# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-23) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (21-16)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last six games after winning four of the previous five contests...are 8-17 (.320) over the last 25 games after starting the year 8-6 (.571)...are 16-23 (.410) overall, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 13th time in the last 14 days... have spent one day tied for first in the West, two days in second, six days tied for second, seven days in third, five days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and 13 days in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high nine games for the third consecutive day... that matches their largest deficit in the West from last year (end of season)... have not been more than nine games out of first place in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...had their season-high three-game winning streak snapped last Friday by Los Angeles (AL).
OFFENSE: The A's are batting . 190 ( 105 -for- 554 ) with 47 runs scored in 18 games in May ( 2.6 runs per game)...the lowest batting average in a month of 10 or more games in Oakland history is . 210 (April, 1979; May, 2012)...have a . 202 batting average for the season, which is the lowest in the majors...also have the lowest on-base percentage (.272), slugging percentage (.311) and OPS (.583)...have the fifth fewest runs scored in the American League (128)... have scored one run or fewer 15 times, which is five more than any other team in the majors... have been shut out six times, which is tied with the Mariners for the most in the majors...were blanked just seven times all last year...have the third most strikeouts in the AL (334), the third most grounded into double plays (30) and the fourth fewest extra base hits (83)....are tied for the most sacrifice hits (7).
THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just four times in the last 15 games... have hit one home run or fewer in each of the last 25 games, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since the record of 32 games from May 25 -June 29, 2011.... have not had a multiple homer game since April 21 against Baltimore when Pache and Murphy went deep... have 23 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League and the majors...however, nine of the home runs have come with at least two runners on base, which is the most in the majors.
PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.80 ERA ( 41 er in 132.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 3.98 ERA over the first 24 contests...are tied for third in the American League in shutouts (4) and rank fifth in fewest home runs allowed (34)...are averaging the fifth fewest walks per nine innings (2.92) but have the fifth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.86)...have the fifth highest opponents batting average (.234).
STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of the last 15 games but are 3-8 despite a 3.13 ERA ( 30 er in 86.1 ip) over that span...are 11-18 with a 3.88 ERA for the season....are tied for the most losses in the American League but are tied for the fifth most wins... have the most innings pitched (204.0).
THE BULLPEN: A's relievers have compiled a 1.65 ERA (8 er in 43.2 ip ) over the last 14 games and now have a 3.01 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have allowed just one home run over the last 15 games and eight for the season, which is second fewest in the AL to the Yankees (7)...have the lowest batting average (.202) and slugging percentage (.286) against first batters faced in the AL and the third lowest on-base percentage (.284)...have allowed 15-of-67 (22.4\%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...the 67 inherited runners are tied for third most in the AL...rank fourth in holds (26).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24 -for- 29 ( $82.8 \%$ ) in stolen base attempts...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank third in steals...A's opponents are 8 -for- $16(50.0 \%)$ in stolen base attempts, which is the lowest success rate in the majors...the eight stolen bases allowed are the fewest in the majors...A's pitchers have four pickoffs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last five games after making just two errors over the previous 11 contests...have 28 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...however, the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...are tied for second in the AL in most double plays turned (36) and fewest outfield assists (3).
HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this seven-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Minnesota (1-1) and have lost 10 of the last 12 home games...are 6-13 (.316) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the majors (Nationals, 5-15/.250)...snapped their-sevengame home losing streak in the day game on Saturday...the streak matched
the ninth longest home losing streak in Oakland history...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games) that begins on Friday....went 4-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota ( $0-3$ ) and Detroit ( $4-1$ ) and are 10-10 (.500) on the road...are hitting 194 (114-for-588) with 48 runs and eight home runs in 19 games at home compared to .209 (137-for-654) with 80 runs and 15 home runs in 20 games on the road...have the lowest home batting average in the majors and are tied for the second fewest runs scored and home runs.
CLOSE CALLS: Of the A's 23 losses, 12 have been by two runs or fewer, which is tied for the most in the majors....are 3-7 (.300) in one-run games...t the losses are tied with the Red Sox for the most in the American League and the record is tied for second worst... had their first walk-off win of the season in the day game Saturday.
SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's are 6-8 in this stretch that began May 6 and concludes today in which they are scheduled to play 15 games in 13 days...that included a stretch of seven games in five days from last Tuesday through Saturday...in 2020, the A's played 16 games over a 13-day stretch from Sept. $4-16$, including seven games in five days several times during that span... this three-game series against Minnesota marks the only games over a 20game stretch from May 13 -June 1 in which the A's will not play an American League West opponent....are 2-5 against divisional foes and the A's seven intradivision games are the fewest in the majors
PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 40 players, which is tied for third most in the American League (Angels, 42; Twins, 41)...have employed 18 rookies, which is tied for the sixth most in a season in Oakland history...it is the most since the 2017 A's had 20 rookies and the record is 21 in 2008...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debut...currently have 11 rookies on the roster, including seven pitchers.... have used eight starting pitchers after using just nine in each of the previous two seasons...have employed six first basemen after using just five all last year.
THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 16 times this year, which includes eight Covid-19 IL placements...currently have six players on the IL (Bolt, Guerra, Honeywell, Irvin, Piscotty, Vogt)...used the IL 27 times last year, which tied the Oakland record set in 2016...however, it was second fewest in the majors.
A's vs. TWINS: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2015 as they are 1-4 entering the final game today....went 3-4 in 2015 and with a loss today, would finish with their second worst record ever against the Twins (1-8 in 2003)...have split the first two games in Oakland after being swept in a three-game series at Minnesota, May 6-8...all four losses have been by two runs or fewer and the A's have been outscored 12-10 in the five games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's fewest runs scored in a season against one team with a minimum of six games played is 12 against San Francisco in 2009...are hitting. 192 (30-for-156) and the fewest hits ( min . 6 games) is 34 against Toronto in 2019...have won seven of the last 10 season series and are 37-21 (.638) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 22-6 (.786) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 315-310 against Minnesota...that includes 176-132 in Oakland and 139-178 in Minnesota....are 22-23 at Target Field....are 372-379 all-time against the Twins and have a 1019-1015 record against the Twins/Senators... the 1019 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

