# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-5) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (3-6)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at Toronto over the weekend after wining three of four at Tampa Bay....went 5-5 on the season-opening road trip...were 3-7 after 10 games last year and 6-4 in 2019 and 2020...have outscored their opponents $53-43$ and the +10 run differential is second best in the American League to the Guardians (+11)...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships....only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122 nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 9150-9552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City... with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on April 8 in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

COLISEUM OPENERS: The A's have a 25-29 record in Coliseum openers...that includes 20-15 on Opening Day and 5-14 in secondary openers...the last time the A's first game in the Coliseum was not the season opener was in 2019 when they defeated Los Angeles (AL) 4-0 after opening the season in Tokyo against the Mariners...that win snapped a 10 -game losing streak in secondary Coliseum openers.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored a Major League leading 53 runs over their first 10 games...are tied for third in the American League with 12 home runs... eight of those home runs have come with runners on base, which is the most in the AL...six have come with at least two runners on base, which is twice as many as the next closest team (Cardinals and Mets, 3)...are batting a Major League leading .368 ( 25 -for-68) with runners in scoring position...have been successful in each of their five stolen bases and are one of three teams without a caught steadling (White Sox, 9; Philles, 2)...are tied for the second most strikeouts in the AL (99).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.14 ERA ( 15 er in 43.0 ip ) over the last five games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests...have the second highest opponents OPS (.755) and slugging percentage (.435) in the American League and the third highest batting average (.250) and on-base percentage (.321)...A's starting pitchers are tied for the AL lead in wins and rank second in innings pitched (47.0)...have issued 12 walks ( 2.30 per nine innings), which is second fewest in the AL...however, the bullpen has walked 22 in 39.2 innings ( 4.99 per nine innings), which is third most in the AL... the pen has allowed just 3-of-20 (15.0\%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL...also rank second in opponents batting average against first batters faced (.156), but have six first-batter walks, which is tied for second most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors over the last six games after making just one over the first four...the eight errors are tied for second most in the American League...are tied for third in outfield assists (2)...opponents are 1-for-2 (50.0\%) in stolen base attempts and two two attempts are second fewest in the majors (Rockies, 1).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their first homestand of the season tonight, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (four games) and Toronto (three games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home, with the two road games coming next week on Tuesday and Wednesday at San Francisco...the homestand ends a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...went 5-5 on the sea-son-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995... in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.
ROOKIES: The A's have used 12 rookies this year, which is one short of their season total of 13 from last year...have three rookies on the roster that have
yet to appear in a game (N. Allen, Logue, Lopes)...have not employed more than 13 rookies in a season since 2017 when they had 20 ...three of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Oller) and N. Allen, Logue and Lopes would also be making their debuts...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012)

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year, which includes seven COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and added one more due to injury (Bolt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18).. used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 32 players this year and have four players on the roster that have yet to appear in a game ( $N$. Allen, Logue, Lopes, Selman)...the breakdown includes 16 pitchers and 16 catchers...the A's Opening Day roster featured nine returning players from the 2021 Opening Day roster, eight other players who played for the A's at some point last year and one who was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021)...in all other springs, have played at least one game in either the Bay Area, Las Vegas, Palm Springs, New Orleans or Bradenton, Fla.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's split the season series with the Orioles last year, going 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won two of three at Baltimore... are 14-5 against the Orioles dating back to 2018, including 7-2 in the Coliseum...are 32-14 (.696) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 277-270 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 140-137 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards...are 1014-949 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

Elvis Andrus is tied for fourth in the American League in doubles (4) and tied for 10th in runs scored (7)...Seth Brown is tied for third in the American League in RBI (9)...Tony Kemp has reached base safely in each of his eight starts...Sean Murphy has hit safely in each of his last five games (8-for-18, .444) after going 2 -for-21 (.095) over his first five contests...Kevin Smith has hit safely in each of his last four games (5-for-12, .417) after going 0 -for-16 over his first six contests.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1970 Don Mincher homers twice and drives in all five Oakland runs, but the A's lose 11-5 to Minnesota...in 1981 Brian Kingman tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Seattle as the A's improve to 10-0...in 2003 Barry Zito tosses a six-hit shutout to defeat Texas, 9-0.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (1-1, 4.76 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his third start of the season...made his second career Opening Day start April 8 at Philadelphia...also started the A's opener on July 24, 2020 and is now $0-1$ with a 6.00 ERA ( $9.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 4$ $\mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}$ ) in his two starts in openers...is one of three pitchers to start two openers for the A's over the last nine years (Gray, 2014-15; Graveman, 201718)...is the only foreign-born pitcher in Oakland history with multiple Opening Day starts...Ariel Prieto (1997) is the only other foreign-born pitcher with an Opening Day start...this is Montas' seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss at Philadelphia on Opening Day on April 8...it was his first loss since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a home run to Schwarber to start the game but then retired six of the next seven batters... yielded four more runs in the third inning on a Harper RBI double, a Hoskins two-run single and a Gregorius RBI single...then retired the final seven batters he faced.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 4-2 win at Tampa Bay last Wednesday...blanked the Rays on three hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Choi in the fourth...retired each of the next nine batters and had a 4-1 lead when he was relieved by Snead with one out in the seventh innings and runners on first and second...Snead allowed one of the runners to score.

MONTAS vs. BALTIMORE: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 10-3 victory at Baltimore on April 10, 2019...retired each of the first 12 batters he faced and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Mancini in the fifth...also allowed a two-run home run to Ruiz that inning...was relieved by Wendelken to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 10-3.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400) and he walked one batter in 5.2 innings...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts... his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes ( 2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth).
STRIKEOUTS: Finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910... is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74 this year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 481 career strikeouts in 459.1 innings, an average of 9.42 per nine innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average

(.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches $(3,028)$ and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11).
BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was $8-7$ with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, . 575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break....had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to 225 (78-for-346) with a . 665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...had a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, . 227 with nine home runs with runners on base...opponents hit . 190 the first time through the order, . 273 the second time and .224 after that....held the opponent's number three hit ter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes and has a .161 career average in that situation.
AGAINST THE WEST: Went 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in 12 starts against AL West teams compared to $8-5$ with a 3.86 ERA and .248 opponents average in 20 starts against all other teams...is now 15-9 with a 3.32 ERA ( 77 er in 208.2 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, 17-15 with a 4.34 ERA ( 121 er in 250.2 ip ) in 59 games against all other teams.
SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 32 starts and now has a streak of 46 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay ( 8.0 ip )...had seven starts of 7.0 innings in 2021 and was $5-0$ with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts.

THIS AND THAT: Was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to $8-7$ with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the AL...allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and . 586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.... had 10 no decisions, five of which came in extra inning games...the A's were 17-15 (.531) in his starting assignments.... had four games of 10 or more strikeouts, which tied for the fourth most 10 -strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history....according to TruMedia, threw 678 splitters, which was second most in the majors (Gausman, SF 1061)...opponents hit .126 with a .352 OPS off his splitter and he allowed just one home run
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Struck out 11 batters May 24 against Seattle...fanned 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and . 204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs....his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and . 212 opponents average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35 ...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4 against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8 -Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a fivegame span over the last 35 years....only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6,1995 , had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer... did not allow a run over his first four innings on Sept. 2 at Detroit to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings....was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September after going $3-0$ with a 2.19 ERA in six starts...led the AL in ERA in September, ranked third in opponents batting average (.193) and slugging percentage (.341) and fifth in strikeouts (40) and OPS (.622)... the 40 strikeouts tied for fifth most in Oakland history in September.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and . 225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's... was also $2-0$ with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and . 186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.
