# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-12) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (12-10)

MONDAY, MAY 2, 2022 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's were swept by Cleveland over the weekend, marking the first time they have been swept this year...it is also the first time the A's have lost more than two consecutive games...have lost three straight and six of the last eight games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are 10-12 overall and are season-high tying two games under .500 (0-2 on April 9)...are in fourth place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 4½ games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, three days in fourth and one day tied for fourth.

**PITCHING:** Over the last eight games, the A's have allowed seven runs or more four times and three runs or fewer four times...have a 4.31 ERA (34 er in 71.0 ip) over that span...have not allowed a home run in 10 of the last 13 games but have surrendered seven home runs in the three games with a homer...are tied for the third most wild pitches in the American League (9) and have the fifth fewest strikeouts (176).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-4 with a 5.03 ERA (22 er in 39.1 ip) over the last eight games...have held the opposition to a .210 (30-for-143) opponents batting average over that span but have issued 18 walks in 39.1 innings (4.12 per nine innings)...are 8-8 with a 4.07 ERA for the season... the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the lossed are tied for second most and the ERA is fourth highest.

**THE BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-10 (70.0%) save opportunities and ranks fourth in the American League in saves...allowed 6-of-8 inherited runners to score in the three-game series against Cleveland after allowing just 6-of-36 to score over the first 19 games...was charged with the loss in two of the games against the Guardians but have just three for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...ranks second in the AL in opponents batting average (.176) and on-base percentage (.269) against first batters faced and third in slugging (.279)...ranks second in holds (21)...has allowed no earned runs in eight of the last 13 games, but three runs or more in the other five contests over that stretch.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .200 (76-for-380) with 31 runs scored and six home runs over the last 12 games after hitting .224 with 53 runs and 12 home runs over the first 10 contests...have a .211 batting average overall, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors... have the second lowest on-base percentage (.277) and OPS (.618) in the AL and the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.342)...are tied for the second most strikeouts (207) and tied for the third fewest walks (58)...have 18 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL...however, seven of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...Christian Bethancourt had a pinch hit RBI double yesterday and A's pinch hitters are now 4-for-24 (.167) with three doubles and three RBI...the A's lead the AL in pinch doubles, are tied for the lead in extra base hits (3), tied for second in hits, rank third in plate appearances (24) and tied for third in RBI...A's designated hitters are batting .130 (10-for-77), which is the lowest mark in the majors behind the Guardians (.151)...are hitting .141 (10-for-71) with RISP over the first 11 contests.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have four stolen bases in the last five games and are 12-for-13 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is tied with the Phillies for the best percentage in the majors...A's opponents are 5-for-11 (45.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors to the Yankees (4-for-9, 44.4%)...the five stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors yesterday and have made one or more errors in 10 of the last 11 games (12 errors total)...have 19 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...have turned 24 double plays, which is tied with the Orioles for the most in the AL.

**ROSTER NOTES:** James Kaprielian made his 2022 debut yesterday and the A's have now used 37 players, which is second most in the American League to the Rays (38)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have employed 16 rookies this year after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since

2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts (N.Allen, Z.Jackson, Lemoine, Logue, Lopes, McDonald, Oller)...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on their second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the first homestand against Baltimore (3-1) and Texas (1-2) and are 4-6 at home...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco last Tuesday and Wednesday and are now 6-6 on the road...leave following the game Wednesday for an eight-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Detroit (five games)...will bat last in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics...are hitting .203 (64-for-315) with 28 runs and five home runs in 10 games at home compared to .217 (88-for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road...have a 3.20 ERA (32 er in 90.0 ip) and five home runs in 12 games on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is tied for the second best record in the American League, but are 2-11 (.154) when the opponent scores first, which is fourth worst...are 2-5 in the first game of a series, 5-2 in the final game of a series...seven of the A's 12 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL...have four one-run losses, which is tied for fourth most...are 4-2 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-10 (.375) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is fourth quickest in the AL.