After using 38 different lineups in the first 38 games, the A's used the same lineup yesterday as they did on Monday...Dany Jiménez allowed his first earned run of the season Sunday and now has a 0.59 ERA, which ranks fifth among American League relievers...leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in saves (7)...A.J. Puk has a career-high and A's season-high 13.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to April 14 and ranks fourth among AL relievers in ERA (0.55).

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, $8-5 . .$. in 2014 Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season, which is the most among American League rookies... has allowed 17 runs in his last four starts ( $20.0 \mathrm{ip}, 7.65$ ERA) after yielding three runs, two earned, over his first three ( 1.17 ERA)...begins his third season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...made one start for the A's in 2020 and another start along with four relief appearances in 2021.

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Picked up the win in his first start this year but has taken the loss in each of his six starts since then, which is the longest losing streak of his career and is tied for the longest in the majors this year... his streak of six consecutive starts with a loss matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 42 years (last: Vin Mazzaro, June 23-July 23, 2009) and is tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six consecutive starts is Brian Kingman, who lost an Oakland record nine straight from Aug. 12-Sept. 25, 1980...Jefferies has a 5.64 ERA (19 er in 30.1 ip ) and . 294 (37-for-126) opponents batting average during his current losing streak...his six losses this year are tied for the most in the American League.

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in his last three starts (16.0 ip)...only three pitchers in Oakland history have gone four consecutive starts without walking a batter: Lew Krausse (Aug. 22-Sept. 8, 1969), Lary Sorensen (June 26-July 21, 1984) and Bartolo Colon (Aug. 18, 2012-April 17, 2013)...has issued just five free passes in 35.1 innings this year and his average of 1.27 walks per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...has walked just 11 in 52.1 career innings (1.89 per nine innings).

