A control pitcher with a sneaky fastball, Catfish Hunter enjoyed a 15-year major league career with the Kansas City/Oakland Athletics and the New York Yankees... posted a 224-166 career record with a 3.26 ERA before arm trouble ended his career at the age of 33...holds Oakland's all-time career mark for wins (131)...won 20 or more games five consecutive seasons (1971-75), including his Cy Young Award-winning season of 1974 when he won a career-high 25 games... won five World Series rings, three with the A's and two with the Yankees...was 4-0 with one save in seven World Series appearances with the A's...signed a free agent contract with the Yankees in 1975 and helped New York to three straight pennants (1976-78)...was an eight-time All-Star...pitched a perfect game on May 8, 1968 against the Minnesota Twins...made his major league debut in 1965 with the Kansas City Athletics and did not miss a start until 1977...a good hitting pitcher, he batted .350 (36-for-103) in 1971 and had a .226 lifetime average with six home runs...nicknamed "Catfish" for effect by A's owner Charles O. Finley...soft-spoken and humble with a dose of country charm, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1987.

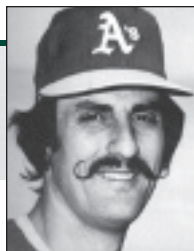

Almost as famous for his handlebar mustache as his pitching, Rollie Fingers is one of the greatest relief pitchers in major league history...in his 17-year career spent with Oakland (1968-76), San Diego (1977-80) and Milwaukee (1981-85), the seven-time All-Star chalked up 341 saves to go along with a 114-118 career mark...ranks sixth on baseball's all-time save list...made his ML debut in 1968 and began the 1969, '70 and '71 seasons as a starter, but finished all three seasons in the bullpen...became a full-time reliever in 1972, winning 11 games in relief and saving 21 to help Oakland to its first World Series appearance...worked out of a bases loaded, one out jam in the eighth inning of Game Seven of the 1972 World Series against Cincinnati...saved 22 games and posted a 1.92 ERA in 1973...saved two games in the '73 World Series against the New York Mets...earned a win and two saves in the '74 World Series against the Los Angeles Dodgers...in 1975, pitched the final two innings of a four-pitcher no-hitter as he, Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott and Paul Lindblad combined to blank the California Angels, 5-0...signed a free agent contract with San Diego following the 1976 season and promptly led the National League in appearances (78) and saves (35)...posted a career high 37 saves for the Padres in 1978...returned to the American League in 1981 after being traded to Milwaukee and led the AL in saves with 28 to go along with a 1.04 ERA as the Brewers made their first-ever postseason appearance... captured both the Cy Young and Most Valuable Player Awards in 1981 after figuring in 55 percent of the Brewers victories...missed the entire 1983 season with arm trouble, but came back in 1984 to save 23 games and post a 1.96 ERA for a Brewer team that won only 67 games...retired following the 1985 season...inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1992.

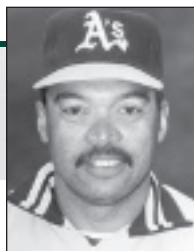

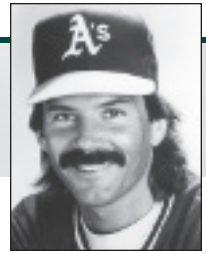

Was originally selected by the Kansas City Athletics in the first round of the 1966 June Draft and played for 21 seasons in the Major Leagues, including nine seasons in Oakland (1968-75; 1987)...was a .262 career hitter with 563 home runs and 1702 RBI...inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1993...named American League Most Valuable Player in 1973...appeared in 12 All-Star Games, 11 League Championship Series and five World Series..."Mr. October" played in five World Series (27 games) and was a part of four world championship clubs...earned World Series MVP honors in 1973 with Oakland and again in 1977 with New York...belted three home runs in Game Six of the 1977 World Series, all on the first pitch...holds World Series records for highest career slugging percentage (.755) and most home runs in a series (5 in 1977)...once said, "Some people call October a time of pressure. I call it a time of character"...stole 228 bases in his career and is one of six Major League players with at least 500 home runs and 200 stolen bases...finished among the AL Top 10 in home runs 13 times and led the circuit on four occasions...had 16 seasons of at least 20 home runs which ties an AL record...had six seasons of 100 or more RBI...when his number was retired on May 22, 2004, he ranked second on Oakland's career charts in home runs (268), double (230) and extra base hits (521)...also ranked third in runs (743) and total bases (2287), fourth in RBI (770) and games played (1311) and fifth in at bats (4568), hits (1207), walks (623) and stolen bases (144)...became the eighth player to have his number retired by at least two teams and third to have two different numbers retired...inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1993.

