seventh home run of the season, a two-run shot, in the second inning. Joey Devine tosses a scoreless eighth before Brad Ziegler adds a scoreless ninth to pick up his second save and extend his career-opening scoreless streak to 38 innings. The streak sets an Oakland record for the longest scoreless streak and an American League rookie record for the longest scoreless streak, breaking a 90-year old mark set by the Yankees' Hank Thormahlen in 1918.

August 13

A's 2 vs. Tampa Bay 3

(55-64, 3rd, -20.0)

Justin Duchscherec works six and a third innings but is charged with three runs on six hits, two home runs and a walk while striking out a career-high eight, only to suffer his eighth loss of the year. Jerry Blevins replaces Duchscherec in the seventh inning and allows an inherited runner to score. The A's only offense in the game comes from Eric Patterson, who singles with the bases loaded in the fifth to bring two runners home in Bobby Crosby and Jack Hannahan. Alan Embree shuts down the Rays in the eighth inning and Huston Street follows with a scoreless ninth. Jack Cust leads off the ninth with a walk and is replaced by pinch runner Rajai Davis, who is caught stealing second base.

August 14

A's 6 vs. Tampa Bay 7 (12)

(55-65, 3rd, -20.5)

Brad Ziegler allows the first run of his career in the ninth to break a 4-4 tie and snap his career-opening scoreless streak at 39 innings, a modern Major League record to start a career. The A's rally with a run of their own in the bottom half of the inning before falling short in the 12th to drop the rubber match of their three-game set against the Rays. Sean Gallagher starts and works four innings, allowing three runs on four hits and four walks while striking out four. Carlos Gonzalez gets the A's on the board with a two-run home run in the first, his fourth of the

season. Daric Barton adds a two-run double in the second. Dan Meyer starts the fifth allows a run before handing Alan Embree get the final out to end the inning. Embree adds a scoreless sixth before Joey Devine shuts down the Rays in the seventh. Brad Ziegler hurls a scoreless eighth inning before allowing the go-ahead run in the ninth. Frank Thomas' RBI-single in the bottom half of the inning ties the game. Huston Street sets down Tampa Bay in order in the 10th and Santiago Casilla works a scoreless 11th inning. Casilla then allows two runs in the 12th and is tagged with his first loss of the season. The A's score once in the bottom of the 12th but it is not enough as they fall by a final score of 7-6. The A's use seven pitchers in the game and Tampa Bay uses eight for 15 altogether.

August 15

A's 6 vs. Chicago 4

(56-65, 3rd, -19.5)

Mark Ellis and Jack Cust each hit solo home runs in the eighth inning to tie the game and Kurt Suzuki hits a pinch-hit walk-off two-run home run as the A's take game one of their three-game series against the White Sox. Dallas Braden starts and works seven innings, allowing three runs on seven hits and one walk while striking out four, but does not factor in the decision. Jerry Blevins allows a solo home run in the eighth inning and Huston Street tosses a scoreless ninth for the win, his third of the year. The A's get on the board in the sixth on a two-run home run by Jack Cust, his first of the game. Ellis starts the eighth inning with a solo shot of his own, his 11th of the year, and is followed two batters later by Cust's second home run of the game, a solo shot and his 22nd of the season.

August 16

A's 1 vs. Chicago 2

(56-66, 3rd, -20.5)

Greg Smith allows two runs on eight hits and two walks while striking out one over five innings but is charged with his 12th loss of the season as the A's manage just one run and drop their second game against Chicago to even the three-game series at a game apiece. Emil Brown drives in the A's lone run in the third inning on a single to plate Kurt Suzuki. Santiago Casilla tossed one and a third scoreless innings and Alan Embree gets the final two outs of the seventh inning. Joey Devine shuts down Chicago in the eighth and Dan Meyer follows with a scoreless ninth. The A's put runners in scoring position in each of the first four innings, including a bases loaded situation in the fourth, but come up empty, as they ground into two costly double plays. Oakland strands nine after collecting six hits.

