# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-6) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (3-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four from Baltimore to start the homestand and have now won eight of the last 12 games after losing the first two... are 8-6 (.571), which is the fourth best record in the American League... have outscored their opponents $66-50$ and the +16 run differential is second best in the AL to the Guardians ( +25 )...three of the A's six losses have been by one run, which is tied for the most in the AL.... have not won or lost more than two straight games...have won three of four in their two four-game series and lost two of three in their two three-game series... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, one day in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth...this is the A's 55th season in Oakland where they have won 17 American League West titles, four AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...this is the Athletics franchise 122nd season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 17 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships.... with this season, the A's will now have spent more years in Oakland than Philadelphia as they began their 55th season in Oakland on April 8 in the city they called home for 54 years from 1901-54.
SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's play their first game against an American League West team today as they face Texas in their 15th game of the season...the last time the A's did not play a divisional foe in the first 14 games of a season was in 2008 when their first game came in game 16 against Seattle...this three-game series with the Rangers ends a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991.
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in each of the last four games ( 3 er in 22.0 ip, 1.23 ERA) and three runs or fewer in each of the last nine contests ( 13 er in $47.1 \mathrm{ip}, 2.47$ ERA)...have not allowed a home run in the last six games ( 30.1 ip), which matches the longest such streak by A's starting pitchers over the last seven years...the last streak longer than six was an 11-game streak from May 7-18, 2015...yielded nine home runs over the first eight games this year ( 38.2 ip)...have not walk a batter in the last two games and are averaging 2.09 walks per nine innings, which is seocnd lowest in the American League (Tigers, 1.88)...are tied with Seattle for the most wins (6) and have 69.0 innings pitched, which is second most to the Mariners (70.2).
OFFENSE: The A's rank second in the American League with 66 runs scored and tied for fourth with 14 home runs...nine of the home runs have come with runners on base, wich is second most in the AL to Seattle (10)...six have come with at least two runners on, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Mariners (4)....are batting 303 with runners in scoring position, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Dodgers (.315)... have the third most strikeouts in the AL (128).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen six bases in the last seven games and are a perfect 7 -for-7 this year...are one of two teams in the majors that have not been caught stealing (Phillies, 2 SB)....were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the American League and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 1-for-4 $(25.0 \%)$ in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors to the Rockies ( 0 -for-1)...only the Rockies, with 0 , have allowed fewer stolen bases.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.39 ERA ( 21 er in 79.0 ip) over the last nine games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests.... have the second highest opponents OPS in the American League (.702) and the third highest batting average (.241) and slugging percentage (.394).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed three runs in 4.0 innings yesterday after allowing no earned runs over the previous four games ( 14.2 ip)...has five saves, which is tied for second most in the American League... has two blown saves, which is tied for the most... has stranded all 13 of its inherited runners over the last six games and has allowed just 3-of-28 (10.7\%) to score for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors...first batters faced are batting .156, which is fourth lowest in the AL, but they have seven walks, which is tied for second most.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last three games and now have 10 for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for third most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (three games)...this
homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home... have a two-game road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday before returning to the Coliseum for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) beginning next Friday...went 5-5 on the season-opening 10 -game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest seasonopening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have employed more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)... had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster (Acevedo, Z. Jackson, Jefferies, Jiménez, Lemoine, Moll, Oller, Pache, Puk, Smith, Snead), which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).
ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 35 players this year and have one player on the roster that has yet to appear in a game (Selman)...the breakdown includes 17 pitchers and 18 position players...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year...the A's Opening Day roster featured nine returning players from the 2021 Opening Day roster, eight other players who played for the A's at some point last year and one who was in the A's farm system...four were acquired in trades and one was claimed off waivers...five were signed as free agents (one to a Major League contract, four to mino league contracts), which does not include Jed Lowrie, who re-signed as a free agent.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times this year, which includes seven COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18).... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.
DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers (5-9-4) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals ( $4-11, .267$ )...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (6) and ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3).
A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas...it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/ Senators...are 54-32 (.628) against the Rangers over the previous five years, including 30-11 (.732) in Oakland...are 395-385 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 208-180 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas... are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 492-467 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for third in the American League in RBI (11)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first six games ( 6.0 ip ) and has a win and two saves...Tony Kemp had his fifth multiple hit game of the season yesterday, which is tied for third in the AL.... has reached base safely in each of his 12 starts...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first six games ( 4.2 ip)...Sean Murphy is 12 -for- 33 (.364) with five doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI over his last nine games...is tied for the AL lead in extra base hits (10), tied for third in RBI (11), doubles (6) and total bases (31) and ranks fifth in slugging (.574).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1916 Jack Nabors defeats Boston 6-2 to even his season record at 1-1... he would go on to lose 19 consecutive games to set the Athletics franchise record for longest losing streak....in 1969 Rollie Fingers tosses the first of his two career shutouts, a five-hitter in the A's 7-0 win at Minnesota...in 1984 Dave Kingman homers twice but the A's lose to Dennis Eckersley at Boston, 12-8...in 2003 Miguel Tejada hits a walk-off home run in the bottom of the $11^{\text {th }}$ inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-5.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adam Oller (0-1, 13.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7, was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his Major League debut April 12 at Tampa Bay...became the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Daulton Jefferies on Sept. 12, 2020 in the first game of a doubleheader at Texas.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut April 12 at Tampa Bay, a 9-8 A's loss in 10 innings...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing by an A's starting pitcher in his debut since Glenn Cox logged 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955...the A's scored three times in the first and he allowed a leadoff home run to Lowe in the bottom of the first...then yielded a RBI single to Walls and a three-run home run to Choi in the second and left trailing 5-3...the A's came back to tie the game in the seventh to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Toronto last Sunday... allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Guerriel sacrifice fly, an Espinal RBI single and a Chapman RBI single...was relieved by Castellani with one out in the fourth inning, a runner on first and the A's trailing 3-0.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-0 with a 9.95 ERA in three Cactus League appearances, including two starts...opponents were 11-for-29 (.379)...struck out nine batters in 6.1 innings....yielded four runs in 1.1 innings in his one relief appearance ( 27.00 ERA ) and three runs in 5.0 innings ( 5.40 ERA ) in his two starts.

