# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-18) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (8-20)

TUESDAY, MAY 10, 2022 — COMERICA PARK -- 1:10 ET GAME 1: RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (2-2, 3.44) VS. LHP TARIK SKUBAL (1-2, 3.04) GAME 2: RHP ADRIAN MARTINEZ (ML DEBUT) VS. RHP ALEX FAEDO (1-1, 3.60) NBCSCA — A'S CAST — A'S RADIO NETWORK (BLOOMBERG 960 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Minnesota in a three-game series over the weekend to start the road trip but snapped a nine-game losing streak with last night's 2-0 win...are 3-12 over the last 15 games after starting the year 8-6...are a seven games under .500 at 11-18 (.379)...that is the fourth worst record in the American League ahead of the Tigers (8-20), Red Sox (10-19) and Royals (9-17)...it matches the third worst record in Oakland history after 29 games and is the worst since the 2009 club started the year 11-18...are in fifth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and six days in fifth...trail first place Los Angeles by eight games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West prior to the 30th game of the season since the 2001 club trailed by as many as 12 games as early as game 24.

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK NO MORE: The A's snapped a nine-game losing streak last night...the streak was tied for the seventh longest losing streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since 2012 when the A's lost nine straight from May 22-June 1...over their last 10 games, the A's have been outscored 45-26...are batting .187 (60-for-321) with 10 doubles, three triples and four home runs over that span...have been held to one run or fewer five times...the pitching staff has compiled a 4.19 ERA (41 er in 88.0 ip).

LET'S PLAY TWO: The A's are scheduled to play their first of three doubleheaders this season today...have a day/night doubleheader on Saturday in Oakland against Los Angeles (AL) and another traditional twin-bill against Detroit on July 21 in Oakland...played one doubleheader last year, a sweep of Minnesota in Oakland on April 20 (7-0, 1-0)...had five doubleheaders in 2020...last played a doubleheader with both games scheduled for nine innings each on June 8, 2019 against Texas...have played just one doubleheader against the Tigers over the last 39 years, a sweep in Oakland on Aug. 22, 1998 (7-2, 7-1)...this will be the first twin-bill between the two clubs in Detroit since July 27, 1980 (lost game one 4-2, won game two 4-0)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have won four doubleheaders against the Tigers, lost one and split eight...are 3-0-3 in Detroit...have a 66-59-113 record in doubleheaders in Oakland history.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 1-6 against American League Central teams...snapped a six-game losing streak against the Central last night... the streak matched their longest such streak over the last 27 years (last: April 13-May 9, 2013)...have not lost more than six straight to the Central since a 15-game losing streak from July 5-Aug. 8, 1995...went 23-10 (.697) against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors...are 75-32 (.701) against the Central over the last five years.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost all three games at Minnesota over the weekend by one run...were outscored 7-4 by the Twins in the three-game series...are now 2-7 (.222) in one-run games...are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-5/.167)...10 of the A's 18 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox, Tigers, 11).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .176 (83-for-472) with 31 runs scored over the last 15 games (2.1 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs scored over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...are now hitting .200 for the season, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors (Diamondbacks, .194)...have the lowest on-base percentage (.263) and OPS (.579) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.316) to the Tigers (.301) and Royals (.315)...have the second most strikeouts in the American League (275), are tied for the third fewest walks (72), have the fourth fewest doubles (39) and extra base hits (64)...have homered just twice in the last eight games and have the fifth fewest home runs in the AL (20)...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the

ON THE BASES: The A's are 16-for-18 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the American League to the White Sox (15for-16, 93.8%)...are tied for sixth in the AL in steals...A's opponents are 7-for-14 (50.0%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Orioles for the second lowest success rate in the AL to the Yankees (4-for-10, 45.5%)...the seven stolen bases allowed are second fewest in the AL (Yankees, 5)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied with the Yankees for the most in the AL