August 17

A's 1 vs. Chicago 13

(56-67, 3rd, -20.5)

Gio Gonzalez makes the third Major League start of his career but struggles after working just three and a third innings. He allows eight runs, seven earned, on six hits, three home runs and five walks while striking out two for his second career loss. Daric Barton collects two of the A's four hits, one of which drives in the A's lone run in the eighth on a RBI-single to plate Cliff Pennington. Jerry Blevins replaces Gonzalez in the fourth inning and induces groundball double play from the first batter he faces to get out of the inning. Blevins goes on to toss a scoreless fifth and sixth. Dan Meyer gets the ball to start the seventh and allows five runs total in the inning, four

of which come on a grand slam. Meyer, however, retires the sides in order in the eighth and ninth to shut down Chicago the rest of the way. The A's do not draw a walk and strike out 10 times.

August 18

A's 3 @ Minnesota 2
(57-67, 3rd, -19.5)

Oakland jumps out to an early 3-0 lead behind Mark Ellis' lead-off shot in the first inning, his 12th home run of the season, and the A's tack on two more in the fourth. Frank Thomas walks to start the inning and Cust doubles to put runners at second and third. Kurt Suzuki then singles to score Thomas and Cust. Justin Duchscherer lasts only two and two-third innings, allowing three hits and striking out three before leaving due to an injury. Kirk Saarloos earns his first win after working a scoreless three and two-thirds innings in relief of Duchscherer. Alan Embree strikes out the only batter he faces in the seventh before Huston Street records the final out of the inning. Street allows a single in the eighth before Brad Ziegler comes in and allows a RBI triple. A second run scores in the ninning on Eric Patterson's throwing error. Ziegler recoups with a scoreless ninth to notch his third save of the year.

August 19

A's 2 @ Minnesota 13
(57-68, 3rd, -19.5)

Kurt Suzuki's hits his seventh home run of the season, a solo-shot, in the second inning to give the A's an early lead. However, Oakland pitching falls apart and surrenders 13 runs on 16 hits as the A's fall 13-2. Jack Hannahan drives in the only other Oakland run in the fourth when his double brings home Bobby Crosby. Starter Sean Gallagher is tagged with 10 runs on 11 hits, two home runs, three walks and two strikeouts over five innings and suffers his second loss of the year. Santiago Casilla also is roughed up in his two innings of work allowing three runs on five hits, while walking one. Joey Devine enters the game in the eighth and has a shutdown inning in the A's loss.

August 20

A's 1 @ Minnesota 3
(57-69, 3rd, -20.5)

Oakland grabs the early lead for the second day in a row but also fails to keep it for the second day in a row. Mark Ellis reaches first on a Minnesota fielding error in the first and advances to second on Emil Brown's single before Jack Cust's infield single scores Ellis for the A's lone run. Brown is the only Athletic with multiple hits as he records two in the game. Dallas Braden takes the loss, his third of the season, after yielding three runs on six hits and three walks while striking out seven over five and two-third innings. Huston Street throws a scoreless one and a third innings with two strikeouts and Alan Embree strikes out one in a scoreless eighth inning.

August 21

A's 2 @ Seattle 0
(58-69, 3rd, -19.5)

Greg Smith shuts out the Mariners over six innings, allowing four hits and three walks, while striking out one, as the A's defeat Seattle in the first meeting of their four-game series. Smith snaps a personal six-game losing streak to earn his sixth win of the season. Emil Brown hits a two-out, solo home run in the sixth, which is all Oakland

would need with Smith's dominating performance. The home run is Brown's 12th of the year. Carlos Gonzalez adds an insurance run in the ninth with his RBI-single. Joey Devine hurls a shutdown seventh and Brad Ziegler adds two scoreless innings to earn the save, his fourth of the year, and complete the shutout.

August 22

A's 5 @ Seattle 7
(58-70, 3rd, -19.5)

The day after Oakland pitching shuts out the Mariners, the A's fall 7-5 to Seattle. Rajai Davis gets the A's on the board first with a solo shot in the fourth inning, his second of the year, after he comes off the bench in the third to replace Jack Cust who leaves the game because of blurred vision. Davis and Bobby Crosby lead Oakland offensively, each finishing the game with three hits. Starter Gio Gonzalez does not factor into the decision after pitching five innings, scattering four runs, two earned, on five hits and three walks while striking out seven. Jerry Blevins pitches one and two-third innings on relief, surrendering the tying run in the sixth and the go-ahead runs in the seventh, and is tagged with his third loss of the season. Alan Embree tosses a scoreless one and a third innings to shutdown Seattle the rest of the way.

