OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-15) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (15-11)

FRIDAY, MAY 6, 2022 — TARGET FIELD — 7:10 CT LHP ZACH LOGUE (1-0, 0.00 ERA) VS. RHP JOSH WINDER (1-0, 2.20) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have a six-game losing streak, which marks the first time they have lost or won more than two straight games this year...have now lost nine of the last 11 games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are a season-low ive games under .500 at 10-15...are in fifth place in the American League West for the first time and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 6 games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth, one day tied for fourth, and one tie in fifth... were swept by Cleveland and Tampa Bay during their last homestand, marking the first time they were swept this season.

OFFENSE: The A's were held scoreless Wednesday against Tampa Bay at the Coliseum...have been held to one run or fewer in seven of the their last 12 games...had a season-low tying two hits Monday night (April 22 vs. Texas) and have been held to five hits or fewer six times in the last 11 games...are now batting .178 (62-for-348) with 26 runs scored over the last 11 games (2.36 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.269; CIN, .267) and the lowest batting average in the American League (.206; KC, .218)...have the lowest OPS (.599) in the AL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.329)...have the third most strikeouts (233) and third fewest walks (63)...have 19 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL... however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors... A's pinch hitters are tied for the Major Leauge leade in doubles (3, Rangers), are tied for second in extra base hits (3), tied for fifth in hits (4) and RBI (3) and rank fourth in plate appearances (26)...A's designated hitters are batting .144 (13-for-90), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five stolen bases in the last eight games and are 13-for-14 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the second best percentage in the majors behind the Phillies (93.3%)...A's opponents are 6-for-13 (46.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best success rate in the majors behind the Yankees (44.4%)...the six stolen bases allowed are second fewest in the majors (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is the most in the AL.

PITCHING: Over the last 11 games, the A's have allowed six runs or more six times and three runs or fewer five times...have a 4.73 ERA (52 er in 99.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.94 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.238) and are third in most wild pitches (11)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 5.01 ERA (31 er in 55.2 ip) over the last 11 games...have walked 20 batters in 55.2 innings over that span (3.23 per nine innings) after issuing just 16 free passes in 69.0 innings over the first 14 contests (2.09 per nine innings)...are 8-10 with a 4.19 ERA for the season...the lossed are tied for second most to the Tigers...the ERA is fifth highest.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-11 (63.6%) save opportunities and is sixth in the American League in saves...allowed 7-of-13 inherited runners to score in six games on the homestand after allowing just 6-of-36 to score over the first 19 games...rank tied for second in holds (23)...has yielded just three home runs in the last 16 games (69.0 ip) and has seven for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...was charged with the loss in the first two games and the last two games of the homestand and has five for the season...has allowed no earned runs in nine of the last 16 games, but three runs or more in the other seven contests over that stretch.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed no errors on Wednesday after committing two errors in back-to-back games and have made one or more errors in 11 of the last 14 games (14 errors total)...have 21 errors for the season, which is tied with the Diamondbacks for second most in the Majors...have turned 25 double plays, which is tied for sixth most in the Majors with the Diamondbacks.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's embark on a road trip during which they will play eight games in seven days against Minnesota (three games) and Detroit (five games)...went 0-6 on their second homestand of the season, against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-3)...went 4-3 on the first homestand and are 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied for the worst home record in the American League (Texas)...the homestand concluded a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-6 on the road...will bat last in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics.. are hitting .194 (80-for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .217 (88-for-405) with 56 runs and 13 home runs in 12 games on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 37 players, which is tied for second most in the American League to the Rays (39)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...16 of the 37 players have been rookies after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THIS AND THAT: Beginning today, the A's are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days from May 6-18...that includes a single-admission doubleheader on May 10 at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16...the A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 2-15 (.118) when the opponent scores first, which is tied with Kansas City for worst in the AL...are 2-6 in the first game of a series, 5-3 in the final game of a series...are tied for third in the AL in losses by two runs or fewer (7) and tied for fifth in one-run loses (4)...are 4-3 (.571) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-12 (.333) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 1 minute per game, which is third quickest in the majors (Tigers, 3:00; Rays, 2:57).

