OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-9) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (7-12)

FRIDAY, APRIL 29, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (2-2, 3.28) VS. RHP AARON CIVALE (0-2, 9.58) NBCSCA+ - A'S CAST - A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM) - EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM, KATD 990 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a two-game series at San Francisco to start the week and have now won two of the last three games after Isoing three of the previous four contests...are 10-9 overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games...are in a tie for third place in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by 1½ games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third and one day tied for fourth...have split their lone twogame series, lost two of three in their three three-game series and won three of four in their two four-game series.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's will play their first game against an American League Central team tonight...had a 23-10 (.697) record against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors...are 74-26 (.740) against the Central over the previous four years and are 88-30 (.746) dating back to June 23, 2017.

PITCHING: The A's shutout San Francisco 1-0 on Wednesday for their second shutout in the last three games...have allowed one run or fewer in five of the $\,$ last nine games and have a 2.70 ERA (24 er in 80.0 ip) over that span...have a 3.40 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League... also have the fifth lowest opponents OPS (.661)...have surrendered just four home runs over the last 10 games after allowing 13 over the first nine con-

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 2.79 ERA (15 er in 48.1 ip) over the last nine games and 8-8 with a 3.68 ERA for the season.. the wins are tied with the Angels and Mariners for the most in the American League but the losses are tied with the Guardians and Tigers for the most in the AL...have 95.1 innings pitched, which is fifth most in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 17 of the 19 games and are averaging 2.27 walks per nine innings, which is third best in the AL...have the third lowest opponents on-base percentage (.281) and fourth lowest batting average (.223)

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-9 (77.8%) save opportunities...has the second best save percentage in the American League (Orioles, 80.0%) and is tied for second in saves (Blue Jays, 10)...has allowed 6-of-36 (16.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and second lowest in the majors (Giants, 15.0%)...leads the AL in opponents batting average against first batters faced (.133), ranks second in on-base percentage (.235) and third in slugging (.233)...has just one loss, which is tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: Over the last nine games, the A's have been held to two runs or fewer seven times and five hits or fewer five times...are batting .186 (52-for-280) with 19 runs scored and four home runs over that span after hitting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs over the first 10 contests...have a .206 average overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also have the second lowest on-base percentage (.275) and second most strikeouts (181) in the AL and the third lowest OPS (.612)...have 16 home runs, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL...however, 10 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for fifth most...six have come with at least two runners on, which is the most in the majors...are 5-for-49 (.102) with runners in scoring position over the last seven games but are hitting .260 with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 10-for-11 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...were successful in 88-of-108 (81.5%) stolen bases attempts last year, which was the second best percentage in the AL and the best in Athletics history in a full season...A's opponents are 3-for-8 (37.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors ahead of the Astros (6-for-12, 50.0%)... the three stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last eight games, which is the longest streak of consecutive games with an error by an A's team since April 6-18, 2017 when they had an 11-game streak...have 16 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is fifth fewest.

A's IN APRIL: The A's are 10-9 in the month of April with two games remaining...posted a winning record in April last year (16-11) and a losing record in 2019 (11-15)...are scheduled to play 21 games this month, which will be their fewest in the month of April since 2009 when they had 19...have a 3.40 ERA and have not posted an ERA under 3.59 in April since 2014 (2.81)...are batting .206 and the lowest April batting average in Oakland history is .210 in 1979...have a .275 on-base percentage and the lowest in April in Oakland history is .276 in 1968.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...had 11 rookies on the Opening Day roster, which are the most since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (previous: 7 in 2012).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Cleveland (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the first homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 6-6 on the road...are batting .186 (40-for-215) with 16 runs and three home runs in seven games at home compared to .217 (88-for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road...have a 2.29 ERA (16 er in 63.0 ip) and two home runs in seven games at home, a 4.08 ERA (47 er in 103.2 ip) with 15 home runs in 12 games on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 4-2 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-7 (.462) when they start a right-hander...last year, the A's were 37-26 (.587) when the opponent started a lefty compared to 49-50 (.495) against righties...the mark against righties was second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-17, .595).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have seven players on the IL, including two on the Covid-19 IL (D. Jackson, Trivino) and five others (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

