ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost 1-0 yesterday and the run was unearned...it was the 26th game in Oakland history where the A's did not allow an earned run in a loss (last: May 29, 2021 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...it was the eighth time it happened in a 1-0 loss...three of the A's six losses this year have been by one run....are now 7-4 over the last 11 games after losing the first two contests... have outscored their opponents $60-46$ and the +14 run differential is second best in the American League to the Guardians (+22)... have not won or lost more than two straight games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, one day in second, six days tied for second, one day in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11), Cardinals (8) and Dodgers (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships....with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on April 8 in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.
ROOKIES: Yesterday, Christian Lopes and Mickey McDonald became the 15th and 16th rookies to appear in a game for the A's this year...last year, the A's used just 13 rookies for the entire season...this is the first time the A's have employed more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).
OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the first time this year yesterday and are now batting 202 ( 25 -for-124) with 10 runs scored over the last four games... however, have scored 60 runs for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...rank second in batting with runners in scoring position (.308)...have hit 12 home runs, which is tied for fifth...eight of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...six have come with at least two runners on base, which is twice as many as the next closest teams in the majors (Cardinals, Guardians, Mariners and Mets, 3)...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (121) and are tied for third in grounded into double plays (9).
ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen six bases in the last six games and are a perfect 7 -for- 7 this year....are one of three teams in the majors that have not been caught stealing (White Sox, 9 SB; Phillies, 2 SB)...were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was second best in the American League and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 1-for-3 ( $33.3 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts...the one stolen base allowed is second fewest in the majors to the Rockies (0) and the three attempts are tied for second fewest.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run in each of the first three games of this series and now have a 2.19 ERA ( 17 er in 70.0 ip ) over the last eight games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests...now have a 3.25 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League... have the third highest opponents batting average (.242), slugging percentage (.401) and OPS (.713)...A's starting pitchers have five wins and 64.0 inings pitched, both of which are second most in the AL to the Mariners ( 6 wins, 66.0 ip)... starters have issued 16 walks in 64.0 innings and the average of 2.25 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the AL (Tigers, 2.08)...however, the bullpen has walked 25 in 49.2 innings and the average of 4.53 walks per nine innings is third highest in the AL...the pen has allowed just 3-of-25 (12.0\%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (Diamondbacks, 11.8\%)
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors over the last nine games after making just one over the first four...the nine errors are tied for third most in the American League...are tied for second with three outfield assists and tied for fifth with 10 double plays.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (2-1) and Texas (three games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home, with the two road games coming next Tuesday and Wednesday at San Francisco...went 5-5 on the season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest
season-opening road trip in Athletics history....played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.
SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are scheduled to play Texas tomorrow, which would be their first game against an American League West team this year... the last time the A's did not play a divisional foe over the first 14 games of a season was in 2008 when their first game came in game 16 against Seattle...the three-game series with the Rangers ends a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times this year, which includes seven COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 35 players this year and have one player on the roster that has yet to appear in a game (Selman)...the breakdown includes 17 pitchers and 18 position players...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year...according to Sportsradar, the 35 players used match the 1955 Kansas City A's for the most in Athletics history over the first 13 games of the season...the A's Opening Day roster featured nine returning players from the 2021 Opening Day roster, eight other players who played for the A's at some point last year and one who was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades and one was claimed off waivers...five were signed as free agents (one to a Major League contract, four to minor league contracts), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent.
DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's .278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals (4-11, .267)...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was .286 (4-10) in 1976...tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (6) and ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3).
A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after splitting the season series last year, 3-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won two of three at Baltimore...are 16-6 (.727) against the Orioles dating back to 2018, including 9-3 (.750) in the Coliseum...are 34-15 (.694) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 279-271 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 142-138 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards...are 1016-950 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/ Senators.

Seth Brown is tied for second in the American League in RBI (11)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first five games ( 5.0 ip ) and has a win and a save...Tony Kemp has reached base safely in each of his 11 starts...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first five games (4.0 ip)... Sean Murphy is 9-for-29 (.310) over his last eight games after going 2-for21 (.095) over his first five contests...ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (8) and tied for fifth in doubles (5)

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1956 Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in 1958 Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run $8^{\text {th }}$ inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in 1981 Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in 2002 Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his $900^{\text {th }}$ career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim...in 2018 Sean Manaea tosses the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston...he walks two and strikes out 10.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-0, 1.80 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-2 win at Tampa Bay on April 11...Oakland scored four times in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk while striking out a career-high seven in 5.0 innings....allowed just one base runner as far as second base... was relieved by Jackson to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-0.
LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Toronto on Saturday... allowed a run in the first inning when Tapia doubled to start the game, went to third on a ground out and scored on a fielders choice...Oakland then scored three times in the second and twice in the third and he yielded a RBI single to Collins in the fourth...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth with the A's leading 5-2...Acevedo allowed three runs for the blown save but the A's scored twice in the ninth for the win.

BLACKBURN vs. BALTIMORE: Is 0-0 with a 3.72 ERA ( $9.2 \mathrm{ip}, 13 \mathrm{~h}, 4 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}$, $3 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in two career appearances, both starts in 2017...the first no deci-
 sion came in the A's $5-4$ win in Oakland on Aug. 11...allowed a run in the second inning on a leadoff home run by Jones, and another in the fourth when Machado scored on a double play...Oakland scored three times in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed a two-run double to Schoop in the fifth and left after 5.2 innings trailing 4-3....also had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win at Baltimore later that month on Aug. 22...blanked the Orioles on three hits in 4.0 innings....was relieved by Castro with a 5-0 lead after being hit by a Mancini leadoff single in the fifth inning.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a 366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to 309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to 333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a .322 career average in that situation... was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road....yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road.... was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, $0-3$ with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were $3-1$ in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.
WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his . 311 opponents batting average was a career high...surren-
dered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 ( 61 -for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 ( 53 -for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, . 311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a 296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.
