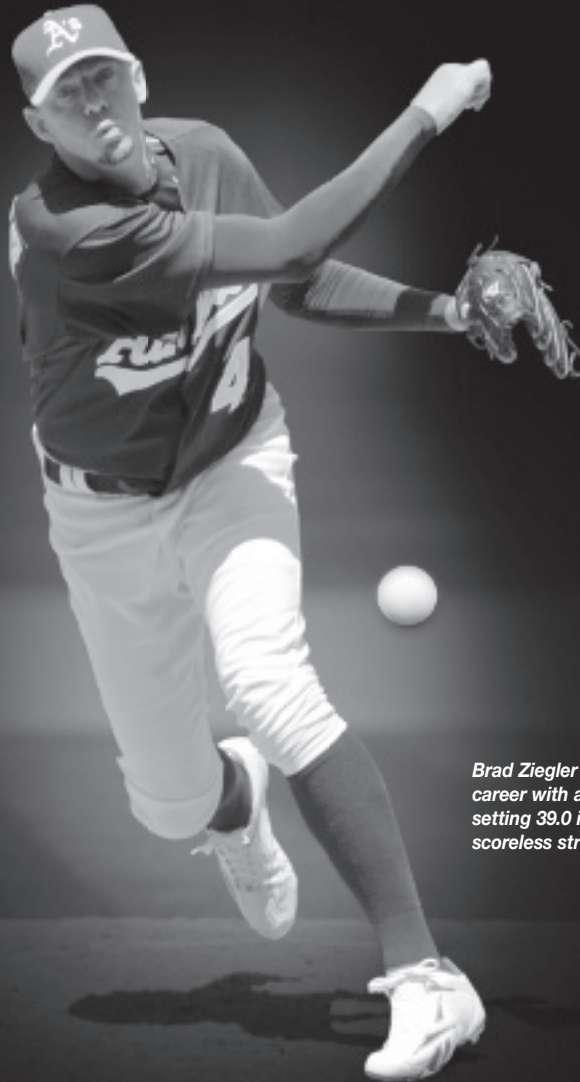


# REVIEW

## 2008 SEASON IN REVIEW

**2008 RECAP:** The A's finished the 2008 season with a 75-86 record, which was one-half game short of their 76-86 mark from 2007...this marks the first time the A's have endured back-to-back losing seasons since 1993-98 when they had six straight...the .466 winning percentage was 11th lowest in the A's 41 years in Oakland and it was their worst since they went 74-88 (.457) in 1998...finished in third place in the American League West for the second consecutive season, 24½ games behind Los Angeles...that was the A's largest deficit in the West since they finished the 1997 season 25 games behind Seattle...finished seventh in the Wild Card race, 19½ games behind Boston, which was their most games out of a playoff spot since the 25-game deficit in 1997...spent seven days in sole possession of first place in 2008, 19 days tied for first, 83 days in second, one day tied for second, 69 days in third and five days in fourth...had a strong first half as they went 51-42 (.548) over their first 93 games through July 11...were in second place in the AL West at the time and trailed Los Angeles by four games...then went 24-44 (.353) from July 12 until the end of the season...that was the second worst record in the AL over that span (Baltimore, 22-47) and fourth worst in the majors...began the season in Japan, splitting a two-game series with Boston, and had a 3-4 record before going 6-2 on the first road trip to Toronto, Cleveland and Chicago...went 19-10 over a 29-game stretch from April 8 to May 7 and were never more than two games ahead or one game behind in the West over that stretch...then went 2-7 on a trip to Texas, Cleveland and Atlanta from May 9 to 18...had a ½ game lead in the West after an off day on May 12 but that would be the A's last day in first place in 2008...spent every day from May 13 to July 20 in second place...remained in contention in the West by going 27-21 from May 19 to July 11...ended that streak on July 11 with a 9-2 win over Los Angeles...then lost the next two games against the Angels going into the All-Star Break to start an Oakland record 11-series losing streak from July 11 to August 20...went 7-27 over that span...compiled a 2-19 record from July 12 to August 7, equaling Oakland's fewest wins ever over a 21-game stretch...lost 14 games in the standings over that span...had a season long 10-game losing streak from July 28 to August 7, which was the fifth longest losing streak in Oakland history...the streak included three-game sweeps by Kansas City and Boston and a four-game sweep by Toronto, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's were swept in three consecutive series of three or more games...snapped the losing streak with a 4-2 win at Detroit on August 8 but dropped the next two games to the Tigers to finish with a 1-9 record on the 10-game road trip to Boston, Toronto and Detroit from August 1 to 10...that equaled the A's worst record on a road trip of 10 or more games in Oakland history...also went 1-9 from May 12-21, 1981...went 18-12 (.600) over a 30-game stretch from August 21 to September 22...put together back-to-back wins on August 27-28 for the first time since July 10-11, snapping an Oakland record streak of 40 consecutive games without a winning streak...were officially eliminated from the AL West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the Wild Card on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997...had spent every day from July 25 to September 21 in third place in the West before defeating Texas 4-3 in 11 innings on September 22 to move into second place...then lost each of the next two games at Texas and finished the season with a five-game losing streak, the second longest season-ending losing streak in Oakland history (lost the final nine games of the 1995 season).