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.02 ERA (63 er in 141.0 ip) over the last 16 games after logging a 3.25 ERA over the first 13 contests...now have a 3.68 ERA for the season, which is seventh highest in the American League... have the fifth highest opponents slugging percentage (.384) and batting

average (.235) and sixth highest OPS (.687)...A's starting pitchers are 9-13 with a 3.98 ERA...have the third most losses in the AL and the fifth most innings (147.0)...A's relievers have four losses and two blown saves during the current losing streak...have converted 8-of-12 (66.7%) save chances overall... have the lowest batting average (.167) and slugging percentage (.256) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.262) against first batters in the AL... have allowed 13-of-56 (23.2%) inherited runners to score, which is sixth lowest in the AL...the 56 inherited runners are second most to the Red Sox (68)... is tied for second in holds (24).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 23 errors, which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors to the Pirates and White Sox (26)...however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is sixth fewest in the AL...have turned 30 doubles plays, which is second most in the AL to the Orioles (35).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-3 on this eight-game road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (1-0 + four games)...went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 7-9 on the road...went 0-6 on the last homestand against Cleveland (0-3) and Tampa Bay (0-3), which marked the first time the A's were winless on a homestand longer than three games since Aug. 10-16, 1956 when the Kansas City A's went 0-6 against Cleveland (0-3) and Chicago (0-3)...are now 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied with the Red Sox and Rangers for the worst home record in the American League...return home following the game Thursday for a seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...are hitting .205 (80-for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .204 (108for-529) with 62 runs and 14 home runs in 16 games on the road...have a 3.81 ERA at home and a 3.56 ERA on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: Yesterday, Luis Barrera became the 39th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with the Angels for second most in the American League (Rays, 40)...Adrián Martínez, who will serve as the 27th man for today's doubleheader, would become #40...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...17 of the players have been rookies (Martínez would be #18) after using just 13 all last year...this is the first time the A's have used more than 13 rookies since 2017 when they had 20...seven of the rookies have made their Major League debuts (Martínez would be #8)...with the addition of Martínez, the A's currently have 12 rookies on the roster, including nine pitchers...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 1-3 in this stretch that began on Friday and runs through May 18 in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...have a single-admission doubleheader today at Detroit and a day/ night doubleheader on Saturday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 6-1 against the Tigers...swept a four-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Detroit...are 25-3 (.893) against the Tigers dating back to 2017, which includes 11-2 at the Coliseum and 14-1 at Comerica Park...have a six-game winning streak in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 277-249 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 124-135 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 48-29 (.623) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 945-1002 against the Tigers.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run over his first 12 games (12.0 ip)...ranks sixth in the American League in saves (5)... Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first 10 games (8.0 ip) and opponents are 2-for-25 (.080)...**Sheldon Neuse** is 15-for-57 (.263) over his last 15 games and is hitting .318 (22-for-69) over his last 18 contests...**Frankie Montas** ranks fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.245), seventh in batting average (.188), third in innings pitched (36.2), tied for sixth in strikeouts (37) and 10th in OPS (.561)... Adrián Martínez will become the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Oller, April 12).

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-2, 3.44 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Is schedued to make his American League leading seventh start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his six starts and five runs in each of his other two starts...is in his seventh season in the majors and he is on his fith Opening Day roster (2017, 19-22).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.245), seventh in batting average (.188), third in innings pitched (36.2), tied for sixth in strikeouts (37) and 10th in OPS (.561)...is average the second most pitches per game (93.2) to the Mariners Gilbert (94.5).

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has held right-handed hitters to a .179 (12-for-67) average compared to .197 (13-for-66) against left-handers...has surrendered all four of his home runs and issued six of his nine walks to lefties...has a .673 OPS against lefties, .449 against righties...three of his four home runs are solo shots...has allowed a .174 (4-for-23) average with runners in scoring position...opponents are hitting .157 (8-for-51) the first time through the order, .271 (13-for-48) the second time and .118 (4-for-34) after that...last year, opponents hit .190 the first time through the order, .273 the second time and .224 after that...opponents are 6-for-71 (.085) with two strikes, including 0-for-12 on an 0-2 count...had a .164 opponents average with two strikes last year and has a .158 career average in that situation.

