# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-2) VS. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (2-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's dropped game two to Philadelphia yesterday by a score of 4-2...lost to the Phillies on Friday, 9-5... have now lost three of their last four openers...the A's open their 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7).... have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.
A's AND PHILADELPHIA: With this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they begin their 55th season in Oakland in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54...in between, the club spent 13 years in Kansas City from 1955-67...have won four World Series and six American League Pennants in Oakland and five World Series and nine AL Pennants in Philadelphia....yesterday marked the A's first Opening Day in Philadelphia since April 13, 1954 when the Philadelphia A's defeated the Boston Red Sox 6-4... Bobby Shantz, who is one of three living Philadelphia Athletics along with Bill Harrington and Bill Wilson, was the winning pitcher.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the season with a 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (0-2), Tampa Bay (four games) and Toronto (three games)...barring multiple rainouts, this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...begin the home schedule with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games) on April 18.

MR. 1,000: Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history on Friday...when Pete Kozma was called up for the final series of the 2021 season, he became the 999th player in Oakland history...there have now been 1,006 players in Oakland history now that Jake Lemoine, Cristian Pache, Kevin Smith, Kirby Snead, Dany Jiménez, and Zach Jackson have also made their A's debuts...the other players on the A's Opening Day roster that have not played for Oakland yet include Justin Grimm and Adam Oller.
DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . $286(4-10)$ in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had $16 . .$. tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)... has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.
FOR OPENERS: The A's have now lost three of their last four openers after winning three of their previous four....are now 8-21 on Opening Day dating back to 1994...yesterday marked the first time the A's have been the visiting team on Opening Day since April 6, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL), ending an American League record streak of 12 consecutive seasons as the home team in openers....opened in Japan in 2012 and 2019 but were the home team each year...was the first time the A's have faced a National League team on Opening Day...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 24-31 on Opening Day, including 20-15 in Oakland, 4-12 on the road, 0-3 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 56-66 in openers.

ROSTER NOTES: Today the A's placed OF Skye Bolt on the IL (right oblique strain) and recalled LHP Adam Kolarek from Las Vegas...they now have 15 pitchers and 13 position players on the roster...the A's opened the season with 14 pitchers and 14 position players...this marks the fifth time in the last six years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers ( 13 in 2021, 15 on 2020's 30 -man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...nine players return from last years Opening Day roster (Andrus, Irvin, Kemp, Lowrie, Montas, Murphy, Pinder, Piscotty, Trivino)... eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Acevedo, Allen, Blackburn, Bolt, Brown, Jefferies, Moll, Puk) and one was in the A's farm system (Jackson)...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent.

TENURE: Of the 28 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only five have played for Oakland in each of the previous four seasons...Chad Pinder has been with the club since 2016, Paul Blackburn and Frankie Montas since 2017 and Stephen Piscotty and Lou Trivino since 2018...only Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16-18, 21) and Stephen Vogt (2013-17) have played for the A's prior to 2016, but both have played for other clubs since then...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization...he is followed by Lou Trivino, who was drafted two days later.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have 10 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019 ...five players have six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus ( 13 years), Vogt (8 years, 64 days), Piscotty ( 6 years, 76 days) and Grimm ( 6 years, 50 days).
THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who is 23 years and 140 days, is the youngest... he is followed by Kevin Smith ( 25 years, 278 days), Daulton Jefferies ( 26 years, 249 days) and A.J. Puk ( 26 years, 348 days)...Jed Lowrie is the oldest at 37 years and 356 days...he is followed by Stephen Vogt (37 years, 158 days), Justin Grimm (33 years, 235 days) and Elvis Andrus ( 33 years, 225 days).
THE INJURED LIST: After placing begin the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.
A's vs. PHILLIES: The A's are 10-10 against the Phillies, which includes 6-3 in Oakland and 4-7 in Philadelphia....are 3-5 at Citizens Bank Park...last met in 2017 when the A's won two of three in Philadelphia...the A's have won two of three in all three series in Oakland $(2005,08,14)$ and lost two of three in Philadelphia in 2003 and 2011.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is on his 14th consecutive Opening Day roster and is scheduled to make his 14th consecutive Opening Day start at shortstop...would become the 20th shortstop in Major League history with 14 or more Opening Day starts...Tony Kemp tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8) and tied for third in runs (9)...Sean Murphy tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8), ranked third in batting and fourth in slugging (.833) and OPS (1.319).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1968 the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore...John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in 1975 Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in 1990 Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith... in 2019 Khris Davis homers twice at Baltimore, including his 200th career home run.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season....begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021... is 1-1 with a 10.29 ERA ( 8 er in 7.0 ip) in his two starts, $0-0$ with a 2.70 ERA ( 3 er in 10.0 ip) in four relief appearances.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA in four appearances, including three starts...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24 -for-65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)... tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

JEFFERIES vs. PHILADELPHIA: Is scheduled to make his first career appearance and start...it will also be his first interleague appearance.


2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 ( 5 -for-27) with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to 231 (6-for-26) with a 605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, 115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a 316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings ( 1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors ( 1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18... has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of $8.22 \ldots$...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA...his opponents batting average broke down to 280 ( 44 -for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 ( 46 -for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers...allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA.... had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, $4-1$ with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were $4-5$ in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake ( $7 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{so}$ )...had a no decision in an $8-5$ loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, 323 opponents batting average and .969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland....allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20

against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's $8-3$ win at Los Angeles-AL ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}$, $3 \mathrm{r}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}$ ) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches....yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses....pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit ( $1.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 2$ so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas....was placed on the 10-day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

RHP Paul Blackburn (1-4, 5.87 ERA in 2021): Begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons... has pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which have come as a starter...was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA in three games, including two starts, this spring...opponents were 13-for-37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...has never faced the Rays in his career...began the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was $4-7$ with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts... allowed a 319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a . 366 opponents on-base percentage.

- Is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014, 16-18, 20, 22)...has pitched three times on Opening Day (1.2 ip, $1 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 1 \mathrm{so}$ ).
- Posted a 3.68 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Last faced the Philies on May 4, 2017 while pitching for the Cubs (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 1 so)
