OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-17) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (17-11)

SUNDAY, MAY 8, 2022 — TARGET FIELD — 1:10 CT RHP DAULTON JEFFERIES (1-4, 4.81) VS. RHP CHRIS PADDACK (1-2, 3.15) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have an eight-game losing streak, which marks the first time they have lost or won more than two straight games this year... have now lost 11 of the last 13 games after winning eight of the previous 12 contests...are a season-low seven games under .500 at 10-17...are in fifth place in the American League West and trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high 7 games...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, four days in fourth, one day tied for fourth, and three days in fifth...were swept by Cleveland and Tampa Bay during their last homestand, marking the first time they were swept this season.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored just one run in their last two games combined... have been held to one run or fewer in 10 of the their last 14 games...had a season-low-tying two hits Monday night (April 22 vs. Texas) and have been held to five hits or fewer eight times in the last 13 games...are now batting .170 (69-for-406) with 27 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.08 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the majors (.265; CIN, .275) and the lowest batting average in the American League (.200; KC &HOU, .218)...have the lowest OPS (.581) in the AL and are tied with Kansas City for second lowest slugging percentage (.317)...have the second most strikeouts (259) and have the fourth fewest walks (68)...have 19 home runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the Major Leauge lead in doubles (3, Rangers), are tied for second in extra base hits (3), tied for fifth in hits (4), tied for sixth in RBI (3) and rank fourth in plate appearances (28)...A's designated hitters are batting .138 (13-for-94), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have seven stolen bases in the last 10 games and are 15-for-17 (88.2%) in stolen base attempts this year, which is the fourth best percentage in the majors...A's opponents are 6-for-13 (46.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best success rate in the majors behind the Yankees (44.4%)...the six stolen bases allowed are second fewest in the Majors (Yankees, 4)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is the most in the AL and is tied for second most in the Majors.

PITCHING: Over the last 12 games, the A's have allowed six runs or more six times and three runs or fewer seven times...have a 4.30 ERA (55 er in 115.0 ip) over that span...now have a 3.79 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League...also have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.237) and have the third most wild pitches (12).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-7 with a 4.61 ERA (34 er in 66.1 ip) over the last 13 games...have walked 24 batters in 66.1 innings over that span (3.26 per nine innings) after issuing just 16 free passes in 69.0 innings over the first 14 contests (2.09 per nine innings)...are 8-12 with a 4.06 ERA for the season...the ERA is sixth highest in the AL.

THE BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 7-of-11 (63.6%) save opportunities and is seventh in the American League in saves...rank tied for second in holds (23)...has yielded just three home runs in the last 18 games (79.1 ip) and has seven for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...was charged with the loss in the first two games and the last two games of the homestand and has five for the season...has allowed no earned runs in 11 of the last 18 games, but three runs or more in the other seven contests over that stretch.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's defense has committed just one error in the last three games after committing two errors in back-to-back contests and have made one or more errors in 12 of the last 16 games (15 errors total)...have 22 errors for the season, which is tied with the White Sox for fourth most in the Majors...have turned 27 double plays, which is fifth most in the Majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a road trip during which they will play eight games in seven days against Minnesota (0-2) and Detroit (five games in four days)...went 0-6 on their second homestand of the season, against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-3)...went 4-3 on the first homestand and are 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied for the worst home record in the American League (Texas)...the homestand concluded a stretch where the A's played 13 of 15 games at home...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 6-6 on the road...will bat last in the first game of tomorrow's doubleheader at Detroit but the game will be considered a road game in the statistics...are hitting .194 (80-for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13

games at home compared to .205 (95-for-463) with 57 runs and 13 home runs in 14 games on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used 37 players, which is tied for third most in the American League to the Rays (39)...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...16 of the 37 players have been rookies after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...currently have 10 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have one player who has started games at five different positions (Brown), two who have started at four positions (McKinney, Neuse) and four at three positions (Bethancourt, Kemp, Lowrie, Vogt)... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are in the midst of a stretch during which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days from May 6-18...that includes a single-admission doubleheader tomorrow at Detroit and a day/night doubleheader on May 14 against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16...the A's are 8-1 (.889) when scoring first, which is the third best record in the American League, but are 2-16 (.111) when the opponent scores first, which is worst in the AL...are 2-7 in the first game of a series, 5-3 in the final game of a series...are 4-3 (.571) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 6-14 (.300) when they start a right-hander...are averaging 3 hours and 0 minutes per game, which is second quickest in the majors behind only Tampa Bay (2:59).