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 16-11 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 15 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have five players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt, Irvin)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the

A's vs. TWINS: The A's won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a threegame series in Oakland and won two of three at Minnesota...have won each of the previous three season series and seven of the previous nine...are 36-17 (.679) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 314-306 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 139-175 in Minnesota...are 22-20 at Target Field...are 371-375 all-time against the Twins and have a 1018-1011 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1018 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chad Pinder extended his hitting streak to 10 games on Wednesday which is an A's season high and is a career high...his previous high was 9, Sept. 24, 2021-April 8, 2022...is 13-for-37 (.351) with a home run and five RBI during his current streak... Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 10 games (10.0 ip)...is tied for sixth in the American League in saves (4)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first nine games (7.0 ip) and opponents are 2-for-22 (.091)... Sean Murphy ranks tied for seventh in the AL in extra base hits (12), is tied for 10th in doubles (7), and tied for 13th RBI (15).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1975 Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2003 Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979...in 2017 Adam Rosales has a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat the Detroit Tigers 6-5...it is the first of three consecutive walk-off wins for the A's.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Double-A New Hampshire and was 3-1 with a 4.54 ERA in seven starts when he was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 12...went 9-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with the Bisons and combined for a 12-4 record and a 3.67 ERA in 25 appearances overall...struck out 144 batters in 125.0 innings, an average of 10.37 per nine innings...walked just 27 (1.94 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.33...his strikeouts were a career-high and he matched his best in wins... hit a career-high 10 batters...tied for third among all minor leaguers in wins and tied for ninth in innings pitched...led the Blue Jays farm system in wins, strikeouts, games started (24) and innings pitched...was named an Milb. com Organizational All-Star after the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .239 opponents batting average, which broke down to .225 (27-for-120) against left-handed hitters compared to .244 (85-for-349) against right-handers...yielded 14 of his 15 home runs to righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs with the bases empty...opponents hit .313 with runners in scoring position...had a 213 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .240 the second time and .313 after that...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .180 batting average... had a .130 opponents batting average with two strikeouts but allowed eight home runs.

THIS AND THAT: Combined for a 1.84 ERA in the first and second inning....had a 4.86 ERA from the third inning on...was 0-2 with a 6.32 ERA in four starts on four days rest or less, 10-2 with a 3.70 ERA in 19 games on five days rest or more...his teams were 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 25 appearances.

innings in his first start with the Bisons on June 18 at Rochester...allowed just one hit and did not walk a batter while striking out eight in a 5-0 win... earned Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week honors for his effort...then went 2-2 with a 4.99 ERA over his next seven games from June 25 to Aug. 1...threw a season-high 97 pitches in 5.0 innings on July 22 against Syracuse...made his one relief appearance on July 28 at Worcester and picked up the win after logging 4.0 scoreless and hitless innings (1 bb, 8 so)...won three consecutive starts from Aug. 7-20... had a 1.65 ERA during the streak, which included 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 13 against Rochester...yielded a season-high tying six runs and hit a career-high three batters in an 8-5 loss to Worcester on Aug. 26...then went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA over his final six starts...struck out 37 and walked just four in 30.1 innings.

CAREER: Was the ninth round selection of the Blue Jays in 2017 and went 32-16 with a 3.43 ERA in 84 games, including 73 starts, in four seasons in the Toronto farm system...was one of four players traded to the A's on March 16, 2022 in exchange for Matt Chapman...tied for third among all minor league pitchers with 12 wins in 2021...was named an MilB.com Organizational All-Star after the 2018 and 2021 seasons...was named to the Eastern League Midseason All-Star team in 2019.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (0-1, 18.00 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list last Sunday and was the losing pitcher in the A'S 7-3 loss to Cleveland that day in Oakland (2.0 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring... went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA (13.2 ip, 15 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stokcton and Triple-A Las Vegas... has never faced Minnesota in his career...last year, he was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among AL rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started.