2021 RECAP: Was named the New York Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year and a MiLB.com organizational All-Star after combining for a 9-4 record, a 3.45 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in 23 starts with Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...it was the first time he pitched above Single-A...struck out a career-high 138 batters in 120.0 innings, an average of 10.35 per nine innings...led the Mets farm system in strikeouts... 95 of the strikeouts came with Binghamton, which ranked sixth in the Double-A Northeast....also had career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched (120.0) and walks (47) and matched his high in hit batters (8)...led the Mets farm system in starts and innings pitched (120.0) and tied for the lead in wins... was 4-3 with a 5.12 ERA, .260 opponents batting average and .740 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 15 ...then went $5-1$ with a 1.89 ERA, .161 opponents average and .514 OPS over his final 11 starts beginning July 23 .
OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of . 201 (42-for-209) with a . 630 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to . 223 (51-for-229) with a . 632 OPS against right-handers...surrendered six of his nine home runs to righties...seven of his eight hit batters came against lefties...opponents hit . 190 with six home runs with the bases empty, . 242 with three home runs with runners on...they were 1-for-10 (.100) with seven strikeouts with the bases loaded...held the seven, eight and nine hitters in the order to a combined .152 batting average....yielded a .141 batting average with two strikes.

THIS AND THAT: Was a combined 3-2 with a 2.91 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in 11 starts in his home ballparks, 6-2 with a 3.92 ERA and . 230 opponent average in 12 starts on the road...his teams were 1-9 in his 10 no decisions and had a 10-13 (.435) record in his starting assignments... did not allow a run six times and allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts...allowed four hits or fewer 13 times.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Allowed a season-high five runs and a season-high four walks in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss in his first start on May 7 at Akron...it was his first of four starts with five runs and his first of six with four walks...yielded a season-high eight hits in a 5-4 loss at Erie on May 23...

finished May 0-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts...picked up his first win of the season June 4 at New Hampshire ( 5.0 ip, $5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )...had a seven-game winning streak from June 30 to Sept. 4...compiled a 1.39 ERA and .180 opponents batting average during the streak...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in a $4-3$ win at Altoona on July 15 ...logged 4.2 scoreless and hitless innings against Erie on July 23 to begin a seven-start stretch where he went 4-0 with a 0.44 ERA and .132 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of those starts... had three consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts from July 30 to Aug. 14 ( 35 so in 20.0 ip)...had 10 strikeouts in 6.1 innings on July 30 at Hartford and 12 in a career-high tying 7.0 scorless innings against Portland on Aug. 5...was promoted to Syracuse on Aug. 9 and fanned a career-high 13 in 6.2 scoreless innings in his first Triple-A start at Worcester on Aug. 14...was $5-3$ with a 4.03 ERA in 15 starts with Binghamton at the time of his promotion...finished the season by going 4-1 with a 2.45 ERA in eight starts with Syracuse...had the second lowest opponents batting average (.179) and slugging percentage (.278) in the Triple-A East from Aug. 8 through the end of the season, the third lowest ERA and the fourth lowest OPS (.568)...allowed just one run in four starts in August and was $3-0$ with a 0.38 ERA and .139 opponents batting average...struck out 34 batters in 24.0 innings....went 1-1 with a 4.71 ERA over his final four starts beginning Sept. 10.

CAREER: Pitched in the Pittsburgh, San Francisco and New York (NL) farm systems prior to being dealt to the A's and is 24-20 with four saves and a 4.05 ERA in 99 games, including 56 starts, in five seasons in the minors... has 395 strikeouts in 380.1 innings ( 9.34 strikeouts per nine innings)... has walked just 115 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.43 ...was originally a 20th round pick of Pittsburgh in 2016 but was released by the Pirates following the 2018 season...nearly retired from the game before signing with Windy City of the independent Frontier League in 2019...signed a minor league contract with San Francisco on May 30, 2019, was selected by New York (NL) in the 2019 minor league Rule 5 draft and was named the Mets Organizational Pitcher of the Year in 2021.

RHP Frankie Montas (2-1, 3.63 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has picked up the win in each of his last two starts ( $12.1 \mathrm{ip}, 7 \mathrm{~h}$, $3 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 11$ so, 1.46 ERA) after allowing five runs in 5.0 ininings for the loss in his first start...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's win over Baltimore on Monday here in Oakland ( $6.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 5 \mathrm{so}$ )... is 2-2 with a 5.63 ERA ( $32.0 \mathrm{ip}, 41 \mathrm{~h}, 22 \mathrm{r}, 20 \mathrm{er}, 11 \mathrm{bb}, 37 \mathrm{so}, 6 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in eight career appearances, including five starts, against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, an 8-3 A's loss at Texas on June 21 ( $5.2 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 8 \mathrm{r}, 8 \mathrm{er}$, $2 \mathrm{bb}, 6$ so)...was $0-1$ with a 6.35 ERA in two starts this spring...went $13-9$ with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971... tied for the AL lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging (.372) and innings (187.0), fourth in ERA and strikeouts tied for fifth in wins.

- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 17, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...compiled a 3.00 ERA ( $3.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}$, $0 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ ) in three relief appearances before he was reassigned to minor league camp on March 27.
- Has spent parts of the previous two seasons with Colorado and was 1-4 with a 5.79 ERA in 11 games, including 10 starts... his only relief apperance came on Sept. 2, 2020 against San Francisco ( $2.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2$ h, 2 so).
Last Year: Made one start with Colorado last year on May 4 (ND, $3.1 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}$, $4 b b, 2$ so)...spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Albuquerque and went 3-11 with a 6.25 ERA and . 256 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 23 starts.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.
