OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-10) VS. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (8-12)

SATURDAY, APRIL 30, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PT LHP COLE IRVIN (2-1, 3.32) VS. RHP SHANE BIEBER (1-1, 2.82) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last six games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are 10-10 overall and have not won or lost more than two straight games...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 3½ games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, one day in fourth and one day tied for fourth...have split their lone two-game series, lost two of three in their three three-game series and won three of four in their two four-game series.

A's IN APRIL: The A's are 10-10 in the month of April entering the final game of the month today...posted a winning record in April last year (16-11) and with a win today would have back-to-back winning April's for the first time since 2013 (16-12) and 2014 (18-9)...last had a losing record in April in 2019 (11-15)...the 21 games this month are the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...have a 3.69 ERA and have not posted an ERA under 4.00 in April since 2016 (3.59)...are batting .211 and the lowest April batting average in Oakland history is .210 in 1979...have a .277 on-base percentage and the lowest in April in Oakland history is .276 in 1968.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's played their first game against an American League Central team last night and lost...had a 23-10 (.697) record against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors...are 74-27 (.733) against the Central over the last five years and are 88-31 (.739) dating back to June 23, 2017.

PITCHING: The A's have two shutouts in the last four games but have allowed 17 runs over that span for a 4.37 ERA (17 er in 35.0 ip)...have surrendered seven home runs over the last six games after yielding no home runs over the previous five contests...now have a .384 opponents slugging percentage, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the fifth fewest strikeouts (163)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-3 with a 4.88 ERA (17 er in 31.1 ip) and .188 (21-for-112) opponents batting average over the last six games...are 8-8 with a 3.95 ERA for the season...the wins are tied with the Angels and Mariners for the most in the American League but the losses are tied for second most (Tigers, 9)...have 100.1 innings pitched, which is fourth most in the AL...have walked two batters or fewer in 17 of the 20 games and are averaging 2.51 walks per nine innings, which is thfifthird best in the AL... have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.225) and fifth lowest on-base percentage (.285).

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its third blown save of the season last night and is now 7-for-10 (70.0%) in save opportunities...is tied for second in the American League in saves (Blue Jays, 10) and tied for fourth in save percentage...has allowed no runs in six of the last 10 games, but three runs or more in the other four contests over that stretch...has allowed 8-of-39 (20.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL…ranks second in opponents batting average (.141) and $\,$ on-base percentage (.236) against first batters faced and third in slugging (.250)...leads the league in holds (21)...has just two losses, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Mariners, 1).

OFFENSE: Over the last 10 games, the A's have been held to two runs or fewer seven times and five hits or fewer five times...are batting .197 (62-for-315) with 27 runs scored and five home runs over the last 10 games after hit-ting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs over the first 10 contests...have a .211 batting average overall, which is third lowest in the American League... have the second most strikeouts (190) and third lowest on-base percentage (.277)...have 17 home runs, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL...however, seven of the home runs have come with at least two runners on, which is the most in the majors...are 8-for-57 (.140) with runners in scoring position over the last eight games but are hitting .267 with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 10-for-11 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...A's opponents are 3-for-8 (37.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors ahead of the Yankees (3-for-7, 42.9%)...the three stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error last night, snapping a streak of eight consecutive games with one or more errors...that was the longest such streak by an A's team since April 6-18, 2017 when they had an 11-game streak...have 16 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...are tied for third in most double plays turned (19).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 36 players, which is tied with the Tigers and Rays for the most in the American League...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five

ROOKIES: The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major Leaue debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...currently have 12 rookies on the roster, including nine pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Cleveland (0-1) and Tampa Bay (three games)... went 4-3 on the first homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2)... this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco on Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 6-6 on the road... are batting .200 (50-for-250) with 24 runs and four home runs in eight games at home compared to .217 (88for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road...have a 3.13 ERA (25 er in 72.0 ip) and five home runs in eight games at home, a 4.08 ERA (47 er in 103.2 ip) with 15 home runs in 12 games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost 9-8 last night and are now 2-4 in one-run games... are tied for the second worst record and the second most losses in one-run games in the American League...six of the A's 10 losses have been by two runs or fewer...are 2-5 in the first game of a series, 5-1 in the final game of a series...are 4-2 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-8 (.462) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the AL.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have seven players on the IL, including two on the Covid-19 IL (D. Jackson, Trivino) and five others (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Kaprielian, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (18)...used it eight times in 2020, which was also second fewest to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

A's vs. GUARDIANS: The A's lost the first game of 2022 last night...won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season, which is the first time Oakland has won more than two straight seasons series from Cleveland since 1987-91 when they won five straight...went 4-2 last year, including 1-2 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cleveland...have won 11 of the last 15 games and are 17-9 against Cleveland over the last five seasons...have an eight-game winning streak at Progressive Field, which is the longest road winning streak in Athletics history against Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 287-245 against Cleveland...that breaks down to 151-109 in Oakland and 136-136 in Cleveland...including 51-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 922-1038 against Cleveland.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is a .354 (109-for-308) career hitter against Cleveland, which is fifth best by any player against Cleveland with a minimum of 300 plate appearances... Dany Jiménez has not allowed a run over his first eight games (8.0 ip)...is tied for third in the American League in saves (4)...has four of the five saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first eight games (6.0 ip)... Sean Murphy is tied for fourth in the AL in extra base hits (12), tied for sixth in doubles (7) and tied for seventh in RBI (14)...Sheldon Neuse is 14for-38 (.368) with seven RBI over his last 10 games and is now batting .328 for the season, which ranks seventh in the AL

