# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-5) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (3-7)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the home opener last night and have now won six of the last nine games after losing each of the first two contests... are 6-5 for the season...were $4-7$ after 11 games last year, $7-4$ in 2020 and $6-5$ in 2019...have outscored their opponents $58-44$ and the +14 run differential is the best in the American League and tied for fourth best in the majors...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships... only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)... have a 4435-4080 (.521) record over the previous 54 seasons in Oakland... only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Los Angeles Dodgers, Boston, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 91509552 (.489) in their previous 121 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City... with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on April 8 in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 58 runs over the first 11 games, which is tied with the Dodgers for the most in the majors....are tied for fourth in the American League with 12 home runs...eight of those home runs have come with runners on base, which is the most in the AL...six have come with at least two runners on base, which is twice as many as the next closest team (Cardinals and Mets, 3)...are batting a Major League leading . 365 (27-for-74) with runners in scoring position.... have been successful in each of their five stolen base attempts and are one of three teams without a caught steadling (White Sox, 9 SB; Philles, 2 SB)....were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was second best in the AL and the best in Athletics history in a full season....are tied for the third most strikeouts in the AL this year (103).
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.77 ERA ( 16 er in 52.0 ip) over the last six games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests... have the second highest opponents OPS (.744) and slugging percentage (.427) in the American League and the third highest batting average (.247)...A's starting pitchers have five wins, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (6)...have 53.0 innings pitched, which is second most in the AL to the Mariners (53.1) and fifth most in the majors...last year, the A's led the majors with 894.0 innings pitched, but that was the fewest by a Major League leader in modern ML history (since 1900)...starters have issued 14 walks in 53.0 innings ( 2.38 per nine innings), but the bullpen has walked 22 in 42.1 innings ( 4.68 per nine innings)...the pen has allowed just 3-of-20 (15.0\%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL (Astros, 11.1\%)...are tied for third in opponents batting average against first batters faced (.171), but have six first-batter walks, which is tied for second most.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors over the last seven games after making just one over the first four...the eight errors are tied for second most in the American League.... had their third outfield assist of the season last night, which is tied with the Rangers and Guardians for the most in the AL...opponents are 1 -for-2 (50.0\%) in stolen base attempts and the two attempts are second fewest in the majors (Rockies, 1).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (1-0) and Texas (three games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home, with the two road games coming next week on Tuesday and Wednesday at San Francisco...the homestand ends a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...went 5-5 on the season-opening 10 -game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 12 rookies this year, which is one short of their season total of 13 from last year...have three rookies on the roster that have yet to appear in a game (N. Allen, Logue, Lopes)...have not employed more than 13 rookies in a season since 2017 when they had 20 ...three of the rook-
ies have made their Major Leaue debuts (Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Oller) and $N$. Allen, Logue and Lopes would also be making their debuts.... had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year, which includes seven COVID-19 IL placements... began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and added one more due to injury (Bolt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016....however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.
ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 32 players this year and have four players on the roster that have yet to appear in a game ( N . Allen, Logue, Lopes, Selman)...the breakdown includes 16 pitchers and 16 position players... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year...the A's Opening Day roster featured nine returning players from the 2021 Opening Day roster, eight other players who played for the A's at some point last year and one who was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...have one player who has played for the A's in each of the last seven seasons (Pinder), two in each of the last six (Blackburn and Montas) and two in each of the last five (Piscotty and Trivino)...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2... the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was $.286(4-10)$ in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16 ...tied for second in the CL in triples (6), ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)... tied for the third fewest home runs (23) and scored the fifth fewest runs (97)...the pitching staff has the second highest opponents batting average in the CL (.298), third highest ERA (6.12), OPS (.852) and on-base percentage (.367) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.486)...has the second fewest strikeouts (152)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3)...played all 18 games in Arizona, which marks just the third time in Oakland history the A's have not played a Spring Training game outside the state of Arizona (1981, 2021).
A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's won the first meeting of 2022 last night after splitting the season series with the Orioles last year, $3-3$...lost two of three in Oakland but won two of three at Baltimore...are 15-5 (.750) against the Orioles dating back to 2018, including $8-2$ (.800) in the Coliseum...are 33-14 (.702) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 278-270 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 141-137 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards... are 1015-949 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