**OFFENSE:** The A's ranked last in the American League in batting (.242), on-base percentage (.318), slugging percentage (.369), runs (646), doubles (270) and extra base hits (418) and had the most strikeouts (1226)...the batting average and slugging percentage were the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage and extra base hits were second lowest...it marked the fourth time in Oakland history the A's finished last in the majors in batting, the first time since 1982...the batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage were all the lowest by an A's team since 1982 (.236/.309/.367)...the slugging percentage was the lowest by an AL team since three teams finished with a lower mark in 1992...individually, the A's had four players among the five lowest batting averages in the AL (Hannahan, Barton, Cust, Ellis) and five of the bottom of seven (Crosby)...averaged 4.01 runs per game, which was the sixth lowest mark in Oakland history and the lowest since the 1979 A's averaged 3.54 runs per game...hit 125 home runs, which was fourth fewest in the AL and the fewest by an Oakland team in a non-strike season since the 1983 club hit 121...set an Athletics franchise record with 1226 strikeouts, breaking the previous mark of 1181 set in 1997...it was the third highest single season total in AL history...in ML history, 35 teams have struck out at least 1200 times in a season, but only the 1968 Mets finished with fewer home runs than the A's (1203 strikeouts, 81 home runs)...had 35 sacrifice flies, which was the fewest in the AL and the fewest by an Oakland team in a non-strike season since 1978 (27)...had 30 sacrifice hits, which were the most by an A's team since 1999 (39)...ranked second in the AL in pitches per plate appearance (3.88) and fourth in walks (574).

**PITCHING:** The A's ranked fifth in the American League with a 4.01 ERA...now have a 3.91 ERA since 2001, which is the lowest mark in the majors over that span...the Dodgers are second best at 3.95 and the Angels are the next closest AL team at 4.05...had the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.392), the fourth lowest batting average (.253) and eighth lowest on-base percentage (.328)...allowed 135 home runs, which was second fewest in the AL (Toronto, 134) and third fewest in the majors...had 1061 strikeouts, which ranked eighth in the AL but was third most in franchise history...it marks the A's eighth consecutive season with 1000 or more

strikeouts...had four complete games, which tied for fourth fewest in the AL and matched 2007 for second fewest in Oakland history (had 2 in 1997)...had the fewest wild pitches in the AL (30) and the second most intentional walks (45)...the wild pitches were the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1974 (27).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers were 48-66 with a 4.29 ERA and .256 opponents batting average...ranked seventh in the American League in ERA, had the third lowest opponents batting average and the second lowest winning percentage (.421)...had the fewest wins and most losses by Oakland starters since the 1997 staff was 29-73...allowed just 91 home runs, which was second fewest in the AL (New York, 86) and fourth fewest in the majors...it was the fewest home runs allowed by an A's team in a non-strike season since the 1989 club yielded 80...had the third lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.400)...issued the third most walks (371) and registered the eighth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.331)...had the second lowest run support (4.33)...tossed just 16 wild pitches, which was the fewest in the AL and tied for the fewest in Oakland history (1972 and 1983).

