# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-23) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (21-15)

ABOUTTHE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games after winning four of the previous five contests...are 7-17 (.292) over the last 24 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are a season-high tying eight games under . 500 at 15-23 (.395), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 12th time in the last 13 days... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 12 days in fifth...trail first place Houston and Los Angeles by a season-high nine games for the second consecutive...that matches their largest deficit in the West from last year (end of season)...have not been more than nine games out of first place in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped Friday by Los Angeles (AL).
OFFENSE: The A's have scored one run in each of the last three games, which marks the second time this year they have scored one run or fewer in three straight games (May 4-7)... had no such streak from 2017-21... have scored one run or fewer 15 times, which is five more than any other team in the majors...have been shut out six times, which is also the most in the majors... were blanked just seven times all last year.... have scored 123 runs for the season, which is fifth fewest in the American League....are batting . 181 ( 94 -for520) in May...the lowest batting average in a month of 10 or more games in Oakland history is . 210 (April, 1979; May, 2012).... have a .199 batting average for the season, which is the lowest in the majors...also have the lowest onbase percentage (.268), slugging percentage (.306) and OPS (.574)...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (328), the third most grounded into double plays (29) and the fourth fewest extra base hits (80)....are tied for the most sacrifice hits (7).
THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just three times in the last 14 games, which are their fewest home runs over a 14-game stretch since Aug. 8-22, 2010 when they also had three...have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 24 games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since May 25-June 29, 2011 when they had a 32-game streak.... have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep... have 22 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League and the majors....however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.85 ERA ( 39 er in 123.0 ip ) over the last 14 games after logging a 3.98 ERA over the first 24 contests...are tied for third in the American League in shutouts (4) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs allowed (32)...are averaging the fifth fewest walks per nine innings (2.92) but have the fifth fewest strikeouts per nine inniings (7.80)... have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.235)
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the last 14 games and are $3-8$ with a 3.12 ERA ( 28 er in 81.0 ip) over that span....are 11-18 with a 3.90 ERA for the season... have the most losses in the American League but are tied for the third most wins...have the most innings pitched in the majors (198.2).
THE BULLPEN: A's relievers have compiled a 1.80 ERA ( 8 er in 40.0 ip ) over the last 13 games and now have a 3.09 ERA for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League.... had their streak of 13 consecutive games without a home run come to an end last night, which was their longest such streak over the last nine years....have surrendered just eight home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to the Yankees (7)...have the lowest slugging percentage (.284) against first batters faced in the AL, the second lowest batting average (.198) and third lowest on-base percentage (.282)... have allowed 15 -of-65 (23.1\%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 65 inherited runners are fourth most in the AL....are tied for third in the AL in holds (26).
ON THE BASES: The A's have eight stolen bases in the last eight games and are 24 -for- $29(82.8 \%)$ for the season... have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 8 -for-16 (50.0\%) in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...the eight stolen bases allowed are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is third most in the AL.
DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last four games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests... have 27 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...rank second in double plays turned (36)...have the third fewest outfield assists (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL ( $1-3$ ) and Minnesota ( $0-1$ ) and have now lost 10 of the last 11 home games...are 5-13 (.308) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-15/.250)...snapped their-seven-game home losing streak in the day game on Saturday...the streak matched the ninth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) that begins on Friday...went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (0-3) and Detroit (4-1) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road....are hitting . 186 ( 103 -for-554) with 43 runs and seven home runs in 18 games at home compared to 209 (137-for-654) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road... have the lowest home batting average in the majors, have the second fewest runs scored and are tied for the second fewest home runs.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 3-1 last night for their 12th loss by two runs or fewer this year, which is tied for the most in the majors....are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...the losses are tied with the Red Sox for the most in the American League and the record is tied for second worst...had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game Saturday.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 5-8 in this stretch that began May 6 and runs through tomorrow in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that included a stretch of seven games in five days from last Tuesday through Saturday...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. $4-16$, including seven games in five days several times during that span...this three-game series against Minnesota marks the only games over a 20-game stretch from May 13 -June 1 in which the A's will not play an American League West opponent....are 2-5 against divisional foes and the A's seven intradivision games are the fewest in the majors
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels and Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including eight pitchers...have used eight starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth most in the AL....employed just nine starting pitchers in each of the previous two seasons... have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)... used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.
A's vs. TWINS: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2015 as they are 0-4 with two games remaining...went 3-4 in 2015 and have not lost more than four games to the Twins since going $3-6$ in 2010...lost the first game in Oakland last night after being swept in a three-game series at Minnesota, May 6-8...all four losses have been by two runs or fewer and the A's have been outscored 10-5 in the four games... won the season series last year, 5-1...swept a three-game series in Oakland and won two of three at Minnesota....have won each of the previous three season series and seven of the previous nine...are 36-21 (.632) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-6 (.778) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 314-310 against Minnesota...that includes 175-132 in Oakland and 139-178 in Minnesota....are 22-23 at Target Field....are 371-379 all-time against the Twins and have a 1018-1015 record against the Twins/ Senators...the 1018 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

