# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-3) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (4-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Played their first extra inning game of the season last night and lost $9-8$ in 10 innings....are now $2-3$ to start the season for the fifth time in the last seven years...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122 nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships....the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City...with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland last Friday in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 21 runs in the first two games of this series after tallying 11 runs in the three-game series at Philadelphia.... have 32 runs for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Guardians (38)....Jed Lowrie hit a three-run home run last night and five of the A's eight home runs this year have come with at least two runners on base... no other Major League team has more than two home runs with at least two runners on...the A's eight home runs overall are tied for third in the AL... are batting a Major League leading. 486 (17-for-35) with runners in scoring position... have been hit by a pitch once in four of the first five games and are tied for second in the AL in hit by pitches (4)...set an Athletics record with 98 hit by pitches last year...drew nine walks last night after walking seven times over the first four games.

PITCHING: The A's allowed nine runs last night, nine runs on Opening Day and seven runs in three games in between...the A's are one of four American League teams with two wins from their starting pitchers (Astros, Angels, Twins) and one of two with no wins from their bullpen (Twins)...the A's bullpen tossed 8.1 innings last night after logging 13.2 innings over the first four games...first batters faced are 3 -for- 15 (.200) against A's relievers but they have five walks, which is tied for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors last night after making just one over the first four games...the four errors are tied for second most in the American League (Twins, 5)...have turned two double plays, which is tied with the Tigers and the Twins for the fewest in the AL...the A's are one of two AL teams who have not had an opponent attempt a steal (Rangers).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eightgame road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco... begin the home schedule on Monday with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).
ROOKIES: The A's had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...all 11 have appeared in at least one game and three of those (Lemoine on Friday, Jackson on Saturday, Oller yesterday) made their Major League debuts...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000th player in Oakland history last Friday...seven other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,007...Adam Oller will become number 1,008 today.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last sev en seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization... the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days last Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest ( 37 years, 356 days last Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie ( 13 years, 111 days), Andrus ( 13 years), Vogt ( 8 years, 64 days), Piscotty ( 6 years, 76 days) and Grimm ( 6 years, 50 days)
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have four players on the injured list after adding Skye Bolt on Sunday...began the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the $\mathrm{CL}(.298)$, third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2022 after winning the season series last year 4-3...have scored 21 runs in the first two games this year after tallying 19 runs in seven games last year... won two of three in Oakland and split four games in Tampa Bay last year....also won the season series 4-3 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series from the Rays for the first time since 2011-12...are 33-32 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 114-80 (.588), which is their best record against any American League team....are 62-33 in Oakland and 52-47 at Tropicana Field... the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

## ODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown has driven in at least one run in four of the A's five games and is tied for second in the American League in RBI (8)...the eight RBI are the most by an Athletic over the first five games since 2007 when Mark Ellis allso had eight...Tony Kemp has reached base safely in all five games (7-for-21, two walks) after hitting safely in nine of his 11 games this spring.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1968 the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington... Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in 1994 the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (0-1, 9.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his second appearance and start of the season...made his second career Opening Day start last Friday at Philadelphia....also started the A's opener on July 24, 2020 and is now $0-1$ with a 6.00 ERA ( $9.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}$ ) in his two starts in openers...is one of three pitchers to start two openers for the A's over the last nine years (Gray, 2014-15; Graveman, 2017-18)...is the only foreign-born pitcher in Oakland history with multiple Opening Day starts...Ariel Prieto (1997) is the only other foreign-born pitcher with an Opening Day start...this is Montas' seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss at Philadelphia on Opening Day last Friday...it was his first loss since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak....allowed a home run to Schwarber to start the game but then retired six of the next seven batters...yielded four more runs in the third inning on a Harper RBI double, a Hoskins two-run single and a Gregorius RBI single...then retired the final seven batters he faced.

MONTAS vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.66 ERA (20.1 ip, $16 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 20$ so, 3 hr ) in four career appearances, including three starts...is 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA ( 3 er in 13.1 ip ) in two starts in

was 1-1 with a 3.97 ERA ( $11.1 \mathrm{ip}, 11 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}, 2 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in two starts last year...the loss came in a 4-3 decision at Tampa Bay on April 27...allowed a run in the first inning when Kiermaier led off with a triple and scored when Arozarena reached on a Machin error...Oakland scored single runs in the second and sixth innings to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run home run to Phillips in the bottom of the sixth for the loss...then picked up the win in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on May 8...shut out the Rays on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a $3-0$ lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Lowe in the sixth inning...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.1 innings of work.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was $0-1$ with a 6.35 ERA....opponents went 10 -for- 25 (.400) and he walked one batter in 5.2 innings...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts... his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes ( 2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth).
STRIKEOUTS: Finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910... is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74 this year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 475 career strikeouts in 453.0 innings, an average of 9.44 per nine innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for the American League lead in games started ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)....also ranked third in pitches $(3,028)$ and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11).
BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 8 - 7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, . 575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break...had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and bat ting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to 225 (78-for-346) with a . 665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...had a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, .227 with nine home runs with runners on base...opponents hit . 190 the first time through the order, . 273 the second time and .224 after that...held the opponent's number three hitter to a 171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes and has a .163 career average in that situation.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in 12 starts against AL West teams compared to $8-5$ with a 3.86 ERA and .248 opponents average in 20 starts against all other teams...is now $15-9$ with a 3.32 ERA ( 77 er in 208.2 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, $16-15$ with a 4.32 ERA ( 120 er in 244.1 ip ) in 58 games against all other teams.
SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 32 starts and now has a streak of 45 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay ( 8.0 ip)...had seven starts of 7.0 innings in 2021 and was $5-0$ with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts.

THIS AND THAT: Was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night....his day ERA was third lowest in the AL...allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, . 232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on....had 10 no decisions, five of which came in extra inning games...the A's were 17-15 (.531) in his starting assignments...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history....according to TruMedia, threw 678 splitters, which was second most in the majors (Gausman, SF 1061)...opponents hit .126 with a .352 OPS off his splitter and he allowed just one home run
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Struck out 11 batters May 24 against Seattle...fanned 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and . 204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs....his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35 ...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4 against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8 -Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a fivegame span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6,1995 , had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer... did not allow a run over his first four innings on Sept. 2 at Detroit to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September after going $3-0$ with a 2.19 ERA in six starts...led the AL in ERA in September, ranked third in opponents batting average (.193) and slugging percentage (.341) and fifth in strikeouts (40) and OPS (.622) the 40 strikeouts tied for fifth most in Oakland history in September.
