# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-19) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (9-22)

ABOUTTHE A'S: Split a doubleheader Tuesday and have won three of the first four from Detroit after losing nine straight....are 5-13 over the last 18 games after starting the year 8-6...are 13-19 (.406) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League and the fifth worst in Oakland history after 32 games...it is the worst since the 2015 club was 12-20...the seven games under 500 are two short of the season low of eight....are 1-4-1 over the previous five series and, with last night's win, secured their first winning series since taking three of four from Baltimore, April 18-21....are in fifth place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and eight days in fifth...trail first place Los Angeles by $71 / 2$ games... had a season-long ninegame losing streak snapped on Monday...the losing streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history and was the longest since 2012 when the A's lost nine straight from May 22-June 1.
PLAYER NOTES: Tuesday, Adrián Martínez became the 40th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, which is tied with the Rays for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...employed 50 players all last year and 38 in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season...Martínez is the 18th rookie, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...Martínez is the eighth of those rookies to make his Major League debut...the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers... Martínez is the A's eighth pitcher to start a game, which is tied for third most in the AL...employed just nine starting pitchers in each of the previous two seasons... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out for the fifth time this year in the first game of the doubleheader Tuesday, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors... have been held to one run or fewer in 10 of the 32 games and have 111 runs scored for the season ( 3.5 per game), which is sixth fewest in the ma....are batting .177 ( 105 -for-566) with 45 runs over the last 18 games ( 2.5 runs per game) after hitting 226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests (4.7 per game)...are hitting . 204 for the season, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (.199)...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.268) and OPS (.584) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.316)...have the second most strikeouts in the majors (299) to the Angels (303) and are tied for the fourth fewest walks (84) and extra base hits (70)... have homered just once in the last eight games and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs in the majors (20)...however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season-high three bases in the second game of the doubleheader Tuesday and are now 20 -for- 24 ( $83.3 \%$ ) in stolen bases attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League (White Sox, 94.4\%) and are tied for third in stolen bases...A's opponents are 7 -for-14 ( $50.0 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is tied with the Orioles for the lowest success rate in the AL...the seven stolen bases allowed are tied for fewest with the Yankees....'s pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied with the Rays and Yankees for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's shut out their opponent for the fourth time this year, which is tied for fifth most in the majors...they have compiled a 2.21 ERA (17 er in 69.0 ip) over the last eight games... have the fifth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.237) and the sixth fewest strikeouts (247)...A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last eight games and are 3-4 with a 2.06 ERA ( 11 er in 48.0 ip ) over that span... are 11-14 with a 3.75 ERA ( 69 er in 165.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the AL but rank third in wins...rank third in innings pitched (165.2).

THE BULLPEN: A's relievers are $0-4$ with a save and two blown saves over the last 13 games....are 8 -for-12 (66.7\%) in save opportunities overall and are tied for sixth in the American League in saves...have the lowest batting average (.186) and slugging percentage (.268) against first batters in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.273)...have allowed 14-of-58 (24.1\%) inherited runners to score, which is fifth lowest in the AL...the 58 inherited runners are tied with the Orioles for third most to the Red Sox (69) and Yankees (60)... rank second in the AL in holds (26).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors over the last nine games after making 16 miscues over the previous 14 contests... have 23 er-
rors for the season, which is tied with the Orioles for second most in the American League to the White Sox (26)....however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL....have turned 33 double plays, which is second most in the AL to the Orioles (38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this eight-game road trip to Minnesota ( $0-3$ ) and Detroit ( $3-1$ )....although the A's hit last in game one Tuesday, the game is still considered as an away game for Oakland....went 1-1 on the last road trip to San Francisco and are 8-10 (.444) on the road....went 0-6 on the last homestand against Cleveland $(0-3)$ and Tampa Bay $(0-3)$, which marked the first time the A's were winless on a homestand longer than three games since Aug. 10-16, 1956 when the Kansas City A's went 0-6 against Cleveland (0-3) and Chicago ( $0-3$ )...are now 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied with the Red Sox for the worst home record in the American League...return home following the game tomorrow for a seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (four games) and Minnesota (three games)...are hitting . 194 ( $80-$ for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to .204 (131-for-623) with 75 runs and 14 home runs in 19 games on the road.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost all three games at Minnesota last weekend by one run and are now 2-7 (.222) in one-run games....are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-5/.167)... 10 of the A's 19 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox, 12; Tigers, 11).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 3-7 against American League Central teams....went 23-10 (.697) against the AL Central last year, which was the best record in the majors....are 77-33 (.700) against the Central over the last five years.