**A's IN APRIL:** The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 16-11 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL, including two on the Covid-19 IL (D. Jackson, Trivino) and four others (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

*A's vs. RAYS:* The A's lead the season series 3-1 after taking three of four at Tampa Bay in April...outscored the Rays 31-16 after scoring just 19 runs in seven games against Tampa Bay last year...have won each of the previous two season series (4-3 in 2021 and 2019) and have not won three straight season series from the Rays since winning six straight from 1999-2004... all time, the A's are 116-80 (.592) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-33 in Oakland and 54-47 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Elvis Andrus* went 6-for-15 (.400) in four games against Tampa Bay earlier this year...is a .313 (98-for-313) career hitter against the Rays, which is his second best batting average against an American League team (.349 vs. Cleveland)...*Dany Jiménez* has not allowed an earned run over his first nine games (9.0 ip)...is tied for fourth in the AL in saves (4)...has four of the five saves by an AL rookie (teammate Zach Jackson has the other)...*Sam Moll* has not allowed a run over his first eight games (6.0 ip)...*Sean Murphy* is sixth in the AL in extra base hits (12), tied for eighth in doubles (7) and tied for ninth in RBI (14)...*Sheldon Neuse* is 16-for-44 (.364) with eight RBI over his last 12 games and is now hitting .328 for the season, which is tied for seventh in the AL.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-3, 3.26 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and the sixth of his career...has lost each of his last three starts after winning his first start and his three losses are tied for second most in the American League...however, has received just two runs of support in his four starts (19.1 ip, 0.93 RSA)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-1 with a 0.00 ERA (11.0 ip) and .135 (5-for-37) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-2 with a 7.56 ERA (7 er in 8.1 ip) and .314 (11-for-35) opponents average in two starts at night.

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory at Philadlephia on April 10...shut out the Phillies in five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...retired the side in order in the first, second and fourth innings...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Moll to start the sixth inning after issuing a leadoff walk to Vierling.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Toronto April 15...allowed a career-high seven hits in 4.1 innings...however, yielded just two runs on a Guerrero solo home run in the first and an Espinal RBI double in the second...was relieved by Grimm with one out and a runner on first base in the fifth inning with the A's trailing 2-0.

**THIRD START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Baltimore last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out a career-high five batters in a career-high 6.0 innings and a career-high 83 pitches...blanked the Orioles on two hits and two hit batters over the first four innings...allowed a leadoff double to McKenna in the fifth and he scored on an Andrus error for an unearned run... that was the only run Jefferies would allow but Lyles and four Baltimore relievers combined to shut out the A's on seven hits.

*LAST START:* He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss at San Francisco last Tuesday...allowed a career-high tying five runs in 4.0 innings...yielded two runs in the second on a Flores RBI double and fielders choice...the A's got one of those runs back in the third but he surrendered a three-run home run to Flores in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Puk to start the fifth with the A's trailing 5-1.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA in four appearances, including three starts...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24-for-65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)... tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

**2021 RECAP:** Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 (5-for-27) with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) with a .605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, .115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a .316 opponents on-base percent-age as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings (1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors (1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18...has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA...his opponents batting average broke down to .280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers...allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA...had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were 4-5 in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake (7 h, 1 so)...had a no decision in an 8-5 loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, .323 opponents batting average and .969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's 8-3 win at Los Angeles-AL (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches...yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 2 so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10-day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept. 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

*RHP Paul Blackburn (2-0, 1.80 ERA):* Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA over his first four starts...the three wins are tied for fourth in the American League and his 1.35 ERA is fifth lowest among pitchers with 20 or more innings...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 1-0 A's win at San Francisco last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Tampa Bay and it came earlier this year on April 11 in a 13-2 win (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA in three games, including two starts, this spring...began the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts.

- Has not allowed a run in seven of his last nine games...allowed multiple runsf runs for the blown save in the two exceptions on April 16 at Toronto and April 29 vs. Cleveland.
- Is tied for 10th in the American League in games (10).
- Faced Tampa Bay once this season on April 12, allowing two hits and an earned run in 2.1 innings of work...struck out two and walked none.
- Begins his second season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...compiled a 5.79 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in four appearances this spring, including one start.

Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's...was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and .186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

#### 46 RHP JUSTIN GRIMM

Last Outing: 5/1 vs. Cleveland (ND, 1.2 ip, h, bb, so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0 Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/1 First Hitters: 0-7

- Has pitched in seven games...has retired the first batter faced in each of
- his appearances and has stranded six of seven of his inherited runners.
- Faced Tamp Bay once this season on April 11, throwing one scoreless inning with a hit and two strikeouts.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

### 61 RHP ZACH JACKSON

- Earned his first career save April 19 against Baltimore, recording the final out in the bottom of the ninth...is one of two rookies in the American League with a save along with teammate Dany Jiménez.
- Is tied for 10th in the AL in games pitched (10).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and is making his Major League debut... is 16-8 with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors...has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring and comipled a 1.35 ERA in six appearances...struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.

Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

#### **56 RHP DANY JIMÉNEZ**