August 23

A's 5 @ Seattle 1
(59-70, 3rd, -19.5)

Dana Eveland turns in seven strong innings, allowing one run on five hits and one walk, while striking out seven as the A's come out victorious in Seattle. Wladimir Balentien's RBI-double in the seventh inning spoils the shutout for Oakland as the A's guarantee themselves at least a series split and snap their streak of losing 11 consecutive series. Daric Barton's two-run home run in the fourth gets the A's on the board. The home run for Barton is his sixth of the year. Bobby Crosby, who finishes the night with three hits for the second consecutive night, drives home Eric Patterson with a single in the fifth inning and again scores Patterson with a run-scoring single in the seventh. Frank Thomas tacks on another run with a RBI-single, capping the scoring for Oakland. Huston Street and Joey Devine throw a scoreless eighth and ninth, respectively, to shutdown Seattle the rest of the way and secure the win.

August 24

A's 4 @ Seattle 8
(59-71, 3rd, -20.5)

Jack Hannahan records the first multi-home run game of his career but it is not enough as the A's are doubled up by Seattle to finish their four-game set at two games apiece. Dan Meyer starts and works five innings, allowing four runs on three hits, one home run and two walks while striking out three for his second loss of the season. Hannahan starts the scoring with a solo home run in the first inning and adds the A's second run with another solo home run in the third, his seventh of the season. Rob Bowen adds a solo shot of his own in the fifth, his first of the year, and Eric Patterson drives in a run on a RBI-groundout in the seventh to complete the scoring for the A's. Kirk Saarloos works two innings in relief of Meyer and allows four runs on five hits and one walk. Santiago Casilla tosses a scoreless eighth.

August 25

A's 2 @ Los Angeles 1
(60-71, 3rd, -19.5)

Dallas Braden turns in a solid performance, tossing seven innings and allowing only one run on a solo home run in the sixth. The lefty allows seven hits, two walks, and strikes out eight for his fourth win of the season. Oakland's bullpen shuts down the Angels in the final two frames. Joey Devine strikes out two in eighth and Brad Ziegler earns his fifth save of the year with a perfect ninth. The A's score first in the third inning on a solo home run by Daric Barton, his seventh of the season. Frank Thomas walks with one out in the fourth and advances to third on Jack Hannahan's double before coming home on a wild pitch to score the A's go-ahead run.

August 26

A's 1 @ Los Angeles 5
(60, 72, 3rd, -20.5)

The A's fall to Los Angeles in the second game of the series on a complete game effort from the Angels John Lackey. Greg Smith takes the loss, his 13th of the season, after allowing five runs on 10 hits and two walks, while striking out three over six innings. Oakland scores its lone run of the game in the ninth inning on Jack Cust's 23rd home run of the season to keep the A's from being shutout. Rajai Davis is the only Athletic to have multiple hits in the game as he records two. Santiago Casilla and Jerry Blevins each pitch a scoreless inning of relief to shutdown the Angels the rest of the way.

August 27

A's 6 @ Los Angeles 5
(61-72, 3rd, -19.5)

The A's put up five runs in the second inning to take a 6-0 lead that would stand to be just enough for the win. Emil Brown singles home a run in the first and Eric Patterson collects a RBI-single to start the second inning. Bobby Crosby then doubles to tack on two additional runs for the A's and Brown adds a two-run home run, his 13th of the year. Gio Gonzalez starts for the A's but lasts only three innings. He allows four runs on three hits and five walks, while striking out four. Alan Embree surrenders a run on one hit and a walk while retiring one batter in the fifth inning before Santiago Casilla is called on to record the final two outs of the frame. Jerry Blevins adds two-thirds of an inning of scoreless relief and Huston Street pitches one and two-thirds innings to earn the win, his fourth of the year. Brad Ziegler hurls a scoreless one and two-thirds innings to earn his sixth save. With the victory, the A's win their first series in their last 12 tries.