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen ranked second in the American League and fourth in the majors with a 3.50 ERA...however, converted just 33 of 52 (63.5%) save opportunities...the saves were second fewest in the AL to Cleveland (31) and the save opportunities tied for third fewest (CLE and NYY, 51)...had the fewest saves and save opportunities by an A's team in a non-strike season since the 1983 club also had 33 saves in 52 chances...struck out an Oakland record 417 batters, topping the previous mark of 408 set in 1997...first batters faced hit .234, which ranked fourth lowest in the AL...had the fewest first batter walks in the AL (29)...allowed 67 of 206 (32.5%) inherited runners to score, which ranked fifth in the AL...opponents grounded into 63 double plays, which tied for the most in the majors (BAL and PIT)...tied for the fewest wild pitches in the AL (14)...tied for third in the AL in most wins (27) and fewest home runs (44), had the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.375), and the fifth lowest batting average (.246) and on-base percentage (.323).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's pitching staff had a Major League leading 36 pickoffs...since pickoffs were tracked in 1987, those are the most pickoffs by an Oakland team and tied for third most by any ML team...the previous high for an A's team was 29 in 2004...opponents were successful in just 70 of 111 (63.1%) stolen base attempts, which was the lowest percentage in the American League and second lowest in the majors to Milwaukee (61.2%)...the 41 caught stealings were second most in the AL...on offense, the A's were successful in 88 of 109 (80.7%) stolen bases attempts, which was the highest percentage in the AL and second highest in the majors to Philadelphia (84.5%)...set an Oakland record for stolen base percentage, topping the previous mark of 77.4% (48 for 62) set in 2003...the 88 stolen bases are the most by an A's team since the 1998 club had 131...ranked seventh in the AL in steals after finishing last or second to last eight times over the previous nine seasons.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's finished ninth in the American League with a .984 fielding percentage...that was the A's lowest ranking since they were 11th in 2001...however, committed just 98 errors, the A's fifth consecutive season with fewer than 100 errors...the only other team in Major League history with five consecutive seasons of fewer than 100 errors is the Philadelphia Phillies (2001-05)...now have a .985 fielding percentage over the last five seasons, which is second best in the majors over that span to Houston (.986)...had the third fewest assists in the AL in 2008 (1573), but turned the fourth-most double plays (169)...the assists were the A's fewest in a non-strike season since 1985 (1566) and the double plays were fifth most in one season in Oakland history...committed at least one error in 12 consecutive games from April 8 to 19, which equaled the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since September 20-October 1, 1985 when they also made at least one miscue in 12 consecutive games.

**ROOKIES:** The A's set an Oakland record by using 21 rookies in 2008...broke the previous mark of 18 from 1983...only San Diego and San Francisco, with 24 each, used more rookies in 2008...13 of the rookies made their Major League debut...had a season high six rookies in the batting order in consecutive games on September 10 at Detroit and September 11 against Texas, and the game on the 10th included a rookie starting pitcher...had at least three rookies in the batting order in each of the last 35 games and 77 of 161 games overall...had just six games without a rookie in the batting order and none after May 14...the A's 10 rookie pitchers combined for 203 games pitched, which is the most in Oakland history...tossed 485.0 innings pitched and had 58 games started...since 1984, the only A's team with more games started by rookie pitchers is the 1996 club, which combined for 62...the 11 rookie position players combined for 481 games played and 1550 at bats, which were the highest by an A's team since the 1998 team combined for 536 games and 1727 at bats.

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's used 51 players in 2008, which fell three short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007...have now used 81 different players over the last two years...the 51 players tied the Yankees for third most in the majors in 2008 behind San Diego (59) and Texas (55)...had 24 pitchers, matching 2007 for second most in Oakland history...the record is 26 set in 1997...used 13 different starting pitchers, which tied for third most in the

majors and tied for third most in Oakland history...the last time the A's used 13 starters was in 1997...used just two catchers, the first time in Oakland history the A's have gone an entire season with just two catchers...the last time the A's franchise used just two catchers was in 1957 in Kansas City (Hal Smith, Tim Thompson)...seven different players appeared in a game at second base, the A's most since using eight in 1994.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's used the disabled list an Oakland record 25 times in 2008...broke the previous mark of 22 set in 1992 and matched in 2007...have used the DL 47 times over the last two years...the 25 players combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...had a season high nine players on the DL on May 29 and had at least four players on the DL every day from May 14 until the end of the season...began the year with three players on the DL and have not had fewer than three on the DL since the final day of the 2006 season when there was just one player on the DL...Mike Sweeney had the longest single stint on the DL as he missed 85 games from May 29 to September 2 with a left knee inflammation...six players had two stints on DL, including Andrew Brown, Eric Chavez, Justin Duchscherer, Keith Foulke, Ryan Sweeney and Frank Thomas...Chavez missed the most time overall as he combined to miss 131 games during his two stints on the DL following back surgery and a right shoulder inflammation.