Dennis Eckersley blazed a unique path to the Hall of Fame that most likely will never be repeated, beginning his career as a highly-touted starting pitcher before transforming into arguably the best closer the game has ever seen...from 1988 to 1992, Eck averaged 44 saves a season and helped the A's to four American League West crowns, three AL pennants and a World Series title in 1989...the six-time All-Star ended his 24-year major league career with a record of 197-171 to go along with 390 saves and a 3.50 ERA...earned both AL Cy Young and Most Valuable Player Awards in 1992 after recording 51 saves in 54 opportunities...tossed a no-hitter against California on May 30, 1977 as a member of the Cleveland Indians...inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2004...had his number retired by the Oakland Athletics on August 13, 2005.

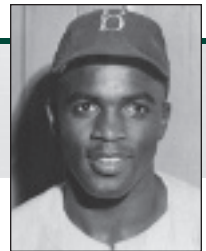

One of the most beloved owners in the history of the Athletics organization, Walter A. Haas, Jr. purchased the A's from Charles O. Finley in 1980, saving the team from potentially moving out of the area...during his 15-year ownership period, the A's won one World Championship (1989) and captured three consecutive American League pennants (1988-90)...team broke franchise attendance records each of those seasons, attracting a record 2.9 million fans to the Coliseum in 1990...long considered one of the top business and civic leaders in the United States, Haas headed some of the finest corporations in the country, including Levi Strauss, Bank of America, United Air Lines and the Pacific Telephone Company...former A's slugger Mark McGwire once described Haas as "the nicest man who has ever been put on this earth"...the A's paid tribute to his ownership reign on September 17, 1995 on Haas Family Tribute Day, when an honorary jersey was retired...Haas passed away on September 20, 1995.

THE CHAMPIONSHIP YEARS

1910: Finished with a 102-48 record and outdistanced the New York Highlanders by 14.5 games in the American League standings...defeated the Chicago Cubs in five games to win the first of five World Championships in Philadelphia...102 wins set a new American League record...opened the season in Washington in a game attended by President William Howard Taft, who honored the game by throwing out the first ball, setting a precedent which was followed by each of his successors until the Senators left Washington following the 1971 season...the pitching staff, headlined by Jack Coombs, Chief Bender, Cy Morgan and Eddie Plank, finished

with a 1.79 ERA...Coombs emerged as the ace of the pitching staff and finished with a 31-9 record and a 1.30 ERA, including 13 shutouts...compiled a 46-inning scoreless streak during the season...the infield of Stuffie McInnis, Eddie Collins, Jack Barry, and Frank Baker would become known as the "\$100,000 Infield"...won the first three games of the World Series before the Cubs took game four, 4-3 in 10 innings...Coombs won his third game of the series in Game 5, out pitching Mordecai Brown to lift the A's to their first world title.

1911: Dominated the American League for the second straight season, finishing with a 101-50 record...defeated the New York Giants in six games to capture a second straight world championship...offense was paced by Eddie Collins, Frank Baker, John "Stuffie" McInnis, Eddie Murphy and Bris Lord...Baker captured the American League home run title with 11 round trippers, earning him the nickname "Home Run" Baker...clinched the pennant on Sept. 26 with an 11-5 win over Detroit at Shibe Park, as Baker hit two doubles and two home runs...faced the New York Giants in the World Series in a rematch of the 1905 Fall Classic, won by the Giants...Christy Mathewson and Chief Bender square-off in Game 1, just as they did in the 1905 Series finale...a run-scoring double by New York's Josh Devore in the seventh inning breaks a 1-1 tie as the Giants capture the first game...the A's won Game Two, 3-1, behind the pitching of Eddie Plank and a home run by Baker...A's took a 2-1 lead in the series by winning Game Three, 3-2 in 11 innings at the Polo Grounds...after heavy rains forced postponement of the series for a week, the A's captured Game Four at Shibe Park, 4-2, as Bender outdueled Mathewson...the Giants staved off elimination by winning Game Five at the Polo Grounds, 4-3 in 10 innings...the A's routed the Giants, 13-2 in Game Six to capture their second straight World Series title.

1913: The Athletics post a 96-57 regular season record and outdistanced Washington by six and a half

games to reclaim the American League pennant...defeated the New York Giants in five games to capture its third World Series title in four years...moved into first place in April and stayed atop the AL standings the rest of the way...Jack Coombs, three years removed from a 31-win season, missed the entire campaign with typhoid fever...Chief Bender (21-10), Eddie Plank (18-10), Boardwalk Brown (17-11), Byron "Duke" Houck (14-6) and rookie "Bullet" Joe Bush (14-6) anchored the pitching staff...the "\$100,000 Infield" turned in another solid season...Frank Baker hit .336 to go along with an American League-best 12 home runs and 117 RBI...Stuffie

McInnis hit .324 with 90 RBI, Collins finished with a .345 average while Barry batted .275...the Athletics and Giants split the first two games of the series before the A's win Games Three, Four and Five to capture their third World Series title.