LET'S PLAY FIVE: The A's and Tigers are scheduled to play a five-game series.. this will be the 18th series of five or more games in Oakland history, the second in the last 26 years...the last was Sept. 7-10, 2020 when the A's won four of five from Houston in Oakland...the last time the A's and Tigers played a five-game series was Sept. 4-6, 1967 when the Kansas City A's lost four of five at Detroit in a series that featured two doubleheaders.

15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 3-4 in this stretch that began last Friday and runs through May 18 in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days....had a single-admission doubleheader Tuesday and are scheduled for a day/night doubleheader on Saturday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. 4-16.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.
A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series, $3-1 \ldots$ won the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 6-1 against the Tigers.. swept a four-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Detroit....are 27-4 (.871) against the Tigers dating back to 2017, which includes 11-2 at the Coliseum and 16-2 at Comerica Park....have a six-game winning streak in Oakland....since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 279-250 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 126-136 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 50-30 (.625) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 947-1003 against the Tigers.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in his first 12 appearances and his 12.0 innings pitched are the second most among American League relievers with no earned runs...leads AL rookies and is tied for sixth among among all AL pitchers in saves (5)...Jed Lowrie is batting . 433 (39-for-90) with a .471 on-base percentage and a .767 slugging percentage (1.237 OPS) in 24 games at Comerica Park...overall is batting . 339 ( 61 -for-180) with a .393 on-base percentage and a .550 slugging percentage (. 943 OPS) in 50 career games against the Tigers...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first 11 games ( 9.0 ip ) and opponents are 2 -for-28 (.071)...Kevin Smith is tied for second among Major League third basemen with five defensive runs saved...Christian Bethancourt is 8 -for- 25 (.320) over his last nine games and is hitting. 245 ( 13 -for- 53 ) with five doubles overall.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season...began the season on the 10 -day IL with an inflamed right AC joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.
REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA ( $13.2 \mathrm{ip}, 15 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 11 \mathrm{er}, 5$ $\mathrm{bb}, 13 \mathrm{so}, 3 \mathrm{hr}$ ) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third....made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, $3 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 6$ so, 2 hr )...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas... had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 ( $4.2 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 4 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{er}$, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 5 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma ( $4.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{so}$ ).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career... walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning...was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Minnesota last Saturday...blanked the Twins on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth...then allowed a home run to Polanco for the only run of the game...was relieved by Jackson following the homer and finished with 5.2 innings...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

KAPRIELIAN vs. DETROIT: Had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 8-6 loss at Detroit last
 year on Sept. 1...Oakland scored in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Castro in the second...the A's scored twice in the fourth but he allowed a two-run home run to Cabrera in the bottom of the fourth...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to give him a 6-3 lead but he allowed a leadoff home run to Baddoo in the bottom of the fifth and was relieved by Petit with no outs in the fifth and the A's leading 6-4.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went $5-3$ with a 2.65 ERA, .202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20...then posted a 3-2 record with a 5.96 ERA, .271 opponents average and .825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to . 201 (46-for-229) with a . 602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (59-for-222) with a . 860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-handers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a . 189 opponents batting average and . 569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a . 907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that....yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a . 083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit . 107 when putting his
curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was $8-5$ with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18...had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and . 890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 -for- 2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was $5-3$ with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, $3-2$ with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a $4-3$ record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night...was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts.. logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

DAY BY DAY: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start....was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, $2 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 5$ so, $0 \mathrm{hr}, 76$ pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and . 182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Texas).. tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2... walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break. struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27 ...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled of Chris Paddack in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his first three starts following his return...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 in nings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strike out a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but picked up the win on Aug. 20 against San Francisco... allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings on Aug. 26 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss...that began a four-start stretch where he went 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA and .324 opponents batting average...allowed a career-high tying eight hits in a season-low tying 3.2 innings in a $4-3$ loss to Texas on Sept. 12 in Oakland...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits in a 3-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept 18...that would be his final start of the season as it brought his season innings pitched total, including Las Vegas, to 116.0...had just 101.0 innings as a professional entering the season...pitched in relief in each of his final three appearances and allowed at least two runs in all three appearances (7.88 ERA)...tossed 2.0 innings in his first relief appearance on Sept. 23 vs. Seattle, which was his shortest outing of the season.
