# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-19) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (9-21) 

WEDNESDAY, MAY 11, 2022 - COMERICA PARK - 7:10 ET

ABOUTTHE A'S: Split a doubleheader yesterday and have won two of the first three from Detroit after losing nine straight... are 4-13 over the last 17 games after starting the year 8-6...are 12-19 (.387) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League and tied for third worst in Oakland history after 31 games...it is the worst since the 2015 club was also 12-19...the seven games under 500 are one short of the season low of eight....are 0-4-1 over the previous five series and have not won a series since taking three of four from Baltimore, April 18-21....are in fifth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and seven days in fifth...trail first place Los Angeles by a season-high $81 / 2$ games, which is the A's largest deficit in the West prior to the 32 nd game of the season since the 2001 club trailed by as many as 12 games as early as game 24 ...had a season-long nine-game losing streak snapped on Monday...the losing streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history and was the longest since 2012 when the A's lost nine straight from May 22-June 1.

PLAYER NOTES: Yesterday, Adrián Martínez became the 40th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with the Rays for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...Martinez is the 18th rookie, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...Martinez is the eighth of those rookies to make his Major League debut...the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers... Martínez is the A's eighth pitcher to start a game, which is tied for third most in the AL...employed just nine starting pitchers in each of the previous two seasons... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the fifth time this year in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors... have been held to one run or fewer in 10 of the 31 games and have 102 runs scored for the season ( 3.3 per game), which is tied for third fewest in the American League...are batting . 177 ( 94 -for-532) with 36 runs over the last 17 games ( 2.1 runs per game) after hitting . 226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests ( 4.7 per game)...are hitting 200 for the season, which is the lowest batting average in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (.201)...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.263) and OPS (.574) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.312)... have the most strikeouts in the AL (294) and the fourth fewest walks (77) and extra base hits (67)...have homered just once in the last seven games and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs in the AL (20)...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high three bases in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday and are now 19-for-23 (86.4\%) in stolen bases attempts... have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League (White Sox, $94.4 \%$ ) and are tied for third in stolen bases...A's opponents are 7 -for-14 ( $50.0 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Orioles and Yankees for the lowest success rate in the AL...the seventh stolen bases allowed are second fewest to the Yankees (6)...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied with the Yankees for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.55 ERA ( 17 er in 60.0 ip) over the last seven games...have the fifth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.238) and the fifth fewest strikeouts (240)...A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in three of the last seven games and are 2-4 with a 2.41 ERA ( 11 er in 41.0 ip ) over that span....are $10-14$ with a 3.91 ERA for the season.... have the second most losses in the AL but are tied for third in wins... rank fourth in innings pitched (158.2).
THE BULLPEN: A's relievers are $0-4$ with a save and two blown saves over the last 12 games...are 8 -for- 12 ( $66.7 \%$ ) in save opportunities overall and are tied for fifth in the American League in saves...have the lowest batting average (.179) and slugging percentage (.263) against first batters in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.269)... have allowed 14 -of- 58 (24.1\%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth lowest in the AL...the 58 inherited runners are second most to the Red Sox (68)...rank second in the AL in holds (26).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors over the last eight games after making 16 miscues over the previous 14 contests... have 23 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League to the White Sox (26)...however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is fifth fewest in the AL... have turned 32 doubles plays, which is second most in the AL to the Orioles (38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this eight-game road trip to Minnesota $(0-3)$ and Detroit ( $2-1$ )....although the A's hit last in game one yesterday, the game is still considered as an away game for Oakland....went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 8-10 (.444) on the road...went 0-6 on the last homestand against Cleveland ( $0-3$ ) and Tampa Bay ( $0-3$ ), which marked the first time the A's were winless on a homestand longer than three games since Aug. 10-16, 1956 when the Kansas City A's went 0-6 against Cleveland $(0-3)$ and Chicago ( $0-3$ )...are now 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied with the Red Sox for the worst home record in the American League...return home following the game tomorrow for a seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...are hitting . 194 (80-for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .204 (120-for-589) with 66 runs and 14 home runs in 18 games on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost all three games at Minnesota last weekend by one run and are now 2-7 (.222) in one-run games....are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-5/.167)... 10 of the A's 19 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox and Tigers, 11).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 2-7 against American League Central teams...went 23-10 (.697) against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors...are 76-33 (.697) against the Central over the last five years.

LET'S PLAY FIVE: The A's and Tigers are scheduled to play a five-game series.. this will be the 18th series of five or more games in Oakland history, the second in the last 26 years...the last was Sept. 7-10, 2020 when the A's won four of five from Houston in Oakland...the last time the A's and Tigers played a five-game series was Sept. 4-6, 1967 when the Kansas City A's lost four of five at Detroit in a series that featured two doubleheaders.

15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 2-4 in this stretch that began last Friday and runs through May 18 in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days....had a single-admission doubleheader yesterday and are scheduled for a day/night doubleheader on Saturday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland... in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series, 2-1...won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 6-1 against the Tigers... swept a four-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Detroit....are 26-4 (.867) against the Tigers dating back to 2017, which includes 11-2 at the Coliseum and 15-2 at Comerica Park...have a six-game winning streak in Oakland....since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 278-250 against the Tigers....that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 125-136 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas....are 49-30 (.620) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 946-1003 against the Tigers.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in his first 12 appearances and his 12.0 innings pitched are the most among American League relievers with no earned runs...leads AL rookies and is tied for sixth among among all AL pitchers in saves (5)...Jed Lowrie is batting . 433 (39-for-90) with a .471 on-base percentage and a .767 slugging percentage (1.237 OPS) in 24 games at Comerica Park...overall is batting .339 ( 61 -for-180) with a .393 on-base percentage and a .550 slugging percentage (. 943 OPS) in 50 career games against the Tigers...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first 10 games ( 8.0 ip ) and opponents are 2-for-25 (.080).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1904 Rube Waddell tosses a complete game and Danny Murphy goes 5 -for-6 in the A's 6-5, 12-inning win over Chicago...in 2012 Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931...in 2014 Derek Norris hits two three-run home runs on a 3-0 count in consecutive innings in the A's 9-1 win over Washington.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Logue (1-1, 2.84 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third appearance and second start of the season and his career...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was added to Oakland's roster as a substitute player on April 15... picked up the win in relief in his Major League debut on April 19 against Baltimore and was returned to the Aviators the next day...was recalled last Friday and made his first start that day at Minnesota.