Dany Jiménez allowed his first earned run of the season Sunday and now has a 0.66 ERA, which ranks sixth among American League relievers...leads AL rookies and is tied for seventh among among all AL pitchers in saves (6)...A.J. Puk has a career-high and A's season-high 13.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks fourth among AL relievers in ERA (0.55).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1959 Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader, 10-0...in 1963 Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in 1996 Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history...in $\mathbf{2 0 1 6}$ Khris Davis has three home runs and six RBI, including a walk-off grand slam, in the A's 8-5 win over Texas.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list May 1 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season....allowed four runs in 2.0 innings in his first start but has yielded just three runs in 10.2 innings over his last two ( 2.53 ERA).... has allowed three hits in each of his three starts and opponents are 9 -for-46 (.196)...began the season on the 10 -day IL with an inflamed right $A C$ joint...did not pitch during the spring...this is his third season in the majors, all with the A's.
REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Went 1-1 with a 7.24 ERA ( $13.2 \mathrm{ip}, 15 \mathrm{~h}, 11 \mathrm{r}, 11 \mathrm{er}, 5$ $\mathrm{bb}, 13 \mathrm{so}, 3 \mathrm{hr}$ ) on a three-start rehab assignment...had 52 pitches in his first start, 78 in his second and 84 in his third....made one start for Low-A Stockton on April 15 against Modesto and picked up the win in a 14-10 decision (5.0 ip, $3 \mathrm{~h}, 2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 6$ so, 2 hr )...his final two starts came with Triple-A Las Vegas... had a no decision in a 12-5 win against El Paso on April 20 ( $4.2 \mathrm{ip}, 9 \mathrm{~h}, 4 \mathrm{r}, 4 \mathrm{er}$, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 5 \mathrm{so}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ ) and then took the loss in a 12-5 decision on April 26 against Tacoma ( $4.0 \mathrm{ip}, 3 \mathrm{~h}, 5 \mathrm{r}, 5 \mathrm{er}, 4 \mathrm{bb}, 2 \mathrm{so}$ ).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Cleveland on May 1 in Oakland...tossed 2.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career... walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed a RBI double to Maile in the second and then walked the bases loaded to start the third inning....was relieved by Lemoine, who allowed all three runners to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Minnesota on May 7...blanked the Twins on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth...then allowed a home run to Polanco for the only run of the game...was relieved by Jackson following the homer and finished with 5.2 innings...Gray and three relievers combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit last Thursday... Oakland scored three times in the first and he blanked the Tigers on a hit and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed two runs in the fifth inning on a Barnhart RBI double and a Grossman RBI ground out...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2.

