# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-16) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (16-11)

ABOUT THE A's: The A's have a seven-game losing streak, which marks the first time they have lost or won more than two straight games this year... have now lost 10 of the last 12 games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests....are a season-low six games under . 500 at 10-16...are in fifth place in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by a seasonhigh 7 games... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth, one day tied for fourth, and two days in fifth...were swept by Cleveland and Tampa Bay during their last homestand, marking the first time they were swept this season.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to just one run scored last night at the Minneosta Twins.... have been held to one run or fewer in eight of the their last 13 games...had a season-low-tying two hits Monday night (April 22 vs. Texas) and have been held to five hits or fewer seven times in the last 12 games... are now batting. 178 ( 66 -for-377) with 27 runs scored over the last 12 games ( 2.25 runs per game) after hitting 226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests ( 4.7 per game)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.266) and the lowest batting average in the American League (.203; KC, .218).... have the lowest OPS (.598) in the AL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.323)...have the third most strikeouts (244) and are tied for third fewest walks (65)...have 19 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL... however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the Major Leauge lead in doubles (3, Rangers), are tied for second in extra base hits (3), tied for fifth in hits (4), tied for sixth in RBI (3) and rank tied for fourth in plate appearances (26)...A's designated hitters are batting . 141 (13-for-92), which is the lowest mark in the majors.
ON THE BASES: The A's have six stolen bases in the last nine games and are 14 -for-16 (87.5\%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the fourth best percentage in the majors...A's opponents are 6 -for-13 ( $46.2 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best success rate in the majors behind the Yankees (44.4\%)...the six stolen bases allowed are second fewest in the Majors (Yankees, 4)....'s pitchers have four pickoffs, which is the most in the AL and is tied for second most in the Majors.

PITCHING: Over the last 12 games, the A's have allowed six runs or more six times and three runs or fewer six times.... have a 4.54 ERA ( 54 er in 107.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.88 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.239) and are tied for third in most wild pitches (11).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are $2-6$ with a 4.90 ERA ( 33 er in 60.2 ip) over the last 12 games.... have walked 22 batters in 60.2 innings over that span ( 3.26 per nine innings) after issuing just 16 free passes in 69.0 innings over the first 14 contests ( 2.09 per nine innings)...are 8-11 with a 4.16 ERA for the season...the ERA is fifth highest.
THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-11 (63.6\%) save opportunities and is sixth in the American League in saves...allowed 7-of-13 inherited runners to score in six games on the homestand after allowing just 6-of36 to score over the first 19 games...rank tied for second in holds (23)... has yielded just three home runs in the last 17 games ( 77.0 ip ) and has seven for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...was charged with the loss in the first two games and the last two games of the homestand and has five for the season.... has allowed no earned runs in 10 of the last 17 games, but three runs or more in the other seven contests over that stretch.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's defense has not committed an error in three consecutive games after committing two errors in back-to-back contests and have made one or more errors in 11 of the last 15 games ( 14 errors total)... have 21 errors for the season, which is tied with the Diamondbacks for fourth most in the Majors...have turned 25 double plays, which is tied for sixth most in the Majors with the Diamondbacks and Marlins
HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a road trip during which they will play eight games in seven days against Minnesota ( $0-1$ ) and Detroit (five games)... went $0-6$ on their second homestand of the season, against Cleveland $(0-3)$ and Tampa Bay ( $0-3$ )...went 4-3 on the first homestand and are 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied for the worst home record in the American League (Texas)...the homestand concluded a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-6 on the road...will bat last in the first game of the May 10 doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics...are hitting 194 ( 80 -for- 412 ) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .212 ( 92 -for-434) with 57 runs and 13 home runs in 13 games on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 37 players, which is tied for third most in the American League to the Rays (39)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season... 16 of the 37 players have been rookies after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers... have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are in the midst of a stretch during which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days from May 6-18...that includes a single-admission doubleheader on May 10 at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16...the A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 2-15 (.118) when the opponent scores first, which is worst in the AL...are 2-7 in the first game of a series, 5-3 in the final game of a series...are third in the AL in losses by two runs or fewer (8) and fifth in one-run loses (5)...are 4-3 (.571) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-13 (.316) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 0 minutes per game, which is second quickest in the majors behind only Tampa Bay (2:59).
A's IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 1611 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)... hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 15 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have five players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Vogt, Irvin)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's dropped game one of this series last night by a score of 2-1...won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Minnesota.... have won each of the previous three season series and seven of the previous nine...are 36-18 (.667) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 314-307 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 139-176 in Minnesota.. are 22-21 at Target Field...are 371-376 all-time against the Twins and have a 1018-1012 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1018 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