1929: Behind a high-powered offense that featured six .300 hitters and the league's best pitching staff paced by Lefty Grove and George Earnshaw, the A's finish with a 104-46 record and capture the American League pennant by 18 games over the New York Yankees...defeat the Chicago Cubs in five games to win their fourth World Series title...the championship is the culmination of a long journey back to the top of the

baseball world for Connie Mack's club...after winning the 1914 pennant, the A's spent the next seven seasons in the AL cellar before finishing seventh in 1922...A's finished sixth in 1923, fifth in '24, second in '25, third in '26 and second in '27 and '28 before winning the pennant in 1929...Al Simmons leads the American League with 157 RBI and finishes second with a .365 batting average...Jimmie Foxx hits .354 with 33 home runs while catcher Mickey Cochrane finishes with a .331 average...Bing Miller (.335), Jimmy Dykes (.327) and Mule Haas (.313) also top the .300 mark for the season...Earnshaw (24-8, 3.29) and Grove (20-6, 2.81) combine for 44 wins.

1930: After posting a 102-52 regular season record, the Athletics successfully defend their World Championship by defeating a hard-nosed St. Louis Cardinal team in six games...offensively, Al Simmons leads the AL with a .381 average to go along with 36 home runs...Jimmie Foxx hits .335 and his 37 home runs rank tied for third in the league behind Babe Ruth (49) and Lou Gehrig (41)...Mickey Cochrane finishes the year with a .357 average...Lefty Grove posts a 28-5 record to go along with a 2.54 ERA while George Earnshaw finishes with a 22-13 record and a 4.44 ERA...the 1931 Athletics won a franchise record 107 games, but were denied a third straight championship after losing to the St. Louis Cardinals in a seven-game World Series...after finishing second in 1932 and third in 1933, the A's would average 92 losses a season for the next 21 years before relocating to Kansas City for the 1955 season.

1972: The Swingin' A's finished with a 93-62 regular season record and held off the Chicago White Sox to capture a second straight American League West title...defeated the Detroit Tigers in five games in the American League Championship Series to advance to the World Series, where they defeated the heavily-favored Cincinnati Reds in seven games...the pitching staff, led by Jim "Catfish" Hunter (21-7), Ken Holtzman (19-11), John "Blue Moon" Odom (15-6) and closer Rollie Fingers (11-9, 21 saves), finished second in the American League with a 2.58 ERA...a contract dispute forced Vida Blue, who won both the AL Cy Young Award and league MVP honors a year before, to miss spring training and he did not make his first start until May 28th...led by Mike Epstein (26) and Reggie Jackson

(25), the A's led the American League with 134 home runs...Jackson tore a hamstring muscle in the fifth game of the ALCS vs. Detroit and was sidelined for the World Series...Gene Tenace, who hit just .225 with five home runs during the regular season, hits a then-Fall Classic record four home runs to go along with a .348 average to earn World Series MVP honors.

1973: The A's claim their third straight AL West title with a 94-68 record and dispatch the Baltimore Orioles to win a hard-fought five-game ALCS...defeat the New York Mets in seven games to capture a second straight World Championship...Reggie Jackson leads the American League in home

runs (32) and RBI (117) and hits .293 to earn AL MVP honors...after hitting just .143 against Baltimore in the ALCS, Jackson earns World Series MVP honors after hitting .310 with three doubles, a triple and a home run against the Mets...third baseman Sal Bando hits .287 with 29 home runs and 98 RBI while playing all 162 games at third base...All-Star shortstop Campy Campaneris reaches the 150-hit plateau for the second consecutive season and for the sixth time in 10 years...hit .333 vs. Baltimore and set then-ALCS records for total bases (14) and stolen bases (3) and ties an ALCS record with two home runs...hit .290 with six runs, three stolen bases, a triple and home run vs. the Mets in

the World Series... Dick Green bounces back from an injury-plagued 1972 campaign to set a then-Oakland record for highest fielding percentage by a second baseman (.988)...Bill North, acquired in a trade with the Cubs in the off-season, emerges as the A's everyday center fielder, but a late season ankle injury forces him to miss both the ALCS and World Series...catcher Ray Fosse is acquired from Cleveland during spring training and establishes career highs in games played (143), at bats (492), doubles (23) and triples (2)...pitching staff is paced by 20-game winners Catfish Hunter (21-5), Ken Holtzman (21-13) and Vida Blue (20-9)...Hunter posts his third straight 21-win season despite missing a month of the season with an injury...strung together 13-straight victories from June 2 to September 5... Hunter posted two wins over Baltimore in the ALCS, including a 3-0 shutout in Game 5...he kept his perfect record perfect in World Series play, winning Game 6 against the Mets...Holtzman wins seven games in the month of May and finishes with four shutouts among his 16 complete games...after a slow start, Blue wins 11 of his last 13 decisions down the stretch to notch his second 20-win season in just his third full Major League season...Blue tossed a team-high four shutouts during the season...Manager Dick Williams resigns shortly after the season after failing to come to terms on a new contract.

