# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-20) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (22-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped last night....have won four of the last six games after a season-high ninegame losing streak....are 6-14 over the last 20 games after starting the year 8-6...are 14-20 (.412) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, one day tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by $81 / 2$ games, which matches the A's largest deficit of the season (May 10)...won four of five at Detroit to start the week, which was the A's first series win since taking three of four from Baltimore, Apri 18-21...had gone 0-4-1 over the previous five series.
SHUT OUT: The A's were shut out for the sixth time this year last night, which is the most in the majors...it matches the most in Athletics history over the first 34 games of the season (eight times, last: 2005)...were blanked just seven times all last year...A's pitchers have four shutouts and this is the first time in Athletics history the A's have either been shut out or shut out their opponent 10 times in the first 34 games.
HOME AND AWAY: The A's extended their home losing streak to seven games last night, which matches the ninth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since an eight-game streak from June 19-July 3, 2017....are 0-1 on this seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Minnesota (three games) and are now 4-10 (.286) at home for the season...that is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors....went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota ( $0-3$ ) and Detroit (4-1) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road...are hitting 187 (82-for-439) with 36 runs and six home runs in 14 games at home compared to 208 (136-for-654) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors, the fewest runs scored and the second fewest home runs.

DAY/NIGHT "DOUBLEHEADERS": Today is the ninth day/night "doubleheader" in Oakland history, the first since Juine 8, 2019 at Texas (lost 5-10 and 1-3)...it is the second in the Coliseum with the other coming on April 2, 2014 against Cleveland (won 6-1 in the day game, lost 6-4 in the night game)... have one sweep, five splits and have been swept twice in the previous eight... today's games are not officially classified as a doubleheader since there are separate admissions.
15 GAMES IN 13 DAYS: The A's are 4-5 in this stretch that began May 6 and runs through next Wednesday in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that includes a stretch of seven games in five days from Tuesday through today...had a single-admission doubleheader in Detroit on Tuesday and will play the Angels twice today...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13 -day stretch from Sept. 4-16, including seven games in five days several times during that span.

AGAINST THE WEST: This four-game series with the Angels is just the A's second against an American League West opponent this year...lost two of three to Texas (April 22-24) and the A's four intradivision games are the fewest in the majors...this series begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 17 of their next 20 games against the AL West, with two series against the Angels and one against each of the other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting. 179 (112-for-624) with 50 runs over the last 20 games ( 2.5 runs per game) after hitting 226 with 66 runs over the first 14 contests ( 4.7 per game)...are hitting .199 for the season, which is the lowest in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (.203)....also have the lowest on-base percentage (.265) and OPS (.573) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.308)...have struck out 310 times, which is second most in the majors to the Angels (311)...have the fourth fewest extra base hits in both the American League and the majors (71)...have been held to one run or fewer 11 times.
THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered twice in the last 10 games... have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 20 games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 25 -June 29, 2011 when they had a 32game streak....have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep... have 21 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League and the majors... however, eight of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have five stolen bases in the last four games but have been caught stealing three times over that stretch...are 21-for-26 (80.8\%) in stolen bases attempts for the season...rank third in the American League in stolen base percentage and tied for third in steals...A's opponents are 7 -for-
$14(50.0 \%)$ in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...the seven stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Yankees, 5).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.19 ERA (19 er in 78.0 ip) over the last nine games and now have a 3.48 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have two shutouts in the last six games and four for the season, which is tied for third most in the AL....are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (28)...have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.236) and the fifth fewest strikeouts (258).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last 10 games and are $3-5$ with a 2.29 ERA ( 15 er in 59.0 ip ) over that span....are 11-15 with a 3.72 ERA for the season... have the second most losses in the American League but rank third in wins....are also third in innings pitched (176.2).