A's vs. GUARDIANS: The A's won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season, which is the first time Oakland has won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...went 4-2 last year, including 1-2 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland... have won 11 of the last 14 games and are 17-8 against Cleveland over the previous four seasons...have an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-244 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-108 in Oakland and 136-136 in Cleveland...including 51-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 922-1037 against Cleveland.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .354 (108-for-305) career hitter against Cleveland, which is fifth best by any player against Cleveland with a minimum of 300 plate appearances... Seth Brown is tied for fifth in the American League in RBI (13)...Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first eight games (8.0 ip)...is tied for third in the AL in saves (4)...has four of the five saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first seven games (5.1 ip)... Sean Murphy is tied for fourth in the AL in doubles (7) and tied for fifth in extra base hits (11)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in 2013 the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-2, 3.28 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts (4 er in 19.2 ip, 1.83 ERA) after allowing five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start...is in his seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

STRIKEOUTS: Is tied for sixth in the American League with 25 strikeouts and now has 494 in his career...needs six more for 500...last year, he finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...it was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's righthander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74, also last year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 494 career strikeouts in 472.2 innings, an average of 9.41 per nine innings...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts last year, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .180 opponents batting average, which is seventh lowest in the American League...has held left-handed hitters to a .167 (8-for-48) average compared to .195 (8-for-41) against right-handers... has surrendered both of his home runs to lefties...both of his home runs are solo shots...opponents are hitting .143 (5-for-35) the first time through the order, .250 (8-for-32) the second time and .136 (3-for-22) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...has allowed a combined .091 (3-for-33) average to the opponents two, three and four hitters...including .091 (1-for-11) against the three hitter...last year, held the opponent's number three hitter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...opponents are 4-for-49 (.082) with two strikes...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .159 career average in that situation.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.46 ERA (2 er in 12.1 ip) and .159 (7-for-44) opponents batting average in two starts at night compared to 0-2 with a 5.11 ERA (7 er in 12.1 ip) and .200 (9-for-45) opponents average in two starts during the day...last year, he was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the American League.

INNINGS PITCHED: Tossed 7.1 innings in his last start, which was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings...it snapped a streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss at Philadelphia on Opening Day April 8...it was his second career Opening Day start (2020) and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers... it was his first loss since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a home run to Schwarber to start the game but then retired six of the next seven batters...yielded four more runs in the third inning on a Harper RBI double, a Hoskins two-run single and a Gregorius RBI single...then retired the final seven batters he faced.

SECOND START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 4-2 win at Tampa Bay on April 13...blanked the Rays on three hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Choi in the fourth...retired each of the next nine batters and had a 4-1 lead when he was relieved by Snead with one out in the seventh innings and runners on first and second...Snead allowed one of the runners to score.

THIRD START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 win over Baltimore on April 18 in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first four innings as his one base runner, a leadoff walk to Mancini in the second, was erased on a double play...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his first hit, a RBI double to Hays in the fifth...Oakland scored four unearned runs in the sixth to take a 5-1 lead and he was relieved by Acevedo to start the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland...tossed 7.1 innings, which was his longest outing since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0)...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun... was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 13 so) in two starts last year...the loss came in a 3-2 decision in Oakland on July 17...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Indians on three hits over the first four innings...then allowed two runs in the fourth on a Hernandez RBI double and a Rosario sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he would yield in six innings of work... then had a no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Cleveland on Aug. 11...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Ramirez RBI single...faced the minimum over his final five innings as his two base runners, both walks, were erased on double plays...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the seventh.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts. his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-towalk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break...had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break...his opponents batting average broke down to .225 (78-for-346) with a .665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86-for-361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...had a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, .227 with nine home runs with runners on base...allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 $\,$ ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on...had seven starts of 7.0 innings and was 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (1-1, 4.32 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA over his first two starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's win over Texas last Sunday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 4 so)... has faced Cleveland once in his career and it came in relief on Sept. 22, 2019 at Cleveland while pitching for Philadelphia (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...is on his third straight Opening Day roster...went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in four starts this spring...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts last year...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings and his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings was eighth lowest in the American League...led the AL in losses, tied for the lead in starts and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1).

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his last eight games...allowed three runs in 0.2 innings for the blown save in the one exception on April 16 at Toronto.
- Is tied for seventh in the American League in games (9).
- Opponents are 1-for-7 (.143) with runners in scoring position.
- Has never faced Cleveland.
- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...compiled a 5.79 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in four appearances this spring, including one start.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

46 RHP JUSTIN GRIMM

Inherited Runners/Scored: 4/0 First Hitters: 0-5

- Has pitched in five games...has retired the first batter faced in each of his appearances and has stranded all four of his inherited runners.
- Has faced Cleveland four times in his career, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings with two hits, zero walks, and one strikeout.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.