August 28

A's 3 vs. Minnesota 2
(62-72, 3rd, -19.5)

Kurt Suzuki comes in as a pinch-hitter in the bottom of the ninth and hits a walk-off double that brings home Ryan Sweeney as the A's defeat the Twins in the first meeting of their four-game series. It is Suzuki's second game-ending pinch-hit of the season as he becomes the first Athletic since Frank Fernandez in 1970 to have two walk-off pinch hits in a season. Daric Barton gets the A's on the board in the fourth with a groundball double play that scores Frank Thomas. Barton tacks on another run in the sixth with a RBI-single. Dana Eveland starts for the A's but is saddled with a no decision after going seven innings. He surrenders two runs on five hits and

three walks while striking out two. Jerry Blevins throws a perfect eighth and Joey Devine picks up his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless ninth, thanks to Suzuki's efforts in the bottom half of the frame.

August 29

A's 2 vs. Minnesota 12
(62-73, 3rd, -20.5)

Dan Meyers remains winless, losing his third game of the year after allowing six runs, two earned, all in the second inning before being chased from the game in the A's loss. The lefty yields four hits and two walks, while striking out two in one and two-thirds innings of work. Frank Thomas and Kurt Suzuki both collect two hits for the A's and Jack Cust knocks in Oakland's two runs in the fourth with a two-run homer to right field, his 24th of the year. Kirk Saarloos pitches five innings in relief of Meyer and surrenders five runs on 12 hits while striking out four. Santiago Casilla throws two and a third innings, yielding one run on four hits, to finish the game.

August 30

A's 3 vs. Minnesota 2
(63-73, 3rd, -20.5)

With runners on first and second and no outs in the ninth, Ryan Sweeney drops down a bunt that would stand to be the winning play as both runners come around to score on a throwing error by Minnesota's Joe Nathan. Jack Cust homers for the second consecutive day with his solo shot in the fifth that makes it a one-run game. The home run for Cust is his 25th of the year. Dallas Braden scatters two runs, one earned, on seven hits and two walks while striking out two over six innings but does not factor into the decision. Alan Embree pitches the seventh inning and walks one before giving way to Huston Street who gets his fifth win of the year after hurling two scoreless innings with three strikeouts.

August 31

A's 4 vs. Minnesota 12
(63-74, 3rd, -20.5)

Greg Smith is roughed up in five innings of work, allowing eight runs on seven hits, two home runs and three walks while striking out four in his 14th loss of the year. Jack Hannahan's RBI-double in the fourth gives the A's their first run of the game. With the bases loaded in the eighth, Daric Barton draws a walk to bring home Ryan Sweeney and Aaron Cunningham comes through a batter later with a two-run single for his first Major League hit. Keith Foulke and Jerry Blevins each throw a scoreless inning off relief before Alan Embree works the eighth and allows two unearned runs. Brad Ziegler tosses the ninth and allows two runs, one earned, on one hit and one walk in the A's loss.

Daric Barton leads Oakland offensively and accounts for all of the A's runs in a 3 for 3 performance. He delivers a triple in the second inning to score Jack Cust and later hits a lead-off home run in the fifth, his eighth of the season. Gio Gonzalez is tagged with his third loss after allowing

four runs, three earned, on two hits, both home runs, and three walks while striking out five over four innings. Santiago Casilla relieves Gonzalez in the fifth inning but surrenders a run. Josh Outman makes his Major League debut and throws two scoreless innings. Joey Devine retires the Royals in order in the eighth.