THE BULLPEN: A's relievers have not allowed a run in six of the last nine games and have a 1.38 ERA ( 4 er in 26.0 ip ) over that span... have a 3.15 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have not allowed a home run over the last 10 games ( 28.0 ip ) and have surrendered just seven for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the AL... have the lowest batting average (.184) against first batters in the AL and the second lowest on-base percentage (.267) and slugging percentage (.282)...have allowed 14-of-58 (24.1\%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL....are tied for second in the AL in holds (26).
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high six-game errorless streak... have made just two errors over the last 11 games after committing 16 over the previous 14 contests... have 23 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest...have turned 34 doubles plays, which is second most to the Orioles (42).
ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-7 (.222) in one-run games....are tied with the Red Sox for the most one-run losses in the American League and have the second worst record (Rangers, 1-5/.167)...11 of the A's 20 losses have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for third most in the AL (Red Sox and Tigers, 12)... have just one come-from-behind win and it came on April 19 against Baltimore...trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the sixth and won 2-1.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for second most in the American League to the Angels (41).... have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of of the rookies have made their Major League debut...the A's currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2022 last night...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins were their most ever against the Angels and there most against any team since going 15-4 against the Astros in 2013...it was the A's third consecutive season series win after losing each of the previous five...went 7-2 in Oakland and 8-2 in Anaheim...the eight road wins are the most most against the Angels and then seven home wins match the most...compiled a 2.01 ERA, which was the A's lowest against the Angels since 1971 (1.97)...outscored the Angels 86-46...have won 11 of the last 13 games and are 34-15 (.694) against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 471-391 against the Angels...that includes 247-185 in Oakland and 224-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 520-468 against the Angels.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Dany Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in his first 13 appearances and his 13.0 innings pitched are the most among American League relievers with no earned runs...leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among among all AL pitchers in saves (6)...Sam Moll has not allowed a run over his first 12 games ( 10.0 ip ) and opponents are 3 -for- 32 (.094).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1944 Ford Garrison goes 5 -for-6 with three RBI, including a walk-off single in the 11th inning in a 4-3 win over St. Louis...in 1988 Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in 1995 Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season.... has not allowed a run in three of his six starts and has yielded three runs or fewer in all six starts... has a 1.74 ERA, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...is in his sixth season in the majors, all with the A's, but is on his first Opening Day roster...pitched in 30 games over his first five seasons with Oakland, all but three of which came as a starter.
4-0: Has won each of his first four decisions for a career-high four-game winning streak (previous: 3, July 31, 2017-June 7, 2018)...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 4-0 since Sonny Gray in 2015...the last to begin the year at least $5-0$ is Trevor Cahill, who won his first six decisions in 2011...the four wins are tied for the most in the American League and are a career high...had just three wins in 30 career appearances entering the season.
DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his six starts, including three starts with no walks...has issued just three free passes in 31.0 innings and his average of 0.87 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings.... has issued just 13 free passes in 69.1 innings over the last two years (1.69 per nine innings) and is averaging 2.18 walks per nine innings in his carer ( 41 bb in 169.0 ip).
OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a 180 ( 9 -for-50) batting average...opponents are 3 -for-19 (.158) with runners in scoring position...entered the season with a .328 career opponents average with RISP... the number three hitter in the order is 1-for-12 (.083)...opponents are hitting .109 with two strikes...they are 7 -for- 14 (.500) with three doubles and a triple when putting the first pitch in play...has a .196 (10-for-51) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .245 (13-for-53) the second time and 143 (1-for-7) the third time.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one home run in 31.0 innings after surrendering eight home runs in 38.1 innings last year...has not allowed a run in the third inning ( 6.0 ip )... has a 3.00 ERA ( 4 er in 12.0 ip) over innings 1-2, a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip ) from the third inning on...is $3-0$ with a 0.83 ERA (2 er in 21.2 ip ) in four starts on the road, 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA ( 4 er in 9.1 ip ) in two starts at home...the A's are 5-1 (.800) in his starting assignments.
2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 5.0 scoreless inning and struck out a career-high seven batters in a 13-2 win at Tampa Bay in his first start on April 11...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win in his second start on April 16 at Toronto...left with a 5-2 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs for the blown save...won back-to-back starts on April 21 against Baltimore and April 27 at San Francisco...combined with five A's relievers on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in the win over the Giants...tossed five of the innings and allowed all three of the hits while walking one...finished April $3-0$ with a 1.35 ERA in four starts...walked just two batters in 20.0 innings and held the opposition to a 197 batting average...it was his first career three-win month and he tied for third in the American League in wins in April...based on a minimum of 20.0 innings, he had the second lowest opponents OPS (.459), ranked third in slugging (.239) and was fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.219)...allowed a seasonhigh three runs on a season-high six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings on May 3 against Tampa Bay.... had a no decision in the A's 10-7, 10-inning loss.
LAST START: He combined with Zach Jackson and Dany Jiménez on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Detroit on Monday...tossed a season-high 6.2 innings, yielded all four of the hits and did not walk a batter...extended his scoreless streak to a career-high 9.0 innings...allowed just two baserunners as far as second base...was relieved by Jackson with two outs in the seventh inning, a runner on first and the A's leading 2-0.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 0-1 with a 9.35 ERA ( 8.2 ip, $13 \mathrm{~h}, 9 \mathrm{r}, 9 \mathrm{er}, 5 \mathrm{bb}$, 5 so, 0 hr ) in three games, including two starts...opponents were 13 -for- 37 (.351) and he issued five walks in 8.2 innings...allowed at least two runs in each of his three appearances.

