# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-19) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (21-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won four of five at Detroit to snap a season-high nine-game losing streak....won each of the final three games, which is the A's longest winning streak of the season...the series win at Detroit was the A's first since taking three of four from Baltimore, Apri 18-21...had gone 0-4-1 over the previous five series...are 6-13 over the last 19 games after starting the year 8-6...are 14-19 (.424) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and nine days in fifth...trail first place Houston by $71 / 2$ games, which is one short of the season high of $81 / 2$ on May 9 and 10 .
HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand against Los Ange-les-AL (four games) and Minnesota (three games) tonight...went 0-6 on the last homestand against Cleveland ( $0-3$ ) and Tampa Bay ( $0-3$ ), which marked the first time the A's were winless on a homestand longer than three games since Aug. 10-16, 1956 when the Kansas City A's went 0-6 against Cleveland $(0-3)$ and Chicago ( $0-3$ )....are now 4-9 (.308) at home, which is tied with the Red Sox for the worst home record in the American League....went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota ( $0-3$ ) and Detroit (4-1) and are now 10-10 (.500) on the road...are hitting . 194 ( 80 -for-412) with 36 runs and six home runs in 13 games at home compared to 208 ( 136 -for- 654 ) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road.
15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 4-4 in this stretch that began a week ago today and runs through next Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that includes a stretch of seven games in five days from Tuesday through tomorrow...had a single-admission doubleheader in Detroit on Tuesday and will play the Angels twice tomorrow...tomorrow is not officially a doubleheader since there are separate admissions...it will be the ninth "day/night doubleheader" in Oakland history, the second at the Coliseum...the other was on April 2, 2014 against Cleveland (won 6-1 in the day game, lost 6-4 in the night game)...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13 -day stretch from Sept. 4-16, including seven games in five days several times during that span.
AGAINST THE WEST: The A's will face an American League West opponent for just the second time this year with this four-game series against the Angels...lost two of three to Texas, April 22-24, and the A's three intradivision games are the fewest in the majors....beginning with this series, the A's will play 17 of their next 20 games against the AL West, with two series against the Angels and one against each of the other teams.
FRIDAY THE 13th: Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have a 20-27 record on Friday the 13th...the last such game was on Aug, 13, 2021, an 8-6 loss at Texas...the last Friday the 13th game in the Coliseum was a 7-0 loss to the Yankees on June 13, 2014...are 2-1 against the Angels on Friday the 13th with the last game coming on April 13, 1984, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland.
OFFENSE: The A's have scored 18 runs in the last three games after tallying 18 runs over the previous 10 contests...are batting . 184 ( 110 -for-597) with 50 runs over the last 19 games ( 2.6 runs per game) after hitting .226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests ( 4.7 per game)...are hitting . 203 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors to the Diamondbacks... have the lowest on-base percentage (.268) and OPS (.582) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.314)...lead the majors in strikeouts (304) and have the fourth fewest extra base hits (71)...have been held to one run or fewer 10 times, including five shutouts, which is tied with the Mariners and Twins for the most in the majors
THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered twice in the last nine games... have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 19 games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 25 -June 29, 2011 when they had a 32game streak....have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep... have 21 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League and the majors... however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five stolen bases in the last three games and are now 21 -for- $26(80.8 \%)$ in stolen bases attempts...are tied for second in the American League in stolen bases and rank third in stolen base percentage... A's opponents are 7 -for-14 ( $50.0 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...the seven stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors....'s pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Yankees, 5).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 2.22 ERA ( 17 er in 69.0 ip) in eight games on the last road trip and now have a 3.53 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League... have two shutouts in the last five games and four for the season, which is tied for third most in the AL... have allowed just one home run in the last six games and 27 for the season, which is fourth fewest...have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.236) and the fifth fewest strikeouts (250).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last nine games and are 3-4 with a 2.21 ERA ( 13 er in 53.0 ip ) over that span....are 11-14 with a 3.74 ERA for the season....are tied for the second most losses in the AL but rank third in wins....are also third in innings pitched (170.2).

