OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-1) VS. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (1-0)

SATURDAY, APRIL 9, 2022 — CITIZENS BANK PARK -- 4:05 EDT LHP COLE IRVIN (10-15, 4.24 IN 2021) VS. RHP KYLE GIBSON (10-9, 3.79 IN 2021) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost to the Phillies yesterday, 9-5...have now lost three of their last four openers...the A's open their 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's... since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

A's AND PHILADELPHIA: With this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they begin their 55th season in Oakland in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54...in between, the club spent 13 years in Kansas City from 1955-67...have won four World Series and six American League Pennants in Oakland and five World Series and nine AL Pennants in Philadelphia...yesterday marked the A's first Opening Day in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4... Bobby Shantz, who is one of three living Philadelphia Athletics along with Bill Harrington and Bill Wilson, was the winning pitcher.

PROJECTION AFFECTION SECTION: The A's scored five runs yesterday and are on pace to score 810 runs this season...would be the most since 2019 when they scored 845...the Oakland recored for runs scored in a season is 947 in 2000...the A's hit two home runs yesterday, which is a pace of 324 for the season...the most home runs ever hit by an A's team in a season is 257 in 2019...A's pitchers struck out eight batters which is a pace of 1,296 for the season...they struck out 1,332 batters last season, which is the franchise record...they combined to walk five batters yesterday which would be 810 in a 162-game season...the most walks issued by an Athletics pitching staff in a season is 758 in 1949.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the season with a 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (0-1), Tampa Bay (four games) and Toronto (three games)...barring multiple rainouts, this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...begin the home schedule with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games) on April 18.

MR. 1,000: Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history yesterday...when Pete Kozma was called up for the final series of the 2021 season, he became the 999th player in Oakland history...there have now been 1,004 players in Oakland history now that Jake Lemoine, Cristian Pache, Kevin Smith, and Kirby Snead also made their A's debuts yesterday...the other players on the A's Opening Day roster that have not played for Oakland yet include Justin Grimm, Zach Jackson, Dany Jiménez, and Adam Oller.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

FOR OPENERS: The A's have now lost three of their last four openers after winning three of their previous four...are now 8-21 on Opening Day dating back to 1994...yesterday marked the first time the A's have been the visiting team on Opening Day since April 6, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL), ending an American League record streak of 12 consecutive seasons as the home team in openers...opened in Japan in 2012 and 2019 but were the home team each year...was the first time the A's have faced a National League team on Opening Day...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 24-31 on Opening Day, including 20-15 in Oakland, 4-12 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 56-66 in openers.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 14 pitchers and 14 position players...this marks the fifth time in the last six years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers (13 in 2021, 15 on 2020's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...nine players return from last years Opening Day roster (Andrus, Irvin, Kemp, Lowrie, Montas, Murphy, Pinder, Piscotty, Trivino)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Acevedo, Allen, Blackburn, Bolt, Brown, Jefferies, Moll, Puk) and one was in the A's farm system (Jackson)... four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free

TENURE: Of the 28 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only five have played for Oakland in each of the previous four seasons...Chad Pinder has been with the club since 2016, Paul Blackburn and Frankie Montas since 2017 and Stephen Piscotty and Lou Trivino since 2018...only Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16-18, 21) and Stephen Vogt (2013-17) have played for the A's prior to 2016, but both have played for other clubs since then...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Lou Trivino, who was drafted two days later.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have 10 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019 ...five players have six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus (13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty (6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who is 23 years and 140 days, is the youngest...he is followed by Kevin Smith (25 years, 278 days), Daulton Jefferies (26 years, 249 days) and A.J. Puk (26 years, 348 days)...Jed Lowrie is the oldest at 37 years and 356 days...he is followed by Stephen Vogt (37 years, 158 days), Justin Grimm (33 years, 235 days) and Elvis Andrus (33 years, 225 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's begin the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

NUMBER CHANGE: Zach Jackson will switch to #61.

A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's are 10-9 against the Phillies, which includes 6-3 in Oakland and 4-6 in Philadelphia...are 3-4 at Citizens Bank Park...last met in 2017 when the A's won two of three in Philadelphia...the A's have won two of three in all three series in Oakland (2005, 08, 14) and lost two of three in Philadelphia in 2003 and 2011.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is on his 14th consecutive Opening Day roster and is scheduled to make his 14th consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop...would become the 20th shortstop in Major League history with 14 or more Opening Day starts... Tony Kemp tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8) and tied for third in runs (9)...Sean Murphy tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8), ranked third in batting and fourth in slugging (.833) and OPS (1.319).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1974 Joe Rudi ties an Oakland record with three doubles as the A's defeat Kansas City 6-4...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 8-6 win over Seattle...in **2008** Fernando Hernandez becomes the first reliever in Oakland history to record a win in his Major League debut when he pitches a scoreless eighth inning in the A's 6-3 win at Toronto.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (10-15, 4.24 ERA in 2021)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster...started the A's third game of the season last year.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (14.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in two interleague starts last year...is now 3-0 with a 1.16 ERA (3 er in 23.1 ip) in five career interleague appearances, including three starts... is 9-17 with a 5.17 ERA (115 er in 200.1 ip) in 46 career intraleague games, including 32 starts.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

IRVIN vs. PHILADELPHIA: Is making his first career appearance and start...was the 5th round draft pick of the Phillies in 2016 and pitched two seasons with Philadelphia (2019-20)...is 1-1 with a 5.82 ERA (17.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 7 so) in seven career appearances, including one start, at Citizens Bank Park.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies.

DON'T WALK: Walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts...had five starts with no walks and 16 with one...has walked just 56 batters in 223.2 career innings (2.25 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: His 15 losses were the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16).

STREAKING: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and 2-5 with a 6.38 ERA and .950 OPS over his final 10 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .335 career opponents average with RISP.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and are an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors this year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and is 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.

DAYS REST: Was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high fourgame losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30... the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)... left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the AL in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the AL and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career... allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...had walked just 25 batters in 135.1 innings over his first 23 starts (1.66 per nine innings) before walking a career-high four batters in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...it snapped a season-opening streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...that started a season-ending stretch where he issued 17 free passes over his final 43.0 innings and nine starts (3.56 per nine innings)... had surrendered just 12 home runs over his first 25 starts and 144.1 innings (0.75 per nine innings)...then allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career on Aug. 31 at Detroit to begin a season-ending stretch where he allowed 11 home runs in seven starts and 34.0 innings (2.91 per nine innings)...finished August 2-2 in five starts but had a 4.91 ERA, which was his highest single-month ERA in 2021, before going 1-3 with a 6.94 ERA in five starts in September...allowed a career-high tying seven runs (May 22, 2019 at Chicago-NL) in a career-low 2.1 innings in an 8-0 loss at Toronto on Sept. 5...yielded a career-high tying three home runs in his final start on Oct. 3 at Houston.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-0, 3.60 ERA): Begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021...was 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA and .369 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, this spring...has never faced the Phillies in his career...spent most of the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 with a .605 OPS against left-handers...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position.