2021 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Las Vegas and was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in nine starts... has spent parts of each of the last five seasons with Oakland and his nine starts were the second most of his career (10 in 2017)... had career highs in strikeouts (26), losses (4), runs (26), earned runs (25) and home runs (8) and matched his high in hit batters (2) and wild pitches (1).

WITH OAKLAND: Allowed a . 319 opponents batting average but walked just 10 batters in 38.1 innings ( 2.35 walks per nine innings) for a .366 opponents on-base percentage...his opponents batting average broke down to 309 (29-for-94) with an . 858 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to . 333 (23-for-69) with a . 953 OPS against left-handers...opponents hit .333 with runners in scoring position and he has a . 304 career average in that situation.. was 0-1 with a 4.03 ERA and .720 opponents OPS in five starts at home, 1-3 with an 8.44 ERA and 1.115 OPS in four starts on the road...yielded seven of his eight home runs on the road...was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.24 ERA in five starts at night... allowed a . 533 batting average to the opponents number nine hitter and .438 average to the seven hitter...the A's were 3-1 in his no decisions and went 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than six innings in all nine starts, including fewer than five innings four times.
WITH LAS VEGAS: His seven losses with the Aviators were his most as a minor leaguer and his . 311 opponents batting average was a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...his opponents batting average broke down to 300 (61-for-203) with an .824 OPS against lefthanded hitters and .323 ( 53 -for-164) with a .776 OPS against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, . 311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a . 296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, . 307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that....went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and . 867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings.... picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sac ramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts... struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, when he was selected by Oakland on Aug. 18...started that day at Chicago (AL) and allowed three runs on five hits in 5.1 innings in a 3-2 loss...tossed a seasonhigh 5.2 innings and struck out a season-high tying five batters in his second start on Aug. 23 against Seattle...also had a season-high 97 pitches...logged 5.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 29 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win...left with a 1-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save...went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA, .250 opponents batting average and .624 OPS in three starts in August...then compiled a 1-3 record with an 8.06 ERA, 359 opponents batting average and 1.060 OPS over his final six starts...picked up his only win of the season on Sept. 16 at Kansas City when he allowed two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings in the A's 7-2 win...it was his first win since June 29, 2018 against Cleveland and it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6, 2018...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (eight starts)...matched his season high with five strikeouts on Sept. 21 against Seattle.

RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 3.44 ERA): Is schedued to make his American League leading eighth start of the season...the A's have been shut out in three of his seven starts and he has received 16 runs of support overall (43.0 ip, 3.35 RSA)...is averaging the most pitches per game in the AL (94.9) and ranks second in innings pitched (43.0)...has allowed a .179 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's loss at Detroit in the first game of the doubleheader last Tuesday ( $6.1 \mathrm{ip}, 7 \mathrm{~h}, 4 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{er}, 3 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )...is $4-1$ with a 2.30 ERA ( $62.2 \mathrm{ip}, 48 \mathrm{~h}$, $20 \mathrm{r}, 16 \mathrm{er}, 24 \mathrm{bb}, 65 \mathrm{so}, 4 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in 13 career appearances against the Angels, including 10 starts...went 2-1 with a 0.68 ERA ( 26.2 ip, $15 \mathrm{~h}, 6 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 9 \mathrm{bb}, 32$ so, 0 hr ) in four starts last year...went 13-9 with a 3.37 ERA and 207 strikeouts in 32 starts last year...finished with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971.

## TODAY'S NIGHT GAME STARTING PITCHER: Adam Oller (0-2, 11.17 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today as the 27th man for the doubleheader and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career....was on the A's Opening Day roster and was $0-2$ with a 11.17 ERA in three starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas on May 1... went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Aviators...was acquired from the New York Mets with J.T. Ginn on March 12 in exchange for Chris Bassitt.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut April 12 at Tampa Bay, a 9-8 A's loss in 10 innings...became the 54th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing by an A's starting pitcher in his debut since Glenn Cox logged 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955...the A's scored three times in the first and he allowed a leadoff home run to Lowe in the bottom of the first...then yielded a RBI single to Walls and a three-run home run to Choi in the second and left trailing 5-3...the A's came back to tie the game in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Toronto on April 17...allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Guerriel sacrifice fly, an Espinal RBI single and a Chapman RBI single...was relieved by Castellani with one out in the fourth inning, a runner on first and the A's trailing 3-0.