**AT HOME:** The A's went 43-38 (.531) at home, the ninth time in the last 10 years they have finished with a winning record in the Coliseum...however, had just the ninth best home winning percentage in the American League...won 11 home series, lost 13 and split three...hit .243 with 326 runs scored and 62 home runs at home and .241 with 320 runs and 63 home runs on the road...the A's home and road batting averages were both the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors...the 62 home runs were the A's fewest at home in a non-strike season since 1983 (60)...had a .320 on-base percentage, which was the lowest since 1982 (.306)...compiled a 3.52 ERA in Oakland compared to 4.55 on the road...ranked fourth in the AL in home ERA and seventh in road ERA.

**ON THE ROAD:** The A's finished with a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season with a mark of 32-48 (.400)...that was the third worst road record in the American League and it was the A's worst mark away from home since 1997 when they were 30-51...won seven road series, lost 15 and split four...the A's .241 road batting average was second lowest in Oakland history to a mark of .230 in 1968...went 20-18 over their first 38 road games through July 4 but then lost 14 of the next 15 road contests and went 12-30 over the final 42 games away from home.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** The A's compiled a 51-44 (.537) record before the All-Star Break, which was the sixth best record in the American League...it marked the ninth consecutive season the A's went into the break with at least a .500 record...then went 24-42 (.364) after the break, which was the third worst record in the AL

and the third worst mark in Oakland history...went 24-47 (.338) in 1977 and 26-49 (.347) in 1978...the 95 games before the break were the A's most since 1974 when they had 96...compiled a 3.39 ERA, .235 opponents batting average and allowed 65 home runs in 95 games before the break...then posted a 4.93 ERA, .278 opponents average and allowed 70 home runs in 66 games after the break...the A's pre-break ERA was their lowest since 1990 (3.09) and it was the lowest by an AL team at the break since Boston had a 3.36 ERA in 1992...A's starting pitchers were 37-34 with a 3.41 ERA and .236 opponents batting average before the break and 11-32 with a 5.82 ERA and .290 opponents average after the break...had nine starts of less than five innings in 95 games before the break and 19 in 66 games after the break...the A's hit .249 before the break and .231 after the break...the post-break batting average was the lowest in the majors, the lowest in Oakland history and the lowest by an AL team since Milwaukee hit .227 in 1974...also ranked last in the majors after the break in slugging (.358), on-base percentage (.310), runs (236), doubles (100) and extra base hits (164)...averaged just 3.58 runs per game after the break, which was second lowest in Oakland history to the 1978 club (3.24).

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's went 16-11 in April, the first time they finished the opening month of the season with a winning record since 2003 (17-10)...tied for the second best record in the American League in April...went 12-15 in May, finishing with a losing record for the third time in the last four years...the pitching staff had 202 strikeouts, the fifth time in Oakland history the A's struck out at least 200 in a month...went 16-10 in June, which tied for third best in the AL...it marked the seventh consecutive season with a winning record in June and the A's are 121-68 (.640) in June since 2002, which is the best mark in the majors (NY, 111-75 .597)...posted a Major League leading 3.24 ERA in June but batted .249, which was the lowest average in the AL...went 8-17 in July, which was the second worst record in the majors ahead of Washington (5-19)...then went 10-20 in August, which was second worst in the AL ahead of Kansas City (7-20)...it was the 12th time the A's have lost 20 games in a month in Oakland history and just the second time since 1998...went 7-20 in May, 2005...it was the first time the A's had a losing record in August since 2000 (11-16)...batted a major league low .220, which was the fifth lowest single month batting average in Oakland history and the lowest since June, 1982 (.216)...it was the lowest by a ML team in August since San Diego hit .212 and Atlanta batted .217 in 1969...averaged 2.73 runs per game, which was the second lowest run per game figure in a month in Oakland history (2.50 in August, 1978)...struck out 233 times, an Oakland record for a single month...topped the previous mark of 223 in September, 1999...the pitching staff walked a ML leading 133 batters, which was the fifth highest one month total in Oakland history and the most since April, 1996 (140)...finished the season by going 12-12 in September.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's were 8-7 in extra inning games...tied for second in the American League in extra inning wins and tied for third in extra inning games...had their worst extra inning record since 2002 and are now 60-31 (.659) in extra inning games since 2003, including 38-14 (.731) in the Coliseum...compiled a 25-24 record in one-run decisions, matching their mark from a year ago...had 11 walk-off wins, matching their total from 2007...were 24-22 in games decid-

