# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-13) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (13-10) 

## TUESDAY, MAY 3, 2022 - OAKLAND COLISEUM - 6:40 PT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have a four-game losing streak, which marks the first time they have lost or won more than two straight games this year...have now lost seven of the last nine games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are a season-low three games under . 500 at 10-13...are in fourth place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high $4 \frac{1}{2}$ games for the second consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth and one day tied for fourth....were swept by Cleveland over the weekend, marking the first time they have been swept this year.
OFFENSE: The A's scored one run last night, which marks the sixth time in the last 11 games they have been held to one run or fewer... had a season-low tying two hits last night (April 22 vs. Texas) and have been held to five hits or fewer five times in the last nine games....are now batting. 171 (48-for-280) with 19 runs scored over the last nine games ( 2.1 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests ( 4.7 per game)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.270) and the lowest batting average in the American League (.206)... have the second lowest OPS (.601) in the AL and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.331)...have the second most strikeouts (216) and third fewest walks (59)... have 18 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL....however, seven of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors....'s pinch hitters lead the majors in doubles (3), are tied for the lead in extra base hits (3), tied for third in hits (4) and RBI (3) and rank fifth in plate appearances (24)...A's designated hitters are batting 136 (11-for-81), which is the lowest mark in the majors behind the Guardians (.151)...the A's are hitting. 153 (11-for-72) with runners in scoring position over the last 12 games after batting .365 with RISP over the first 11 contests.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five stolen bases in the last six games and are 13 -for-14 (92.9\%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the best percentage in the majors ahead of the Phillies ( $92.3 \%$ )....'s opponents are 5 -for$11(45.5 \%)$ in stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest success rate in the majors to the Yankees ( 4 -for-9, 44.4\%)...the five stolen bases allowed are tied for second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 4)....'s pitchers have three pickoffs, which is tied with the Rangers for the most in the AL.
PITCHING: Over the last nine games, the A's have allowed six runs or more five times and three runs or fewer four times...have a 4.50 ERA ( 40 er in 80.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.77 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.235) and are tied for third in most wild pitches (9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $2-5$ with a 5.68 ERA ( 28 er in 44.1 ip ) over the last nine games... have walked 18 batters in 44.1 innings over that span ( 3.65 per nine innings) after issuing just 16 free passes in 69.0 innings over the first 14 contests ( 2.09 per nine innings)...are $8-10$ with a 4.37 ERA for the season...the wins are tied for fifth in the American League but the lossed are tied for the most with the Tigers and Mariners...the ERA is third highest.
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-10 (70.0\%) save opportunities and is tied for fourth in the American League in saves...ranks second in the AL in opponents batting average (.169) and on-base percentage (.259) against first batters faced and third in slugging (.268)...has allowed 6-of-8 inherited runners to score in four games on the homestand after allowing just 6-of-36 to score over the first 19 games ...ranks second in holds (21)... has yielded just two home runs in the last 14 games ( 54.1 ip ) and has six for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL....was charged with the loss in the first two games of the homestand but has just three for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.... has allowed no earned runs in nine of the last 14 games, but three runs or more in the other five contests over that stretch.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in back-to-back games and have now made one or more errors in 11 of the last 12 games ( 14 errors total)...have 21 errors for the season, which is tied with the White Sox and Diamondbacks for the most in the majors... have turned 24 double plays, which is second most in the American League to the Orioles (25).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on their second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Cleveland ( $0-3$ ) and Tampa Bay ( $0-1$ )...went 4-3 on the first homestand and are 4-7 (.364) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...this homestand concludes a stretch
where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-6 on the road....leave following the game tomorrow for an eight-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Detroit (five games)...will bat last in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics...are hitting 203 ( 66 -for-344) with 29 runs and five home runs in 11 games at home compared to .217 ( 88 -for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road.
ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 37 players, which is second most in the American League to the Rays (38)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season... 16 of the 37 players have been rookies after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20 ...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...currently have nine rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.
THIS AND THAT: Beginning Friday, the A's are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days from May 6-18...that includes a single-admission doubleheader on May 10 at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16...the A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 2-12 (.143) when the opponent scores first, which is tied for third worst...are 2-6 in the first game of a series, 5-2 in the final game of a series....are tied for third in the AL in losses by two runs or fewer (7) and tied for fifth in one-run loses (4)...are 4-2 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-11 (.353) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 1 minute per game, which is third quickest in the majors (Guardians, 2:59; Rays, 2:57).

