# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-5) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (3-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won the first two games of this series to move into a tie for first place in the American League West... have won seven of the last 10 games after losing the first two contests and are 7-5 for the season... have outscored their opponents $60-45$ and the +15 run differential is the best in the American League and fifth best in the majors... have spent one day tied for first in the West, one day in second, six days tied for second, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the Atlanta Braves (21), New York Yankees (19) and Los Angeles Dodgers (19) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships....only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships... with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on April 8 in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.

ROOKIES: Last night, Nick Allen and Zach Logue became the 13th and 14th rookies to appear in a game for the A's this year...last year, the A's used just 13 rookies for the entire season...this is the first time the A's have employed more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...have two rookies on the roster that have yet to appear in a game (Lopes, McDonald)...five of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Oller) and Lopes and McDonald would also be making their debut...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 60 runs over the first 12 games, which is the most in the majors...also lead the majors with a .333 ( 28 -for-84) batting average with runners in scoring position...have hit 12 home runs, which is tied for fifth in the American League...eight have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...six have come with at least two runners on base, which is twice as many as the next closest team (Cardinals, Mariners and Mets, 3)...have grounded into the second most double plays in the AL (9) and have the third most strikeouts (110).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen six bases in the last five games and are a perfect 7 -for- 7 this year....are one of three teams in the majors that have not been caught stealing (White Sox, 9 SB; Phillies, 2 SB) and the seven stolen bases are tied for fifth in the American League...were successful in 88 -of-108 (81.5\%) stolen bases attempts last year, which was second best in the AL and the best in Athletics history in a full season....'s opponents are 1-for-2 ( $50.0 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts... the one stolen base and two attempts are second fewest in the majors to the Rockies ( 0 steals, 1 attempt).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.51 ERA ( 17 er in 61.0 ip) over the last seven games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests... have the third highest opponents batting average (.246) and slugging percentage (.412) in the American League...A's starting pitchers have five wins, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL....have 58.0 innings pitched, which is second most to Seattle (59.1) and fifth most in the majors...starters have issued 16 walks in 58.0 innings and the average of 2.48 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the AL (Tigers, 2.16)...however, the bullpen has walked 24 in 46.2 innings and the average of 4.63 walks per nine innings is third highest in the AL...the pen has allowed just 3-of-23 ( $13.0 \%$ ) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors over the last eight games after making just one over the first four....the nine errors are tied for the most in the American League...are also tied for the AL lead with three outfield assists and tied for fourth with nine double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (2-0) and Texas (three games)... this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home, with the two road games coming next Tuesday and Wednesday at San Francisco...the homestand ends a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in

Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991...went 5-5 on the season-opening 10 -game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year, which includes seven COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added two more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18).... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 33 players this year and have three players on the roster that have yet to appear in a game (Lopes, McDonald, Selman)... the breakdown includes 17 pitchers and 16 position players...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year....according to Sportsra dar, the 33 players used are second most in Athletics history over the first 12 games of the season to the 1955 Kansas City A's, who used 34 ...the A's Opening Day roster featured nine returning players from the 2021 Opening Day roster, eight other players who played for the A's at some point last year and one who was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades (Oller, Pache, Smith, Snead) and one was claimed off waivers (Neuse)...five were signed as free agents, including one to a Major League contract (Vogt) and four to minor league contracts (Grimm, Jiménez, Lemoine, McKinney), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.82 years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers ( $5-9-4$ ) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...the 18 games were the A's fewest since 1990 when they had 16...tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (6) and ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2022 after splitting the season series with the Orioles last year, $3-3 . .$. lost two of three in Oakland but won two of three at Baltimore...are 16-5 (.762) against the Orioles dating back to 2018, including 9-2 (.818) in the Coliseum....are 34-14 (.708) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 279-270 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 142-137 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards... are 1016-949 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

Seth Brown ranks second in the American League with 11 RBI, which match the most by an A's player over the first 12 games over the last 18 years...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first five games ( 5.0 ip ) and has a win and a save... Tony Kemp has reached base safely in each of his 10 starts...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first five games ( 4.0 ip)...Sean Murphy is 9 -for-26 (.346) over his last seven games after going 2 -for-21 (.095) over his first five contests...is tied for second in the AL in extra base hits (8) and tied for fourth in doubles (5)

In 1969 Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader.... in 1971 Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in 1982 Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota....in 2021 the A's shutout Minnesota in both games of a doubleheader, giving Oakland pitchers four shutouts over a five-game span for the first time since May 12-18, 1909.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-1, 1.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the fourth of his career...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021...is 2-2 with a 5.51 ERA ( 10 er in 16.1 ip ) in his four starts, $0-0$ with a 2.70 ERA ( 3 er in 10.0 ip ) in four relief appearances.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory at Philadlephia on April 10...shut out the Phillies in a career-high tying five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...retired the side in order in the first, second and fourth innings...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position....was relieved by Moll to start the sixth inning after issuing a leadoff walk to Vierling.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's $4-1$ loss at Toronto last Friday...allowed a career-high seven hits in 4.1 innings.... however, yielded just two runs on a Guerrero solo home run in the first and an Espinal RBI double in the second...was relieved by Grimm with one out and a runner on first base in the fifth inning with the A's trailing 2-0

2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10 -day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 ( 5 -for-27) with a 661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to 231 (6-for-26) with a 605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, . 115 with runners on base....opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts....also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a 316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings ( 1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors ( 1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18... has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22 ...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA.... is opponents batting average broke down to .280 ( 44 -for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers....allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA.... had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, $4-1$ with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were $4-5$ in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times... had eight starts without a walk.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake ( $7 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{so}$ )... had a no decision in an $8-5$ loss....logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, 323 opponents batting average and . 969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's $8-3$ win at Los Angeles-AL ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}$, $3 \mathrm{r}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}$ ) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches....yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit ( 1.0 ip, $2 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 2$ so)... it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10 -day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept. 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

- Has spent parts of the previous two seasons with Colorado and was 1-4 with a 5.79 ERA in 11 games, including 10 starts... his only relief apperance came on Sept. 2, 2020 against San Francisco ( $2.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 2$ so).

- Posted a 3.68 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances this spring...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
- Has made three career appearances against the Orioles, pitching 5.0 innings and allowing two runs while striking out six.
Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Made his Major League debut last Saturday at Philadelphia, throwing one scoreless inning with a walk and a strikeout...fanned Didi Gregorius to end the eighth inning for his first career strikeout.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring...did not allow a run in five of his six spring appearances for a 1.35 ERA...allowed a . 208 opponents batting average and struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.
- Was originally a third round pick of Toronto in the 2016 draft and was selected by the A's in the Triple-A portion of the 2020 Rule 5 draft...is 16-8 with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors...h has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