Seth Brown is tied for third in the American League in RBI (9)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first five games ( 5.0 ip ) and has a win and a save...Tony Kemp has reached base safely in each of his nine starts... Sean Murphy has hit safely in each of his last six games ( 9 -for-22, .409) after going 2 -for-21 (.095) over his first five contests...is tied for second in the AL in doubles (5) and extra base hits (8)...is the only Athletic to start all 11 games (eight at catcher, three at designated hitter).

## IHIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1981 the A's defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-1 in the first game of a double header at the Coliseum to run their record to 11-0, a Major League record at the time...the Mariners won the second game of the twinbill to end the A's streak but Oakland won the next six to improve to 17-1...in 1986 Jose Rijo strikes out an Oakland record 16 batters in the A's 7-2 win at Seattle... Bill Mooneyham adds two in an inning of relief for a then-club record 18 for a nine inning game.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (1-1, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season.... begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
DON'T WALK: Did not walk a batter in his last start after issuing one free pass in his first start...has one walk in 11.2 innings this year ( 0.77 per nine innings) after walking just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year...his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts last year and has now done so in 33 of his 37 career starts... has walked just 57 batters in 235.1 career innings ( 2.18 per nine innings).
FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Philadelphia on April 9 ...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...allowed a two-run home run to Castellanos in the first and then blanked the Phillies on three hits and a walk over innings two through five...surrendered back-to-back homers to Hoskins and Segura to start the sixth and was relieved by Jiménez with one out in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0.
LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's $6-3$ victory at Tampa Bay last Thursday...Oakland scored three times in the second inning and he allowed a RBI single to Margot in the bottom of the second...retired each of the next 14 batters following the Margot single and had a $6-1$ lead when he yielded a leadoff double to Ramirez in the seventh...Lowe homered one out later and he was relieved by Acevedo with one out in the seventh and the A's leading 6-3.

IRVIN vs. BALTIMORE: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 3-1 victory at Baltimore last year on April 23...shut out the Ori-

oles on four hits and a walk over the
first five innings before loading the bases on three consecutive singles to start the sixth...struck out the next batter he faced (Mountcastle) before allowing a RBI single to Severino...was relieved by Petit following the Severino single with the A's leading 3-1

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20 -for62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies.

AMONG THE LEADERS: His 15 losses were the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16)

STREAKING: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and . 586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and . 522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and 2-5 with a 6.38 ERA and .950 OPS over his final 10 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a . 739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a . 767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots...allowed a . 324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the ma jors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .330 career opponents average with RISP.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors this year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.
DAYS REST: Was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to $9-4$ with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents hit . 440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of sup port, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a fivehit shutout in a 7-0 win over Detroit on April 17...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and . 232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays.. left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the AL and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...had walked just 25 batters in 135.1 innings over his first 23 starts ( 1.66 per nine innings) before walking a ca-reer-high four batters in a $5-4$ victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...it snapped a season-opening streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland his tory to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999.. had surrendered just 12 home runs over his first 25 starts and 144.1 innings ( 0.75 per nine innings)...then allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career on Aug. 31 at Detroit to begin a season-ending stretch where he allowed 11 home runs in seven starts and 34.0 innings ( 2.91 per nine innings)...yielded a career-high tying three home runs in his final start on Oct. 3 at Houston

RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-1, 1.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the fourth of his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss at Toronto last Friday ( $4.1 \mathrm{ip}, 7 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 2$ so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...was $0-2$ with a 9.64 ERA and .369 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, this spring... spent most of the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a . 208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 against right-handed hitters compared to .231 against left-handers