THE BULLPEN: A's relievers are 1-4 with two saves and three blown saves over the last 14 games...overall, are tied fourth in the American League in saves (9) and blown saves (5)...have the lowest batting average (.190) against first batters in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.274) and slugging percentage (.290)...have allowed 14-of-58 (24.1\%) inherited runners to score and the 58 inherited runners are fourth most in the AL....are tied for second in the AL in holds (26).
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high five-game errorless streak... have made just two errors over the last 10 games after committing 16 over the previous 14 contests... have 23 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest... have turned 34 doubles plays, which is second most to the Orioles (41).
one-run games and other close calls: The A's lost all three games at Minnesota last weekend by one run and are now 2-7 (.222) in one-run games....are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-5/.167)... 10 of the A's 19 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox and Tigers, 12)...have just one come-from-behind win this year and it came on April 19 against Baltimore...trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the sixth and won 2-1.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors.... have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008... eight of of the rookies have made their Major League debut...the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers.
A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and there most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most...compiled a 2.01 ERA, which was the A's lowest against the Angels since 1971 (1.97)...outscored the Angels $86-46 \ldots$... have won four straight and 11 of the last 12 games and are 34-14 (.708) against the Angels over the previous three years...have a five-game winning streak in the Coliseum, which matches the A's longest home winning streak against the Angels over the last 30 years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 471-390 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 224-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 520-467 against the Angels.

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in his first 13 appearances and his 13.0 innings pitched are the most among American League relievers with no earned runs...leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among among all AL pitchers in saves (6)...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first 11 games ( 9.0 ip ) and opponents are 2-for-28 (.071).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daulton Jefferies (1-5, 5.22 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, which is the most among American League rookies...has allowed 15 runs in his last three starts ( $14.0 \mathrm{ip}, 9.64$ ERA) after yielding three runs, two earned, over his first three (1.17 ERA)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Picked up the win in his first start this year but has taken the loss in each of his five starts since then, which is the longest losing streak of his career and is tied for the longest in the majors this year... is the first A's pitcher to lose five consecutive starts since Kendall Graveman (April 3-25, 2018)...the last A's pitcher to lose six consecutive starts is Vin Mazzaro (June 23-July 23, 2009)...Jefferies has a 6.29 ERA (17 er in 24.1 ip ) and .311 (32-for-103) opponents batting average during his current losing streak... his five losses this year are tied for the most in the American League.
THIS AND THAT: Received three runs of support in his last start after receiving three runs of support total over his first five starts...now has six runs of support in his six starts ( $29.1 \mathrm{ip}, 1.84$ RSA)....has not walked a batter in three of his six starts and has issued just five free passes in 29.1 innings this year (1.53 per nine innings)...is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) and . 207 (12-for-58) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-3 with an 8.78 ERA (13 er in 13.1 ip ) and . 361 (22-for-61) opponents average in three starts at night.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 4-1 A's win at Philadelphia in the third game of the season...shut out the Phillies in five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...walked a season-high two...is 0-5 with a 6.29 ERA (17 er in 24.1 ip ) in five starts since then...received no runs of support in back-to-back starts on April 15 at Toronto and April 20 against the Orioles and lost both starts despite allowing three runs, two earned, in 10.1 innings...struck out a career-high five batters in a career-high 6.0 innings in his outing against the Orioles...yielded five runs in 4.0 innings for the loss on April 26 at San Francisco...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 11 hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Tampa Bay on May 2...the hits were the most by an A's pitcher since Frankie Montas allowed 11 on June 14, 2018 against Houston...tossed a career-high 90 pitches.