1974: Under new manager Alvin Dark, the A's defeat the Los Angeles Dodgers to claim their third straight World Series...finish the regular season with a 90-72 record and win their fourth straight AL West title by five games over Texas...defeat the Baltimore Orioles in a four-game ALCS to set up the first ever All-California World Series against the Dodgers...Catfish Hunter captures the American League Cy Young Award after winning a career high 25 games

to go along with a 2.49 ERA...Rollie Fingers makes a career high 76 appearances to set a then-Oakland record...he was named World Series MVP after chalking up a win, two saves and a 1.93 ERA in four appearances...Fingers earned the win in Game One as he worked 4.1 innings in relief of Ken Holtzman...Campy Campaneris hits a career high .290 and steals over 30 bases for the 10th straight season...Campy batted .353 in five World Series games against the Dodgers...Joe Rudi led the AL in doubles (39) and total bases (287) while finishing third in RBI (99), fourth in slugging (.484) and fifth in hits (174)...Sal Bando finishes second in the American League with 103 RBI...he hit game winning home runs in the second and third games of the ALCS vs. Baltimore...Reggie

Jackson starts the season by batting .399 with 15 home runs and 42 RBI over the first 50 games...he made his fifth All-Star Game appearance in six years and amassed over 3.5 million votes in the fan balloting, nearly 800,000 more than runner up Hank Aaron...after a blazing start, Jackson hits just .239 with 14 home runs and 51 RBI over the final 104 games of the season...Claudell Washington made the jump from Double A to appear in 73 games and is named to Topps Rookie All-Star Team...

1989: The A's posted a regular season mark of 99-63 and finished seven games ahead of Kansas City in the American League West Division...defeated Toronto in five games to win a second straight American League pennant...swept the San Francisco Giants in the "Battle of the Bay" World Series,

which will always be remembered for the devastating earthquake that struck on Oct. 17 at 5:04 pm, just minutes before the first pitch of Game 3 at Candlestick Park...for the second straight season, won more regular season games than any team in the Majors...never led the AL West by more than 4.5 games until the final week and never were more than three games out of the division lead...were an injury-plagued team for the first four months of the season as 11 different players spent time on the disabled list, including Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire, Storm Davis, Walt Weiss, Dennis Eckersley and Bob Welch...pitching staff posted the lowest ERA in the American League (3.09) for the second straight season...tossed a Major League-best 20 shutouts on the year...starting pitchers Dave Stewart (21-9), Mike Moore (19-11), Storm Davis (19-7) and Bob Welch (17-8)—combined for a 76-35 record with a 3.25 ERA...Stewart became the first pitcher to string together three 20-win seasons since Hall of Famer Jim Palmer accomplished the feat from 1975-78...became just the second player in Oakland history to reel off three straight 20-win seasons since Catfish Hunter won 20 or more games during a four year stretch from 1971-74...was 4-0 in four postseason starts and earned World Series MVP honors...third baseman Carney Lansford set an Oakland single-season record with a .336 batting average, which was the second best mark in the AL...offense received a tremendous boost when the team reacquired Oakland native Rickey Henderson in a trade with the New York Yankees on June 20th...Henderson hit .294 and reached base safely in 80 of the 85 games he played with Oakland down the stretch...tied Wade Boggs for the AL lead in runs scored (113) and topped the loop with a career high 126 walks...

was named ALCS MVP after hitting .400 with 15 total bases, eight runs scored, five RBI and seven walks in five games vs. the Blue Jays...hit a combined .441 in nine postseason games...Dave Parker topped the team with 97 RBI to go along with 22 home runs...McGwire ranked third in the AL with 33 home runs and ranked 10th in RBI (95)...Mike Gallego, who was thrust into the starting shortstop's role with Weiss sidelined for 65 games with an injury, finished the season with career highs in virtually every offensive category, including average (.252), runs (45), hits (90) home runs (3) and RBI (30)...Canseco, who won AL MVP honors the year before, missed the first 88 games of the season due to a stress fracture of the hook of the hamate bone in his left hand...

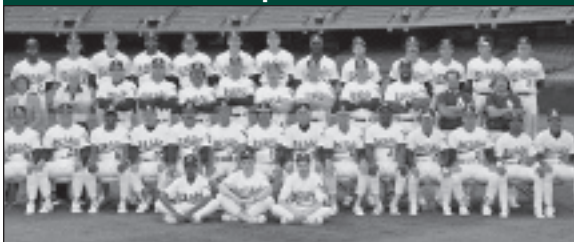
