# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-3) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (4-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Earned the 4-2 win last night and have now won three of their last four...are now 3-3 to start the season...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a $3886-4248$ record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City....with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland last Friday in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 25 runs in the first three games of this series after tallying 11 runs in the three-game series at Philadelphia.... have 36 runs for the season, which is second most in the Majors to the Guardians (45)... Seth Brown hit a three-run home run last night and six of the A's nine home runs this year have come with at least two runners on base...no other Major League team has more than two home runs with at least two runners on... the A's nine home runs overall are tied for second in the AL... have been hit by a pitch once in four of the first six games and are tied for third in the AL in hit by pitches (4)...set an Athletics record with 98 hit by pitches last year.

PITCHING: The A's have three wins from their starting pitchers and are one of two with no wins from their bullpen (Twins)...the A's bullpen tossed 2.2 innings last night after logging 22.0 innings over the first five games...first batters faced are 3 -for- 18 (.167) against A's relievers but they have five walks, which is tied for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in their last two games after making just one over the first four games... the five errors are second most in the American League (Twins, 7)...have turned two double plays, which is tied with the Tigers and the Twins for the fewest in the AL... the A's are one of two AL teams who have not had an opponent attempt a steal (Rangers).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (three games)...this will be the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eightgame road trip...following this trip, the A's are scheduled to play 13 of their next 15 games at home, with the two road games coming at San Francisco... begin the home schedule on Monday with a seven-game homestand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games).
ROOKIES: The A's had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)...all 11 have appeared in at least one game and three of those (Lemoine on Friday, Jackson on Saturday, Oller yesterday) made their Major League debuts...employed just 13 rookies all last year, eight in 2020 and nine in 2019.
THIS AND THAT: The A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...Billy McKinney became the 1,000 th player in Oakland history last Friday....seven other players have made their A's debut since then to bring the total to 1,007...Adam Oller will become number 1,008 today.
ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 15 pitchers and 13 position players after starting the year with 14 pitchers and 14 positions players...nine players returned from last years Opening Day roster, eight other players played for the A's at some point last year and one was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez,

Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a
free agent... have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...only Pinder and Piscotty have been on each of the last five Opening Day rosters and only Montas and Trivino have been on each of the last four...Chad Pinder, who was drafted on June 6, 2013, has the longest uninterrupted tenure in the A's organization.. the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years...Christian Pache, who was 23 years and 140 days last Friday, is the youngest and Jed Lowrie is the oldest ( 37 years, 356 days last Friday)...five players on the A's Opening Day roster began the season with six or more years of service: Lowrie ( 13 years, 111 days), Andrus ( 13 years), Vogt ( 8 years, 64 days), Piscotty ( 6 years, 76 days) and Grimm (6 years, 50 days)

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have four players on the injured list after adding Skye Bolt on Sunday...began the season with three players (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) on the injured list after starting the season with two last year and one in 2020...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)....used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . $286(4-10)$ in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had $16 . .$. tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)... has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have started 2-1 against Tampa after winning the season series last year 4-3...have scored 25 runs in the first three games this year after tallying 19 runs in seven games last year...won two of three in Oakland and split four games in Tampa Bay last year....also won the season series 4-3 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series from the Rays for the first time since 2011-12...are 34-32 against the Rays dating back to 2012... all-time, are 115-80 (.590), which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-33 in Oakland and 53-47 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown has driven in at least one run in four of the A's six games and is tied for third in the American League in RBI (8)...Tony Kemp has reached base safely in all five of his games (7-for-21, two walks) after hitting safely in nine of his 11 games this spring.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1915 Herb Pennock comes within one out of pitching the first Opening Day no-hitter...a scratch single by Harry Hooper is the only hit in the A's 5-0 win over Boston...in 1925 two future Hall of Famers make their Major League debut in the same game as Lefty Grove starts against Boston and Mickey Cochrane has a pinch hit single in a game the A's would win 9-8 in 10 innings...in 1971 Reggie Jackson hits his 100th home run in an Oakland uniform to become the first Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark.... he also hit his 101st in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota...in 1974 Jim Hunter strikes out Toby Harrah in the first inning of the A's $4-2$ win against Texas...it is his 1000th strikeout as an Oakland Athletic, making him the first Oakland pitcher to reach that plateau...two years later, in 1976, Vida Blue strikeouts out four Texas Rangers to give him 1000 career strikeouts... he finished his A's career with 1315 career strikeouts, an Oakland record... in 2001 Miguel Tejada hits the $10000^{\text {th }}$ home run in Athletics history in a 9-8 loss to Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season....begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
three-game losing streak: Was the losing pitcher in his first start this year after dropping each of his final two decisions in 2021...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (twice, last: May 9-30, 2021)...has a 7.45 ERA ( 16 er in 19.1 ip) during the losing streak, which spans four starts dating back to Sept. 22, 2021...has surrendered eight home runs during the streak, including three in his first start this year and his final start last year.
LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's $4-2$ loss at Philadelphia last Saturday...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...allowed a two-run home run to Castellanos in the first and then blanked the Phillies on three hits and a walk over innings two through five...surrendered back-to-back homers to Hoskins and Segura to start the sixth and was relieved by Jiménez with one out in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0.

IRVIN vs. TAMPA BAY: Is $0-2$ with a 3.75 ERA ( $12.0 \mathrm{ip}, 11 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}$, 11 so, 3 hr ) in two career starts, both
 last year...the first loss came in a 2-0 decision at Tampa Bay on April 28... allowed at least one hit in each of the first four innings but did not allow a run until Zunino homered with two outs in the fifth....also allowed a RBI single to Margot in the fifth but then struck out the side in the sixth...Glasnow and two Tampa Bay relievers combined to shut out Oakland on seven hits...then took the loss in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May $9 . .$. allowed a leadoff single to Arozarena but then retired each of the next 12 batters...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Adames in the fifth...then surrendered a solo home run to Brosseau in the sixth for the loss.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20 -for62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies.
DON'T WALK: Walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League... walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts.... had five starts with no walks and 16 with one...has walked just 57 batters in 229.0 career innings ( 2.24 per nine innings).
among the leaders: his 15 losses were the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a 281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors.... his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most....averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the

majors....allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16).

STREAKING: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and . 868 OPS over his first two starts, $3-2$ with a 1.89 ERA and .586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and . 820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and . 522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and 2-5 with a 6.38 ERA and .950 OPS over his final 10 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 ( 52 -for-180) with a . 767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots....allowed a 324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a 325 career opponents average with RISP.
AGAINST THE WEST: Went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and are an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)....his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors this year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and is $0-3$ with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.
DAYS REST: Was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to $9-4$ with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more....led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.
NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to $4-8$ with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998... however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a fivehit shutout in a $7-0$ win over Detroit on April 17...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May $4 . .$. tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays.. left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the AL and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0 -inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...had walked just 25 batters in 135.1 innings over his first 23 starts ( 1.66 per nine innings) before walking a ca-reer-high four batters in a $5-4$ victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...it snapped a season-opening streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26 -start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999. had surrendered just 12 home runs over his first 25 starts and 144.1 innings ( 0.75 per nine innings)...then allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career on Aug. 31 at Detroit to begin a season-ending stretch where he allowed 11 home runs in seven starts and 34.0 innings (2.91 per nine innings)...yielded a career-high tying three home runs in his final start on Oct. 3 at Houston.