LAST START: He lost his fifth consecutive start in the A's 4-3 loss at Minnesota last Sunday...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed an Urshela sacrifice fly in the second...the A's scored twice in the third to take a 3-2 lead but he yielded three runs in the bottom of the third on a Miranda RBI double and a Polanco two-run single...was relieved by Grimm to start the sixth with the A's trailing 4-3.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (14.0 ip, $24 \mathrm{~h}, 16 \mathrm{r}, 15 \mathrm{er}$, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 14 \mathrm{so}, 3 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in four appearances, including three starts...walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24 -for-65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)...tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a . 208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 (5-for-27) with a . 661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to 231 (6-for-26) with a .605 OPS against left-handers...had a 296 opponents average with the bases empty, . 115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts....also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a . 316 opponents on-base percent age as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings ( 1.29 per nine innings).. has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors (1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18...has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22 ... based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA...his opponents batting average broke down to 280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers...allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA...had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning....was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were $4-5$ in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.
2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the season on the Las Vegas injured list with right biceps tendinitis...was reinstated May 21 and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his Triple-A debut on May 24 against Salt Lake ( $7 \mathrm{~h}, 1$ so)...had a no decision in an 8-5 loss...logged 4.1 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his second start on May 29 against Sacramento...was 1-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .225 opponents batting average over his first four starts through June 8...then allowed a career-high seven runs and issued a career-high three walks on June 14 against Reno but had a no decision in a 21-16 Aviators loss...surrendered three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...that began a four-start stretch where he went 1-1 with a 12.33 ERA and .408 opponents batting average...tossed a season-low 2.0 innings June 26 at Salt Lake...went 2-0 in five starts in June but had a 7.25 ERA, . 323 opponents batting average and . 969 OPS...struck out a career-high nine batters in 4.1 innings on July 3 against Sacramento but was charged with his only loss of the season...then went 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA over his next four starts before his first promotion to Oakland...allowed just one run in a career-high 7.0 innings on July 15 to defeat El Paso 5-1...matched his career high with nine strikeouts on July 20 against El Paso...allowed four runs on 10 hits in 5.0 innings July 26 against Salt Lake and was promoted to Oakland on Aug. 1...picked up his first Major League win that day in a start in the A's 8-3 win at Los Angeles-AL (5.0 ip, 3 h , $3 \mathrm{r}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}$ ) but that would be his only outing before he was optioned back to Las Vegas Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 4.00 ERA over his final three starts with the Aviators...logged 6.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 15 against Tacoma and tossed a career-high 96 pitches...yielded a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high 12 hits in 6.0 innings in his final start with Las Vegas on Aug 20 against Albuquerque but had a no decision in a 12-7 win...was recalled by Oakland on Aug. 27 and compiled a 2.70 ERA and . 222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances, all in A's losses...pitched in relief for the first time in the majors on Sept. 1 at Detroit (1.0 ip, $2 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 2$ so)...it would be his shortest outing as a reliever as he logged 2.1 scoreless innings Sept. 4 at Toronto, 3.1 innings Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (AL) and 3.1 scoreless innings Sept. 12 vs. Texas...was placed on the 10-day injured list Sept. 18 retroactive to Sept 15 with right elbow ulnar neuritis and missed the remainder of the season

Day Game - RHP Paul Blackburn (4-0, 1.74 ERA): Has not allowed a run in three of his seven starts and has yielded three runs or fewer in all six starts... is tied for the Major League lead in wins and his 1.74 ERA is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's win at Detroit last Monday ( $6.2 \mathrm{ip}, 4 \mathrm{~h}, 3$ so)...combined with Ryan Dull, Santiago Casilla and Blake Treinen on a six-hit shutout in his only career appearance against the Angels, a start in the A's 5-0 win at Anaheim on Aug. 5, 2017 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 so).
Night Game - RHP Adam Oller (0-2, 11.17 ERA): Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 0-2 with an 11.17 ERA in three starts in his ML debut before he was optioned to Las Vegas April 22...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Aviators...the win came in his last start last Sunday at Sacramento ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 6 \mathrm{so}$ ).
