# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-8) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (12-5)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Texas to close out the last homestand... have played three three-game series this year and have lost two of three in each series...have played two four-game series and have won three of four in both of those series....are 9-8 overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games...are in third place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day and fifth time in the last six days.... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, five days in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their first shutout of the season on Sunday against Texas and have allowed one run or fewer in four of the last seven games... have a 2.63 ERA ( 31 er in 106.0 ip ) over the last 12 games after posting a 4.95 ERA over the first five contests...have a 3.31 ERA overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League... have not allowed a home run in seven of the last eight games (two home runs total) after yielding 13 over the first nine contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last seven games and are $3-3$ with a 2.29 ERA ( 10 er in 39.1 ip) over that span....are 7-7 with a 3.54 ERA for the season...the wins are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League but the losses are the most in the AL....have 86.1 innings pitched, which is second most to Seattle (88.0)... have walked one batter or fewer in 10 of the 17 games and are averaging 2.19 walks per nine innings, which is second lowest in the AL.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 6-of-8 (75.0\%) save opportunities...the six saves are tied for second in the American League and the save percentage is third best... has allowed 6 -of- $33(18.2 \%)$ inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.132) and on-base percentage (.233) against first batters faced and are third in slugging (.245)... has just one loss, which is tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the AL.
OFFENSE: The A's have been held to two runs or fewer in five of the last six games and are batting. 190 ( 35 -for-184) with 11 runs scored over that span... are hitting 209 overall, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.278), slugging percentage (.341) and OPS (.619)...are tied for the second most strikeouts (155)...are 4 -for- 38 (.105) with runners in scoring position over the last six games but are hitting .277 with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL... 10 of the A's 15 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied for second most in the AL...six have come with at least two on, which is the most in the majors.
ON THE BASES: Tony Kemp was thrown out attempting to steal second base on Sunday for the A's first caught stealing of the season...the A's are now 8 -for-9 (88.95) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...were successful in 88 -of-108 ( $81.5 \%$ ) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the American League and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 2-for-7 (28.6\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors to the Rockies (1-for-2, 50.0\%)...only Colorado has allowed fewer stolen bases (1)...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last six games, which is the longest streak of consecutive games with an error by an A's team since June 20-25, 2018 when they also had a six-game streak... the last longer streak was an 11-game streak from April 6-18, 2017...have 13 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (White Sox, 18)...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is fifth fewest.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players over the first 17 games...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season.... have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20 ...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster, which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a brief two-game journey across the bay to face San Francisco...went 5-5
on the first road trip, a season-opening 10 -game trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay ( $3-1$ ) and Toronto ( $1-2$ ), which was the longest season-opening road trip in Athletics history...these two games against the Giants are the A's only two road games over a 15-game stretch from April 18-May 4...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2) and return to the Coliseum on Friday for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...batted . 186 (40-for-215) with 16 runs and three home runs in seven games on the first homestand after hitting .224 ( 76 -for- 340 ) with 53 runs and 12 home runs in 10 games on the first road trip....had a 2.29 ERA ( 16 er in 63.0 ip ) and surrendered two home runs on the homestand, a 4.05 ERA ( 39 er in 86.2 ip ) with 13 home runs on the road trip.
INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's will play their second interleague opponent of the season after starting the year by losing two of three at Philadelphia.... will also travel to Atlanta (June 7-8) and Washinton (Aug. 30-Sept. 1) and host San Francisco (Aug. 6-7), Miami (Aug. 22-24), Atlanta (Sept. 6-7) and New York (Sept. 23-25)...went 11-9 against the National League last year, which marked the 15th time in 25 seasons of interleague play the A's finished with a winning record.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fifth time this year...are 3-1 (.750) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 6-7 (.462) when they start a right-hander. last year, the A's were 37-26 (.587) when the opponent started a lefty compared to 49-50 (.495) against righties...the mark against righties was second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-17, .595).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their first day off yesterday after beginning the year with 17 consecutive games without a day off...that was the longest sea-son-opening stretch of days without a day off in Oakland history...the previous high was 16 in 1987 and 1991...will have another day off on Thursday... had a 15-7 (.682) record following an off day last year, which was the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 19-4/.826)...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the majors...the Giants are third quickest at 3:01...five of the A's eight losses have been by two runs or fewer, including three by one run....are tied for third in the AL in one-run losses and losses by two runs or fewer.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight COVID-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18).... used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 2-4 against the Giants...lost two of three in both Oakland and San Francisco.. in the previous 25 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost six and split 10...are 71-65 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-29 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

## ODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fourth in the American League in RBI (12)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first seven games ( 7.0 ip )...is tied for fifth in the AL in saves (3)... has three of the four saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first six games (4.2 ip)...Sean Murphy is 14 -for-45 (.311) with six doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI over his last 12 games...is tied for the American League lead in doubles (7) and extra base hits (11), ranks sixth in total bases (34) and tied for ninth in RBI (11).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1901 Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history...he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average....in 1990 Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore... he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak....in 1997 Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in 2001 the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-2, 1.17 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the fifth of his career...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his first three starts this year and has not allowed and earned run twice...however, has received just one run of support total in his three starts...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 10 -for- 35 (.286) with the bases emtpy, 2 -for21 (.095) with runners on base...has not allowed a hit with runners in scoring position (10 ab)...has not allowed an earned run after the second inning (1 $r$ in 9.1 ip)...has made one career interleague appearance, his start against Philadelphia earlier this year.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory at Philadlephia on April 10...shut out the Phillies in five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...retired the side in order in the first, second and fourth innings...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Moll to start the sixth inning after issuing a leadoff walk to Vierling.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Toronto April 15....allowed a career-high seven hits in 4.1 innings....however, yielded just two runs on a Guerrero solo home run in the first and an Espinal RBI double in the second...was relieved by Grimm with one out and a runner on first base in the fifth inning with the A's trailing 2-0.
LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Baltimore last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out a career-high five batters in a career-high 6.0 innings and a career-high 83 pitches...blanked the Orioles on two hits and two hit batters over the first four innings....allowed a leadoff double to McKenna in the fifth and he scored on an Andrus error for an unearned run... that was the only run Jefferies would allow but Lyles and four Baltimore relievers combined to shut out the A's on seven hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA in four appearances, including three starts...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24 -for-65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)... tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 ( 5 -for-27) with a 661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to 231 (6-for-26) with a 605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, 115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances....was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a 316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings ( 1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors ( 1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18.... has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22 ...based on a minimum

of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA.... his opponents batting average broke down to 280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 ( 46 -for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers....allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA.... had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were 4-5 in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis.... was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake ( $7 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{so}$ )...had a no decision in an 8 -5 loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss....surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, .323 opponents batting average and .969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's 8 - 3 win at Los Angeles-AL ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}$ $3 \mathrm{r}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}$ ) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches....yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit ( $1.0 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 2$ so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10 -day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept. 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

- Is tied for fourth in the American League in games (8).
- Opponents are 1-for-7 (.143) with runners in scoring position.
- Has never faced the Giants in his career.
- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...compiled a 5.79 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in four appearances this spring, including one start.
Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and . 225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's..... was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and 186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Was added to the roster as a substitute player April 15 and has not allowed an earned run in three appearances with the A's ( $2.2 \mathrm{ip}, 1 \mathrm{r}$ ).
- Faced the Giants once last year while pitching for Colorado, a start and no decision in the Rockies $8-6$ win on May 4 ( $3.1 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{so}, 1$ hr)...it was his only Major League appearance in 2021.
- Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and had three saves and a 4.15 ERA in four relief appearances ( $4.1 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ ).
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 17, 2021 and compiled a 3.00 ERA in three relief appearances this spring as a non-roster invitee before he was reassigned to minor league camp on March 27.
Last Year: Made one start with Colorado last year on May 4 ( $N \mathrm{D}, 3.1 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}$, $4 b b, 2$ so)...spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Albuquerque and went 3-11 with a 6.25 ERA and 256 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 23 starts.

- Is 1-0 with a save and a 0.93 ERA ( 1 er in 9.2 ip ) in 10 career appearances against San Francisco...last faced the Giants on Sept. 4, 2016 while pitching for the Cubs ( $1.0 \mathrm{ip}, 1 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{so}$ ).
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Is tied for fourth in the ALin games pitched (8).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and is making his Major League debut... is $16-8$ with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors... has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring and comipled a 1.35 ERA in six appearances...struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.