Chad Pinder snapped a 10-game hitting streak last night which was an A's season high and is a career high...his previous high was 9, Sept. 24, 2021-April 8, 2022...over his last 11 games, he is 13 -for-41 (.317) with a home run and five RBI...Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 10 games ( 10.0 ip )...is tied for sixth in the American League in saves (4)...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first nine games (7.0 ip) and opponents are 2 -for-22 (.091)...Sean Murphy ranks tied for eighth in the AL in extra base hits (12), is tied for 12th in doubles (7), and tied for 14th RBI (15).

> THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY
> In 1979 the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play...it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979... in 1991 Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he has a double, a club record tying threehome runs and also walks while collecting seven RBI...in 1997 the A's and Milwaukee set a what was then a major league record for the longest 1-0 nine inning game...the Brewers win the game in 3 hours and 20 minutes, breaking the previous record of 3:07...in 2019, Mike Fiers tosses his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win over Cincinnati...it is the 13th no-hitter in Athletics history, the eighth since the club moved to Oakland in 1968.

## TODAY'S STARTING PIICHER: James Kaprielian (0-1, 18.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list last Sunday and is scheduled to make his second start of the season...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.
REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA ( $13.2 \mathrm{ip}, 15 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 11 \mathrm{er}, 5$ $\mathrm{bb}, 13$ so, 3 hr ) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third....made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, $3 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 6 \mathrm{so}, 2 \mathrm{hr}$ )...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas... had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 ( 4.2 ip, 9 h, $4 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{er}$, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 5 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma ( $4.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{so}$ ).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career....walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning... was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017.... went 5-3 with a 2.65 ERA, . 202 opponents batting average and . 657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20 ...then posted a $3-2$ record with a 5.96 ERA, 271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.
OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to 201 (46-for-229) with a . 602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 ( 59 -for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and . 569 OPS the first time through the order, . 285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order....allowed a . 083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit . 107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was $8-5$ with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18... had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and . 890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 -for- 2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was 5-3 with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, $3-2$ with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road... had a $4-3$ record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was $1-2$ with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts... logged a $7-3$ record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-4, 4.81 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, which is tied for the most among American League rookies...has lost each of his last four starts after winning his first start and his four losses are tied for most in the AL....has received one run of support or fewer in all five of his starts and has a season run support average of 1.11 (3 rs in 24.1 ip)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's loss to Tampa Bay in Oakland last Monday ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 11 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 6 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )...has never faced the Twins in his career...went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA in four appearances, including three starts, this spring...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24-for-65 (.369)...spent most of the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was $5-1$ with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list.

- Has pitched in eight games... has retired the first batter faced in each of his appearances and has stranded seven of eight of his inherited runners.
- Is 1-0 with a 4.32 ERA (4ER/8.1IP) in 3 career appearances against the Twins.
- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.
Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.

- Earned his first career save April 19 against Baltimore, recording the final out in the bottom of the ninth...is one of three rookies in the American League with a save along with teammate Dany Jiménez and Minnesota's Jhoan Duran.
- Has never faced the Twins in his career
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and is making his Major League debut... is $16-8$ with 14 saves and a 3.00 ERA in 170 career relief appearances in five seasons in the minors.... has 281 strikeouts in 227.2 innings.
- Was a non-roster invitee this spring and comipled a 1.35 ERA in six appearances...struck out 11 batters in 6.2 innings.
Last Year: Split his season between Double-A Midland and Triple-A Las Vegas and combined for a 2-2 record, a career-high tying six saves and a 2.57 ERA in 25 relief appearances before a right hip labral tear ended his season in mid-July.

- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Oct. 15, 2021 and had a 1.50 ERA in six appearances this spring as a non-roster invitee...was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his first Opening Day roster.
Last Year: Was with the A's during Spring Training after being selected in the Rule 5 draft but was returned to Toronto March 15...spent the entire regular season with Triple-A Buffalo and was 3-3 with three saves and a 2.22 ERA in 39 games, including one start.