September 3

A's @ Kansas City – Postponed, Rain
(63-75, 3rd, -21.0)

September 4

A's 4 @ Kansas City 5 (10)
A's 6 @ Kansas City 9
(63-77, 3rd, -22.5)

After dropping the first game of their doubleheader against the Royals in extra-inning fashion the A's lose the second games as well and are swept by Kansas City. Dana Eveland starts game one and goes six innings, allowing four runs on 10 hits while striking out five in a no decision. Huston Street tosses two scoreless innings in relief of Eveland before Joey Devine hurls one and a third and is tagged with the loss after surrendering the game-ending run in the 10th inning. The A's score three runs in the fifth on a Bobby Crosby RBI single and a Jack Cust two-run double. Daric Barton hits his ninth home run of the year in the sixth, a solo shot to tie the game, before the A's fall in extra-innings. Ryan Sweeney goes 3 for 4 with three doubles in the second game, collecting three RBI and scoring two runs. Dan Meyer starts and takes the loss in the night-cap after working just three and a third innings. He allows eight runs, seven earned, on nine hits and two walks while striking out one. Kirk Saarloos relieves Meyer and allows an inherited runner to score while tossing one and two-third scoreless innings. Alan Embree allows a run in the sixth before Keith Foulke and Jerry Blevins shut down Kansas City in the seventh and eighth, respectively.

Orioles' pitching unravels further and walks home three straight before recording the inning's first out. Bobby Crosby walks to bring home Jack Hannahan for the fourth run of the inning. Emil Brown files out for the second out before Davis belts a two-out grand slam, the first of his career. Dallas Braden gets the win after working five innings and allowing two runs, one earned, on four hits and one walk while striking out three. Jerry Blevins, Joey Devine, Keith Foulke and Brad Ziegler combine to shutdown Baltimore the rest of the way to secure the victory for the A's. The four-RBI for Davis are a career-high.

September 6

A's @ Baltimore – Postponed, Rain
A's 6 @ Baltimore 1
(65-77, 3rd, -21.0)

The A's scheduled doubleheader turns into just one after game one is postponed due to rain. Oakland wins

game two for their second straight victory and secures a series win over the Orioles behind Jack Cust's two home run night. Cust starts the scoring for the A's in the first inning with a sacrifice fly to drive in Rajai Davis. In the second, Cust pads Oakland's lead with a lead-off home run followed by another solo shot in the fourth inning, his 27th of the season. Jack Hannahan hits a solo homer of his own in the fifth inning before Davis triples in another run. Greg Smith shuts out Baltimore over seven innings and allows three hits and five walks while striking out two for his seventh win of the year. Huston Street enters the game in the eighth and surrenders a run on two hits while striking out one. Brad Ziegler pitches a scoreless ninth to close out the game for the A's.

(65-78, 3rd, -22.0)

The A's get off to an early lead with two runs in the first inning on a Daric Barton RBI-triple and a Kurt Suzuki RBI-single but rookie Gio Gonzalez finds himself in trouble early. Gonzalez lasts only an inning and two-thirds, allowing nine runs, eight earned, on five hits, three home runs, two walks and one strikeout for his fourth career loss. After Gonzalez gives up a grand slam and hits his next batter he is replaced by Josh Outman in the second inning. Outman records the final out of the inning but goes on to allow three runs over his next two innings. Santiago Casilla works a scoreless fifth and sixth before Alan Embree allows a run in the seventh and Jeff Gray yields a run in the eighth. The A's bat around in the fifth and put up five runs in the inning, but that would be all the offense Oakland could muster, in dropping the first game of their three game set against Detroit. Kurt Suzuki goes 3 for 5 with a RBI while Rajai Davis and Jack Hannahan each collect two hits and drive in two runs.

Oakland gets on the board in the sixth on a RBI-ground out from Daric Barton that scores Rajai Davis, who had tripled earlier in the inning. Joey Devine tosses a scoreless seventh and comes away with the win, his fifth of the year. Davis laces another triple in the eighth to bring in a run and scores on a sacrifice fly by Emil Brown, which gives the A's a 3-2 lead. Huston Street starts the eighth and records the first two outs before handing the ball to Brad Ziegler with the bases loaded. Ziegler strikes out the final batter in the eighth and then tosses a scoreless ninth to notch his seventh save of the season.

(67-78, 3rd, -21.0)

Ryan Sweeney and Jack Cust go back-to-back in the first inning to jump out to a 2-0 lead and the A's never look back as they win their second game in a row and take their three-game set against Detroit, two games to one.

