OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-9) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (13-5)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27, 2022 — ORACLE PARK — 6:45 PT RHP PAUL BLACKBURN (2-0, 1.80) VS. LHP SAM LONG (0-0, 0.00) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM, KATD 990 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...this is the A's first two-game series of the season... have played three three-game series this year and have lost two of three in each series...have played two four-game series and have won three of four in both of those series...are 9-9 overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games...are in third place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and sixth time in the last seven days...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, six days in third, four days tied for third and one day tied for fourth...trail first place Seattle by 2½ games, which is the first time the A's have been more than two games out of first this year.

PITCHING: The A's allowed eight runs last night and have now yielded 18 runs over the last four games (35.0 ip, 4.63 ERA) after compiling a 2.70 ERA over the previous 12 contests...have surrendered just four home runs over the last nine games after allowing 13 over the first nine contests.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) over the last four games after going 2-1 with a 1.23 ERA over the previous four contests...are 7-8 with a 3.89 ERA for the season...the wins are second most in the American League to the Mariners (8), but the losses are the most...have 90.1 innings pitched, which is second most to Seattle (93.2)... have walked two batters or fewer in 16 of the 18 games and are averaging 2.29 walks per nine innings, which is third best in the AL...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.226), on-base percentage (.281) and OPS (.671).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 6-of-8 (75.0%) save opportunities...has the second best save percentage in the American League and is tied for second in saves...has allowed 6-of-34 (17.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and tied for third lowest in the majors...ranks second in the AL in opponents batting average (.145) and on-base percentage (.254) against first batters faced and third in slugging (.255)...has just one loss, which is tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the AL

OFFENSE: Over the last eight games, the A's have been held to two runs or fewer six times and five hits or fewer five times...are batting .182 (45-for-247) with 18 runs scored and three home runs over that span after hitting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs over the first 10 contests...have a .206 average overall, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have the third lowest on-base percentage (.276) and OPS (.609) in the AL and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.334)...have struck out 170 times, which is second most in the majors to the Diamondbacks (171)...are 5-for-45 (.111) with runners in scoring position over the last seven games but are hitting .269 with RISP overall, which is third best in the AL...10 of the A's 15 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...six have come with at least two on, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 10-for-11 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...were successful in 88-of-108 (81.5%) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the AL and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 2-for-7 (28.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors ahead of the Astros (5-for-11, 45.5%)... the two stolen bases allowed are the fewest in the majors (Rockies and Yankees, 3)...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Nationals and Rangers for the most in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last seven games, which is the longest streak of consecutive games with an error by an A's team since April 6-18, 2017 when they had an 11-game streak... have 14 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (White Sox, 20)...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is fifth few-