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 1611 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276),
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have four players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016....however, it was second fewest in the majors.
A's vs. RAYS: The A's lead the season series 3-2...lost the first game in Oakland last night after taking three of four at Tampa Bay in April...have outscored the Rays 32-22 after scoring just 19 runs in seven games against Tampa Bay last year...have won each of the previous two season series (4-3 in 2021 and 2019) and have not won three straight season series from the Rays since winning six straight from 1999-2004....all time, the A's are 116-81 (.589) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team....are 62-34 in Oakland and 54-47 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first nine games (9.0 ip)....is tied for fifth in the American League in saves (4)...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first nine games ( 7.0 ip ) and opponents are 2 -for22 (.091)...Sean Murphy ranks sixth in the AL in extra base hits (12) and tied for ninth in doubles (7) and RBI (14)...Chad Pinder extended his hitting streak to eight games last night, which is an A's season high and one short of his career high (9, Sept. 24, 2021-April 8, 2022)...is 10-for-29 (.345) with a home run and five RBI during his current streak.

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1980 Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City...in 2019 Josh Phegley collects eight RBI in the A's 14-1 win at Pittsburgh to set an Athletics record for RBI by a catcher.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (3-0, 1.35 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA over his first four starts...the three wins are tied for fourth in the American League and his 1.35 ERA is fifth lowest among pitchers with 20 or more innings...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked just two batters over his first four starts (20.0 ip), an average of 0.90 per nine innings...has issued just 12 free passes in 58.1 innings over the last two years (1.85 per nine innings)...opponents are 2-for-2 (.167) with runners in scoring position...has a . 118 (4-for-34) opponents batting average the first time through the order and .286 (10-for- 35 ) the second time...opponents are 0-for-2 the third time...the opponents three hitter in the order is 0 -for- 7 ...h has allowed two runs or fewer in all four of his starts... the A's are 4-0 in his starting assignments.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-2 win at Tampa Bay on April 11...Oakland scored four times in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk while striking out a career-high seven in 5.0 innings...allowed just one base runner as far as second base... was relieved by Jackson to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 9-0.
SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win at Toronto on April 16...allowed a run in the first inning when Tapia doubled to start the game, went to third on a ground out and scored on a fielders choice...Oakland then scored three times in the second and twice in the third and he yielded a RBI single to Collins in the fourth...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth with the A's leading 5-2...Acevedo allowed three runs for the blown save but the A's scored twice in the ninth for the win.

THURSDAY START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore on April 21 in Oakland...faced the minimum over the first four innings and allowed just one hit...had a 2-0 lead when Mountcastle singled to start the fifth and scored one out later on a Hays double...Oakland added two more runs in the bottom of the fifth and he was relieved by Moll to start the sixth with the A's leading 4-1.

LAST START: He combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at San Francisco last Wednesday...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...retired the side in order just once (third inning) but faced the minimum three times as he was aided by a total of three double plays.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts...has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career ( 10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).
WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a 319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage.... his opponents batting average broke down to . 309 (29-for-94) with an .858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (23-for-69) with a .953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a .313 career average in that situation.. was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road....was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night....allowed a . 533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his .311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings ...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 ( 53 -for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, . 311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a 296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that...went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and . 867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a sea-son-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings... picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a sea-son-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season... allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25 ... had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak....including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a $4-3$ loss...was $4-7$ with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a 3-2 loss...also walked a season-high three batters...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches... logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's $3-1$ win...left with a $1-0$ lead but the bullpen blew the save...went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA . 359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...allowed a season-high nine hits and surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...yielded four runs on six hits in a season-low 2.2 innings on Sept. 10 against Texas. left with a $6-4$ lead but had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's $7-2$ win...it was his first win since June 29 , 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6,2018 ...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his season high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle...allowed a season-high six runs and a career-high tying three home runs in 2.0 innings in his final start on Oct. 2 at Houston, a 10-4 loss.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 4.25 ERA): Is schedued to make his American League leading sixth start of the season...allowed five runs in last start, five runs in his first start and five runs in three starts in between...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-8 A's loss to Cleveland on Friday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, $5 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 6$ so)...is 2-1 with a 2.36 ERA ( $26.2 \mathrm{ip}, 21 \mathrm{~h}, 8 \mathrm{r}, 7 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}$, 26 so, 4 hr ) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Tampa Bay...including a win this year on April 13 ( 6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 6 so)... is $2-0$ with a 1.46 ERA in two starts against American League East teams this year and now has a five-game winning streak against the AL East dating back to May 3, 2021...was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA in two starts this spring... went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971.