FIRST APPEARANCE: Made his Major League debut on April 19 in Oakland against Baltimore and earned the win with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 2-1 victory...became the 17th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his ML debut, the first since Jharel Cotton on Sept. 7, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL)...relieved Irvin to start the sixth inning with Oakland trailing 1-0...struck out the first batter he faced (Ramon Urias) and retired the side in order in the sixth...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Castellani with one out and runners on first and second in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 2-1 A's loss at Minnesota last Friday...surrendered a lead off home run to Miranda in the second and a leadoff home run to Buxton in the fifth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work and he was relieved by Puk to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.


LOGUE vs. DETROIT: Is scheduled to make his first career appearance and start.


WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 0-0 with a 5.63 ERA and .318 opponents batting average in four starts, all at home....walked eight batters in 16.0 innings for a .400 on-base percentage...surrendered five home runs and had a .621 opponents slugging percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to 286 (4-for-14) against left-handed hitters and .327 (17-for-52) against right-handers...surrendered all nine of his extra base hits (three doubles, one triple, five home runs) and issued six of his eight walks to righties... had a 1.118 OPS against righties, .661 against lefties...all five of his home runs allowed were solo shots...logged 2.2 innings and 48 pitches in his first start and 4.0 innings and 64 pitches in his second start before joining the A's bullpen on April 15... then tossed 4.0 innings and 75 pitches in his third start and 5.1 innings and 87 pitches in his fourth start before joining the A's rotation on May 6.

righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs with the bases empty...opponents hit .313 with runners in scoring position...had a 213 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .240 the second time and .313 after that...held the opponents clean-up hitter to a 180 batting average... had a .130 opponents batting average with two strikeouts but allowed eight home runs.

THIS AND THAT: Combined for a 1.84 ERA in the first and second inning.....had a 4.86 ERA from the third inning on...was $0-2$ with a 6.32 ERA in four starts on four days rest or less, 10-2 with a 3.70 ERA in 19 games on five days rest or more.... his teams were 16-8 (.667) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 25 appearances.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Struck out a career-high 12 batters in 6.0 innings in the first game of a May 29 doubleheader at Somerset...it was his second career game of 10 or more strikeouts (Aug. 13, 2018 for Dunedin vs. Jupiter)...went $3-0$ with a 2.96 ERA and . 188 opponents batting average in five starts in May... struck out 39 batters in 27.1 innings and walked just three...was charged with his first loss of the season in his sixth start on June 4 against Bingham ton...issued a season-high four walks and yielded three runs in 4.1 innings in an 11-4 loss...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings on June 11 at Portland but had a no decision....also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...it would be his final Double-A start as he was moved up to Buffalo the next day...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first start with the Bisons on June 18 at Rochester...allowed just one hit and did not walk a batter while striking out eight in a $5-0$ win... earned Triple-A East Pitcher of the Week honors for his effort...then went 2-2 with a 4.99 ERA over his next seven games from June 25 to Aug. 1...threw a season-high 97 pitches in 5.0 innings on July 22 against Syracuse...made his one relief appearance on July 28 at Worcester and picked up the win after logging 4.0 scoreless and hitless innings ( $1 \mathrm{bb}, 8$ so)...won three consecutive starts from Aug. 7-20... had a 1.65 ERA during the streak, which included 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 13 against Rochester...yielded a season-high tying six runs and hit a career-high three batters in an 8-5 loss to Worcester on Aug. 26...then went $3-0$ with a 2.08 ERA over his final six starts...struck out 37 and walked just four in 30.1 innings.

CAREER: Was the ninth round selection of the Blue Jays in 2017 and went $32-16$ with a 3.43 ERA in 84 games, including 73 starts, in four seasons in the Toronto farm system....was traded to the A's on March 16, 2022 with Gunnar Hoglund, Kevin Smith and Kirby Snead in exchange for Matt Chapman...tied for third among all minor league pitchers with 12 wins in 2021...was named an MiLB.com Organizational All-Star after the 2018 and 2021 seasons...was named to the Eastern League Midseason All-Star team in 2019.

RHP James Kaprielian (0-2, 5.87 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season...began the season on the 10-day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA ( $13.2 \mathrm{ip}, 15 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 11 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}, 13 \mathrm{so}, 3$ hr ) on a three-start rehab assignment with Low-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 1-0 A's loss at Minnesota on Saturday ( $5.2 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 7 \mathrm{so}$ )...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Tigers, a start in the A's 8-6 loss at Detroit last year on Sept. 1 (4.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, $4 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4$ so)...was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas last year but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign

- Has pitched on one day of rest in 11 of his 15 appearances.
- His outing in game two yesterday was his first career appearance against the Tigers.
Last Year: Made his ML debut and compiled a 3.27 ERA and . 225 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over two stints with the A's... was also 2-0 with nine saves, a 2.48 ERA and . 186 opponent average in 30 relief appearances with Las Vegas.

- Has allowed a . 138 (4-for-29) average against right-handed hitters compared to 250 (4-for-16) against left-handers.