A's IN APRIL: The A's are 9-9 in the month of April with three games remaining...posted a winning record in April last year (16-11) and a losing record in 2019 (11-15)...are scheduled to play 21 games this month, which will be their fewest in the month of April since 2009 when they had 19...have a 3.60 ERA and have not posted an ERA under 4.10 in April since 2016 (3.59)...are batting .206 and the lowest April batting average in Oakland history is .210 in 1979...have a .276 on-base percentage and the lowest in April in Oakland history is .276 in 1968.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, $\,$ Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster, which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their second road trip of the season, a brief two-game journey across the bay to face San Francisco...went 5-5 on the first road trip to Philadelphia (1-2), Tampa Bay (3-1) and Toronto (1-2) and are now 5-6 on the road...these two games against the Giants are the A's only two road games over a 15-game stretch from April 18-May 4...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2) and return to the Coliseum on Friday for a six-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...are batting .186 (40-for-215) with 16 runs and three home runs in seven games at home compared to .218 (81-for-372) with 55 runs and 12 home runs in 11 games on the road...have a 2.29 ERA (16 er in 63.0 ip) and two home runs in seven games at home, a 4.47 ERA (47 er in 94.2 ip) with 15 home runs in 11 games on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-3 in interleague plays (1-2 vs. Philadelphia; 0-1 vs. San Francisco)...will also travel to Atlanta (June 7-8) and Washinton (Aug. 30-Sept. 1) and host San Francisco (Aug. 6-7), Miami (Aug. 22-24), Atlanta (Sept. 6-7) and New York (Sept. 23-25)...went 11-9 against the National League last year, which marked the 15th time in 25 seasons of interleague play the A's finished with a winning record.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game and third time in the last four games...are 3-2 (.600) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 6-7 (.462) when they start a right-hander...last year, the A's were 37-26 (.587) when the opponent started a lefty compared to 49-50 (.495) against righties...the mark against righties was second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-17, .595).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...began the season with three players on the IL (Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian) and have added three more due to injuries (Bolt, Smith, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night after losing the season series last year, 2-4...lost two of three in both Oakland and San Francisco...in the previous 25 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost six and split 10...are 71-66 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-29 in Oakland and 32-37 in San Francisco...are 28-34 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for fifth in the American League in RBI (13)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first seven games (7.0 ip)...is tied for sixth in the AL in saves (3)...has three of the four saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first six games (4.2 ip)...Sean Murphy is tied for the American League lead in doubles (7), tied for second in extra base hits (11) and tied for 10th in total bases (34).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1968 Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in 1981 former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in 2002 the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs...in 2010 Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (2-0, 1.80 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...joins Frankie Montas and Chad Pinder as the only players to play for the A's in each of the last six seasons...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland. all but three of which came as a starter.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made four career interleague appearances, all starts...his last one came on June 19, 2018 against San Diego, a no decision in a 4-2 A's win (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.37 ERA (22.2 ip, 21 h, 12 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in four career interleague starts.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked just one batter over his first three starts (15.0 ip), an average of 0.60 per nine innings...has issued just 11 free passes in 53.1 innings over the last two years (1.86 per nine innings)...opponents are 1-for-7 (.143) with runners in scoring position...has a .115 (3-for-26) opponents batting average the first time through the order and .308 (8-for-26) the second time...opponents are 0-for-2 the third time...the A's are 3-0 in his starting assignments.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-2 win at Tampa Bay on April 11...Oakland scored four times in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk while striking out a career-high seven in 5.0 innings...allowed just one base runner as far as second base... was relieved by Jackson to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Toronto on APril 16...allowed a run in the first inning when Tapia doubled to start the game, went to third on a ground out and scored on a fielders choice...Oakland then scored three times in the second and twice in the third and he yielded a RBI single to Collins in the fourth...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth with the A's leading 5-2...Acevedo allowed three runs for the blown save but the A's scored twice in the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore last Thursday in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first four innings and allowed just one hit...had a 2-0 lead when Mountcastle singled to start the fifth and scored one out later on a Hays double...Oakland added two more runs in the bottom of the fifth and he was relieved by Moll to start the sixth with the A's leading 4-1.

but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first...allowed two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Hwang and Moncrief but Oakland scored four times in the sixth to take the lead for good...was charged with two more runs in the seventh inning when he left with runners on first and third and one out and the bullpen allowed both runs to score.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a .319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings (2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to .309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a .317 career average in that situation... was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night...allowed a .533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 (53-for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings... picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season... allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a 3-2 loss...also walked a season-high three batters...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches... logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win...left with a 1-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save...went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA, .359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...allowed a season-high nine hits and surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...vielded four runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings on Sept. 10 against Texas... left with a 6-4 lead but had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's 7-2 win...it was his first win since June 29, 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6, 2018...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his season high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle...allowed a season-high six runs and a career-high tying three home runs in 2.0 innings in his final start on Oct. 2 at Houston, a 10-4 loss.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-3, 3.28 ERA): Is schedued to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts after allowing five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start...has allowed a .180 opponents batting average, which is third lowest in the American League... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland (7.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 1-2 with a 2.62 ERA (34.1 ip, 34 h, 11 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 38 so, 1 hr) in eight career appearances, including five starts, against Cleveland...was 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts last year...was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA in two starts this spring...went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...tied for the AL lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging (.372) and innings (187.0), fourth in ERA and strikeouts tied for fifth in wins.

- Was added to the roster as a substitute player April 15 and has not allowed an earned run in three appearances with the A's (2.2 ip, 1 r).
- Faced the Giants once last year while pitching for Colorado, a start and no decision in the Rockies 8-6 win on May 4 (3.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 2 so, 1 hr)...it was his only Major League appearance in 2021.
- Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and had three saves and a 4.15 ERA in four relief appearances (4.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so).
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 17, 2021 and compiled a 3.00 ERA in three relief appearances this spring as a non-roster invitee before he was reassigned to minor league camp on March 27.

Last Year: Made one start with Colorado last year on May 4 (ND, 3.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...spent the balance of the season with Triple-A Albuquerque and went 3-11 with a 6.25 ERA and .256 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 23 starts.