Eric Patterson tacks on another run in the fourth with a RBI-single and Aaron Cunningham drives two more in the inning to cap the scoring for Oakland at five. Jerry Blevins works a scoreless fifth before allowing three straight singles to start the sixth. He is relieved by Santiago Casilla, who allows two runs to score before Alan Embree gets the final out of the inning. Huston Street works a scoreless seventh and earns his sixth win of the season. Joey Devine tosses a scoreless eighth before Brad Ziegler shuts the Tigers down in the ninth for his eighth save.

September 11

(67-79, 3rd, -22.0)

Dallas Braden makes the start and allows six runs, five earned, on nine hits and three walks in four-plus innings and is tagged with his fourth loss of the season. Braden starts the fifth and allows a solo home run to the first batter he faces before Kirk Saarloos enters and works three scoreless innings. Keith Foulke hurls a scoreless eighth inning before Jeff Gray retires the Rangers in order in the ninth. Cliff Pennington knocks in the A's only run in the sixth inning a sacrifice fly that plates Jack Cust. Cust strikes out three times to set an Oakland record for strikeouts in a single season at 176.

September 12

A's 0 vs. Texas 7
(67-80, 3rd, -23.0)

The A's are shutout by Texas rookie Matt Harrison, who tosses the first complete game of his career and sends Oakland to their second straight loss. Greg Smith starts and allows six runs on seven hits, two home runs and two walks while striking out two over five and two-thirds innings for his 15th loss of the year. Jeff Gray relieves Smith in the sixth inning and gets the final out of the inning before running into trouble in the seventh, allowing a run to score. Alan Embree enters with one out and the bases loaded and needs only three pitches to induce an inning-ending double play. Gio Gonzalez retires the Rangers in order in the eighth and ninth.

September 13

A's 7 vs. Texas 1
(68-80, 3rd, -23.0)

Josh Outman makes his first Major League start and comes away with a win after working five innings and allowing just one run on four hits and two walks while striking out three. Huston Street, Jerry Blevins, Joey Devine and Brad Ziegler each toss a scoreless inning of relief to shut down Texas the rest of the way. Jack Cust gets Oakland on the board with a two-run home run in the fourth inning, his 29th of the season. The A's follow up with five more runs in the next inning on a two-run single from Aaron Cunningham and a bases-clearing double from Bobby Crosby.

September 14

Aaron Cunningham hits the first home run of his career, a three-run shot in the eighth inning to break a 4-4 tie and give the A's their second straight win. Dana Eveland works five innings and allows three runs on four hits and four walks while striking out six. Alan Embree tosses a scoreless sixth before Huston Street gets the ball in the

seventh and allows the tying run to score for his seventh blown save of the year. Jerry Blevins relieves Street in the seventh and retires the first batter he faces to get out of the inning. Jack Cust singles in a run in the first to get Oakland on the board early and Cliff Pennington follows with a RBI-single of his own in the next inning. Ryan Sweeney comes up with a bases-loaded single in the sixth to drive in two more runs to give the A's a 4-3 lead. After Street allows the game to be tied in the seventh, Joey Devine works a scoreless eighth and Cunningham gives the A's a 7-4 lead in the bottom half of the inning to give Devine his sixth win of the year. Ziegler shuts down Texas in the ninth for his ninth save of the season.

Sean Gallagher works seven solid innings, allowing only one run on four hits and no walks while striking out six for his fifth win of the season, his second with the A's. Jack Hannahan gets Oakland on the board in the fifth with a solo-shot, his ninth of the year, and Ryan Sweeney singles in another run in the inning. Kurt Suzuki scores from third base on a wild pitch in the sixth and Daric Barton doubles in another run in the inning before Oakland puts up three runs in the seventh on two bases-loaded walks and a bases-loaded hit-by-pitch. Travis Buck pads the A's lead with one last run in the eighth inning, giving Oakland an 8-1 advantage. Alan Embree and Jerry Blevins each retire the side in order in the eighth and ninth respectively to finish the game and secure the victory over their division-rivals.