2021 RECAP: Was the Opening Day starter for Triple-A Las Vegas on May 6 but that would be his only start with the Aviators...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and spent the remainder of the season with the A's, going 8-5 with a 4.07 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in 24 games, including 21 starts, in his rookie campaign...tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins, tied for sixth in innings pitched (119.1), ranked seventh in strikeouts (123) and eighth in games started...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, he ranked fifth in opponents batting average, sixth in ERA, seventh in on-base percentage (.302), ninth in OPS (.732) and 10th in slugging (.430)...his 123 strikeouts were eighth most in Oakland history by a rookie and were the most since Sean Manaea had 124 in 2016...his 21 starts were the most since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...went $5-3$ with a 2.65 ERA, . 202 opponents batting average and .657 OPS over his first 12 starts through July 20 ...then posted a $3-2$ record with a 5.96 ERA, . 271 opponents average and . 825 OPS over his final 12 games (nine starts) beginning on July 27.
OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to 201 ( 46 -for-229) with a . 602 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 ( 59 -for-222) with a .860 OPS against left-handers...issued 31 of his 41 walks to lefties...had the third lowest batting average and OPS against right-hand-
ers in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...opponents were 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...had a .189 opponents batting average and .569 OPS the first time through the order, .285 with a .907 OPS the second time and .221 with a .710 OPS after that...yielded 10 of his 19 home runs the second time through the order...allowed a . 083 average against the opponent's number five hitter...surrendered six of his 19 home runs to the clean-up hitter...opponents hit .107 when putting his curveball in play, which was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 150 or more curveballs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Began the season with 21 starts and was 8-5 with a 3.80 ERA and .720 OPS before being moved to the bullpen following his start on Sept. 18... had no decisions, a 7.88 ERA and .890 OPS in three relief appearances...tossed at least 2.0 innings in each of his three relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 -for- 2 with a hit by pitch and he did not inherit any runners.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 1.93 ERA over the first two innings, a 5.24 ERA from the third inning on...was $5-3$ with a 3.28 ERA in 11 games at home, $3-2$ with a 4.82 ERA in 13 games on the road...had a 4-3 record and a 3.16 ERA in 10 day games, a 4-2 record and a 4.76 ERA in 14 night games...allowed 15 of his 19 home runs at night... was 1-2 with a 5.68 ERA in three interleague starts. logged a 7-3 record and a 3.86 ERA in 21 games against AL competition...left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's were 11-10 (.524) in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 21 starts and five hits or fewer 16 times.

2021 DAY-BY-DAY: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento ( $4.2 \mathrm{ip}, 8 \mathrm{~h}, 2$ r, 2 er, $1 \mathrm{bb}, 5$ so, $0 \mathrm{hr}, 76$ pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and . 182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Texas)... tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27 ...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddack in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...went 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his first three starts following his return...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strike out a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Ange-les-AL)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits in a 3-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 18...that would be his final start of the season as it brought his season innings pitched total, including Las Vegas, to 116.0...had just 101.0 innings as a professional entering the season...pitched in relief in each of his final three appearances and allowed at least two runs in all three appearances (7.88 ERA)...tossed 2.0 innings in his first relief appearance on Sept. 23 vs. Seattle, which was his shortest outing of the season.

RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-6, 4.84 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...has allowed 17 runs in his last four starts (7.65 ERA) after yielding three runs, two earned, over his first three (1.17 ERA)...won his first start but has lost each of his last six...his streak of six consecutive starts with a loss matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 42 years (last: Vin Mazzaro, June 23-July 23, 2009) and is tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...has not walked a batter in his last three starts...has received one run of support or fewer in six of his seven starts and has six runs of support total in his seven starts ( $35.1 \mathrm{ip}, 1.53 \mathrm{RSA}$ )...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Friday here in Oakland ( $6.0 \mathrm{ip}, 5$ h, $2 \mathrm{r}, 2 \mathrm{er}, 0 \mathrm{bb}, 4 \mathrm{so}$ )... was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Twins, a 4-3 A's loss at Minnesota earlier this month on May 8 ( $5.0 \mathrm{ip}, 7$ h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 3 so).
