# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-0) VS. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (0-0)

FRIDAY, APRIL 8, 2022 — CITIZENS BANK PARK — 3:05 EDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (13-9, 3.37 IN 2021) VS. RHP AARON NOLA (9-9, 4.63 IN 2021) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's open their 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

A's AND PHILADELPHIA: With this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they begin their 55th season in Oakland in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54...in between, the club spent 13 years in Kansas City from 1955-67...have won four World Series and six American League Pennants in Oakland and five World Series and nine AL Pennants in Philadelphia...today marks the A's first Opening Day in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4...Bobby Shantz, who is one of three living Philadelphia Athletics along with Bill Harrington and Bill Wilson, was the winning pitcher.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the season with a 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (three games), Tampa Bay (four games) and Toronto (three games)... barring multiple rainouts, this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...begin the home schedule with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games) on April 18.

**#1,000:** When Pete Kozma was called up for the final series of the 2021 season, he became the 999th player in Oakland history...the first new player to appear in a game for this year will be the 1,000th in Oakland history...the players on the A's Opening Day roster that have not played for Oakland yet include Justin Grimm, Zach Jackson, Dany Jiménez, Jake Lemoine, Billy McKinney, Adam Oller, Cristian Pache, Kevin Smith and Kirby Snead.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

FOR OPENERS: The A's have lost two of their last three openers after winning three of their previous four...are now 8-20 on Opening Day dating back to 1994...this marks the first time the A's have been the visiting team on Opening Day since April 6, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL), ending an American League record streak of 12 consecutive seasons as the home team in openers...opened in Japan in 2012 and 2019 but were the home team each year...this will be the first time the A's have faced a National League team on Opening Day...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 24-30 on Opening Day, including 20-15 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 56-65 in openers.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Three players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Andrus, Murphy, Pinder)...Chad Pinder is scheduled to make his fourth straight Opening Day start...the previous three came at three different positions (right field last year, second base in 2020, left field in 2019)... Sean Murphy is scheduled to make his third straight start Opening Day behind the plate

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 14 pitchers and 14 position players...this marks the fifth time in the last six years Oakland begins the season  $% \left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{$ with at least 13 pitchers (13 in 2021, 15 on 2020's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...nine players return from last years Opening Day roster (Andrus, Irvin, Kemp, Lowrie, Montas, Murphy, Pinder, Piscotty, Trivino)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Acevedo, Allen, Blackburn, Bolt, Brown, Jefferies, Moll, Puk) and one was in the A's farm system (Jackson)... four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free

TENURE: Of the 28 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only five have played for Oakland in each of the previous four seasons...Chad Pinder has been with the club since 2016, Paul Blackburn and Frankie Montas since 2017 and Stephen Piscotty and Lou Trivino since 2018...only Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16-18, 21) and Stephen Vogt (2013-17) have played for the A's prior to 2016, but both have played for other clubs since then...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Lou Trivino, who was drafted two days later.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have 10 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019 ... five players have six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus (13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty (6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who is 23 years and 140 days, is the youngest...he is followed by Kevin Smith (25 years, 278 days), Daulton Jefferies (26 years, 249 days) and A.J. Puk (26 years, 348 days)...Jed Lowrie is the oldest at 37 years and 356 days...he is followed by Stephen Vogt (37 years, 158 days), Justin Grimm (33 years, 235 days) and Elvis Andrus (33 years, 225 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

NUMBER CHANGE: Zach Jackson will switch to #61.

A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's are 10-8 against the Phillies, which includes 6-3 in Oakland and 4-5 in Philadelphia...are 3-3 at Citizens Bank Park...last met in 2017 when the A's won two of three in Philadelphia...the A's have won two of three in all three series in Oakland (2005, 08, 14) and lost two of three in Philadelphia in 2003 and 2011.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is on his 14th consecutive Opening Day roster and is scheduled to make his 14th consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop...would become the 20th shortstop in Major League history with 14 or more Opening Day starts... Tony Kemp tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8) and tied for third in runs (9)...**Sean Murphy** tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8), ranked third in batting and fourth in slugging (.833) and OPS (1.319).

# THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1934 the A's and the Phillies meet in a City Series game before 15,000 fans at Shibe Park for the first legal Sunday baseball game ever played in Philadelphia...in 1982 Rickey Henderson ties a club record with five walks but the A's lose to California 8-6 in 16 innings...in **2003** Barry Zito extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 2-1 win at Texas, the fifth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...in 2006 Zito combines with the A's bullpen on a one-hit shutout in a 3-0 win at Seattle after the A's pitching staff tosses a two-hit shutout against the Mariners the night before...the three hits allowed in consecutive games sets an Oakland record.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (13-9, 3.37 ERA in 2021)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second career Opening Day start... also started the A's opener on July 24, 2020 against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 7-3 win (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is one of three pitchers to start two openers for the A's over the last nine years (Gray, 2014-15; Graveman, 2017-18)...is the only foreign-born pitcher in Oakland history with multiple Opening Day starts...Ariel Prieto (1997) is the only other foreign-born pitcher with an Opening Day start...this is Montas' seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Went 4-0 with a 1.84 ERA (9 er in 44.0 ip) and .178 (28-for-157) opponents batting average over his final seven starts last year...the four-game winning streak is one short of his career high of five from May 17 to June 15, 2019...his last loss came on Aug. 16 of last year at Chicago (AL).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 1-1 with a 5.26 ERA (25.2 ip, 25 h, 15 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 28 so, 2 hr) in five interleague starts last year...is now 3-5 with a 6.42 ERA (44 er in 61.2 ip) in 15 career games (12 starts) in interleague play...is 28-18 with a 3.45 ERA in 87 games (60 starts) against American League competition.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400) and he walked one batter in 5.2 innings...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts... his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth).

STRIKEOUTS: Finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910... is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74 this year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 469 career strikeouts in 448.0 innings, an average of 9.42 per nine innings.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break...had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break.

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* His opponents batting average broke down to .225 (78-for-346) with a .665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for-361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...had a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, .227 with nine home runs with runners on base...opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...held the opponent's number three hit-

ter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes and has a .164 career average in that situation.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in 12 starts against AL West teams compared to 8-5 with a 3.86 ERA and .248 opponents average in 20 starts against all other teams...is now 15-9 with a 3.32 ERA (77 er in 208.2 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, 16-14 with a 4.32 ERA in 57 games against all other teams.

SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 32 starts and now has a streak of 44 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip)...had seven starts of 7.0 innings in 2021 and was 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts

THIS AND THAT: Was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the AL...allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on...had 10 no decisions, five of which came in extra inning games...the A's were 17-15 (.531) in his starting assignments...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...according to TruMedia, threw 678 splitters, which was second most in the majors (Gausman, SF 1061)...opponents hit .126 with a .352 OPS off his splitter and he allowed just one home run.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the AL... won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of seven starts of 7.0 innings...went 6-2 with a 2.24 ERA and .198 opponents batting average over his final 17 starts...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4 against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer...left with a 1-0 lead in his start on the 22nd but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times he left with the lead in one of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Sept. 19 at Los Angeles-AL)... did not allow a run over his first four innings on Sept. 2 at Detroit to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 19...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September after going 3-0 with a 2.19 ERA in six starts...held the opposition to a .193 batting average and struck out 40 in 37.0 innings...led the AL in ERA in September, ranked third in opponents batting average and slugging percentage (.341) and fifth in strikeouts and OPS (.622)...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and the 40 strikeouts tied for fifth most in Oakland history in September.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin(10-10, 3.94 ERA): Begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster...went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in four starts this spring...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...will be making his first career appearance and start against the Phillies...is 1-1 with a 5.82 ERA (17.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 7 so) in seven career appearances, including one start, at Citizens Bank Park...was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts last year after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...led the AL in losses, tied for the lead in starts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1).
