# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-8) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (5-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and three of the last four games after winning seven of the previous 10 contests...are 8-8 (.500) overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games.... have outscored their opponents 67-60 and the +7 run differential is third best in the American League...five of the A's eight losses have been by two runs or fewer, including three by one run....are tied for the AL lead in one-run losses and tied for third in losses by two runs or fewer...are 3-1 in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 5-7 when they start a righthander... have won three of four in their two four-game series and lost two of three in their two three-game series... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, three days in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players over the first 16 games...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season... have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20 ...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster, which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the second time in the last four games yesterday....are now batting . 186 ( 35 -for-188) with 14 runs and two home runs in six games on the homestand after hitting 224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs in 10 games on the road trip...rank fifth in the American League in runs (67) and doubles (25) and tied for fifth in home runs (14)....six of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Mariners (5)...are batting .292 with runners in scoring position, which is the best mark in the AL and fourth best in the majors....however, have the third lowest batting average (.210) and onbase percentage (.275) in the AL and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.341) and OPS (.616)...have the second most strikeouts (146).

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 8 -for- 8 in stolen base attempts and are one of teams in the majors that has not been caught stealing (Phillies, 3 -for-3)...were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the American League and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 2 -for- 7 (28.6\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors to the Rockies ( 1 -for- $2,50.0 \%$ )...only Colorado has allowed fewer stolen bases (1).
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.88 ERA ( 31 er in 97.0 ip ) over the last 11 games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests... have allowed two runs over the last seven games after yielding 13 over the first nine contests... have the third highest opponents OPS in the American League (.692) and the fourth highest batting average (.238) and slugging percentage (.386).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-3 despite a 2.62 ERA (10 er in 34.1 ip ) over the last six games...have allowed one run four times over that stretch and two runs once...starters are 6-7 with a 3.76 ERA for the season... the wins are tied for second most in the American League to the Mariners (7) but the losses are the most in the AL and tied for fifth most in the majors...have 81.1 innings pitched, which is second most to Seattle (82.0)... have walked one batter or fewer in 10 of the 16 games and are average 2.10 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 5-of-7 (71.4\%) save opportunities...the five saves are tied for third most in the American League but the two blown saves are tied for fifth most... has allowed 6-of-33 ( $18.2 \%$ ) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...first batters faced are batting .140, which is second lowest in the AL, but they have seven walks, which is tied for third most...

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last five games, which matched the longest streak by an A's team over the last four years...the last longer streak was a six-game streak from June 20-25, 2018... have 12 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the Ameri-
can League (White Sox, 17)... have turned 13 double plays, which is tied for fourth most...A's outfielders have three assists, which is also tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on their first homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (0-2)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 13 of 15 games at home... have a two-game road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday before returning to the Coliseum for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) beginning next Friday...went 5-5 on the season-opening 10-game road trip to Philadelphia (12), Tampa Bay ( $3-1$ ) and Toronto ( $1-2$ ), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...played their first eight games on the road in 1927, 1981 and 1995...in 1996, the A's started the season with six games in Las Vegas as the home team followed by an eight-game road trip.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Today is game 17 of the A's season-opening stretch of 17 consecutive games without a day off to start the season...that is the longest season-opening stretch of days without a day off in Oakland history...the previous high was 16 in 1987 and 1991.... will have their first day off tomorrow and will have another day off on Thursday...the A's played their first game against an American League West team Friday night in their 15th game of the season...the last time the A's did not play a divisional foe in the first 14 games of a season was in 2008 when their first game came in game 16 against Seattle...began the season by going 1-2 in interleague play, went 7-4 against the AL East and are now 0-2 against the AL West.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight COVID-19 IL placements... began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt).... used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 5-10-3 and finished with a losing record during the spring for the first time since 2018 when they went 14-16-2...the A's 278 winning percentage tied with the Dodgers ( $5-9-4$ ) for the lowest in the Cactus League and tied for second lowest in the majors to the Nationals ( $4-11, .267$ )...it was the lowest during the spring in Oakland history...the previous low was . 286 (4-10) in 1976...tied for second in the Cactus League in triples (6) and ranked third in doubles (40) and grounded into the fewest double plays (8)...the defense committed the fewest errors in the CL (10) and tied for the lead in outield assists (3).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have lost the first two games of 2022 and have not been swept by the Rangers in a series of more than two games since May 12-14, 2017 at Texas... have not been swept in Oakland since Sept. 22-24, 2015...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 5-4 in Oakland and 5-5 in Texas....it was the A's fifth consecutive season series win from Texas, which is the longest streak by the A's against the Rangers/Senators...are 54-34 (.614) against the Rangers over the last six years, including 30-12 (.714) in Oakland...are 395-387 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 208-182 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas....are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 492-469 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown ranks fourth in the American League in RBI (12)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first six games ( 6.0 ip ) and has a win and two saves...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first six games (4.2 ip)...Sean Murphy is 13 -for-41 (.317) with six doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI over his last 11 games... is tied for the American League lead in doubles (7) and extra base hits (11), ranks fifth in total bases (33), tied for fifth in RBI (11) and eighth in slugging (.532)