ed in the seventh inning or later, including 18-14 in games decided in the last at bat...overcame a 4-0 deficit on April 19 against Kansas City and won 6-5, the A's largest deficit overcome to win in 2008...erased a deficit of three or more runs 13 times and were 8-5 in those games...had a 5-0 lead over Texas on July 25 but lost 14-6, the A's largest blown lead of the season...blew a lead of three or more runs nine times, but had a 5-4 record in those games.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters were 16 for 79 (.203) with two home runs, 14 RBI, 11 walks and 31 strikeouts... had the third lowest batting average in the AL and the third most strikeouts...hit over .200 for the first time since batting .225 in 2003...the two pinch hit home runs were one more than the A's combined total from the previous three seasons...Kurt Suzuki's pinch homer on July 10 was the first pinch extra base hit by an Athletic since Bobby Kielty had a double on September 22, 2006 and the first home run since Adam Melhuse on August 28, 2006 against Boston...A's pinch hitters had a 0 for 23 streak from May 13 to July 6...the A's are now 65 for 368 (.177) with 12 doubles, six home runs and 57 RBI in the pinch over the last five seasons...have the fewest pinch extra base hits in the Majors over that span (18), the second lowest batting average (Baltimore, .173) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (Boston, 5).

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters batted .229 with 25 home runs and 64 RBI...the RBI were the fewest in the American League and the batting average was third lowest but the A's tied for fifth in home runs...the .229 average was the lowest mark by A's designated hitters since 1987 (.203)...also had the fewest doubles (18) and second fewest extra base hits in the AL (44) and the most strikeouts (163)...the strikeouts equaled the most ever by Oakland designated hitters (1987)...the A's had four stolen bases by their designated hitters but all of those were by substitutes (Davis 3, Patterson 1)...have not had a stolen base by a starting DH since Erubiel Durazo on May 4, 2005 against Texas.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** This A's finished interleague play with a 10-8 record for the fourth time in the last five years...tied for the 10th best interleague record in the majors...it marked the 10th time in 12 interleague seasons the A's finished with a .500 record or better and the eighth time they finished with a winning record...had the sixth lowest ERA (3.49) and the sixth lowest batting average (.242)...A's hitters struck out 156 times, which was the most in the majors and the most ever by an Oakland team in interleague games...it was second most by any team to the 2006 Phillies (158)...the A's have the second best all-time record in interleague play with a mark of 123-89 (.580), trailing the Yankees who are 123-87 (.586).

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The A's scored one run or less in 37 of the 161 games (23.0%) and lost all of those games, leaving the A's with a 75-49 (.605) record when scoring two runs or more...went 5-0 against Baltimore, which was the third time in franchise history the A's have gone undefeated against an American League team...went 7-0 against the Orioles in 2004 and were 12-0 against New York in 1990...had their worst mark in 2008 against the Yankees (1-5)...compiled a 26-31 record against AL West teams after going 24-33 within the division in 2007...it is the first time the A's have finished with back-to-back losing records in divisional games since 1985-87 when they did it in three straight seasons...went 17-23 against the East, just the second time in the last 10 years the A's finished with a losing record against the East...went 31-22 (.585) in the first game of a series and were 44-64 (.407) in all other games...including 19-34 in the second game of a series...had a 40-23 (.635) record when stealing at least one base and 35-63 (.357) with no steals...were 31-13 (.705) when the starter tossed at least seven innings and 44-73 (.376) in other games.

**ATTENDANCE:** The A's drew 1,665,256 fans in 2008, which was the A's lowest attendance since 1999 when they drew 1,434,610...it was the fifth consecutive season the A's attendance decreased...had the second lowest attendance in the American League ahead of Kansas City (1,578,922) and fourth lowest in the majors ahead of Florida (1,335,079) and Pittsburgh (1,609,076)...had five sellouts, four of which came against Boston and two of which came in Japan.