A's pitching blanks the Angels for eight straight innings before Brad Ziegler allows his first home run, a two-run shot in the ninth, to give Los Angeles a 2-1 lead in a game that would end in walk-off fashion for the A's in the bottom half of the inning. Greg Smith is dominant over six scoreless innings, allowing four hits and one walk while striking out four. Huston Street and Joey Devine each retire the side in order in the seventh and eighth respectively, before Ziegler allows a two-run home run to Mark Teixeira for his first blown save in 10 career save opportunities. Ziegler would come away with the win, however, after Oakland rallies in the bottom of the ninth and capitalizes on two errors to score two runs against Los Angeles' Francisco Rodriguez. Cliff Pennington singles with two on and no outs in the ninth to score Daric Barton and Jack Hannahan comes home on a throwing error to give the A's a 3-2 victory.

The A's rally in the bottom of the ninth inning but come up short as they can not complete the three-game sweep of their division-rival Los Angeles. Josh Outman makes the start and allows three runs on six hits and three walks while striking out four over four and one-third innings and is tagged with his first career loss. Santiago Casilla

replaces Outman with one out in the fifth and allows two of Outman's runners to score, one on a steal of home by Torii Hunter. Alan Embree shuts down the Angels in the sixth before Keith Foulke allows a career-high tying three home runs in the seventh. Jeff Gray and Dan Meyer toss a scoreless inning in the eighth and ninth respectively. Oakland starts off the ninth by loading the bases with no outs and scores four times on RBI-singles by Carlos Gonzalez and Kurt Suzuki, a bases loaded walk by Jack Cust and a RBI-groundout by Aaron Cunningham. Dana Eveland is dominant over seven scoreless innings, allowing seven hits while striking out seven for his ninth win of the season. Joey Devine retires the Mariners in order in the eighth and Brad Ziegler gets out of a bases loaded jam in the ninth to earn his 10th save of the year. Travis Buck sends a solo shot into right field to start the fourth inning for the A's, his fourth home run of the year, which gives Oakland all the offense they would need to notch the win. Kurt Suzuki adds a run in the fourth on a RBI-single that plates Ryan Sweeney, who had doubled in the inning. Jack Cust fans in the fourth inning for his 187th strikeout on the season, setting a new American League record for strikeouts, breaking Milwaukee's Rob Deer's record of 186 set in 1987.

September 20

Daric Barton comes through with a run-scoring single in the eighth inning to give Oakland an 8-7 lead and the A's never look back as they win their second consecutive game of the three-game set against Seattle. Kirk Saarloos makes the start and allows five runs on seven hits and one walk over three and a third innings pitched. Jerry Blevins relieves Saarloos in the fourth and tosses one and two-third scoreless innings. Jeff Baisley drives in the first runs of his career with a two-run single in the second that gets Oakland on the board and adds another two-run single in the fourth inning, finishing 2 for 2 with four RBI. Alan Embree allows a two-run home run in the sixth that gives Seattle a 7-4 lead. Carlos Gonzalez delivers a RBI-single in the bottom half of the inning and Rob Bowen follows with a two-run double to tie the game. Sean Gallagher works six and two-thirds innings, allowing three runs on four hits and three walks while striking out five. Jerry Blevins relieves Gallagher and allows two inherited runners to score before recording the final out of the inning. Carlos Gonzalez collects the first hit of the game for Oakland with a double in the sixth inning. Bobby Crosby knocks in the first A's run in the seventh with a RBI-double and

is followed by pinch hitter Aaron Cunningham, who drills the first pitch he sees into left field for a two-run double that ties the game at 3-3. Cust comes through in the next inning with a two-run home run for his career-high 30th of the season to give Oakland a 5-3 lead. (75-81, 2nd, -22.0)

Travis Buck comes through in the 11th inning with a RBI-single to plate Cliff Pennington as the A's win their fourth consecutive game and move into second place in the American League West for the first time since July 24. Greg Smith pitches five innings and allows two runs on six hits and two walks while striking out one. Oakland gets on the board in the second on a two-run single by Pennington, and tacks on another in the third on a RBI-double from Jack Cust for a 3-2 lead. Jerry Blevins, Huston Street and Joey Devine each work a scoreless inning in the sixth, seventh and eighth respectively, before Brad Ziegler allows the second home run of his career in the ninth that ties the game and saddles Ziegler with his second career blown save. Ziegler is replaced by Alan Embree who gets the final out in the ninth before working a scoreless 10th for his second win of the year. Santiago Casilla works a scoreless bottom half of the 11th to pick up his second save of the season.