A's IN APRIL: The A's went 10-11 in the month of April and posted a losing record in the month for the second time in the last three April's (were 16-11 last year and 11-15 in 2019)...the 21 games were the A's fewest in April since 2009 when they had 19...compiled a 3.56 ERA, which was their lowest in April since 2014 (2.81)...hit .212, which was fourth lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since 2012 (.211)...had a .277 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and $\,$ second lowest in Oakland history to the 1968 A's (.276).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Irvin, Guerra, Honeywell, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have dropped games one and two of this series...won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Minnesota...have won each of the previous three season series and seven of the previous nine... are 36-19 (.632) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 314-308 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 139-177 in Minnesota...are 22-22 at Target Field...are 371-377 all-time against the Twins and have a 1018-1013 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1018 wins are the A's most against any franchise

TODAY'S TIDBITS

A.J. Puk has a 0.69 ERA (1 er, 13.0 ip) 14 strikeouts and just three walks this season...allowed his only earned run of the season on April 11 at Tampa Bay...has seven consecutive scoreless appearances...has thrown multiple innings in five of his nine outings... Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 10 games (10.0 ip)...is tied for sixth in the American League in saves (4)...*Sam Moll* has not allowed a run over his first 10 games (8.0 ip) and opponents are 2-for-25 (.080)... Sean Murphy ranks tied for eighth in the AL in extra base hits (12), is tied for 14th in doubles (7), and tied for 15th RBI (15).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1906 pitcher Chief Bender is inserted into the game in left field in the sixth inning and hits two inside the park home runs in a game against the Boston Pilgrims...in 1968, the A's first year in Oakland, Catfish Hunter tosses a perfect game and almost single handedly defeats Minnesota 4-0.. he strikes out 11 and also collects three hits while driving in three of the A's four runs...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley records his 200th career save in the A's 8-6 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-4, 4.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, which is the most among American League rookies...has lost each of his last four starts after winning his first start and his four losses are tied for most in the AL... has received one run of support or fewer in all five of his starts and has a season run support average of 1.11 (3 rs in 24.1 ip)...has allowed 11 runs in his last two starts (9.0 ip, 11.00 ERA) after yielding three runs, two earned, over his first three (1.17 ERA)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 0.00 ERA (11.0 ip) and .135 (5-for-37) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-3 with an 8.78 ERA (13 er in 13.1 ip) and .361 (22-for-61) opponents average in three starts at night.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 4-1 A's win at Philadelphia in the third game of the season...shut out the Phillies in five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...walked a season-high two...is 0-4 with a 6.05 ERA (13 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts since then...received no runs of support in back-to-back starts on April 15 at Toronto and April 20 against the Orioles and lost both starts despite allowing three runs, two earned, in 10.1 innings...struck out a career-high five batters in a career-high 6.0 innings in his outing against the Orioles...yielded five runs in 4.0 innings for the loss on April 26 at San Francisco.

LAST START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-1 loss to Tampa Bay last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 11 hits in 5.0 innings...the hits were the most by an A's pitcher since Frankie Montas allowed 11 on June 14, 2018 against Houston...tossed a career-high 90 pitches...surrendered a leadoff home run to Diaz in the first and yielded two more runs in the third on an error and an Arozarena RBI single...also allowed RBI singles to Zunino and Franco in the fourth and a RBI double to Margot in the fifth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (14.0 ip, 24 h, 16 r, 15 er, 1 bb, 14 so, 3 hr) in four appearances, including three starts...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24-for-65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)...tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a .208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 (5-for-27) with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) with a .605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, .115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a .316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings (1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors (1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18...has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA...his opponents batting average broke down to .280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS

against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers...allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA...had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning...was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were 4-5 in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake (7 h, 1 so)...had a no decision in an 8-5 loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, .323 opponents batting average and .969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's 8-3 win at Los Angeles-AL (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches...yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug. 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 2 so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10-day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept. 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (3-0, 2.22 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.22 ERA over his first five starts...the three wins are tied for fifth in the American League and his 1.35 ERA is 13th lowest among AL pitchers with 20 or more innings...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...had no devision in his last start, a 7-10 A's loss on Tuesday (4.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5, so)...has never faced the Twins...begins his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA in three games, including two starts, this spring...began the 2021 season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 7 and was on his sixth Opening Day roster...this is his ninth season in the majors with his sixth team.
- Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract on Nov. 29, 2021 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...posted a 3.68 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in a team-leading seven appearances...tied for the Cactus League lead in games pitched.

Last Year: Signed a minor league contract with Seattle on May 7 and spent the entire season at Triple-A Tacoma where he was 3-1 with a career-high five saves and a 4.37 ERA in 45 games, including one start.