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1937 Duke All-American football star Ace Parker hits a pinch hit home run in his first major league at bat...he would later be elected to the Football Hall of Fame...in 1969 Rick Monday's third inning grand slam at California gives him at least one RBI in a club record 10 consecutive games...he finishes with five RBI on the day and drives in 18 runs during the streak... in 2000 Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run.. in 2005 Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-1, 3.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has allowed just one run over his last two starts (10.0 ip) and is 2-0 with a 2.20 ERA (4 er in 16.1 ip) over his last three starts after taking the loss in his first start...has won three straight decisions just once in his career (June 5-27, 2021)...begins his fourth season in the majors, his second with the A's...also pitched for Philadelphia in 2019 and 2020...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.

DON'T WALK: Has walked five batters in 21.2 innings over his first four starts, an average of 2.08 per nine innings...walked just 42 batters in 178.1 innings last year...his average of 2.12 walks per nine innings in 2021 was eighth lowest in the American League...walked two batters or fewer in 29 of his 32 starts last year and has now done so in 35 of his 39 career starts...has walked just 61 batters in 245.1 career innings (2.24 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) and .184 (7-for-38) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip), .261 (12-for-46) opponents average and all four of his home runs in two starts on the road

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his fourth in a day game...last year he made 17 of his 32 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...has held left-handed hitters to a .111 (2-for-18) batting average compared to .258 (17-for-66) against right-handers... opponents are 3-for-16 (.188) with runners in scoring position...last year, he allowed a .324 average with runners in scoring position, which was the highest in the majors and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .323 career opponents average with RISP...has struck out 14 batters in 21.2 innings, an average of 5.82 strikeouts per nine inings...last year, he fanned just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Philadelphia on April 9...yielded a career-high tying three home runs...allowed a two-run home run to Castellanos in the first and then blanked the Phillies on three hits and a walk over innings two through five...surrendered back-to-back homers to Hoskins and Segura to start the sixth and was relieved by Jiménez with one out in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 victory at Tampa Bay on April 14...Oakland scored three times in the second inning and he allowed a RBI single to Margot in the bottom of the second...retired each of the next 14 batters following the Margot single and had a 6-1 lead when he yielded a leadoff double to Ramirez in the seventh...Lowe homered one out later and he was relieved by Acevedo with one out in the seventh and the A's leading 6-3.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore on April 19 in Oakland...allowed a RBI ground out to Mancini in the first inning but that was the only run he would surrender in five innings of work...yielded four hits and two walks over his final four innings but stranded all six...was relieved by Logue to start the sixth inning and Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

LAST START: He combined with Jackson, Snead and Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...tossed five of the innings and allowed just one hit while walking two...did not allow a base runner past first base...retired the side in order just once, his final inning (5th).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 6.43 ERA in a team-leading four starts...walked just two batters in 14.0 innings but opponents were 20-for-62 (.323)...tied for second in the Cactus League in hits allowed (20), tied for sixth in most runs (11) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Jefferies for the team lead in innings pitched and strikeouts.

2021 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021 and went 10-15 with a 4.24 ERA in 32 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies.

AMONG THE LEADERS: His 15 losses were the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 13 years (Jesse Chavez, 2015)...is the first Athletic to lead the league in losses since Tom Candiotti in 1998...tied for the AL lead in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (178.1)...had a .281 opponents batting average and his 195 hits allowed were the most in the AL and second most in the majors...his 94 runs were fifth most in the AL and his nine hit batters tied for 10th most...averaged 15.0 pitches per inning, which was the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...struck out just 125 batters and his average of 6.31 strikeouts per nine innings was third lowest in the AL and the majors...allowed 23 home runs and ranked seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.16).

STREAKING: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and 2-5 with a 6.38 ERA and .950 OPS over his final 10 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .270 (143-for-530) with a .739 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (52-for-180) with a .767 OPS against left-handers...surrendered 18 of his 23 home runs to righties...17 of the home runs were solo shots.

DAYS REST: Was 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.84 ERA and .657 OPS in 19 starts on five days rest or more...led the majors in losses and highest ERA on four days rest and had the second highest OPS...tied for third in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranked fourth in ERA and sixth in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.58 ERA in 17 starts during the day...tied for the most starts during the day in the majors and ranked second in most losses...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, had a .718 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 4-12 with a 5.29 ERA in 19 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses matched the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and set an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.29 intradivision ERA was fourth highest in the majors this year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.40 ERA in four starts against Houston.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents hit .440 with a 1.462 OPS when putting his curveball in play...the OPS was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs in play...had 20 assists, which tied for sixth most among AL pitchers...the A's were 4-3 in his no decisions and went 14-18 (.438) in his starting assignments...left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...went 10-3 in 18 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (2022 debut): Is scheduled to be reinstated from the injured list tomorrow to make his first start of the season...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stokcton and Triple-A Las Vegas...has never faced Cleveland in his career...last year, he was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.