Travis Buck goes 2 for 3 with a two-run home run, but the A's fall short against the Rangers and have their four-game winning streak snapped. Josh Outman starts and works six innings, allowing three runs on 10 hits and two walks while striking out four. Jack Cust gets Oakland on the board in the second inning with a solo-home run, his 31st of the year, and Buck adds two more with a two-run shot in the third, his fifth of the season. Cliff Pennington drives in a run on a groundout in the seventh inning to cap the scoring for the A's at four. Alan Embree allows three runs in the seventh inning to give Texas a 6-4 lead and is tagged with his fifth blown save and fifth loss of the season. Gio Gonzalez works a scoreless eighth before the A's go down in order in the ninth to end the game and fall from second place in the American League West.

Jack Cust homers for the second consecutive game but the A's are out hit 17-10 and drop the rubber match of their three-game set against the Rangers. Dana Eveland works five-plus innings and allows seven runs on eight hits, two home runs and three walks while striking out four to even his record at 9-9. Eveland hits the first batter he faces to start the sixth and allows a home run to the next batter before handing the ball to Santiago Casilla who is also unable to record an out in the inning, allowing four runs on three hits and a walk. Casilla is relieved by Jeff Gray who allows two of Casilla's runners to score before allowing two runs of his own. Cliff Pennington gets Oakland on the board in the second with a RBI-single and Cust hits his 32nd home run of the year, a solo-shot

in the sixth inning. Rob Bowen adds another run in the seventh on a RBI-double before Chris Denorfia caps the scoring for the A's in the eighth with his first home run of the season, also a solo-shot. Dan Meyer starts the seventh and allows a home run to the first batter he faces before shutting down the Rangers the rest of the way.

Jack Cust homers for the third consecutive game and Travis Buck goes 2 for 5 with four RBI but the A's fall short by two runs for their third consecutive loss. Sean Gallagher is tagged with his seventh loss of the year after allowing eight runs on 10 hits and one walk while striking out four over four and two-thirds innings pitched. Jerry Blevins relieves Gallagher with two outs in the fifth and allows his only inherited runner to score before allowing two runs of his own on a two-run home run. Gio Gonzalez shuts the Mariners down the rest of the way for Oakland in the sixth, seventh and eighth and strikes out four. The A's get on the board with two in the second on a Jack Cust solo home run, his 33rd of the year, and a Jeff Baisley single before Buck adds three more in the fourth on a three-run home run, his sixth of the year.

September 27

A's 3 @ Seattle 7

(75-85, 3rd, -23.5)

The A's drop their fourth game in a row, losing 7-3 despite out-hitting Seattle 10-8. Oakland leaves a total of nine men on base in the game. Greg Smith works seven innings and allows six runs, five earned, on five hits and two walks while striking out three for his team-leading 16th loss of the season. Seattle does all of their damage against Smith in the first inning, after which he settles down to retire 19 of his last 21 batters. Smith also records his 16th pickoff of the season in the second inning to tie Texas' Charlie Hough (1988), Atlanta's Charlie Leibrandt ('92) and Philadelphia's Terry Mulholland ('92) for the most pickoffs since 1987. Brad Ziegler works the eighth and allows a run on three hits.

September 28

A's 3 @ Seattle 4

(75-86, 3rd, -24.5)

The A's take an early lead with three runs in the first inning on a Travis Buck leadoff home run, his seventh of the year, and a two-run double from Chris Denorfia. However, that would be all the A's could muster as they are shutout the rest of the way for their fifth consecutive loss and the three-game sweep by Seattle to end their 2008 season. Josh Outman works six innings and allows four runs, three earned, on eight hits and one walk while striking out five for his second career loss. Jerry Blevins and Joey Devine work scoreless innings in the seventh and eighth to respectively to finish the game for the A's bullpen. Oakland collects 10 hits but leaves a total of nine men on base for the 4-3 loss to the Mariners.
