# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-7) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (4-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two of the last three games but have won eight of the last 13...are 8-7 (.533) overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games...lost 8-1 last night, which was their first loss by more than three runs since losing 9-5 on Opening Day....have outscored their opponents 67-58 and the +9 run differential is third best in the AL...three of the A's seven losses have been by one run, which is tied for the most in the AL... have won three of four in their two four-game series and lost two of three in their two three-game series.... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, two days in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth.
LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth time this year...are 3-0 in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 5-7 when they start a right-hander...are one of three teams that has not lost when the opponent starts a lefty (Red Sox, Giants)...last year, the A's were 37-26 (.587) when the opponent started a lefty compared to 49-50 (.495) against righties...the mark against righties was second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-17, .595).

ROSTER NOTES: Last night, Sam Selman became the 36th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...the A's used 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have employed 18 pitchers and 18 position players...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have employed more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20 ...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)... had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster, which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).
OFFENSE: The A's are batting 203 ( 32 -for-158) with 14 runs and two home runs in five games on the homestand after hitting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs in 10 games on the road trip...rank fourth in the American League in runs (67) and doubles (23) and tied for fourth in home runs (14)...however, have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.282)...nine of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the AL to Seattle (10)...six have come with at least two runners on, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Mariners (4)....are batting . 304 with runners in scoring position, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Dodgers (.319)... are tied for the second most strikeouts in the AL (138).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen seven bases in the last eight games and are a perfect 8 -for-8 this year....are one of two teams in the majors that has not been caught stealing (Phillies, 2 SB)...were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the American League and the best in Athletics history in a full season... A's opponents are 1-for-5 ( $20.0 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors to the Rockies ( 0 -for-1)...only Colorado, with 0 , has allowed fewer stolen bases.

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs last night after yielding seven runs in the four-game series against Baltimore...now have a 2.97 ERA ( 29 er in 88.0 ip ) over the last 10 games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests...have the second highest opponents OPS (.711) and slugging percentage (.399) in the American League (.702) and the third highest batting average (.242).

STARTING PITCHING: Sam Oller allowed five runs last night after A's starting pitchers yielded just one run in each of the previous four contests.... he also surrendered two home runs after the starters went six consecutive games without allowing a home run...starters are now 2-2 despite a 2.67 ERA (8 er in 27.0 ip ) over the last five games...overall, A's starters have the second most wins (6) and innings pitched (74.0) in the American League to Seattle ( 7 wins, 77.2 innings)...are averaging 2.19 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed three runs in back-to-back games ( 6 er in 8.0 ip, 6.75 ERA) after allowing no earned runs over the previous four games ( 14.2 ip ).... has five saves, which is tied for third most in the American League...has two blown saves, which is also tied for third most...has straned 15 of its 16 inherited runners over the last seven games and has allowed just 4-of-31 ( $12.9 \%$ ) to score for the season, which is the lowest percentage in the majors ahead of the Dodgers ( $14.3 \%$ )...first batters faced are batting
.146, which is second lowest in the AL, but they have seven walks, which is tied for third most.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last four games and now have 11 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have three assists, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore ( $3-1$ ) and Texas ( $0-1$ )...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home.. have a two-game road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday before returning to the Coliseum for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) beginning next Friday...went $5-5$ on the season-opening 10 -game road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Today is game 16 of the A's season-opening stretch of 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...the most consecutive days without a day off to start a season in Oakland history is 16 in 1987 and 1991....are scheduled to match that mark tomorrow before getting their first day off on Monday...the A's played their first game against an American League West team last night in their 15th game of the season...the last time the A's did not play a divisional foe in the first 14 games of a season was in 2008 when their first game came in game 16 against Seattle...began the season by going 1-2 in interleague play, went 7-4 against the AL East and are now 0-1 against the AL West.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)....used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers ( $5-9-4$ ) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals ( $4-11, .267$ )...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (6) and ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lost the first game of 2022 last night after winning the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas...it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 54-33 (.621) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 30-11 (.714) in Oakland...are 395-386 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 208-181 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas....are 9-8 at Globe Life Field....have an all-time record of 492-468 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

## ODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second in the American League in RBI (12)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first six games ( 6.0 ip ) and has a win and two saves...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first six games (4.2 ip)...Sean Murphy is 13 -for- 37 (.351) with six doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI over his last 10 games...is tied for the AL lead in doubles (7) and extra base hits (11), tied for third in total bases (33), tied for fourth in RBI (11) and ranks sixth in slugging (.569)

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1978 the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in 1985 the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the A's first 14 games...in 1988 Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his fourth start of the season...has picked up the win in each of his last two starts ( $12.1 \mathrm{ip}, 7 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}, 1.46$ ERA) after allowing five runs in 5.0 ininings for the loss in his first start... is in his seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is scheduled to make his first start against an American League West team after making his first three starts against the East (one vs. NL East, two vs. AL East)...last year, he went $5-4$ with a 2.64 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in 12 starts against AL West teams compared to $8-5$ with a 3.86 ERA and .248 opponents average in 20 starts against all other teams...is now 15-9 with a 3.32 ERA ( 77 er in 208.2 ip) in 45 career appearances against the AL West, 18 -15 with a 4.28 ERA ( 122 er in 256.2 ip) in 60 games against all other teams.
SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed 6.1 innings or fewer in each of his first three starts...last year, he tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 32 starts and now has a streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay ( 8.0 ip).... .ad seven starts of 7.0 innings in 2021 and was 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss at Philadelphia on Opening Day April 8....it was his second caree Opening Day start (2020) and he is now $0-1$ with a 6.00 ERA ( $9.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 11 \mathrm{so}$ ) in two openers... it was his first loss since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a home run to Schwarber to start the game but then retired six of the next seven batters...yielded four more runs in the third inning on a Harper RBI double, a Hoskins two-run single and a Gregorius RBI single...then retired the final seven batters he faced.
SECOND START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 4-2 win at Tampa Bay on April 13...blanked the Rays on three hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Choi in the fourth...retired each of the next nine batters and had a 4-1 lead when he was relieved by Snead with one out in the seventh innings and runners on first and second...Snead allowed one of the runners to score.
LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's $5-1$ win over Baltimore on Monday in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first four innings as his one base runner, a leadoff walk to Mancini in the second, was erased on a double play... had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his first hit, a RBI double to Hays in the fifth...Oakland scored four unearned runs in the sixth to take a 5-1 lead and he was relieved by Acevedo to start the seventh.

MONTAS vs. TEXAS: Is $2-2$ with a 5.63 ERA (32.0 ip, 41 h, 22 r, 20 er, 11 bb, 37 so, 6 hr ) in eight career appearances, including five starts...is 1-0 with a 2.74 ERA (3 er in 7.2 ip ) in two games in Oakland and 0-2 with a 9.82 ERA (12 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts at Globe

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was $0-1$ with a 6.35 ERA...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400) and he
walked one batter in 5.2 innings...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts... his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes ( 2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth).

STRIKEOUTS: Finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910... is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season... his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74 this year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 486 career strikeouts in 465.1 innings, an average of 9.40 per nine innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches $(3,028)$ and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11).
BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, 258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, 199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break...had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .225 (78-for-346) with a . 665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for361) with a 667 OPS against right-handers...had a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, 227 with nine home runs with runners on base...opponents hit . 190 the first time through the order, . 273 the second time and . 224 after that...held the opponent's number three hitter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes and has a .161 career average in that situation

THIS AND THAT: Was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day com pared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the AL...allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and . 647 OPS from the fourth inning on...had 10 no decisions, five of which came in extra inning games...the A's were 17-15 (.531) in his starting assignments...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...according to TruMedia, threw 678 splitters, which was second most in the majors (Gausman, SF 1061)...opponents hit . 126 with a . 352 OPS off his splitter and he allowed just one home run

LHP Cole Irvin (1-1, 4.32 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Baltimore on Tuesday here in Oakland ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 6 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )...is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA ( $29.0 \mathrm{ip}, 28 \mathrm{~h}, 16 \mathrm{r}, 13 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}, 23 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in five career starts against Texas, all last year...left with the lead in both of his losses and his one no decision but the pen blew the save each time...begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...is on his third straight Opening Day roster...went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in four starts this spring...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts last year...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League... led the AL in losses, tied for the lead in starts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1).
