# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-2) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (3-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost two of three at Philadelphia to start the season, winning their first game yesterday after dropping the first two...this marks the sixth time in the last seven years the A's have started the year 1-2 or worse (were 0-3 last year and 2-1 in 2020)...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 44354080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland....only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships....only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City...with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on Friday in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (four games) and Toronto (three games)... this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco...begin the home schedule a week from today with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).

ROOKIES: The A's had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)... 10 have appeared in a game and the other, Adam Oller, is scheduled to start tomorrow...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019...two of the players made their Major League debuts (Lemoine on Friday, Jackson on Saturday)...Oller is scheduled to make his debut tomorrow.

MR. 1,000: Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history on Friday...there have now been 1,006 players in Oakland history now that Jake Lemoine, Cristian Pache, Kevin Smith, Kirby Snead, Dany Jiménez, and Zach Jackson have also made their A's debuts...the other players on the A's Opening Day roster that have not played for Oakland yet are Justin Grimm and Adam Oller.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991....A's relievers have 9.2 innings pitched, which is the fewest in the majors...five players on the A's Opening Day roster have six or more years of service: Lowrie (13 years, 111 days), Andrus ( 13 years), Vogt ( 8 years, 64 days), Piscotty ( 6 years, 76 days) and Grimm ( 6 years, 50 days)...the A's have lost three of their last four openers and are now 8 -21 on Opening Day dating back to 1994....were the visiting team on Opening Day for the first time since 2009 (opened in Japan in 2012 and 2019 but were the home team each year)

ROSTER NOTES: The A's placed Skye Bolt on the 10-day injured list yesterday (right oblique strain) and recalled Adam Kolarek from Triple-A Las Vegas... now have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after opening the season with 14 pitchers and 14 position players...this marks the fifth time in the last six years Oakland begins the season with at least 13 pitchers ( 13 in 2021, 15 on 2020's 30-man roster and 12 in 2019 in Japan)...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Andrus, Irvin, Kemp, Lowrie, Montas, Murphy, Pinder, Piscotty, Trivino)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Acevedo, Allen, Blackburn, Bolt, Brown, Jefferies, Moll, Puk) and one was in the A's farm system (Jackson)...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent.

TENURE: Of the 28 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only five played for Oakland in each of the previous four seasons...Chad Pinder has been with the club since 2016, Paul Blackburn and Frankie Montas since 2017 and Stephen Piscotty and Lou Trivino since 2018...only Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16-18, 21) and Stephen Vogt (2013-17) have played for the A's prior to 2016, but both have played for other clubs since then...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization... he is followed by Lou Trivino, who was drafted two days later.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days on Friday, is the youngest....he is followed by Kevin Smith ( 25 years, 278 days), Daulton Jefferies (26 years, 249 days) and A.J. Puk ( 26 years, 348 days)...Jed Lowrie is the oldest at 37 years and 356 days...he is followed by Stephen Vogt ( 37 years, 158 days), Justin Grimm ( 33 years, 235 days) and Elvis Andrus (33 years, 225 days).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have four players on the injured list after adding Bolt yesterday...began the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020... used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)....used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had $16 . .$. tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the $\mathrm{CL}(.298)$, third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)... played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the season series last year 4-3....won two of three in Oakland and split four games in Tampa Bay...also won the season series 4-3 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series from the Rays for the first time since 2011-12...are 32-31 against the Rays dating back to 2012... all-time, are 113-79 (.589), which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-33 in Oakland and 51-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

Tony Kemp reached base safely in all three games at Philadelphia (4-for12, walk)...hit safely in nine of his 11 games this spring and batted . 343 with six doubles, which tied for the Major League lead...tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8) and tied for third in runs (9)...Sean Murphy tied for the Major League lead in doubles this spring (6), tied for second in the Cactus League in extra base hits (8), ranked third in batting and fourth in slugging (.833) and OPS (1.319).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1993 Rickey Henderson's eighth inning home run was the 200th of his career...in 1994 Henderson collects his $231^{\text {th }}$ double in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record.... Henderson would finish his A's career with 289 doubles...in 2012 Jonny Gomes is hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the bottom of the $12^{\text {th }}$ inning to force in the winning run in a 5-4 win over Kansas City...it is the first of 14 "walk-off" wins for the A's in 2012.

FOR STARTERS: Begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons... has pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which have come as a starter.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA in three games, including two starts...opponents were 13 -for- 37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings....allowed at least two runs in each of his three appearances.


BLACKBURN vs. TAMPA BAY: Is making his first career appearance and start.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an 858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 ( 23 -for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a .328 career average in that situation ...was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, $1-3$ with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road....was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a . 533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were $3-1$ in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.
WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his 311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings.... his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an 824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 ( 53 -for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, 311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots....had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that....went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and . 737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a sea-son-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings... picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a sea-son-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season... allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25 ...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and 360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit....allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug.

18...started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a $3-2$ loss...also walked a season-high three batters...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a career-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches... logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's $3-1$ win...left with a $1-0$ lead but the bullpen blew the save...went $0-1$ with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA, .359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...allowed a season-high nine hits and surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...yielded four runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings on Sept. 10 against Texas... left with a $6-4$ lead but had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's $7-2$ win...it was his first win since June 29 , 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6,2018 ....posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his career high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle...allowed a season-high six runs and a career-high tying three home runs in 2.0 innings in his final start on Oct. 2 at Houston, a 10-4 loss.

RHP Adam Oller (Major League Debut): Was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt....was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday, was on the A's Opening Day roster and will be making his Major League debut.... will become the 53rd pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Daulton Jefferies on Sept. 12, 2020...was 1-0 with a 9.95 ERA in three Cactus League appearances, including two starts...opponents were 11-for-29 (.379)...struck out nine batters in 6.1 innings...was named the New York Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year and a MiLB.com organizational All-Star last year after combining for a $9-4$ record, a 3.45 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 23 starts with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...it was the first time he pitched above Single-A...struck out a career-high 138 batters in 120.0 innings, an average of 10.35 per nine innings...led the Mets farm system in strikeouts.

- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday...is one of five non-roster invitees to make the A's Opening Day roster.
- Begins his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team (Rangers, 201213; Cubs, 2013-17; Royals, 2018; Mariners, 2018; Brewers, 2020; A’s, 2022)...pitched in 306 games from 2012-18 but has just four big league appearances over the previous three seasons.
- Is on his sixth Opening Day roster (2014, 16-18, 20, 22).
- Posted a 3.68 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Has not allowed a run or a hit in four career appearances against Tampa Bay ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 2$ so)...his last appearance came on Sept. 20, 2017 with the Cubs ( $0.2 \mathrm{ip}, 1$ so).
Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.


## 61 RHP ZACH JACKSON

- Was originally a third round pick of Toronto in the 2016 draft and was selected by the A's in the Triple-A portion of the 2020 Rule 5 draft...is 16-8 with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors...has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