*THE THIRD INNING*: Has allowed eight of his 15 runs in the third inning for a 12.00 ERA (8 er in 6.0 ip)...has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) over innings 1-2 and a 1.93 ERA (4 er in 18.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...last year, he allowed 20 of his 79 runs in the third inning for a 5.68 ERA, .316 opponents batting average and .854 OPS...had a 2.53 ERA, .182 average and .586 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.15 ERA, .232 opponents average and .647 OPS from the fourth inning on.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second career Opening Day start on April 8 at Philadelphia and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss...his other Opening Day start came in 2020 and he is now 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 r, 4 bb, 11 so) in two openers...the loss was his first since Aug. 16, 2021 as he finished the 2021 season with a four-game winning streak...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high five hits in 5.0 innings...then won consecutive starts on April 13 at Tampa Bay and April 18 against Baltimore... struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on April 23 against Texas but took the loss in a 2-0 decision...it was his first start over 7.0 innings since June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay when he pitched 8.0 innings and it snapped an Athletics record streak of 47 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer...did not allow a hit until K. Calhoun singled in the fifth and had a one-hit shutout entering the eighth inning...retired the first batter before allowing back-to-back singles to Garcia and W. Calhoun...was relieved by Acevedo, who allowed both runs to score...Perez and three Texas relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits...had a no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Cleveland in Oakland on April 29...struck out Franmil Reyes to end the fifth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high four batters and matched his highs in runs (5) and home runs (2)...left with a 6-5 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...finished April 2-2 with a 4.25 ERA but held the opposition to a .194 batting average...tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (31) and had the sixth lowest opponents batting average.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-0 loss to Tampa Bay last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hitters while walking one...logged a season-high 103 pitches...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...Kluber and three Rays relievers combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base...then picked up the win in an 8-6 A's victory at Detroit on Sept. 2...blanked the Tigers on a walk and a triple over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings... had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Castro in the fifth... yielded a two-run home run to Baddoo in the seventh and was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the sixth innings and the A's leading 8-3.

*SPRING TRAINING RECAP:* Made just two starts in Cactus League games this spring and was 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (5.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...opponents went 10-for-25 (.400)...the outings came on March 22 at Kansas City and March 27 against Seattle.

2021 RECAP: Went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts...the strikeouts were second best in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...they were was 10th best in Athletics history and second by an A's right-hander to Jack Coombs, who had 224 in 1910...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and the ninth in Athletics history (14 times) to fan 200 or more in a season...his average of 9.96 strikeouts per nine innings was the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74, also last year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...his 32 starts doubled his previous career high of 16 in 2019 and his 187.0 innings pitched nearly doubled his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...had career highs in every category...had his second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and onbase percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282)...tied for the American League lead in games started, ranked third in opponents slugging percentage (.372) and innings pitched (187.0), fourth in ERA, opponents OPS (.723), strikeouts and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.08), tied for fifth in wins, seventh in batting average (.232), on-base percentage (.294) and winning percentage (.591) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.63)...also ranked third in pitches (3,028) and tied for fourth in wild pitches (11)...led the A's in wins, ERA, strikeouts and innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...finished sixth in AL Cy Young balloting and received 11 votes (2 third, 6 fourth, 3 fifth)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-2 with a 2.17 ERA, .199 opponents average, .575 OPS and six home runs in 87.0 innings and 14 starts after the break.. had the lowest opponents OPS, slugging percentage (.303) and batting average after the break in the AL, ranked second in ERA, third in strikeouts (102) and fourth in on-base percentage (.272)...the strikeouts were fourth most in Oakland history after the break...his opponents batting average broke down to .225 (78-for-346) with a .665 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .238 (86for-361) with a .667 OPS against right-handers...held the opponent's number three hitter to a .171 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the majors...was 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 3.91 ERA in 21 starts at night...his day ERA was third lowest in the American Leagu...had seven starts of 7.0 innings and was 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA and .130 opponents average in those starts...has 506 career strikeouts in 484.2 innings, an average of 9.40 per nine innings...had four games of 10 or more strikeouts last year, which tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Zach Logue (1-1, 2.84 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third appearance and second start of the season...was added to the roster as a substitute player on April 15 and made his Major League debut in relief on April 19 against Baltimore and picked up the win in the A's 2-1 victory (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so)... was returned to Triple-A Las Vegas on April 20 but was recalled last Friday to start at Minnesota...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 et, 2 bb, 5 so)...was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts with Las Vegas...was one of four players acquired from Toronto on March 16 for Matt Chapman...began the 2021 season at Double-A New Hampshire and was 3-1 with a 4.54 ERA in seven starts when he was promoted to Triple-A Buffalo on June 12...went 9-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with the Bisons and combined for a 12-4 record and a 3.67 ERA in 25 appearances overall.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Adrian Martinez (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today as the 27th man for the doubleheader and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 18th rookie to play for the A's this year and the eighth to make his ML debut...was acquired from the San Diego Padres on April 3 with minor league infielder Euribiel Angeles for pitcher Sean Manaea and minor league pitcher Aaron Holiday...will become the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Oller, April 12)...the last to win was Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...the last to strike out 10 or more batters was Aaron Harang on May 25, 2002 against Tampa Bay...the last to toss at least seven innings was Rich Harden on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 53 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 15-18 record and a 4.15 ERA.