RUN SUPPORT: The A's were shutout in his last start, which was his third start this year with no run support...has received one run of support or fewer in six of his seven starts and has six runs of support total in his seven starts (35.1 ip, 1.53 RSA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered three of his four home runs to righthanded hitters...three have been solo shots...has a . 241 (14-for-58) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .350 (21-for-60) the second time and 167 (4-for-24) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-2 with a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) and . 207 (12-for-58) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 6.98 ERA ( 15 er in 19.1 ip ), 321 ( 27 -for-84) opponents average and all four of his home runs allowed in four starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is 0-3 with a 2.20 ERA (4 er in 16.1 ip ) and .238 (15-for-63) opponents batting average on three starts on four days rest compared to 0-3 with a 9.64 ERA ( 15 er in 14.0 ip ) and .349 (22-for-63) opponents average in three starts on five days rest.
2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the winning pitcher in his first start, a 4-1 A's win at Philadelphia in the third game of the season...shut out the Phillies in five innings of work and tossed just 48 pitches...walked a season-high two...is 0-6 with a 5.64 ERA (19 er in 30.1 ip ) in six starts since then...received no runs of support in back-to-back starts on April 15 at Toronto and April 20 against the Orioles and lost both starts despite allowing three runs, two earned, in 10.1 innings...struck out a career-high five batters in a career-high 6.0 innings in his outing against the Orioles...yielded five runs in 4.0 innings for the loss on April 26 at San Francisco...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 11 hits in 5.0 innings in a 6-1 loss to Tampa Bay on May 2...the hits were the most by an A's pitcher since Frankie Montas allowed 11 on June 14, 2018 against Houston...tossed a career-high 90 pitches.
LAST START: He lost his sixth consecutive start in the A's 2-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Friday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Marsh in the fourth and a solo home run to Velazquez in the fifth...was relieved by Snead to start the seventh with the A's trailing 2-0... Silseth and three relievers combined to shutout the A's on two hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with a 9.64 ERA (14.0 ip, $24 \mathrm{~h}, 16 \mathrm{r}, 15 \mathrm{er}$ $1 \mathrm{bb}, 14 \mathrm{so}, 3 \mathrm{hr}$ ) in four appearances, including three starts... walked just one batter in 14.0 innings but opponents were 24 -for- 65 (.369)...led the majors in runs (16) and hits allowed (24)...tied for fifth in the Cactus League in innings pitched and tied for seventh in strikeouts (14)...tied Irvin for the team lead in innings pitched (14.0) and strikeouts (14).

2021 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Las Vegas where he was 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 starts...also had two stints with Oakland and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in five games, including one start, before his season ended on Sept. 18 when he was placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow ulnar neuritis...allowed a . 208 opponents batting average with the A's, which broke down to .185 (5-for-27) with a .661 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) with a . 605 OPS against left-handers...had a .296 opponents average with the bases empty, . 115 with runners on base...opponents were 1-for-12 (.083) with runners in scoring position...stranded all five of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 1-for-4 (.250) with a double...tossed 5.0 innings in his start and more than 2.0 innings in three of his four relief appearances...was rated as the A's seventh-best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

WITH LAS VEGAS: His five wins with the Aviators were a minor league career high and he matched his best with 15 starts...also had career highs in ERA (4.91), opponents batting average (.288), hits (90), runs (44), earned runs (42), home runs (13) and walks (11)...had a . 316 opponents on-base percentage as he walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings (1.29 per nine innings)... has walked just 23 batters in 176.1 career innings in the minors (1.17 per nine innings)...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18...has 189 career strikeouts for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.22 ... based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he led Triple-A West pitchers in strikeout-to-walk ratio, ranked second in fewest walks per nine innings, third in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), eighth in opponents on-base percentage and ninth in ERA...his opponents batting average broke down to .280 (44-for-157) with a .789 OPS against righthanded hitters compared to .297 (46-for-155) with a .830 OPS against left-handers... allowed 23 of his 44 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 6.60 ERA...had a 3.83 ERA after that, including 1.93 in the third inning.... was 1-0 with a 3.58 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 6.15 ERA in nine starts on five days rest or more...the Aviators were 4-5 in his no decisions and had a 9-6 (.600) record in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in seven of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked one batter or fewer 12 times...had eight starts without a walk.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Paul Blackburn (4-0, 1.67 ERA): Has allowed seven runs over his first seven starts...only two starting pitchers in Athletics history (excluding "openers") have allowed fewer runs over their first seven starts in a season... Mike Norris had six in 1980 and Harry Krause had three in 1909...has a 1.67 ERA, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...has won each of his first four decisions for a career-high fourgame winning streak...is the first A's starting pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season 4-0 since Sonny Gray in 2015...the four wins are tied for second most in the AL and are a career high...had just three wins in 30 career appearances entering the season...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) in the day game last Saturday in Oakland ( $6.2 \mathrm{ip}, 5 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2 \mathrm{bb}, 3 \mathrm{so}$ )...is 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA ( $13.1 \mathrm{ip}, 10 \mathrm{~h}, 1 \mathrm{r}, 1 \mathrm{er}, 2$ $\mathrm{bb}, 4$ so) in two career starts against Los Angeles (AL).