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1969 Rick Monday establishes a club record with three doubles in the A's 6-4 win at Minnesota...in 1986 Jose Rijo strikes out 14 Seattle Mariners after fanning a club record 16 batters in his previous start, but the A's lose 3-1...in 2003 Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Detroit...in 2021 the A's defeat the Baltimore Orioles 7-2 to extend their winning streak to 13 games...the win improves the A's record to 14-7 after starting the season 0-6.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (1-1, 4.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season....begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
DON'T WALK: Walked two batters in his last start after issuing just one free pass in his first two starts... has three walk in 16.2 innings this year ( 1.62 per nine innings) after walking just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year...his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts last year and has now done so in 34 of his 38 career starts...has walked just 59 batters in 240.1 career innings ( 2.21 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is scheduled to make his first start against an American League West team today...went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition last year, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors this year... went $0-5$ with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and $0-3$ with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 18 hits, which is tied for second most in the American League...led the AL with 191 hits allowed last year...is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season, his third in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...opponents are 3 -for-16 (.188) with runners in scoring position...last year, he allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .323 career opponents average with RISP.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Philadelphia on April 9 ....yielded a career-high tying three home runs...allowed a two-run home run to Castellanos in the first and then blanked the Phillies on three hits and a walk over innings two through five...surrendered back-to-back homers to Hoskins and Segura to start the sixth and was relieved by Jiménez with one out in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's $6-3$ victory at Tampa Bay on April 14...Oakland scored three times in the second inning and he allowed a RBI single to Margot in the bottom of the second...retired each of the next 14 batters following the Margot single and had a $6-1$ lead when he yielded a leadoff double to Ramirez in the seventh...Lowe homered one out later and he was relieved by Acevedo with one out in the seventh and the A's leading 6-3.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore on Tuesday in Oakland....allowed a RBI ground out to Mancini in the first inning but that was the only run he would surrender in five innings of work...yielded four hits and two walks over his final four innings but stranded all six.... was relieved by Logue to start the sixth inning and Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

IRVIN vs. TEXAS: Is 2-2 with a 4.03 ERA (29.0 ip, $28 \mathrm{~h}, 16 \mathrm{r}, 13 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}, 23$ so, 1 hr ) in five career starts, all last year... left with the lead in both of his losses and his one no decision but the pen blew the save each time...the first win came in the A's $13-6$ victory on June 22 in Texas...Oakland scored nine times over the first three innings and he blanked the Rangers on three hits over the first four innings...then allowed four runs in the fifth on RBI doubles by Calhoun and Culberson and RBI singles by White and Garcia....his first loss came in a 3-2 decision on July 9 in Texas...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters...did not allow a hit over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he yielded a RBI single to Ibanez in the sixth...was relieved by Romo with the bases loaded and no outs in the sixth inning and Romo allowed two of the base runners to score for the blown save...defeated the Rangers 12-3 on Aug. 7 in Oakland....allowed a two-run home run to Garcia in the first inning but then shut out the Rangers on one hit and two walks over his final six innings of work...then took the loss in his next start, an 8-6 decision at Texas on Aug. 13...surrendered three runs in the first inning on an error, a RBI ground out and a Peters sacrifice fly...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next four innings and had a 4-3 lead when the first two batters in the sixth inning reached base...was relieved by Romo, who allowed a three-run home run to Pozo for the blown save.... had a no decision in his final

start, an 8-6 A's loss in Oakland on Sept. 11...the A's scored single runs in each of the first three innings and he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Solak RBI double and a Pozo RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work and he left with a 6-2 lead...then pen allowed five runs in the eighth for the blown save.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20 -for62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies.

AMONG THE LEADERS: His 15 losses were the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors... allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16).
STREAKING: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and . 586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and 2-5 with a 6.38 ERA and .950 OPS over his final 10 starts.
OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a . 739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a . 767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties... 17 of the home runs were solo shots.

DAYS REST: Was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998....however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.
THIS AND THAT: Opponents hit . 440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

- Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and had three saves and a 4.15 ERA in four relief appearances ( $4.1 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ ).
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 17, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...compiled a 3.00 ERA ( $3.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}$, $0 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ ) in three relief appearances before he was reassigned to minor league camp on March 27.
- Has spent parts of the previous two seasons with Colorado and was 1-4 with a 5.79 ERA in 11 games, including 10 starts...his only relief apperance came on Sept. 2, 2020 against San Francisco ( $2.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 2$ so).
